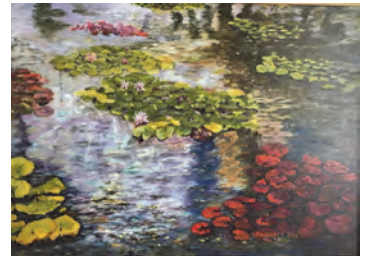

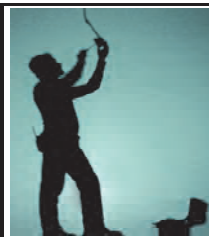
The Season is almost over and two of our teams are definitely in the Finals. Our Senior 3 team is going well in second position and our Inter 3 Junior team are top!!

Many of us have been there or have seen television programs about Windsor Castle, but Tom Duncan will stir our memories and bring the history to life in his lecture about the oldest continually inhabited Royal residence. Tom will give insight into the tragic fire of 1992, the impact it had on Queen Elizabeth and the restoration which followed. It will allow him to review much of Windsor's past from William the Conqueror, through the changes under George IV and the extraordinary collections then amassed by the King to the present day. Making Marmalade For Fun

Mike Steele is a modest marmalade maker. Although he describes himself as 'just' a marmalade maker, he has won local and international recognition for his marmalade, including a silver award in the UK competition. His enthusiasm is contagious as he shares his tips in a way that will make you want to have a go yourself.

He remembers eating great home-made marmalade as a child. After going along to a session at Beaumont House in Adelaide, a few years ago, to hear about the Australian Marmalade Awards, he was hooked. He came away with his own parcel of citrus to start his aromatic journey.

He says, good marmalade should be bitter-sweet. It needs good quality, not over-ripe fruit and the correct balance of ingredients. A lot of people fall

into the trap of trying to use less sugar with disappointing results. Getting the ratio right and a consistent gel is part of the enjoyment.

What makes it fun for Mike is the appeal to all five senses. He describes the aroma of freshly cut citrus as well as that generated during the cooking process as just divine. You also hear the mix bubbling as it cooks towards a gel set. There is the crinkle test as you push your finger through a cooled mixture to see whether it is ready or not. Sealed in jars and sitting in a sunny window, the translucent marmalade, is a beautiful sight. And lastly of course, is that evocative bitter-sweet taste on perfectly cooked toast or crumpets.

If you are tempted now to start a batch, Mike has some great advice. Start sooner than later to get good quality, not over-ripe fruit. Look for a tried and tested recipe to get the ratios right. Try small batches first, even if you need to halve the recipe. Start with sour orange marmalade (with lemon) recipes. Then go crazy with different citrus and ratios – you'll begin to learn what happens as you vary the fruit type, pectin, sugar and acid levels.

Enter your efforts in the country shows, like the Yankalilla Show. There are over 45 Country Shows in SA. Feedback from experienced judges is very valuable. Grow citrus yourself. They work well in pots and can also be espaliered. He recommends Ian Tolley's book *Commonsense Citrus* as a great place to start.

Hunt For Australia's Champion Marmalade Makers

As this year's citrus hangs heavy on the trees, it is time to have a go at winning world-wide fame in the annual Australian Marmalade Awards run by the National Trust of South Australia.

Marmalade is a traditional favourite on many breakfast tables. It is also one of the most challenging home-made preserves to create, balancing sweet and sour flavours and achieving the right texture, with just enough peel.

The 2019 Australian Marmalade Competition is now open until Friday 20 September; you can bring or post your jars of marmalade to Beaumont House, where they will be stored in preparation for judging by a panel of experts.

The competition has two sections, one for home-made entries and one for small artisan producers.

In the home made section, there are categories for all levels of skills and experience: octogenarians plus, children, even one just for men. Special categories include Marmalade with a Twist (marmalade with additions), Gardener's Marmalade (using your own fruit), and Heritage Marmalade (using an old family recipe).

You can find an entry form online and the competition closes on Friday 20 September.

Winners will be announced and awards presented at the Australian Festival of Marmalade at Beaumont House on Sunday 13 October.

The champion marmalade makers in this year's awards will have the opportunity to have their marmalade produced in a limited commercial run by South Australia's iconic preserve maker Beerenberg Farm.

Winners in the Australian Awards will gain free entry to the World Marmalade Awards in England in March 2020 at Dalemain Estate. Dalemain has a special connection with South Australia as the place that inspired the building of the famous Martindale Hall at Mintaro.

The Australian and World Awards have been joined this year by a third international competition in Japan.

