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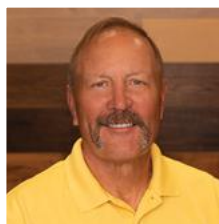

When housing costs rise and routines are disrupted, families need something they can count on. A stable, affordable home offers more than shelter. It creates a foundation that allows families to regain their footing, plan for the future, and move forward with confidence.

That is the power of Habitat. For nearly five decades, we have seen again and again how access to affordable homeownership changes lives. It creates momentum, expands opportunity, and sets families on a path toward greater stability, dignity, and hope.

In a world that often feels uncertain, one truth remains clear. Stable homeownership delivers lasting results.

We see those results every day. The immediate relief from housing instability brings safety and peace of mind. With that security in place, families are able to focus on what comes next. Children sleep better. Parents can concentrate on work and long-term goals. Over time, school performance improves, savings grow, and goals related to education, careers, and financial security become attainable. Years later, the deeper impact becomes clear as children raised in stable homes become thriving adults.

In fiscal year 2025, 95 families in Collier County achieved Habitat homeownership, gaining the security and stability of owning a place to call home along with the confidence to imagine something more.

Throughout this report, you will read stories that reflect the path to homeownership and its outcomes. These families are using stability as a foundation for long-term opportunity, and their progress reminds us why this work matters.

We also took time to look back, reconnecting with families from years past to see where life has taken them. The results speak volumes. With stable housing as their foundation, many have gone on to achieve more than they once thought possible.

Homeownership does not only benefit individual families. It strengthens entire communities. Stable households contribute to stronger neighborhoods. Children raised in safe homes grow into adults who give back. The impact is generational, and its benefits extend far beyond a single front door.

Habitat homeownership is a proven strategy for long-term well-being. While the landscape around us may continue to shift, the results of this work remain remarkably consistent. Lives improve when families have a decent place to live.

We are proud of what we have accomplished this year and energized by the work ahead. We are grateful for the faith, generosity, and shared belief that every family deserves a decent place to live. Affordable Homes Help Life Work.



What Wasn't Working

High rents. Overcrowded homes. Hardworking families forced to make impossible choices. These aren't new challenges—they're the same ones we've seen year after year, but the strain is only getting worse. Families who are doing everything right are still falling behind. When there's nothing left after covering the basics, there's no room to plan, to rest, or to grow. It's a system that simply isn't working.

In the middle of that broken system, Habitat Collier continues to offer a way forward.

Before Mario and Hilda became homeowners, they lived in a cramped house with Hilda's parents—nine people sharing a three-bedroom, one-bath space. Their family of five occupied a single bedroom, where a double bed, bunk beds, and a crib left barely any room to walk, let alone grow. The high cost of childcare meant that Hilda's entire paycheck would be wiped out, so the couple decided it was better for her to stay home with the kids. Mario has worked in construction for over a decade and earns a steady income, but still homeownership felt out of reach.

Rickey and Latoya also faced an uphill battle. They were paying nearly \$2,700 a month in rent—an unsustainable burden despite their stable jobs. Latoya works for Collier County Public Schools and Rickey is employed at an auto body shop. But even with two full-time incomes, they found themselves dipping into savings to keep the lights on and food on the table. Their apartment complex had become unsafe, with vehicle break-ins and a shooting nearby. *"The rent is so high, sometimes my kids and I have to go without certain things just to make sure the rent is paid first, the lights are on, and they are fed."* Latoya said.

Across the county, families just like these are doing everything right—but still falling behind on fundamentals. The math doesn't add up, and the housing landscape simply isn't working for our local workers.



Where Home Works

This summer, both families became homeowners at Majestic Place.

Mario and Hilda's children now have space to grow, play, and be kids. *"Without your help we would be crowded in a single room,"* Mario wrote in a thank you note. *"Now my family will have space for us to enjoy. We are going to cherish this home and we are looking forward to all the memories my family will create."*

For Rickey and Latoya, the relief is both emotional and financial. Their mortgage is less than half of what they were paying in rent. They're no longer living paycheck to paycheck or moving from one temporary solution to the next. For the first time, they're planning for the future—saving money, considering a family vacation, and watching their boys thrive in a home that's finally theirs.

