history of Berea

In 1850, this area of southern Madison County was called the Glade. There was no town, just a loose community of scattered farms known primarily for its racetrack and citizens who were sympathetic to emancipation.

EARLY BEREA - THE GLADE

Since the early 1840's, Cassius Clay, a large landowner in Madison County, had sought to build a community in the Glade which would be a base for his own high political ambitions and the abolitionist cause. Located between the solid slavocracy of the Bluegrass and the mountains, he hoped the Glade would provide a gateway into a political base in the mountains. He sold land to prominent nonslaveholders at nominal cost and encourage abolitionist missionaries to come to the area.

In 1853, Clay offered his friend Reverend John G. Fee, of Lewis County, Kentucky, a free tract of land to move to the Glade. With some reluctance, Fee decided to move, and in 1854 accepted ten acres upon the ridge. With the help of local supporters and other missionaries from the American Missionary Association, Fee established a church, a school and a tiny village. Asked by Clay to name the new settlement, Fee called it Berea after the Biblical town where the people "received the Word with all readiness of mind." This tiny village became the center of an abolitionist missions field as Fee directed a band of teachers and preachers in Madison, Jackson and Rockcastle Counties. Although never a significant political threat, the Berea Community was enough of an irritant that prominent Madison County slave owners drove Fee and 94 other supporters from the state in late 1859 and 1860.



history of Richmond

The City of Richmond was founded in 1798 by Colonel John Miller, a Revolutionary War soldier. According to tradition, Miller was attracted to the area by the good spring water and friendly Native Americans.

That year, the Kentucky legislature approved moving the Madison County seat from Milford to land owned by Colonel Miller.

The move was bitterly opposed by about 300 residents of Milford, which led to a fistfight between Dave Kennedy, representing Milford, and William Kearly representing Richmond. Although history does not record the results of the brawl, the county approved the move in March 1798, and two acres of land were purchased from Colonel Miller. The court was held in his barn.

On July 4, 1798, the site was officially named Richmond in honor of Miller's birthplace, Richmond, Virginia.

On August 30, 1862, during the Civil War, the Union and Confederate Armies clashed in the Battle of Richmond. Troops under Confederate General Edmund Kirby Smith routed the soldiers of Union General William Nelson. Out of Nelson's 6,500 men, only 1,200 escaped; the rest were all captured.[4] One historian called this battle "the nearest thing to a Cannae ever scored by any general, North or South, in the course of the whole war."

In 1906, Eastern Kentucky State Normal School was founded in Richmond to train teachers. There were eleven members of the first graduating class in 1909. It became a four-year college in 1922 and added graduate programs in 1935. In 1965, the institution was renamed Eastern Kentucky University.

In the late 1990s and through the first decade of the 21st century, Richmond had a commercial and residential boom. Richmond is currently Kentucky's seventh-largest city, moving up four places from Kentucky's eleventh-largest city in the 2000 census.




Walking Trails

- Camp Catalpa Park: Located at 2200 Catalpa Loop
 Drive, this is a 2 miles unpaved loop. The walking trail
 has a ½ mile loop, 0.7-mile loop, and a 0.8-mile loop that
 equals 2.0 miles. This walking trail is crushed limestone
 and travels up and downhills. Partially shaded. Moderate
 difficulty level.
- Duncannon Walking Trail: Located on Enterprise Drive, this 0.6-mile walking path is paved and 10 feet wide. This path is 0.3 miles with a turn around which leads back to the parking lot and is completely flat. Partially shaded. Easy difficulty level.
- Lake Reba: Located at 299 Lake Reba Drive, this path is a 1.5-mile walking trail. A 1-mile loop is paved and travels next to the lake and soccer fields, up and down a few hills. Please note that the back 0.5 miles of this path is under repair. Zero shade. Easy- Medium difficulty level.
- Million Park: Located at 240 Stratford Drive, this is a half-mile paved walking trail. This path is paved and travels up and downhills. Partially shaded. Moderatedifficult difficulty level.
- Million Park: Located at Tates Creek, this walking trail is located in a private park located off of Tates Creek Road It is paved and partially shaded. Easy difficulty level. (This park is not maintained by the City of Richmond)
- White Hall Park: Located off of exit 95, this walking trail is paved and nearly three miles long. Zero Shade.
 Medium-Moderate difficulty level. This park is maintained by the Madison County Parks Department.

FISHING IN MADISON COUNTY

- **Fort Boonesborough State Park:** Located off I-75 N of Richmond to KY 627 exit; North to a state park, the park is year-round boat access to Kentucky River. You may also launch a kayak or canoe. You can loan fishing poles at the campground grocery store.
- Lake Reba Fishing Pier and Cleaning Station: Located at 299 Lake Reba Drive, Lake Reba is a 75-acre fishing lake with fishing access on the Lake Reba Parks and Camp Catalpa Parkside. The boat dock parking lot is accessible 24/7 (April through November) Trolling Motors only. Park Closes at Dark (December through March).
- **Owsley Fork Reservoir:** The Reservoir is located off US 421 S of Richmond; left on KY 21 near Big Hill. It is a 150-acre lake with a very limited park; part of the lake in Jackson County. The ramp is only open during daylight areas.
- **Poosey Ridge Ramp:** Located off KY 52 SW of Richmond, right on Highway 1295 to Kirksville, right on KY 595 to River contains year-round boat access to Kentucky River (ramp fee).
- Valley View Carrydown: Located in Madison County off KY169 N of Richmond to Valley View Ferry on KY River, The Valley View Carrydown can be used as a canoe/kayak carry down. Please yield to ferry and vehicular traffic.
- White Hall Park: Located at the end of White Hall Shrine Road, just off I-75's Exit 95, White Hall Park features a 5.6-acre lake. Fishing during daylight hours only. No boating is allowed.
- **Wilgreen Lake:** Located on Wilgreen Lake Road, Wilgreen Lake is a 141.7-acre fishing lake. Boats must be idle-speed only. Year-round access to the lake and marina.
