OUR TIMELINE

2000

WE BEGAN

- The Center for Marine Education and Recreation at Oyster Bay (later DBA: The WaterFront Center) was incorporated and education programs began.

2001

GROWTH

- Launched the first capital campaign and bought the Oyster Bay Sailing School, Optimists, Sunfish, and coach boats.

2002

LANDMARK

- The National Historic Landmark CHRISTEEN was acquired, and Junior Summer Programs were launched, combining sailing and marine science.

2004

EXPANSION

- The fleet expansion campaign was a success, and eight used Sonars were purchased. Kayak rentals began.

2009

SAILING

- Launched an open-to-the-public after-school High School Sailing program.
- The WaterFront Center serves over 10,000 program participants.

2012

PARTNERSHIP

- Began providing free afternoon programming and summer activities for children part of the Youth and Family Counseling summer program.

2013

EDUCATION

- Partnered with St. Dominic's Elementary School to provide in and out of the classroom STEM education throughout the school year.

2015

GIVING BACK - VETERANS

- Veterans on Water (VOW), a free program for veterans, launched sailing aboard Sonars.
- The WaterFront Center serves over 15,000 program participants.

2016

GIVING BACK - ACCESSIBLE SAILING

- ZigZag, a free adaptive sailing program for people with cognitive and physical disabilities, launched.

2019

HONORED

- Senator James F. Gaughran Honored WFC for service to the community in promoting water sports and safe boating.

2020

WE'RE OPEN

- WFC acquires new launch boat ROUGH RIDER
- The Covid-19 Pandemic hit, and WFC successfully pivoted programming online and on the water to provide a space for the community to learn and play when most all activities were closed.

2021

CHRISTEEN

- A new mast is completed and fitted on CHRISTEEN.
- TOB Supervisor Joseph S. Saladino recognizes CHRISTEEN's National Historic Landmark registration with a sign in the park & celebration

2022

GROWTH

- WFC continues to serve over 20,00 people from the tri-state area and beyond through marine science and sailing education and recreation.

2023

THE FUTURE

- WFC looks forward to sailing the Oyster dredge IDA MAY, the replica of the boat that used to dredge for shellfish in the 1920s around Oyster Bay Harbor.

As we enter our 24th year of service to the community, it is with gratitude that we reflect on the dedication and passion of those who came before us, elected officials and private citizens alike, who had the passion and commitment to drive forward a public-private partnership. The WaterFront Center was founded with the focused mission to connect people to the water through education and recreation. It is a simple yet powerful mission that drives everything we do daily. In executing this mission, we are proud that we serve more than 20,000 people annually.

The WaterFront Center is thriving in many ways. With each new season, we continue to reach new people, many of whom never had the chance to paddle through the water on a kayak, explore the marshes along the edge of West Harbor, or experience the wonder of a sailboat moving peacefully through the water. Our marine education activities are enjoyed by young and old alike. They may include seining the tideline at Beekman Beach or experiencing the touch tank during a Marine Exploration sail aboard our 1883 Oyster Sloop, CHRISTEEN, a National Historic Vessel. We continue to offer needs-based programming to our community, often working closely with other organizations that do the same. We continue to provide free sailing to the disabled community through our Zig Zag program and honor our nation's veterans in the same way with our Veterans on the Water program.

New in 2023, we are proud to introduce the latest vessel in our fleet, the IDA MAY. Commissioned and constructed by the CHRISTEEN Oyster Sloop Preservation Corp., the same organization which restored CHRISTEEN from her original plans and made possible by the generosity of private donors and state grant funds, the all-wood Ida May was donated to the WFC following her launch on May 4. Built as a replica of the original IDA MAY, which was constructed in 1925 as one of the first powered oyster dredges operating in Oyster Bay, she served the Flowers Oyster Company for 75 years before her original hull was donated to the WFC. Joining CHRISTEEN, the possibilities for IDA MAY are endless as she has greater passenger capacity and range, allowing The WaterFront Center to share its marine education programming beyond the shores of Oyster Bay Harbor. We are excited to press IDA MAY into service and have no doubt that she will serve us well as the newest ambassador of both The WaterFront Center and Oyster Bay.

As The WaterFront Center approaches its 25th year, we reflect on the people who have volunteered their time and effort, believing in the mission and making a difference. On behalf of our board and staff, we thank our volunteers, past and present. We look forward to continuing the work together, dedicated to making a difference in our Oyster Bay community and beyond.

