



Exceptional Bird Diversity Along the Nile

Along the Nile's banks, a world of dazzling birdlife awaits soaring migratory raptors, graceful herons, dazzling sunbirds and darting kingfishers painting the skies and waters with colour and motion.

Late April to early May is the golden moment, when the final waves of spring migration cross Egypt on their way back to Europe and Asia offering rare sightings and unforgettable opportunities for photography.

But the true magic begins on the stretch from Luxor to Cairon here, the Nile is serene, and you will scarcely encounter another boat unlike the Luxor-Aswan route, often crowded with over 300 vessels. This tranquillity opens up pristing scenes of nature, with birds approaching close along the riverbanks, villages and farms unfolding before you, and herds of cattle grazing at the water's edge.

An experience unlike any other... the kind of adventure birdwatchers dream of their entire lives.





The Harmony of Nature and Egypt's Timeless Heritage

Sailing from Aswan to Cairo for over 1,000 kilometres along the majestic Nile, travellers enjoy more than birdwatching they also immerse themselves in Egypt's most iconic archaeological sites, including Abu Simbel, Philae, Kom Ombo, and Luxor.

Yet the true delight lies in exploring rarely visited treasures beyond the crowded tourist routes, such as Dendera, Abydos, the tombs of Beni Hassan, Akhmim, and Tell el-Amarna. These remarkable sites are seldom seen by other travellers, as 98% of Nile cruise boats never sail this stretch. This offers a distinctive, non-traditional experience, where guests enjoy history, culture, and nature in serene surroundings far from the bustle.

Equally enriching is the chance to engage with local communities along the riverbanks, creating a unique harmony between the tranquillity of nature and the warmth of human connection.

For birdwatchers, this journey is truly exceptional – a rare opportunity to encounter unique species thriving along the Nile, set against the breathtaking backdrop of ancient temples and timeless monuments.





Overview

Embark on a **16-day journey** that begins in Cairo with a visit to the long-awaited **Grand Egyptian Museum**, followed by the timeless **Pyramids of Giza** and the mighty Sphinx. You then travel south to **Abu Simbel** for a three-night stay, where dawn and dusk bring flocks of migratory birds to the shimmering waters of **Lake Nasser**, alongside one of the most impressive temples ever built.

From here, your Nile voyage begins in Aswan, the very place where Agatha Christie wrote Death on the Nile. For eleven days you sail northwards through Egypt's timeless river landscapes, pausing at **Kom Ombo, Edfu,** and the magnificent temples of **Luxor**, while also enjoying tranquil stretches where **kingfishers** dart above the reeds and herons stand guard along the banks. Few other vessels pass this far, leaving you to savour the peace of the river, history, and wildlife combined.

The journey continues with visits to Dendera and Abydos before reaching Tell el-Amarna, where the tombs of the philosopher-king Akhenaten tell the story of ancient Egypt's great religious revolution. From here, you sail further north to Cairo, completing the long course of the Nile with a rare perspective of Egypt's life and nature unfolding at every bend.

Your adventure concludes with three nights in the Fayoum Oasis, a paradise of lakes, desert landscapes, and some of Egypt's richest birding grounds, where thousands of migratory and resident species gather. Finally, you return to Cairo and transfer directly to Cairo International Airport for your homeward flight.

Itinerary

D1 - Monday: Arrival in Cairo

Upon arrival in **Cairo** you will be transferred to your hotel for a comfortable overnight stay, preparing for the adventure ahead.

D2- Teusday: Pyramids & Grand Egyptian Museum

After breakfast, begin your adventure with a visit to the **Grand Egyptian Museum**, a landmark project more than ten years in the making. This world-class museum houses the largest collection of Pharaonic treasures ever assembled, including the magnificent artefacts of Tutankhamun.

Later, head to the Giza Plateau and enjoy lunch with spectacular views of the iconic Pyramids of Giza. Afterwards, explore the **pyramids** themselves and stand before the enigmatic Sphinx, one of Egypt's most enduring symbols.

In the evening, transfer to the railway station and board the **sleeper train** to Aswan, where dinner and overnight accommodation will be provided on board. **B-L-D**

D3- Wednsday: Aswan-Abu Simbel After breakfast, Upon arrival in Aswan,

continue by air to Abu Simbel. On arrival at Abu Simbel, visit the temples and spend the day with your guide birdwatching around Lake Nasser.

D4-Thursday : Birdwatching in Abu Simbel

At the end of April, Abu Simbel offers a rare birding haven. Spend the day along Lake Nasser, spotting herons, kingfishers, and migrating raptors with your expert guide. Away from the crowds, enjoy peaceful observation in breathtaking desert landscapes. Conclude the day with a visit to the legendary Temples of Abu Simbel, where nature and history meet.



D4- Friday: Aswan - Sightseeing

Morning Transfer to Aswan: After breakfast, travel from Abu Simbel to Aswan. Visit Philae Island, exploring the Temple of Isis and enjoying birdwatching among the lush riverbanks. Continue to a nearby Nubian village, where you can spot more bird species and experience the charm of local life along the Nile.