"With God, your support, donations, effort and time, my family found our forever home. Home is truly where the heart is."

Dozens of families have already moved into Majestic Place, and while construction continues, the foundation of a strong, supportive community is already taking root.



A Better Way Forward

It used to be that a full-time income was enough to secure a safe, stable home. But today's workers are being priced out of the communities they help keep running.

We believe that if you work full time, you should be able to afford a decent place to live and provide for your family. That belief is reflected in every home we build, and in every family with whom we partner. Because when families are grounded—when they have the stability of a home—they're better positioned to put down roots, build lasting connections, and invest in the very communities they've long supported.

In a housing market that isn't working, these families are proof that home does.



Theory of Change

A theory of change explains how our work leads to the outcomes we seek. It connects our daily efforts to long term impact. The following outlines how Habitat Collier uses affordable homeownership to create stability for families and strengthen our community.

Problem

In Collier County, rising housing costs, limited land availability, and a shortage of affordable options make it increasingly difficult for local families to secure safe, stable housing. These challenges disproportionately affect essential workers, families, and long time residents who support the local economy and community life, making it harder for them to remain in the place they call home.

Strategies

We focus on practical, community driven solutions that address both immediate housing needs and long term opportunity.

- **Partner** with families and community members to understand needs and incorporate their voices into housing solutions and advocacy.
- **Build** safe, decent homes that support long term housing security.
- **Educate** the public about the housing crisis through storytelling and community engagement.
- **Advocate** for forward looking policies and strategies that expand access to affordable homeownership.
- **Engage** volunteers, donors, congregations, and businesses as essential partners in this work.
- **Invest** in neighborhoods to strengthen infrastructure, resilience, and connection.

Outcomes

When families and community partners work together, meaningful and lasting outcomes follow.

- More families achieve affordable homeownership and long term housing security.
- Children grow up in stable homes that support healthy development.
- Essential workers are able to live closer to their jobs, strengthening the local workforce.
- Neighborhoods become stronger, more connected, and more resilient.
- Generational cycles shift, creating lasting opportunity and pride rooted in stable housing.

Extraordinary Gifts

In a time of unprecedented housing challenges, two extraordinary gifts have helped propel Habitat Collier's mission forward in fiscal year 2025—each breaking records and reaffirming the vital power of community investment.

Last fall, Janet and Andrew Miller committed a remarkable \$5 million to Habitat Collier—at the time, the largest gift in this organization's history. The gift was a major milestone, offering critical support as costs to build affordable homes continue to climb.

Just a few months later, that milestone was followed by another: a \$25 million gift from the Schoen Foundation. We celebrated the announcement and the Schoen Family's decades-long partnership in this work during our February Home Dedication Ceremony. Not only did it set a new record for our largest donation—it also stands as one of the most significant philanthropic gifts in Naples.

Partners in Vision, Steadfast in Commitment

The Millers have supported Habitat Collier for years, but their 2024 gift marked a new chapter in their personal commitment. Janet Miller, who also serves as Habitat Collier's Board Chair, spoke at the November wall raising:

"I feel so privileged to live in Naples—I truly love this community. But I don't want to live in a place that is only available to those with means."

Their gift, made with deep gratitude for the community they call home, has already fueled progress in neighborhoods like Majestic Place, which will soon provide housing for more than 100 families.

The Schoen Foundation's relationship with Habitat Collier began in 2003 and has grown over more than two decades. To date, their generosity has helped 63 families achieve homeownership. Their most recent gift provides critical resources to acquire land, build infrastructure, and expand access to affordable housing for years to come.

