ABOUT THE CREATIVE TEAM

Laugh Sanchez (Man/Stranger/Townspeople) is a multifaceted artist, mainly in Theater and Spoken Word. He practices creating, teaching and developing ways to bridge the arts with communities. A graduate from CCSU, Ensemble member of HartBeat Ensemble, and an Educator at the Greater Hartford Academy of the Arts (HD), he only wants to learn and expand what he has to offer other creative communities.

Donnetta Lavinia Grays (Playwright) is the author of Kudzu Calling, Where We Stand (Lucille Lortel, Drama League, AUDELCO and Broadway Black award nominee), Last Night and the Night Before, Warriors Don't Cry, Laid to Rest, and The Review or How to Eat Your Opposition. She is the recipient of The Whiting Award for Drama, Helen Merrill Playwright Award, The National Theater Conference's Stavis Playwright Award, Lilly Award, Todd McNerney National Playwriting Award and the Doric Wilson Independent Playwright Award. Donnetta holds commissions with Steppenwolf Theatre Company, Denver Center for the Performing Arts, Alabama Shakespeare Festival, WP Theater, SC New Play Festival and True Love Productions. For television, she has staffed on Spectrum's Manhunt, FX's Y: The Last Man, served as Executive Story Editor on Joe vs. Carole for Peacock, and is currently co-producer on Seconds for AMC. Broadway acting credits include The Skin of Our Teeth, In The Next Room, or the vibrator play and Well. Vernice Miller (Director) (She/They) is a Jamaican-born, Afro-Caribbean theatre artist rooted in New York City, whose work across borders is guided by an unwavering faith in the arts as a common language of transformation and hope. Most recent; Blood Orange, Et Alia Theater Company, NYC; Mr. Joy, Chester Theatre Company, Chester, MA; Where We Stand, WAM Theatre, Lenox, MA; Other venues; Joe's Pub @ The Public Theatre, NYC; Folger Shakespeare Theatre, Washington, DC; HartBeat Ensemble, Hartford, CT; Market Theater Laboratory, Johannesburg, South Africa; Ukrainka Dramatic Theatre, L'viv, Ukraine: Glei Theatre, Liubliana, Slovenia: Warsztaty Teatralne, Opole, Poland; Edinburgh Fringe Festival, Scotland; Skolen Teater, Dans og Musik, Silkeborg, Denmark. Vernice is Producing Director for Keen Teens, the educational arm of the Obje and Drama Desk Award-winning Off-Broadway Keen Company. She is also Co-founder and Artistic Director of A Laboratory for Actor Training Experimental Theatre Company in New York City.

Margo Caddell (Production Designer) is a Connecticut-based lighting designer for theater and dance. Her work has appeared at numerous theaters, including ART (Cambridge, MA), Lyric Stage (Boston), Knoebel Dance Theater (Long Beach, CA), and the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. As an educator, Margo has been on the faculty at Tufts University, where she taught courses in lighting design and stage management, and at the University of Massachusetts Amherst, where she lectured in both the BA and MFA theater programs. She's also taught stage management at Connecticut College and conducted workshops at Boston College. Currently, she is the Program Coordinator for the Performing Arts at Trinity College.

Jeremy Winchester (Production Designer) is an educator, producer, and multi-modal artist in the performing arts. He is a Professor of Theatre at the Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts, where he also serves as the Director of MOSAIC, the college's public program for open arts and intersectional culture. Prior to joining the faculty at MCLA in 2016, he was the Executive Artistic Director of the nationally renowned Flint Youth Theatre. He is an affiliated artist with Cape Cod-based Pacific Performance Project/east, maintains an artistic practice with a focus on equity and social justice, and served for six years on the Board of Directors of Theatre for Young Audiences USA.
