

any books have been written that signify the importance of saying yes to various experiences, opportunities, or challenges in life, such as "Year of Yes," published by Shonda

Rhimes, and "Yes Man, " a comical memoir by Danny Wallace

Having a positive attitude or mindset that allows one to take risks or grab ahold of fresh opportunities make c a n break a person in the areas of personal growth, relationships, business success. Saying yes implies that you are being led by something or someone else. Whether it be from momentary impulse, ending your reluctance to follow another person, or giving into the rules set forth by governing authorities, saying yes determine the outcome of your dreams and goals and define



your eternal future. It can break chains of fear, inhibition, reluctance, and unbelief. But it can also lead to failure, broken relationships, sickness, and even death.

So with the same power given to us to say yes, God has given us equal power to say no. And although it may seem negative or bound up from being free to say no, it has been argued by some that having a

healthy balance between saying yes and no, can have the most significant impact on your psychological, emotional, and spiritual growth. Authors such as R. Carson (2005) "The Power of No." And A. Morin



(2015) "Seven Reasons Learning to Say No is a Sign of Personal Growth" emphasized the importance of saying no as well as yes, for minimizing stress, building interpersonal relationships, and crossing cultural boundaries; with clear and straightforward language.

As Christians, we are taught from Scripture how to avoid the world's influences and be "transformed by the renewing of our minds." (Romans 12:2) We are to say no to the lies of the devil and focus on our commitment and identity, we have in following Christ.

-James 4:7

We are to replace all fear with love: "There is no fear in love."

-I John 4:18

Jesus told us that all the commands of God are summed up in two:

1) Love God with all your heart, mind, soul, and

strength, and

2) love one another as yourself" - Matt 22:37-40

If we follow the guidelines of Scripture that help us know when to say yes and when to say no, we are wise as well as blessed in everything we do.

Two forces are trying to influence what we do in every situation. One leads to death. One leads to life. Scripture makes this clear in Deuteronomy 30:19, "...I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing; therefore choose life...."

But what if everything looks right on the outside, and everyone is telling you to say yes, but inside your heart, you feel you should say no. Is that fear? Or wisdom?

"There is a way that seems right to a man, But its end is the way of death." -Proverbs 16:25

When this question comes to me, I remember two key

Apply love before feeding your own pride; -I Cor 13:4,5

Choose submission and peace over rebellion and conflict; -I Pet 5:5

Choose Faith in God's word over disbelief; -Mark 5:36

Believe in God's promises over circumstances.
-Hebrews 11:1

verses that have always helped me in making difficult decisions:

- 1) Prov 3:5,6 tells me not to overthink it; acknowledge God in the decision. (pray about it first) Trust God with my whole heart as I step forward. Then He promises me that He will guide my path.
- 2) Proverbs 16:9, "A man's heart will plan his way, but the Lord is directing his steps."

The cool thing about God is He knows the outcome before He guides our steps. And following His guidance will always end up well. You can trust Him. He provides where He guides. We don't always know what the outcome will be. But He does. And He gives us clues on how to know when to say yes or no, in His word:

Then You will KNOW in your heart what to do. Follow your heart even if it doesn't make a whole lot of sense! Just say yes to the Spirit (Galatians 6:8) and no to the flesh.

And remember: what you say matters. You don't need to swear. It will backfire on you if you do. Just say yes or no.

Life and death are in the power of the tongue. "Whatever we believe will be what we speak." -II Corinthians 4:13

Every decision we make has life-or-death consequences connected to it. Therefore having the wisdom to know what to do and understanding the consequences of each choice is the foundation of living a healthy and prosperous life in God's kingdom.

"My son, let them not depart from your eyes—Keep sound wisdom and discretion, so they will be life to your soul and grace to your neck. Then you will walk safely in your way, And your foot will not stumble." -Proverbs 3:21-23


Will you dream with Me?


The possibilities are endless when we say yes to the dreams God has for us. We rest in agreement and watch Him expand our lives beyond our hopes and dreams.





There are varied levels of yes. These levels are based on precisely what is asked of the listener. Some questions are relatively insignificant. Others require bravery in order to say yes.

"Isn't it a beautiful day?" doesn't need much soul-searching before saying yes. But, when Mordecai asked Esther to intercede with the king for the lives of all the Jews in his Kingdom, her yes included, "If I perish, I perish." She was saying yes with a commitment to risk her life for others. She was saying yes with no guaranteed outcome.

In the case of Esther, her yes included asking for help. She requested Mordecai to ask all the Jews of the city to fast and pray. She also committed to fasting and praying with her attendants. Queen Esther took action that demonstrated faith by preparing a feast in advance for the king to attend immediately after approaching him – even though she didn't know if she'd even be alive to serve it. She said yes with commitment, prayer, preparation, and persistence.

