Whether you're searching for your next great read, exploring a new genre, or supporting local literary voices, we hope this catalog helps you make meaningful connections throughout the summer.

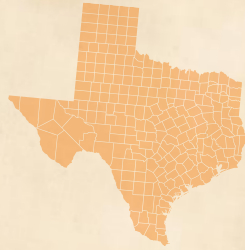

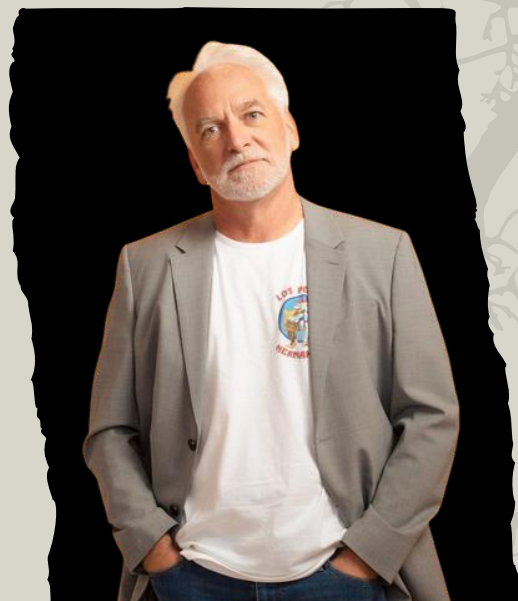


On the Bayou

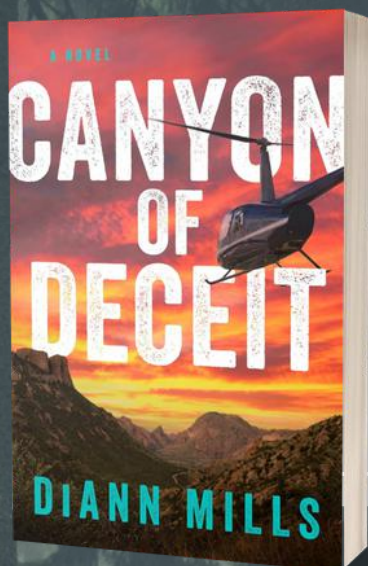
The Big Bend Country Mysteries

Our family of six had fallen on hard times and moved to the poorer side of town. It wasn't a happy place, but the extra-wide ledge of that window seat, in the bedroom I shared with three siblings, caught the afternoon sun like a bright secret. Despite our poverty, I always had books piled around me in careful stacks in my cushioned nook. Nancy Drew novels were favorites, their spines a cheerful chorus of yellows and pinks that matched the summer outside.

I'd sit there as the limbs of the big gumball tree brushed the screened window, providing shade, and sink into worlds of possibility. In each case file—*The Secret of the Old Clock*, *The Hidden Staircase*, *The Mystery at Lilac Inn*—I found a map of how to think, how to question, how to notice what others missed. Nancy's courage felt like a weather vane, always pointing toward truth, even when the turmoil of the grown-up world outside felt heavy with uncertainty.

I imagined solving puzzles with clever steps, page by page, learning to map my own path—one clue, one brave question at a time. That window seat became a lighthouse for me, offering light during long afternoons and the promise of a wider world beyond the frame of my room.

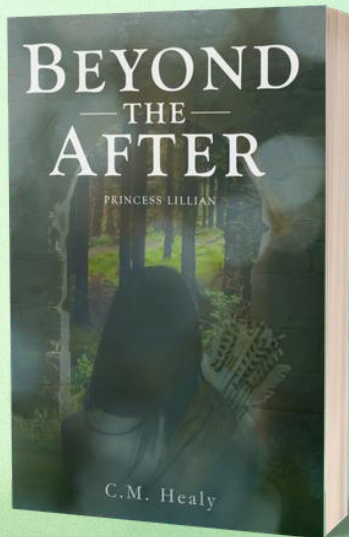
"I want to write my own stories of tension, challenge, and obstacles faced in life," I said to myself.

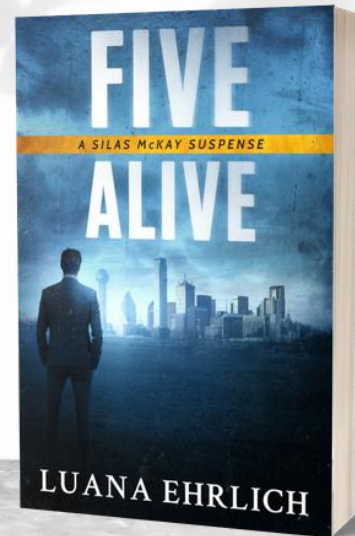

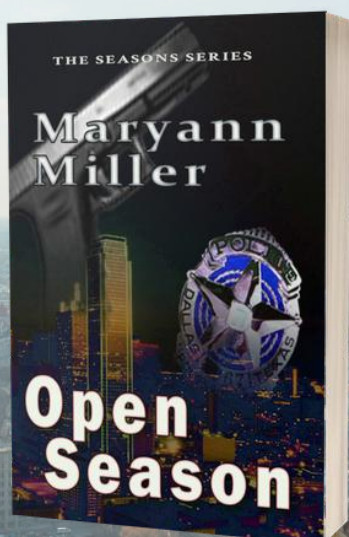

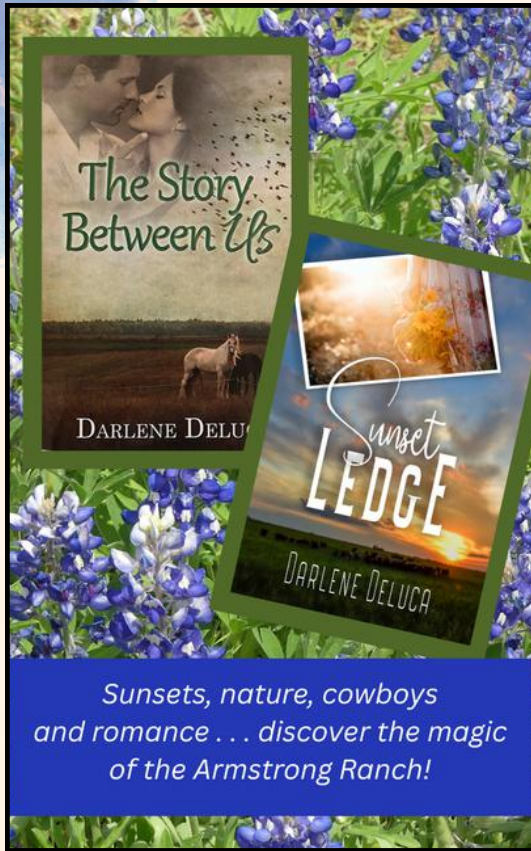