MISSION

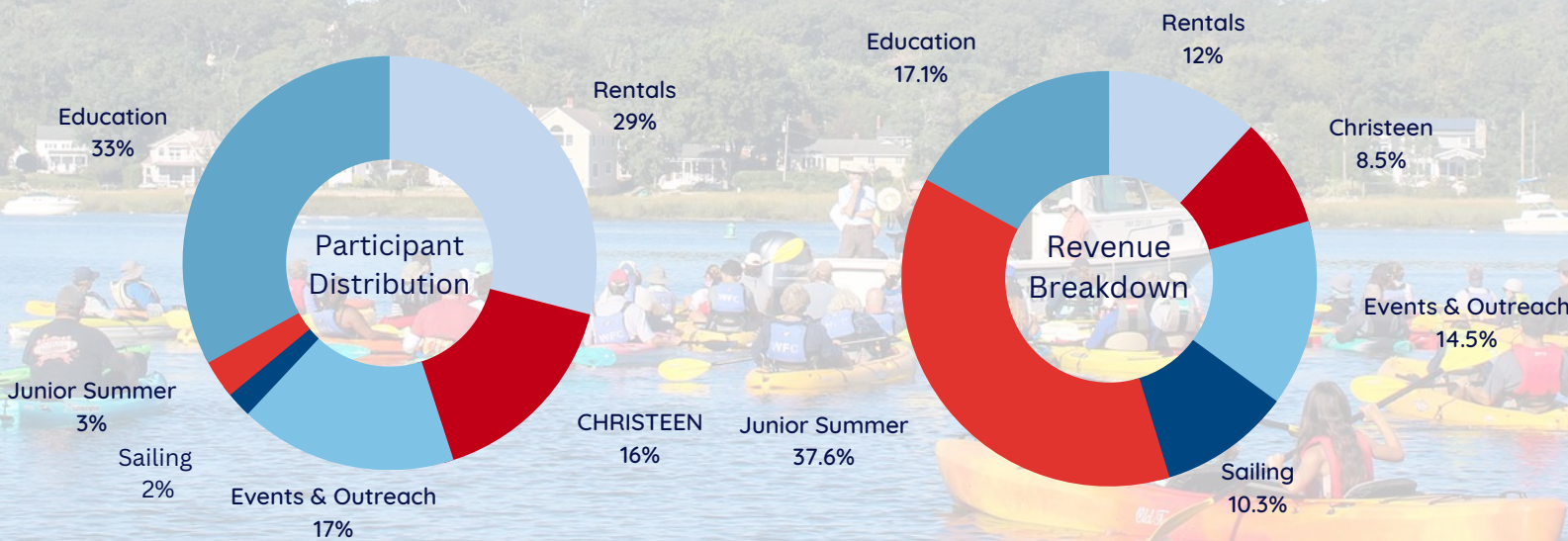
To connect people to the water through education and recreation.

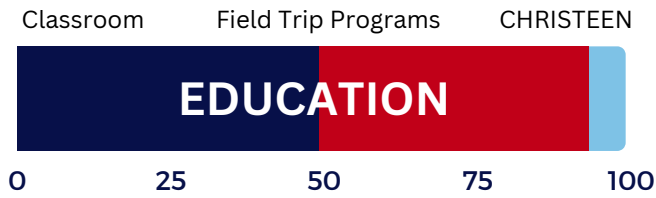

Our Core Programs



Through marine discovery, marine science, and coastal ecology programs, we introduce students to local marine wildlife and foster their appreciation for and understanding of the marine environment. Our programs utilize the vast outdoor classroom surrounding our facilities, as well as hands-on activities on the beach, in the wet lab, and aboard our flagship CHRISTEEN.



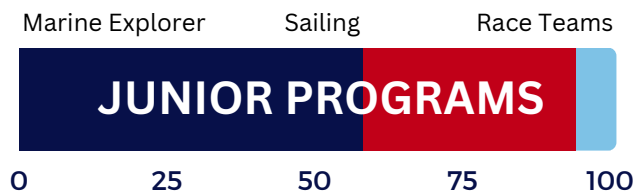
These hands-on programs focused on inquiry and discovery were created to meet and reinforce the New York State and the National Science Standards. Teachers can use these programs as a foundation, reinforcement, complement, or introduction to science. Through our STEM programs, students can make connections across disciplines, including mathematics, social studies, and language arts.



As a U.S. Sailing accredited facility, The WaterFront Center offers a variety of sailing lessons and programs for adults and children. From “first experiences” to certifications and instructor seminars, The WaterFront Center has everything you need to become a confident sailor.



The WaterFront Center helps to make sailing more inclusive with no-cost programs for veterans, at-risk youth, and individuals with disabilities.



