

Murdeduke | 730 Cressy Rd, Winchelsea

Situated near Lake Murdeduke - which is thought to mean "muddy waters" - from the moment you enter Murdeduke you are transported to a time gone by. The large garden surrounds a two-storey homestead, built in 1875 for Arthur Hopkins and designed by the noted architects Terry and Oakden. Most of the garden as it stands today was developed in the late 1940s by Jessica and Jim Wilson, the present owners' grandparents. Combining open spaces with formalised paths, sculptures and water features, Murdeduke has something for everyone. The garden incorporates lush trees, roses and perennials of varying strong colours which are highlighted by the bluestone background. Featuring a circular carriage-way, rose arbour, open lawn spaces, a sunken garden and pond, as well as stand-alone art pieces, including a sculpture from renowned artist Peter Blizzard.

Narwee | 175 Armytage Rd, Winchelsea

A country garden of roughly seven acres that began its revamp in 2010 after a ten year drought. It includes an orchard, vegetable garden, many roses, iris, salvias, teucrium and other drought tolerant plants. We have planted many new trees including oaks, acers, robinias and Manchurian pears.

Chittering | 135 Armytage Rd, Winchelsea

A relatively young country garden, developed by the current owners over weekends since 1989. The original weatherboard cottage sat in a bare paddock. Trees and a cottage garden were established and added to over the years to soften the landscape. In 2010, the homestead was extensively renovated and the garden adapted to suit the new home. This included the establishment of a formal rose garden, a wisteria clad pergola, orchard and vegetable garden. Low maintenance garden beds featuring dry climate Mediterranean plants, succulents and shrubs surround the house

Coombe Cottage | 70 Lauders Lane, Winchelsea

Sitting on approximately three acres, this eclectic garden is made of natives, exotics, succulents, orchard and a billabong. The present garden is about 12 years old with many features of the old garden. The cottage was built in 1860 and renovated in 2008. Highlights are the number and variety of birds, particularly exciting being the regular visit from a pelican and occasionally a couple of his friends. Sculptures from Will Wilson and Peter Blizzard.

Calluna | 25 Richmonds Lane, Winchelsea

Walking into the garden, it's surprising to learn that Calluna is only eight years old. The property is one hectare and has a tranquil park-like feeling, with a variety of deciduous trees, native trees and shrubs. The northern garden features a sprawling lawn, rose arbour and native plants. A wonderful borrowed vista of the golf course is the western boundary of the property and a productive vegetable garden and orchard are on the south boundary, all providing a peaceful atmosphere and a haven for a variety of birds.


Winch House going well

The 2022 AGM for Winchelsea Community House followed its usual agenda to review the past year, with reports by the House itself and also by the groups that are a part of it. In short, it's been difficult but good progress is being made.

In spite of a closing financial loss for the year, Winch House is recovering well from the disruptions that have so heavily affected everyone in the community. Expansion into the Shire Hall has taken up a lot of time and effort, and there is much more to come for that space. Occasional Child Care is seeing much change in terms of legislation, funding and demand yet remains a popular service - it too takes up lots of time and effort to manage. Ongoing activities such as the Craft Group are back. Courses and new activities are being planned.

The various groups operating under the wing of Winch House have done some great work - Men's Shed, Wensleydale Community Group, WYLD, Wildlife Shelter and Wurdale Recovery Network



continue to get things done. Each one of these groups is volunteer-powered and makes our place a better one to live. Their reports will be published here in the coming weeks.

Our thanks to Councillor Adrian
Schonfelder for officiating the Committee
elections. All positions were declared
vacant and promptly re-elected as
before, so no change there! We do
welcome a new Committee member,
Cromwell Hooper. Over the coming year,
the Committee will be continuing to

develop a more detailed Strategic Plan with some specific, measurable, achievable, relevant and time-bound (aka SMART) goals.

A big thankyou to all that enable Winch House - visitors & participants (hopefully that's you), Surf Coast Shire, state & federal agencies, donors and grant funders (special mention to the Foundation for Rural & Regional Renewal and their donors The William Buckland Foundation and Equity Trustees, for a \$9,000 grant towards renovating the Shire Hall kitchen - coffee machine will be online soon!). And of course, my personal thanks to the staff, the volunteers and the Committee members for pulling it all together and making it happen.

Our vision for Winch House is "To be Winchelsea's community centre for inspiration, growth and enjoyment". To achieve that, we'll need your help - your ideas, suggestions and advice on what to put on and make available (and how to resource it), your expertise as a tutor, your guidance as a Committee member, and most of all your participation in activities and events. There are many irons in the fire at the moment so watch this space and we look forward to seeing you soon.

It is with much sadness that we mourn the loss of John Bumford. John passed away peacefully on the afternoon of Sunday 9th October aged 75 years and in the care of his family and Hesse Rural Health in Winchelsea.

John took on the function of Coordinator at the Winchelsea Uniting Church in 2012, a position he held until his retirement due to ill health in 2021. During those nine years John's role rapidly evolved into that of ministry worker within the congregation.

On most Sundays, John would play piano and organ for worship as well as deliver the sermon. Mid-week he led bible studies, regular nursing home services at Hesse Rural Health, undertook pastoral visitation, and organised semi-regular Saturday morning men's breakfasts.

John's prodigious musical talents led him to organise the Sunday worship singing group and the presentation of musicals and cantatas (many written by himself) for Easter and Christmas, often staged in the Globe Theatre in Winchelsea. He organised monthly Morning Melodies in the Winchelsea Tearooms (old Shire Hall) bringing accomplished performers to Winchelsea and accompanying them on the grand piano.

John also found time to be involved in The Men's Shed, Growing Winchelsea, Winchelsea Combined Churches, and watching Winchelsea when they played at home during the football season.

Family and friends gathered at The Hub last Friday afternoon to celebrate John's life at a memorial service and over light refreshments.

John's presence within the Winchelsea Uniting Church congregation and the wider community will be greatly missed. Sincere thoughts, prayers and condolences to Olive, Tim, and extended family.





Save hooded plover chicks

Beachgoers are reminded to look out for hooded plovers nesting along the south west's shorelines with the threatened species at risk of being scared off and their nests trampled on by beach users and wayward dogs.

Hooded plovers lay their eggs in shallow sand scrapes from August through to March and where possible nesting sites are fenced off to alert the public and protect the tiny birds and their nests.

If an incubating adult bird is scared away from its nest by passers-by or dogs, its eggs can bake in the sun or become too cold in the cool weather, which can kill the developing chick.

Last breeding season BirdLife recorded 1,003 hooded plover eggs along Victoria's coastline. 185 hatched and 66 chicks survived to become juveniles.



COVID Update

There were 8,061 COVID-19 cases reported in Victoria this week

In the past three months, 5,564 COVID-19 patients were hospitalised in Victoria. 44.1 per cent of these patients had not received their third vaccine dose. 1,653 (29.7 per cent) were unvaccinated, 57 had received one dose, 743 had two doses, 1,612 had received three doses and 1,499 had received four doses.

A total of 46 COVID-19 related deaths were reported to the Department in the past week.

The total number of COVID-related deaths in Victoria since the pandemic began is 5,756. The number of COVID-related deaths recorded in Victoria so far this year is 4,146.

Testing and treatment with COVID-19 medicines have been an important intervention that has likely contributed to our reduced number of hospitalisations and deaths. COVID-19 medicines are available if you test positive and people are encouraged to speak to their doctor about these treatments.