D5-Saturday: Birdwatching & Kom ombo-Edfu

Morning Birdwatching, After an early breakfast, your guide will take you to Lord Kitchener's Island and Elephantine Island, lush green havens in the Nile. In early May, these islands attract colorful species such as bee-eaters, kingfishers, herons, sunbirds, and black kites. A peaceful morning surrounded by nature and birdlife in the heart of Aswan.

After lunch, the boat will sail towards Kom Ombo. Along the way, you may spot various birds before sunset. Upon arrival, visit the Temple of Kom Ombo, then continue sailing onward to Edfu.

D6- Sunday: Edfu-Esna-Luxor

Early in the morning, visit the Temple of Edfu, the best-preserved temple in all of Egypt and a magnificent example of Ptolemaic architecture. After your visit, return to the boat for breakfast while sailing towards Esna.

Here you will experience the fascinating process of crossing the Esna Lock, where the boat is carefully lowered from the higher water level of the Upper Nile to the lower level below.

Arriving in Luxor, step into history with an evening visit to the Luxor Temple. Bathed in golden light, the temple's towering statues and grand colonnades reveal a beauty and serenity that daytime crowds can never match. Exploring this ancient site under the stars is an unforgettable experience, offering a sense of timeless wonder along the Nile B-L-D



Early in the morning, enjoy breakfast before heading to the lush fields on the West Bank for birdwatching. Afterwards, visit the Valley of the Kings, the ancient royal necropolis where Egypt's pharaohs were laid to rest.

Continue to the Temple of Queen Hatshepsut, an architectural masterpiece built into the cliffs of Deir el-Bahari, and stop at the Colossi of Memnon, the towering statues that have watched over Thebes for millennia. Return to the boat for lunch.

In the afternoon, explore the magnificent Karnak Temple, one of the largest temple complexes in the world. Later, return to the boat for your overnight stay.

D8- Teusday: Luxor -Qena

After breakfast, the boat sails north towards Qena. As you journey along this tranquil stretch of the Nile, enjoy birdwatching from the deck – with chances to spot black kites gliding overhead, pied kingfishers hovering above the water, herons and egrets along the riverbanks, and flocks of bee-eaters adding flashes of colour to the sky.

On arrival in Qena, visit the beautifully preserved Temple of Dendera, dedicated to the goddess Hathor. This remarkable site is

famous for its vivid astronomical ceiling, massive columns, and sacred sanctuary In the evening, continue sailing to Naga Hammadi, where the boat will moor for the night.

D9- Wednesday: Abydos & Sailing to Suhag
Sail onward to El Balyana, where you'll visit the Temple of Abydos, one of Egypt's most important cult centers, dedicated to Osiris, god of the afterlife.

Return to the ship and continue the journey north toward Sohag. Evening on board with entertainment. Overnight in Sohag. B-L-D

D10 -Thursday: Monastery of Prince Tawdrous & Tel El Amarna

Cruise from Sohag toward Tel El Amarna, passing through the Asyut Lock. Along the way, a guided explanation as you view PrinceTawdrous Monastery from the ship, an important Coptic Christian landmark on the Nile.

Arrive at Tel El Amarna and overnight on board.

D11-Friday: In the Footsteps of Akhenaten

Today, explore the ancient city of Tel El Amarna, the short-lived capital of Pharaoh Akhenaten and Queen Nefertiti. Here you'll see the Northern Tombs, the Royal Tomb of Akhenaten, the Northern Palace, and the Small Temples of Aten, all reflecting Egypt's brief experiment with monotheism.

Continue to Ashmunein, once a centre dedicated to Thoth, and then on to Tuna El Gabal, famous for its catacombs, animal necropolis, and painted tombs that blend Egyptian and Greco-Roman traditions. Afterwards, relax on board as you sail to Minya for an overnight

D12 -Saturday: Beni Hassan Tombs & Sailing to Beni Suef

Journey to the cliffs of Beni Hassan, where rock-cut tombs reveal colourful scenes of daily life, wrestling, agriculture, and foreign delegations from over 4,000 years ago. Among the most impressive are the tombs of Baget III, Khety, Amenemhat, and Khnumhotep II. After your visit, sail towards Beni Suef, enjoying the changing Nile landscapes. Overnight in Beni Suef.

D13- Sunday: Arrival in Cairo & Old City Tour

Sail into Cairo and step ashore for a tour through the vibrant old city. Stroll along Al-Muizz Street and lose yourself in the colorful alleys of Khan El Khalili Bazaar, where spices, handicrafts, and souvenirs fill every corner. Return to your boat for overnight in Cairo.