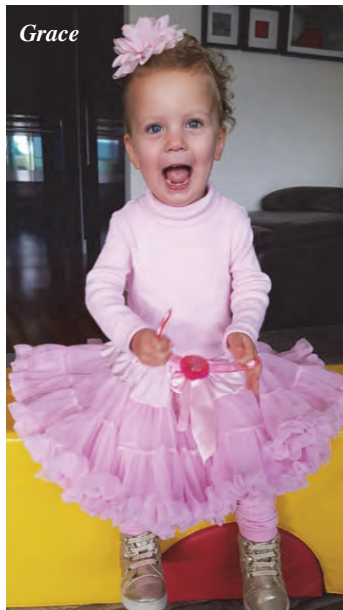

Each program offers a guaranteed \$150,000 to share among a maximum of 20 groups in our electorate. Eligible groups can apply for grants of between \$2,500 and \$20,000.

There is also the Local Schools Community Fund which is offering \$200,000 to share in Mayo, but only schools can make official applications so perhaps talk to your principal.

You may have seen notices around inviting you to attend the meetings of the Youth Advisory Committee YAC. The council wanted to give local youth the opportunity to gather information about what young people wanted, and then pass that on to council, for resources to be allocated in an effective way. Setting up this committee partly arose from wanting to hear from young people about the Library and the use of The Centre.

As we know, The Centre was established by Lions to provide a place for the youth to meet and develop their interests in a wide arrange of areas - drama, music, media, hospitality and food, games and hobbies, to name some. Census data shows there are around 600 young people in the district from the ages of mid-teens to mid-20s.

I have been to two committee meetings of YAC and want to share my admiration for the quality and dedication of the small group of young people - most still at school, some at uni or in work - who are contributing to this committee. They are impressively smart, engaged, willing to ask hard questions and find out what others in the district want in terms of services, support and entertainment. This is not easy work, and can easily become discouraging. But, members of this group are showing that they are mature beyond their years. Spending time in their company, watching them delve deep and develop strategies to meet and engage with others in their age group, leaves me with enormous

admiration and hope for high-quality leadership in the future. Keep an eye out for their meetings, come and observe them in action - it is time well-spent.

A public meeting to discuss creating a 'Residents' Association (name yet to be decided) was held at Club Fleurieu on Wednesday 14 August. Over thirty attended and were enthusiastic in their participation and discussion of topical issues. A small group has formed to report back to offer suggestions about the structure and form of a future association, and a name. It is expected these initial meetings will continue over the next months until a constitution has been decided on and the type of association agreed to. Keep an eye out for future meetings - all are welcome, even if you missed the first meeting.

It is very encouraging to see so many attending the two Council meetings each month - the informal forum for elected members on the first Tuesday of every month at 3pm, and the formal meeting on the third Tuesday of each month at 4pm. I have lived at Wirrina Cove for 2 1/2 years now, with my husband and we love it here! One of the best parts of the day is my early morning run

from my house, on Seaview Avenue to the highway. Running, is a great way to start the day and I have been doing it for years. When we lived at Marino I only had cars, early morning workers hopping onto trains and the occasional jogger pounding the pavements to keep me company. However, at Wirrina Cove I have the kookaburras, corellas, sulphur crested cockatoos, alpacas, sheep, a lazy agisted horse, variegated wrens and perhaps a hip swaying echidna traversing the narrow bitumen road. But by far the most engaging, delightful and awe-inspiring creatures that I meet, are the kangaroos. The huge, proud buck lounging on the soft, green, grass, not ready to tackle the day yet but with antenna ears always twitching with every sound. Then there's the attentive, loving, mother, scanning the environment, ready to spring to safety should she sense danger, with her joey, who is well over the age of living at home, peaking over the top of the pouch, only looking when there is silence. Sometimes there are the skittish joeys who bound from my pathway, hoping to hop back into mum's pouch, just in case.

These families of kangaroos scatter themselves across the hillsides, the verges, backyards, the entrance to New Terry and even on the empty blocks of land, nibbling their way through the morning. Even the local pet canines live inclusively with the kangaroos, having been trained by their owners that kangaroos take



precedence over "Tiger", "Milly", "Bear" and "Rexy".

I first encountered the kangaroos at Wirrina Cove in the 1980's when my husband and I were Mitre 10 retailers and the hierarchy decided to have a weekend conference here amongst the intense bushland, pristine golf course and shining resort. The kangaroos provided entertainment, with the young adolescents sparring with one another, the big bucks bounding up the hillsides with their jet propelled hind legs and the mothers, slow to take off at first with their oversized pouches but still maintaining distance in keeping up with the mob! Around the dinner tables at night the overzealous Mitre 10 golfers dissected their tee offs, their drives, their putts and scores. But, by far, most conversations centred around the kangaroos! Their inclusion gave the days a delightfulness, humour and comradery that transgressed competitiveness and sarcasm and seemed to be therapeutic for all. However...getting back to my morning runs!