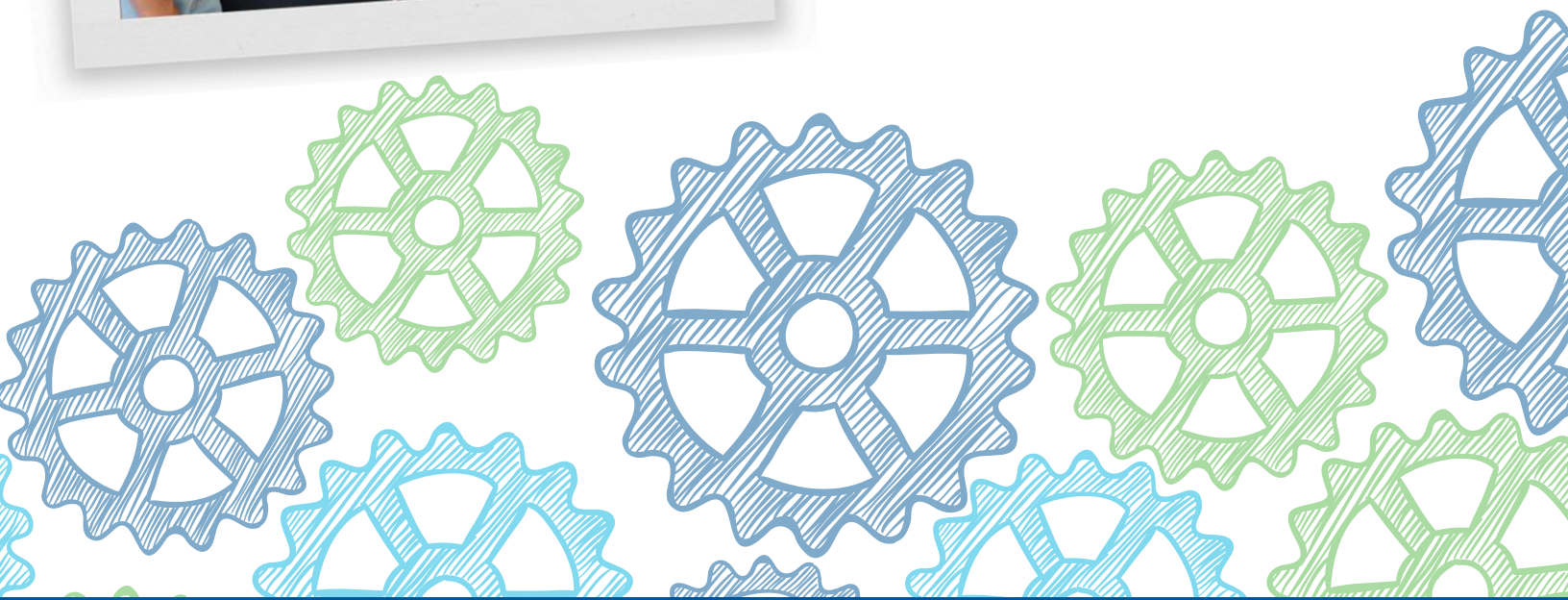


Laying the Groundwork for What’s Next

Where We are Building



Majestic Place

All of the homes in Majestic Place are now assigned as we complete construction in this beautiful community in the coming months. The final homes are scheduled to close this summer, and soon after we will hand over management of the HOA in this 109-home community to a newly elected Board of Directors made up of passionate homeowners ready to guide the future of their neighborhood.



Kaicasa

Located just five minutes from the heart of Immokalee, work continues in Kaicasa. The name blends the Creole “kai” and Spanish “casa” which means “home”, in tribute to the community’s rich cultural roots. Families here enjoy modern townhomes with three to four bedrooms, two bathrooms and garage parking, set amid nearly three acres of recreational space. More than 50 families already call this community home.

LAS PALMAS



Spanning approximately 17 acres, Las Palmas will bring 210 new affordable condominium units to Collier County. A generous gift recently allowed us to purchase construction-ready land adjacent to our original site of 60 homes, giving us the ability to offer 150 more homes than originally planned in this community. Las Palmas will bring back the popular home design we used in Songbird at Whippoorwill. We expect the first homes in this community to close in Summer 2026.