Junior Programs prioritize fun and experiential learning. Between late June and late August, summer programs engage children through marine exploration that fosters stewardship for the environment and sailing programs for children of all levels. Qualified, knowledgeable, and enthusiastic naturalists implement all Marine Explorer programs. Activities include seining, dip-netting, snigging, kayaking, exploration of the Spartina marsh, etc. Almost all these activities occur on Beekman Beach, the Mill Creek tributary, and the marsh near West Shore Road.

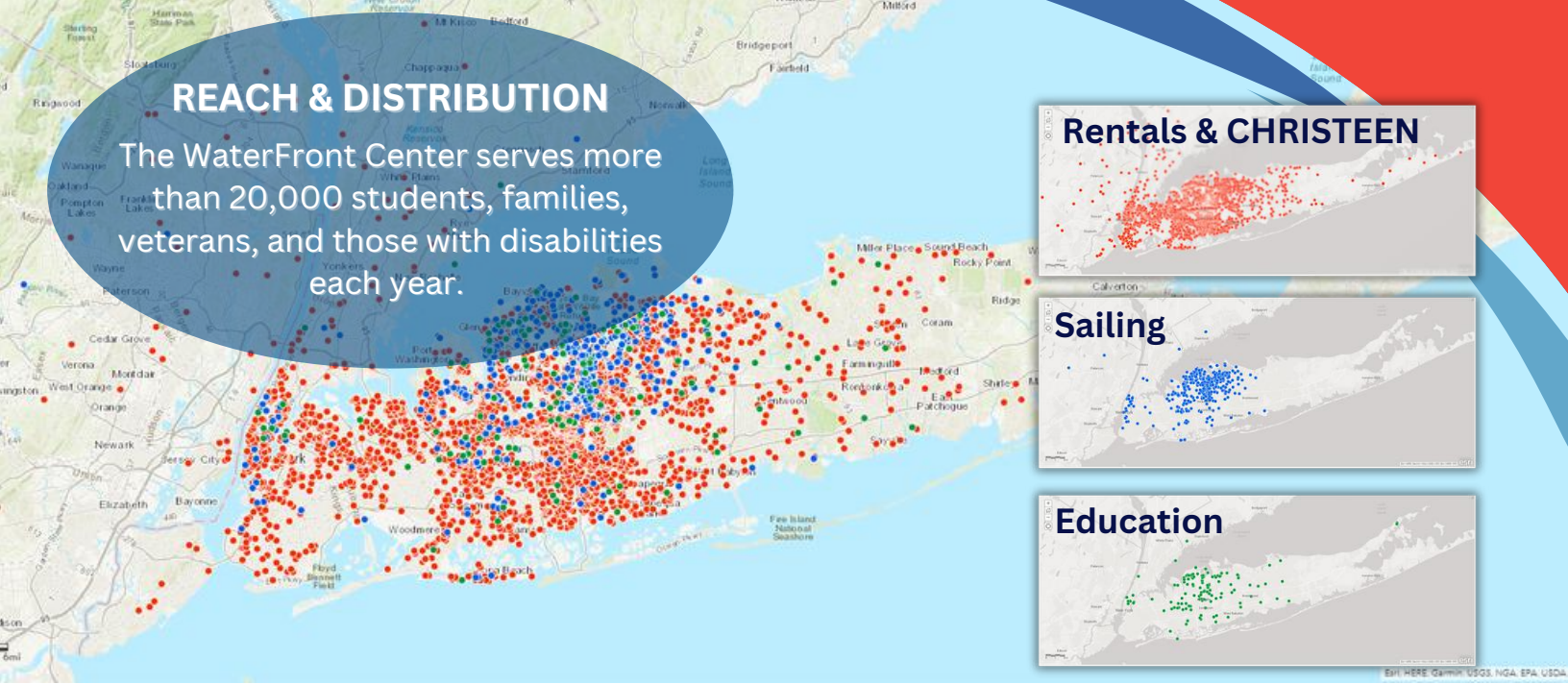


Sailing classes range from Beginner level to Race Team ready, as well as Adventure sailing for those who would rather leisurely sail and explore the bay. Our junior sailing fleet includes prams, optimists, C420s, Sonars, and J105.

Spring & Fall Sailing Programs meet or exceed the high standards for junior sailing instruction set by US Sailing. Students in High School can join our team and compete in local regattas. Opti sailors have the opportunity to experience all levels of sailing.