In the past two weeks at Wirrina

Cove, I have still headed out for my run but now I find myself alone.

I turn my head in search for my mates, the kangaroos...but they have gone!

I feel a melancholy and loneliness as I shuffle along the bitumen and the images in my head are difficult to erase, for I know what has happened to my mates, because I have investigated their absence.

The proprietors of New Terry have engaged a permit and a shooter!

I have sought clarification from all of the appropriate bodies and organisations and the hand balling and explanations are the same. It is legal.

I have had a number of discussions with the New Terry managers and the words, "dis is our property...dis is our property," keep repeating themselves in my ears.

But, by far the most disturbing factor, is that some Chinese billionaire, residing in overcrowded China has wrecked my mornings with my mates, all of whom I will never see again! Pfftttt!

It's simple arithmetic we are worse off in Yankalilla.

At page 14 of the August edition of the Yankalilla Regional News, Mayor Rowlands published figures to support a claim of the reasonableness of his council's rates versus those of neighbouring Victor Harbor and Alexandrina. For his convenience he chooses a rated value of \$350,000 for his example and then invites us to do the sums on our own properties. His \$350,000 conveniently places Yankalilla at the mid point but overlooks the simple arithmetic that above that figure the much higher Rate in the Dollar rapidly disadvantages the Yankalilla ratepayer. At \$450,000 we are \$28.74 worse than Victor and already \$206.49 worse than Alexandrina. At \$550,000 then \$121.80 and \$339.48 worse off. At \$650,000 then \$214.85 and \$471.60. At \$750,000 it becomes \$307.91 and \$604.16 and at \$850,000 becomes \$400.96 and \$736.71. Obviously it just gets worse for the simple reason the RID is so high. How many of our properties are rated at \$350,000 or below?

The Mayor would know what the mean and mode valuations are for this area so the figures he should publish is the comparison of his rate book at the Victor and Alexandrina rate arrangement and then it may mean something. In the meantime this type of fallacious argument merely reinforces why amalgamation is imperative.

Council's Cruel Joke: Stacked August Council Meeting gives Glamping Tents the Green Light.

In the May edition of "In the Loop" Nigel Morris (CEO) stated that "Community feedback is the cornerstone of everything we do as a Council. It's so important for our elected members and staff to hear from our residents so we continue to deliver the high-quality services they need. This feedback is particularly

important when it comes to formulating our 2019/20 Annual Business Plan and Budget. It's currently in draft format and before it's finalised, we want to hear from you so we can improve our plan and make it more relevant."

Like many in the community, I took this statement at face value. I took the time to read the Budget documents, submitted a 7-page submission, and attended a public Consultation Meeting. In addition, prepared 27-page Powerpoint presentation titled "Proposed Eco Tents - Jetty Caravan Park" and had a one-on-one meeting with Mayor Rowlands to go through my presentation. Following that meeting, I sent a copy of the presentation to all Elected Members. (I am happy to provide copies to the general public.) I was pleased when common sense prevailed at Council meeting 18 June 2019. The motion "That the New Capital Project for the Jetty Caravan ECO structure for \$376,000 be included in the adopted 2019/20 Annual Business Plan and Budget" was lost. The minutes show that **Councillors Zarins, O'Neil, and Olsson supported the motion. Against the motion were Mayor Rowlands, Councillors Spilsbury, Quirke, Trigg, and Christie.**

However, Council did a U-turn at the Meeting on 20th August. With Mayor Rowlands and Councillors Spilsbury and Christie apologies, **Councillor Peter O'Neil** placed a motion on notice, dated 20th August, that "Council instructs the Administration to proceed with the revised project to install 4 luxury 'Eco Structures' at the Jetty Caravan Park". The motion was passed with **Councillors Rothwell, Zarins, O'Neil, and Olsson supporting the motion. Councillors Quirke and Trigg, and Christie opposed the motion.**

The motion also included a statement "That the Administration include the budget amendments in the first budget review of the current financial year". The effect of this is that Council is proposing to spend \$377,921 of ratepayers' money to install these tents. There has been no consideration of the cost of a marketing plan or most of the issues I raised in my correspondence with Council.