D14 - 15- Monday & Tuesday: Fayum

After breakfast, head south of Cairo to the lush oasis of Fayoum, one of Egypt's most rewarding birding destinations. Known for its tranquil lakes, wetlands, and fertile farmlands, Fayoum provides a rich habitat that attracts both resident and migratory species

In early May, this region becomes particularly exciting as it coincides with the last wave of spring migration. Birdwatchers may encounter colorful bee-eaters, hoopoes, and rollers, alongside water birds such as herons, egrets, and ibises around Lake Qarun and Wadi El Rayan. Raptors, including black kites and marsh harriers, can also be spotted gliding across the skies.

A few days in Fayoum let you explore its rich birdlife, with the chance to catch species during their final northward migration. It's a rare blend of Egypt's natural beauty and the excitement of spotting birds in transit.

DAY 4 TUNIS VILLAGE FARMS (Agriculture Habitat)

Awaken at sunrise in Tunis Village in Fayoum, the enchanting oasis located en route to Wadi El Rayan. Perched on a hill overlooking a saltwater lake teeming with fish, the village offers breathtaking panoramic views of the desert. Once a humble community sustained by farming and fishing, it rose to fame in the 1980s when the Swiss potter Evelyne Porret built her country house and pottery workshop there, transforming Tunis into a renowned artistic and cultural hub.

As dawn breaks, and after a refreshing cup of coffee, embark on a two-hour birdwatching walk through the fields of Tunis Village, where seasonal crops create a vibrant mosaic of landscapes. During the walk, we will be on the lookout for a wide variety of songbirds, including: Eastern Bonelli's Warbler, Chiffchaff, Black-headed Wagtail (M.F. feldegg), Eurasian Wryneck, Zitting Cisticola, Clamorous Reed Warbler, Senegal Coucal, Common Bulbul, African Green Bee-eater, Sedge Warbler, Nile Valley Sunbird, and Red Avadavat.

After this delightful excursion, enjoy breakfast at the Tache Boutique Hotel, before continuing with another two-hour birdwatching walk around the nearby farms. As evening approaches, the day concludes with a magical birdwatching horse ride through Tunis Village and around Lake Qarun at sunset — an unforgettable

DAY 5: WADI RAYAN PROTECTED AREA (IBA) (Desert / Wetland Habitat)

today we will have a 2-hour walking birding session at the west of Wadi Rayan waterfall, focusing on the Fishfarms and desert parts of this area. We will enjoy a picnic breakfast. We will be on the lookout for desert birds such as the Greater Hoopoe-Lark, Cream Coloured Courser, Crested Lark, and Egyptian Nightjar, as well as waders and waterbirds

In the afternoon, you have your own free time to walk around the village, ride horses, or visit the Pottery School and small pottery shops around the village.

DAY 6: FAIYUM -CAIRO - ASWAN

After breakfast today, embark on a **desert adventure** by **4WD**, journeying to the mesmerizing **Whales Valley**. Explore this ancient site where whales (Hitan) once roamed millions of years ago, during a time when the ocean receded due to climate change. Immerse yourself in the history at the **Climate Change Museum**, then traverse through the majestic sand dunes to reach **Kosur Al Rab**, renowned for its Arabian Palaces rocks naturally sculpted over time.

Following this, include in a serene experience at the enchanting lakes, offering an opportunity for swimming and a delightful BBQ lunch. Later, continue your exploration to the picturesque **Wadi Al Rayan waterfalls**, where you can marvel at the natural beauty of cascading waters. As the day comes to a close, return to **Tunis village** to check out, before heading to **Cairo's** main station at Ramses Square. There, board your **sleeper train** bound for Aswan, marking the end of an unforgettable day in the Egyptian desert.

DAY 7: ASWAN EXPLORATION

Upon arrival in Aswan, visit the impressive **High Dam**, a modern engineering marvel that controls the Nile and provides vital irrigation and power. Continue to the Temple of **Philae**, dedicated to Isis, where elegant carvings and serene riverside surroundings bring ancient mythology vividly to life.


While exploring, you may spot migrating Egyptian Vultures and White Storks resting at Lake Philae, along with African Pied Wagtails or the elusive Greater Painted Snipe near the temple.

In the afternoon, immerse yourself in the vibrant traditions of Nubian culture with a visit to a **traditional home** on an island near the cataracts. Enjoy warm hospitality and take part in a birdwatching experience led by knowledgeable locals, who will share fascinating insights into the region's diverse birdlife.

DAY 8: ASWAN BIRWATCHING

Starting at sunrise, birding around the Aswan Nile islands can commence either from Aswan City or directly from the Mövenpick hotel. Following that, we will explore Nile Island, Aswan Botanical Garden Island (ABGI), and the Saloga & Gazal Protected Area. A coffee break awaits us at Mafia Island - Gabbana Coffee Tohamy. The Nubian area boasts a rich culture encompassing food, Gabbana coffee, landscape, and Egyptian heritage. Moreover, it harbors a hidden wildlife treasure amidst the Nile landscape, particularly for migrant and resident birds, waterbirds, soaring birds, Nile Monitor, and Red Fox. Return to Hotel and over night


