I was recently watching a news story entitled, "It is the way the game is supposed to be played so, why is it such a big deal?" The story took place in June of 2016 at the Indiana State Baseball Championships, during which a player from the winning team went onto the mound to console the losing pitcher, who was laying on the ground visibly upset, rather than embarking in a celebration with his teammates.

At the end of the story, the newscaster made a point to say, "The actions of the player reflected on the coaches and the parents of the kid. Somebody is doing something very right." Adults in the player's life, leading by example.

When the newscast finished, I pondered about why the story made the news. I was happy that the actions of the boys made national headlines, but saddened that acts

of sportsmanship are not the norm. The realization that stories like this are highlighted because they are seen as something special and extraordinary was disheartening to me.

Throughout this year, the NMAA and our member schools are focusing on the importance of sportsmanship by coaches, players and spectators. When you attend a game as a spectator, remember that you too are setting an example for the kids on the court or field and for the individuals around you. Remember that it takes just one person to make a difference and the way you act can set an example for your community.

Be mindful of the example you set in whichever role you play in interscholastic athletics – as a coach, a parent, a player or a spectator. Be POSITIVE and support your team, without being negative towards opponents or contest officials. We need to all be a part of changing the culture of interscholastic athletics so that doing what is right is no longer newsworthy. Competing with Class should be the rule, not the exception.

Let us all band together and lead by example. Show the youth of today that sportsmanship matters. Show our student-athletes the proper way to win and lose. Show our "leaders of tomorrow" that their character far outweighs their performance. In New Mexico, our news story should always read, "It is the way the game is supposed to be played so, why is it such a big deal?" In New Mexico, let good sportsmanship and positive behavior always be the norm.





Legend of the Diamond Mitch Garver

"I FEEL LIKE MY WHOLE LIFE I HAVE SOMETHING TO PROVE."


The New Mexico Activities Association is pleased to recognize Mitch Garver as this year's Legend of the Diamond. The former La Cueva High School standout was a two-sport star who earned his way to the majors and is currently a catcher with the Minnesota Twins.

Garver grew up in Albuquerque and remembers playing baseball at an early age. "I remember my grandfather giving me my first catcher's mask," Garver recalled. "He was a catcher, so I guess I was sort of destined to become one. I liked the catcher's gear. I didn't mind carrying it around and stuff." Little did he know that would be the first step to becoming a major leaguer.

In high school, Garver lettered in both soccer and baseball. He won state championships in both sports in 2008. Garver was named first team all-state, first team all-district and first team all-metro from 2008-2009. He earned honorable mention All-American honors in 2009 and was named the La Cueva High School and Albuquerque Public Schools Male Athlete of the Year in 2009.

Garver went on to play baseball at the University of New Mexico and become one of the most successful Lobos in the program's history. In his final two years at UNM, Garver was named the Mountain West Co-Player of the Year and one of three finalists for the Johnny Bench Award, given to the best collegiate catcher in the





country. Garver became UNM's Iron Man by starting 181 straight games during his career. His senior season, he led the team in hits (96) and had a 26-game hitting streak (6th longest in school history). Garver finished his stretch at UNM tied for fifth in career doubles (66) and earned Academic All-Mountain West honors all four years, becoming one of only three players in the program history to accomplish that.

In 2013, the Minnesota Twins drafted Garver in the 9th round of the Major League Baseball draft. He made his major league debut on August 19th, 2017. Garver never considered himself a four-star recruit or top prospect, but was determined to work his way to the highest level of professional baseball. "Not many people expected me to make it," said Garver. "I use that as motivation."

Here is more of our conversation with Mitch Garver.

You were a two-sport start in high school. You don't hear of too many dual-sport athletes who play soccer and baseball. What did you like about soccer? My brother played soccer so I got into it. It was a great way to stay in shape. I loved playing defense. We were stacked the year we won state, that was a really good team. We beat Mayfield in the final 7-1 that year.

How did you decide on playing baseball at UNM? I liked UNM. Ray Birmingham and I have a great relationship. UNM was really my only option. I wasn't a top prospect in high school. I was a walk-on at UNM and given an opportunity to prove myself. I didn't receive a scholarship until my senior year.

What do you remember about the day you were drafted?

The first day was like two rounds. Then, on the second day, my family and I were sitting by the computer, it got to about round 8, and I got a call from the Minnesota Twins saying they were going to draft me. Sure enough, they picked me in the 9th round. My parents threw a little party for friends and family and before you knew it, I was off to Rookie Ball.

What was it like when you were first called up to the majors?

I was in Triple A (with the Rochester Red Wings) and got a call from my agent saying, 'I wish I was there to shake your hand because you're going to be a major leaguer.' They had me on a plane to Minneapolis and I suited up against the Diamondbacks in my first game. They put me in as a pinch hitter and I struck out swinging in the seventh.

When did you hit your first major league home run? It was early in the year last season in 2018. We were playing Seattle. It was the bottom of the seventh and the game was tied 2-2. I hit my first home run and what made it even better is we ended up winning the game, 4-2.

Did you have a 'welcome to the majors' moment or were you ever star-struck?