It is my considered opinion that what we have seen is a Fundamental Governance failure. **Councillors O'Neil, Rothwell, Zarins, and Olsson have shamelessly exploited the absence of Mayor Rowlands and Councillors Spilsbury and Christie.** Furthermore, it is my opinion that the project is unfunded until budget amendments and the borrowings required for the Tents are approved in the first budget review of the current financial year. I therefore believe it would be illegal for the Administration to proceed with implementing the resolution until the first budget review is reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by Council.

By their actions, Councillors O'Neil, Rothwell, Zarins, and Olsson have

undermined any faith I had that the Council's plans for Community Consultation in respect to the new Strategic Plan. I encourage all ratepayers to write to Council expressing their dissatisfaction with Councillors O'Neil, Rothwell, Zarins, and Olsson's willingness to ride roughshod over Council's own Community Consultation Process.

ICE or methylamphetamine

Ice methylamphetamine is a pernicious substance about which many of us think we know about. But do we? Ask yourself if you know the difference between ICE and methylamphetamine and the answer is none. It is about the method of delivery whether you inject, smoke or swallow a pill. Ice is the purest and most potent form of methylamphetamine, usually in the form of crystalline rocks and it is commonly smoked. The user attains levels more quickly.

The National Drug and Alcohol research Centre at the University of NSW advise that one quarter of methylamphetamine users will experience a meth psychosis.

What does that mean?

The NDRC tell us that means a quarter of all users will be:

- feeling overly suspicious of other people and that other people are out to get them
- having strange beliefs about things that are not plausible
- hearing or seeing things that are not there.

Cannabis psychosis. According to an article in 'the conversation from Sarris and Firth at the Mental Health Research Institute University of Western Sydney tell us "Those with gene variants seem to be at higher risk, or have a paranoid personality type, are even more at risk. So too are adolescents and young adults, who have growing brains are at an age where schizophrenia is more likely to manifest".

In outer Melbourne where I have been working with people whose capacity to live life is wholly impaired by addiction psychosis are called (and excuse the expression) "drug fucked"

because there is little that can be done for them when there are so many others in need. A very sad state to be in.

Then just HOW addictive is ICE? The summary from an ABC report in February 2017 put it this way. "The immediate effects from ice are intense pleasure and clarity, this is because it raises the level of dopamine, an hormone. Users will confirm they can think clearly, feel like they can make good decisions, and plan effectively. BUT... The effects usually last for between four and twelve hours and then the user is in trouble. This is the opposite of what one feels when you are high (ABC). Depressed, irritable, jittery and anxious. You may also have headaches, blurred vision and start to feel hungry. Of course then users take more which becomes a calamity.

It is not the right thing for us in our ivory towers to pass judgement on users of ICE (or Cannabis for that matter). There are usually real reasons that have put them in this situation. Stigmatisation only makes things worse and a person may be in an alarming state of psychosis (Uni. of NSW) in which case:

- Avoid confrontation
 - Keep a safe distance from the person
 - Speak in a quiet voice
 - Avoid physical contact
 - Minimise direct eye contact
 - Do not disagree or argue with them
 - Be reassuring and supportive
- Nothing here is over stated. Ice is an increasing scourge and the victims are not just the users, but also their friends and family and the police as well.

Our war on waste continues

Compostable dog poop bags now in use



Another first for Council, we are proud to introduce compostable, non-plastic dog bags, designed to breakdown in three to six months and they have been installed into the 29 dispensers across our district.

These compostable bags are less damaging to the environment as they are likely to break down quickly if they end up in local waterways, they don't crumble into tiny pieces of plastic like 'degradable' bags. Wildlife often mistake these tiny pieces of plastic for food as they break down into smaller and smaller pieces, they can work their way into the food chain and make birds and animals sick and even kill them and that doesn't include the tangling hazard of plastic bags.

While these are a slightly higher investment than our recently used 'biodegradable bags' the new bags represent an economic benefit and fall in line with Council's War on Waste.

These bags can be placed in your home green organics bin or go into a general waste bin where they will disintegrate in landfill.

For a limited time, Council has compostable dog poo bags for sale at

a discounted of \$15 for 300 bags – be quick before we sell out.

Stop fires before they start, think fire safety

Spring has finally sprung, making now the perfect time to get your property ready for the upcoming Fire Danger Season.

While you should keep your property clean and free from fire hazards throughout the year, it's extra important to do now as both the Fire Danger Season and summer quickly approach.

A well-prepared home can be easier for you, or firefighters, to defend, is less likely to put your neighbours' homes at risk and will give you more protection if a fire threatens suddenly and you can't leave.

Some ways to get started over coming weeks include reducing vegetation within 20 metres of your home, using non-flammable materials if you're in the process of building and filling in gaps around your home where embers could enter or catch.

