



DAY 1

Eden Island, Mahe – Baie Beau Vallon - 16nm







PARADISE FOUND

Arrive on the beautiful island of Mahe and enjoy the scenery as you travel from the airport to your yacht in Eden Island Marina. Enjoy a refreshing cocktail as the yacht leaves the Marina to cruise round to the Baie Beau Vallon in the north-west of the island where you can take your first dip in the Indian Ocean before being served a delicious lunch on board.

Spend the afternoon relaxing or you could explore all the watersport options on board. Gaze out at the spectacular sunset over cocktails before sitting down to a wonderful welcome dinner.





Baie Beau Vallon - Port Glaud - 9nm

FORESTS OF MIST

A short cruise will bring you to your anchorage at Port Glaud. Set within the Morne Seychelles National Park and next to the Port Launay Marine Park, you will have mountains to climb, trails to hike and underwater marvels to explore – in short, an ideal spot to spend the day.



Port Glaud - Silhouette Island - 22nm


NATURE AND NURTURE

Enjoy breakfast as the yacht makes the two hour cruise to Silhouette Island. Even at just 20 square metres, it has a lot to offer, from stunning nature to the man-made luxury of the Hilton Labriz resort.

Take a local guide to make the gentle hike to Jardin Marron, or choose a more strenuous trail to Anse Mondon. Cool off in the crystal clear water before tucking into the picnic lunch the crew has prepared for you on the beach, before enjoying a rewarding massage in the Hilton Labriz Eforea Spa.











Silhouette Island - North Island - 7nm

SMALL BUT PERFECTLY FORMED

After breakfast your yacht will leave Silhouette and make the short cruise to North island where you will stay at anchor for the day and night. Nature has gifted the island with a natural beauty – a fertile paradise amongst the granite islands. Man has added a luxury hotel and spa. Settled in the early 19th century by the Beaufond family who spent 150 very productive years growing fruit and spices, the island was bought by an ecotourism company in 1997 who re-established the natural biodiversity of the island. Explore the hiking trails with a knowledgeable guide.


Take mountain bikes to explore further or some rendezvous diving can be arranged. Choose between cocktails in the lounge or keep the nature theme going with sundowners and a BBQ dinner served under the stars on the beach.












North Island - Fregate Island - 46nm







FISH FOR YOUR SUPPER

The yacht will make an early start for the cruise to Fregate Island – the longest leg of this trip. Fregate Island is considered the jewell in the conservation crown in the Seychelles; there are several hundred relocated Aldabra giant tortoises roaming freeand bird and bat colonies abound as it is a haven for endangered species. Choose between one of seven glorious beaches or take a guide with you to explore the 11kms of trails, either on foot or in golf buggies.

Go diving with the experienced dive team or head to the Rock Spa at the resort for a yoga session or some pampering. As evening falls, enjoy a wonderfully fresh dinner before settling back with the resident astronomers for some stargazing.





Fregate Island - La Digue - 20nm

BICYCLE RIDE

Enjoy an early morning dip before the yacht departs for the island of La Digue. Bicycles are the most accepted form of transport here and the crew will organise bikes for all of your party on arrival. La Digue is the third most inhabited island of the Seychelles and fourth largest in terms of land size after Mahe, Praslin and Silhouette.

The beaches are all stunning – so much so, you will be hard pressed to decide on a favourite. En route to Anse Source d'Argent in the south, you will pass through the old coconut plantation and copra factory in the Union Estate.

Lunch will be a relaxed picnic on one of the beautiful beaches, with cocktails and a luxurious feast served up back on board your yacht for dinner.










La Digue – Praslin - 7nm







COCO DE MER

Today your yacht will anchor between Praslin and Curieuse Island gives you easy access to both islands. Curieuse is popular for the giant Aldabra tortoises which roam freely as well as having a nursery for the baby tortoises. Praslin Island's main claim to fame is the Vallée de Mai, a primeval rainforest and home to the endemic palm trees which produce the highly protected Coco de Mer, the largest seed in the plant kingdom.

Take a guide on one of the hiking trails to fully understand the ecological importance of this site. After the hike, reward yourselves with a visit to Black Pearl museum and shop. When you are ready, the yacht's tender can pick you up and take you to Anse Georgette, a stunning beach in the north of the island with limited access to the hordes.

For your final evening on board the crew will organise a farewell party and celebration dinner.





Praslin - Eden Island Marina, Mahe - 30nm

PARADISE LOST

The yacht will make an early start for the cruise back to Mahé. Once back at Eden Island and depending on your flight times, spend some time visiting Victoria, the capital of Mahé, for some last minute souvenir shopping. Say a fond farewell to your Captain and yacht crew before boarding your onward flight.