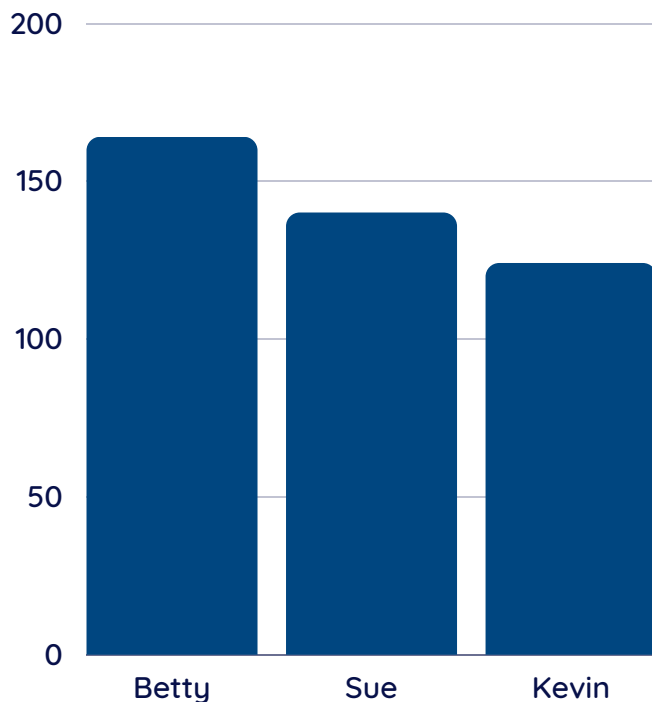

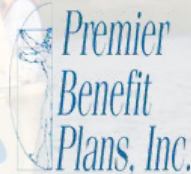

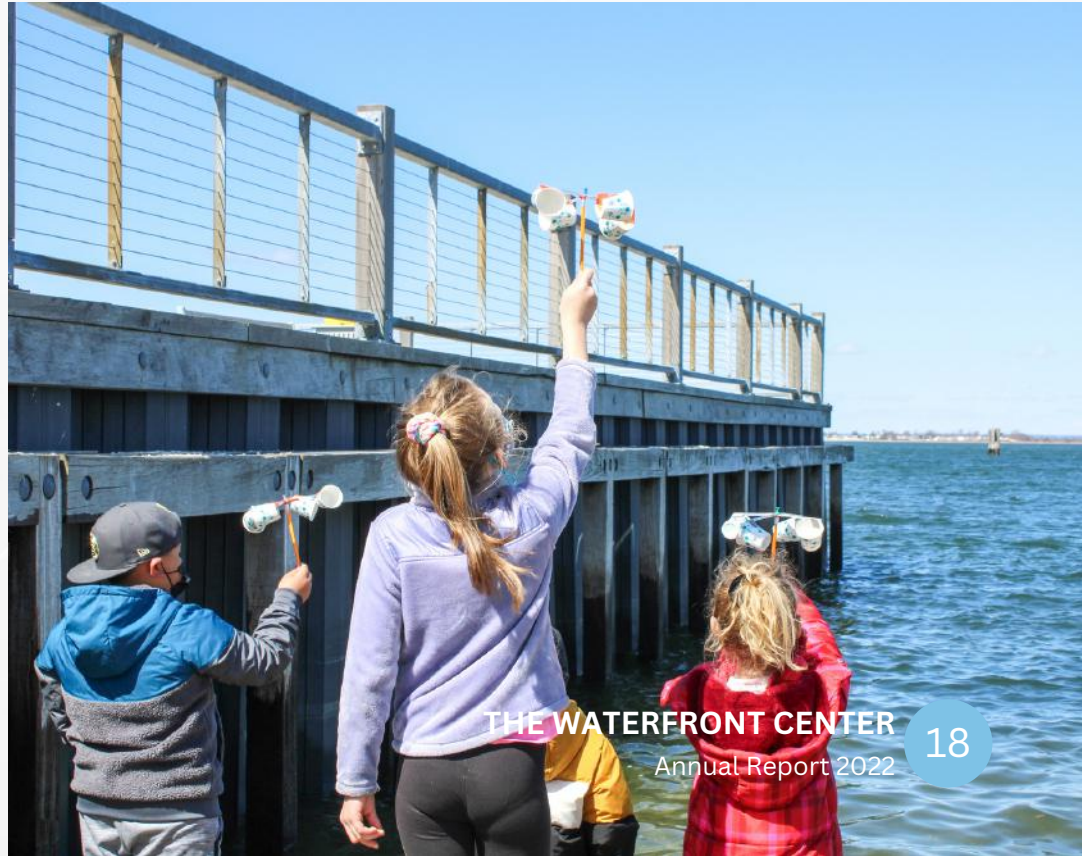