We will start our annual property inspections in mid-September to identify fire hazards in our district. It's important we all work together to keep each other safe and remember that prevention is everyone's responsibility.

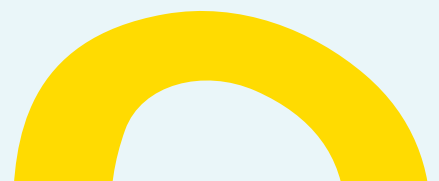

Weed Of The Month brought to you by **Cape Jervis Coastal Community Group**
Musky Stork's-Bill (*Erodium moschatum*)

There are many plants commonly called stork's bill or crane's bill (with or without apostrophes and hyphens!). In each, the flowers produce fruit that looks like a beak or a bill. Some are weeds, some are not. This particular one is of the weedy

variety. It is low growing annual, at just shin high. Over winter, a rosette is produced, then longer stems follow, curling upwards at the ends. The leaves consist of a set of leaflets. As can easily be seen in the photo above, these leaflets are basically

oval in shape, 7-12mm long, and toothed on the margins. From July to November, flowers are produced. Some folk can detect a faint musky odour in the flowers.

The pinkish flowers grow in clusters, each of up to 7 flowers; each flower has 5 petals, 5 stamens and 5 small antherless filaments. Continuing on with the 5-ness, the bill-like fruit following the flowers each splits into 5 fruitlets, which in turn mature into seeds. The seeds are like a needle with a corkscrew attached. These twisty seeds can then burrow into the ground. Sorry...no fruits around when we were photographing! You will have to go search them out yourself to see them!!

Yankalilla show ... more than 160 years of agricultural history

Rural shows began as a means of showcasing a region's produce to the rest of the colony and included horses, cattle, pigs, fruit, dairy produce, wine, grains and vegetables. These shows were held in the vicinity of Yankalilla from 1856 onwards, often accompanied by sports days or exhibitions of hand-made items. Later, ploughing matches were also held in a paddock near Normanville.

The Yankalilla Rapid Bay & Myponga Agricultural & Horticultural Society was officially formed at a meeting in the Yankalilla District Council Chambers on 31 July 1882. A working committee of 33 men was formed and the first show held in November that year in a paddock near the Yankalilla Hotel, owned by proprietor Mr Deeney, and also at the Yankalilla District Council Chambers. By forming a society on prescribed lines, a Government grant was obtained. The first office bearers elected were FM Graham (president), W Nosworthy and J Mayfield (vice president), Charles Gosling (secretary) and JW Clayton (treasurer).

However, an earlier society must have been formed as Mr Clayton was able to produce accounts at the July 1882 meeting which showed a balance of £7.7s.

For the 1883 show, Robert Norman gave permission for it to be held in Normanville at the now demolished Royal Hotel in Jetty Road, and adjoining paddocks.



There was considerable rivalry between the townships of Yankalilla and Normanville regarding the venue. So, in March 1887, the current grounds were purchased – four acres from Mr Baker at £30 an acre – putting the society into a £40 debt. Soon the land was fenced with donations of posts, rails and labour. The Ladies Committee then set about raising £150 for Mr Ted Bird to build the stone hall. Although the hall was not finished, in July 1887 the first show was held on the society's own grounds.

In 1900 two acres of adjoining land was purchased for £20 an acre and, in the same year, the supper room was built and this was used for the show on 8 November 1900.

In 1950 further building extensions were considered and a plan prepared adding a foyer, gallery, cloak room and a cinema projection room. These additions were built following the laying of the foundation stone by Mr JR Croser on 12 July 1952. Mrs CW Clarke who had been the reliable

caretaker of the property for 35 years, officially opened these additions on 1 February 1954.

Since the purchase of its own land and the erection of the halls the society has played a dual role, providing a venue for social and sporting fixtures as well as conducting the annual show. As early as 1866 the society was lending equipment to a cricket club and later a pitch was laid down in the show ring (the pitch was removed in 1978). In 1909 the showground was let to the Yankalilla Football club for 50 shillings a season. Main sporting events were transferred to the Yankalilla Memorial Parks after its opening in 1926, however sports and pastimes such as hockey, gymkhanas, dog shows, caravan clubs and visiting circuses have all used the showgrounds. The pony club still uses the grounds, and many dances, balls and cabarets were held in the hall over the last century and now various community groups and clubs utilise the facilities.

The Pioneer Memorial Gate, between the hall frontage and the Supper Room, was unveiled by Rev. Milton

Tresize and opened by William Stacey. The gate was a gift from the family of Thomas Stacey and his descendants who had been involved with the Show since its inception.