Esther's yes, meant she was saying no to other things. By saying yes to prayer with fasting, she said no to food and other activities for three days. She was also saying no to relaxing because she said yes to preparing a feast for the king's enjoyment. This is also one of the varied powers of yes, – the power to say no to other things so we can follow through on what we've said yes to.



Applying these points to being a Kingdom Writer means:

We don't know exactly what the outcome will be: How many will read our writing? Will we get a financial return on our investment? Or what impact our stories will have for the Kingdom.

We may need to ask for help: Editors, illustrators, formatters, publishers, etc.

We will certainly need to pray: To hear his voice/be led by the Spirit.

We will need to prepare: Classes/practice, organization, obtaining skills/equipment, etc.

We will need to persist: Keep going until it's complete, and start the next one. Don't give in to discouragement/distraction.

We will need to say no to other activities in order to follow through on our yes to write for the Kingdom: Mindless scrolling on social media, TV, reading addiction, etc.

Some Kingdom writing may be harder than others, whether in length, complexity, or the resistance of the evil one. But it is God who works in us, both to give us the desire and the ability to do what pleases Him. Say yes. Keep saying yes.

Expect. Expect God to keep His word. Replace any lingering doubts with the surety that God said it, and He used you to do it. Remember all the times in your life when He has done exactly what He promised. Know that He is both author and finisher. Expect Him to finish everything that He has started in your life.

We won't always know God's when, but we can give Him our "Yes!", hold onto the promise, and prepare.

aying yes is scary. I believe as children; we instinctively say yes quickly. Yes to adventures, yes to treats, yes to good things. Our personality, temperament, and experiences reinforce or erode our yes tendencies. Early in life, I learned to say no with vehement strength and conviction. Do you want to go on a date? No. Do you want to try diving off the cliff? No. Will you share your thoughts with _____ (fill n the blank)? No. You get the picture.

As a single parent, the word no became my default answer (my poor daughter). It seemed easier to say no on the spot to most of her requests, especially while navigating dinner, laundry, permission slips, and parental worries. In many instances, I'd reconsider and change my answer later. I completely identify with Moses when God called Moses through the burning bush to approach Pharaoh. Moses hedged. He sputtered excuses and concerns. I hear his internal no loud and clear. No is a great word if you're trying to set boundaries within unhealthy relationships. However, it is not good when God calls you to do something. It's disobedience.

Thankfully, when we reject fear or mental objections with the mind of Christ, saying yes becomes easier. As we become stronger in our faith and more secure in our identity as Christ-followers, we see God work. We develop the courage to say yes when we respond to His requests. God moves in mighty and miraculous ways when we honor him with our yes in small and large matters. When we say yes amid fear and questions, that faith step allows God-sized growth. And then life changes.

Should we give the power of our yes to A.I.?


I have concerns, one of which is the loss of voice.

What about infusing our writing with Jesus? He granted us the heart and passion for our writing, not A.I. Facts are great but not equal to heart or Spirit.





held the brush in my hand, pondering. Will I remember how? Will I be joyous at the outcome or embarrassed that I even tried? I was nervous as much as excited at that moment. I thought I signed up for a writing session, but somehow, I was now sitting in a chair with crisp white paper in front of me. A small rectangle filled with colored cubes was placed at each person's spot, along with a brush and a cup of water.

I could have gotten up at that moment. could have said 'no' to creative experiment that toyed with my self-worth. I could have, but didn't. I said 'Yes,' and so did all the others at the table with me that day. We came together as writers and creatives but had no idea what God had planned for us. Our leader, Jill, began to share about tapping into who are as creatives and partnering with Holy Spirit, "Go ahead and put some water in each of the cubes to soften the paint. We are going to do a watercolor!" Suddenly, my inner child jumped for joy, and I couldn't wait to paint and have fun, but then Jill said, "I want you to close your eyes and then start painting."

What? Paint with my eyes closed? It will look awful. I'll be embarrassed. I looked around at the others who had signed up for Jill's session. They, too, seemed confused, but one-by-one, they closed their eyes and






said, "Yes." I had been praying for an encounter. I desired to partner with Holy Spirit more and more in my writing and in my life. This was the moment that shifted how I flow in my giftings.

For the next few hours, we painted. The blind paintings revealed prophetic messages; as we held each up, others would share what they saw. "Provision, freedom, healing..." I was captivated by that experience, especially because I was blind when I painted. I thought I was reaching for blue, but another color immerged. We were partnering with Holy Spirit and tapping into our creative flow.