There was one time I was behind the dish in Toronto and Josh Donaldson came up to the plate. This was not too long after he won the MVP award and I thought to myself, 'That's Josh Donaldson and I'm catching in front of 50 thousand people at an afternoon game in Toronto. This is pretty cool!'

What is your goal now as a professional baseball player?

I want to become an All-Star at some point and be known as one of the top catchers in the game. I'd love to play this game for as long as a can.

Here's what University of New Mexico Baseball Coach Ray Birmingham had to say about Mitch Garver:

"He's a blue-collar kind of kid. He never was selfish, he was always a team player, just always working. He's a byproduct of two great parents. Mitch wanted be a chiropractor and didn't see himself playing professional baseball, but I thought he could."



Was there a game or moment that stands out when you think of Mitch?

"Mitch didn't play much his freshman year and didn't complain. He just went to work. His sophomore year, catcher Raphael Neda had left and Mitch was learning on the fly to play at a very high level. The group that year beat TCU in the conference championship and Mitch was a big part of it. He caught for Austin House, another local kid. It was cool to watch two kids call their own signals and work their way through it. It sparked Mitch. I think he realized he can compete with some of the best players in the country. That game with TCU was when he came of age."

"He's really grounded, that's why he made it. He bypassed so many athletes and he did it because he would go to work every day and shoot for the next step. Mitch is the poster child for New Mexico kids who can make it. They are given the opportunity to mix it up with the elite in the country and Mitch realized he could."

2018 State Championship Recap

MORA WINS A/2A STATE BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP




The 2018 edition of the Mora Rangers won the school's first state baseball championship. Mora (19-4) beat Mesilla Valley in a mercy-rule title game, 12-2.

Mora came into the tournament as a 2-seed and met up with the top ranked SonBlazers at Isotopes Park. After a scoreless first inning, the Rangers jumped out to an early lead after plating four in the second inning. Kenneth Martinez and Javier Branch each knocked in a run with back-to-back singles, giving the Rangers their 4-0 lead. Mesilla Valley (16-4) would cut the lead in half after scoring two runs in the bottom of the second on three consecutive hits.

Mora distanced themselves from Mesilla Valley in the next frame as they put together an eight-run third inning. The Rangers sent 14 batters to the plate in the third. Gene Hern started the rally with an RBI to left to make it 5-2 and the rout was on. Pitching problems didn't help Mesilla Valley's cause. SonBlazer pitchers hit three batters, recorded five walks and threw a pair of wild pitches.

Branch, one of just two seniors on the roster, went 2-3 at the plate with three RBIs and two runs scored. Alonzo Aragon, the only other senior, was 2-4 with a pair of doubles and four RBIs. Devondre Cordova finished the game 1-2 with two runs and two RBIs.

TEXICO EARNS THIRD STRAIGHT BLUE TROPHY IN BASEBALL



Texico, Texico, Texico. That's what it looks like on the list of New Mexico State Baseball Champions for Class 3A in 2016, 2017 and 2018.

The Texico Wolverines (27-2) beat Estancia 5-0 in the champonship game of the 3A bracket. Most of their scoring came in the first inning. The Wolverines touched up Estancia (25-3) starter Zach Abeita. Texico junior Dalton Thatcher got on base with a double. Then, his teammate Cole Rohrbach knocked in Thatcher with a triple of his own. Rohrbach would later score on a throwing error by the Bears. In that same inning, senior Nathan Phipps added another run with a deep solo homer giving Texico a 3-0 lead. The Wolverines would add another run in both the fifth and sixth innings to close out the scoring.

Thatcher was on the mound the entire game, only giving up five hits over seven innings and striking out six batters.

"Dalton pitched a heck of a game, hats off to that man," said Phipps. "He competed the whole time and we just stayed resilient through the whole game."

The victory was a redemption of sorts for the Wolverines, who came up short as a number one seed at the state basketball tournament just months earlier.

"We didn't come up with a state championship in basketball, but it's a whole different game," explained Thatcher. "You hit the ball, you field the ball, you pitch the ball and that's how you win."

"This group's been building and growing for 3-4 years now," said Coach Ty Thatcher following the win. "They played a lot of baseball and learned from the other sports as well and it's fun to see them come through and play the game the right way."



2018 State Championship Recap

HOPE CHRISTIAN CLAIMS 4A BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP



The Hope Huskies (25-6) took home the blue trophy with a 3-0 win over Bernalillo (21-10) in the 2018 Furr's Buffet 4A State Baseball Championship at Isotopes Park. It was Hope's second consecutive trip to the title game after falling to Portales in the championship the previous season.

The Spartans threatened early, loading the bases in the first. But Hope pitcher Tristan Copeland got out of the jam and struck out the next three batters in the second.


Hope got on the board in the second inning. The Huskies loaded the bases and Noah Chavez scored the first run on a balk by Bernalillo pitcher Isaiah Chavez. Braden Rue would cross home on a wild pitch to make it 2-nothing Huskies. Hope's only hit in the second inning was off the bat of Coy Karler. His bloop single scored Nikko Ruiz to give Hope a 3-0 lead and that is all they would need.


Spellbring finished 3-3 at the plate with an RBI, Pardo also went 3-3 on the game, including a double and a pair of runs.
