When the opportunity to create an art and wine pairing came to me, I jumped at the occasion. A sommelier is more familiar to depict the quality of a good wine around a table in the restaurant than in an art gallery. However, Art and wine making are linked somehow. The juice bottled at the end of season is a product of full reflection between reason and feelings, sometimes easily readable, sometimes abstract.

For this exhibition where pop art is showcased, I choose two wines to enjoy while you are delighting your eyes of colourful pieces.

Gamay Sans Tralala, Domaine de la Gareliere - Loire, France

This is a natural fresh crunchy red juice. For me the perfect approach to the philosophy of 'rule breaking', typically French but no strike into the quality. This wine represents elegantly the terroir of the Loire (where I am from) without any pretention.

Figure Libre Freestyle, Domaine de Gayda - Pays d'Oc, France

As the pop art didn't follow any rules of classism. The Domaine de Gayda didn't follow any rules of winemaking. The result is a joyful gold wine with an enjoyable aromatic palate. The complexity of the blend used, offers us a true example of the powerful magic of the winemaker.

INTRODUCTION

Growing up as a teenager in the 1980's with analogue technology such as the tape cassette recorder and the Home Entertainment Centre seems like a world away from the age of the internet where people are never without WIFI or 4G and can access anything, anywhere in the world, at any time of day.

In the 80's listening to the UK Top 40 countdown on Sunday evenings was 'teen essential' and an excellent way to drag out the weekend for as long as possible. Part of the ritual was to record your favourite chart toppers onto a blank audio cassette which would then provide your soundtrack for the week ahead (whilst wearing your Sony Walkman in lessons).

Whilst the process of recording a mix onto an audio cassette from LPs or live radio was technically straightforward, teenage pop music fans were eventually compelled to confront some of the practical and aesthetic challenges involved in the mixtape format.

From a practical standpoint, such issues as avoiding an excessive amount of blank tape at the end of one side (which requires careful planning of the length of each side of the mix) and reducing the audible click between songs (which requires mastery of the pause button on the cassette recorder) have been identified as part of the shared experience of the mixtape generation.

From an aesthetic point of view, many enthusiasts believe that because a tape player, unlike a CD player, lacks the ability to skip from song to song, the mixtape needs to be considered in its entirety. This requires the mixtape creator to consider the transitions between songs, the effects caused by juxtaposing a soft song with a loud song, and the overall "narrative arc" of the entire tape.

One notable listing of such aesthetic "rules" can be found in an exquisite paragraph from Nick Hornby's High Fidelity but the point is this. A whole generation were self-trained in sampling, cutting, editing and curating. We didn't realise it, because we didn't have a name for it then, but as much as we were Thatcher's children we were also the first 'post-modern' generation.

Post Modernism in art, as in music, required the eclectic sampling of diverse cultural references from across the decades. The influences of Disco, Hip Hop and Breakdance had a profound and lasting impact on subsequent generations. Studio 54 in New York was the backdrop for a high octane cross pollination of art and music but equally fertile ground was found in Hip Hop music from the same period where artists from the Bronx and Harlem spread their message globally via mixtape parties featuring Kool Herc and Afrika Bambaataa.

This survey exhibition brings together some of the greatest artists from the 80's, 90's and new millennia in a mixtape of visual richness which is graphical in style and as clean cut as a breakbeat mix. Blending the Pop Art of Warhol and Haring with the Street Art of Banksy provides an analogue perspective on the digital age. I hope you enjoy the show as much as I have enjoyed creating it as it's allowed me to temporarily suspend by disbelief and be a bedroom teenager once again.

On closing I would also like to thank our exhibition sponsors Style Homes, all the participating artists and especially Charlotte Rose, The Cameron Twins and Benjamin Thomas Taylor who are exhibiting at Private & Pubic Gallery for the first time and who have kindly agreed to join us for the opening events and also to Charlie Haydn Taylor for his curatorial assistance.