Leading with Purpose

Franco was in fourth grade when he and his mother moved into their Habitat home in Regal Acres. After years of living in small efficiencies, having a yard and a neighborhood full of friends was life-changing.

“That stability helped my mom focus on raising me,” he says.

Today, Franco is a college graduate and First Lieutenant in the U.S. Army. After completing his service, he plans to train as a firefighter and EMT.

He credits the stability of his Habitat home with giving him the freedom to simply be a kid and the foundation to pursue his goals.

“Habitat gave my mom the chance to breathe and me the chance to grow. One day, I hope to give another kid that same opportunity.”

A Legacy of Hope

As a teenager, Saddath slept on a cot in his family’s small apartment. When his mother was approved for a Habitat home, everything changed.

He helped build the house alongside volunteers and neighbors who soon became friends. The experience shaped how he saw the world.

“For the first time, I had a space to think, to breathe, and imagine what was possible,” he says.

Saddath graduated from The Citadel Military Collage of South Carolina where he played football. Now married with two daughters, Saddath works in the nonprofit sector, helping organizations raise funds for causes across the country, including Habitat Collier.

To him, Habitat represents something powerful: people coming together to invest in one another’s potential.

“Habitat stands for hope. When you invest in people, the ripple effects are endless.”

A Life Transformed

More than a decade ago, 21-year-old Jessica Perez applied for a Habitat home while working, attending school, and raising her children. In her application, she didn't just ask for a house, but for the chance to build a stable future and grow into the best version of herself. This past spring, Jessica returned to share how far she has come. She is now a college graduate, a school counselor, a community leader, and a proud mother of four. She shared the impact of her partnership with Habitat in her own words:

“As a mother of four children, I can tell you that stability is one of the most important things we can offer our families. Growing up, we moved frequently, always in search of a stable home that could provide the foundation for my siblings and I to grow and thrive. But despite my parents’ efforts, we found ourselves facing uncertainty and moving often.

When I became a parent at the age of 15, I always knew that I wanted to provide a foundation for my child to grow. I enrolled at Lorenzo Walker after obtaining my high school diploma for a better job and opportunity for myself because I knew that I needed to work to apply for a mortgage, so I got to work! I quickly realized I would not be able to afford a mortgage on my own. Then in 2012, Habitat for Humanity came into our lives. Through their partnership, I was able to obtain a home that has given my family a sense of stability and security. But it didn't stop there. Habitat for Humanity didn't just provide us with a house — they provided us with hope, the opportunity for a future, and the belief that we could build an even better life for ourselves.

As I stand here today, I'm proud to say that this stability and security has allowed me to pursue goals I once thought were out of reach. One of my biggest dreams was to become a police officer. While it was short lived, I became a police officer for the Collier County Sheriff's Office. After leaving the sheriff's office, I went back to the drawing board.

Today, I'm a graduate with a master's degree in school counseling working at Parkside Elementary, a journey I never thought possible while juggling the responsibilities of raising four children. Habitat for Humanity's support helped me to focus on my studies and move forward, knowing I had a safe and reliable home to sleep in every night, and that I could afford to put my children in extracurricular activities to entertain them, while I worked on papers AND I had A LOT OF PAPERS.

In addition to completing my degree, I was featured in the 2023 Gulfshore Magazine 40 under 40 for my contribution to the community. I recently began a new chapter of leadership by being selected for the Associate Leadership Collier Class of 2025. My heart has and always will be giving back to the community that gave so much for me. This current opportunity is helping me hone the skills I need to continue to give back to my community in an even more meaningful way. Habitat for Humanity not only gave me a home but gave me the confidence to take on new challenges, knowing that anything is possible when you have the right foundation - literally and figuratively.

None of this would have been possible without the incredible work Habitat for Humanity does. From the volunteers who help build the homes to the staff who guide families like mine through the process, Habitat is a lifeline for so many people, giving us a chance to succeed, grow, and dream.

Thank you, Habitat for Humanity, for being a part of our journey. And thank you to all of you for making such a difference in the lives of so many, including myself. ”

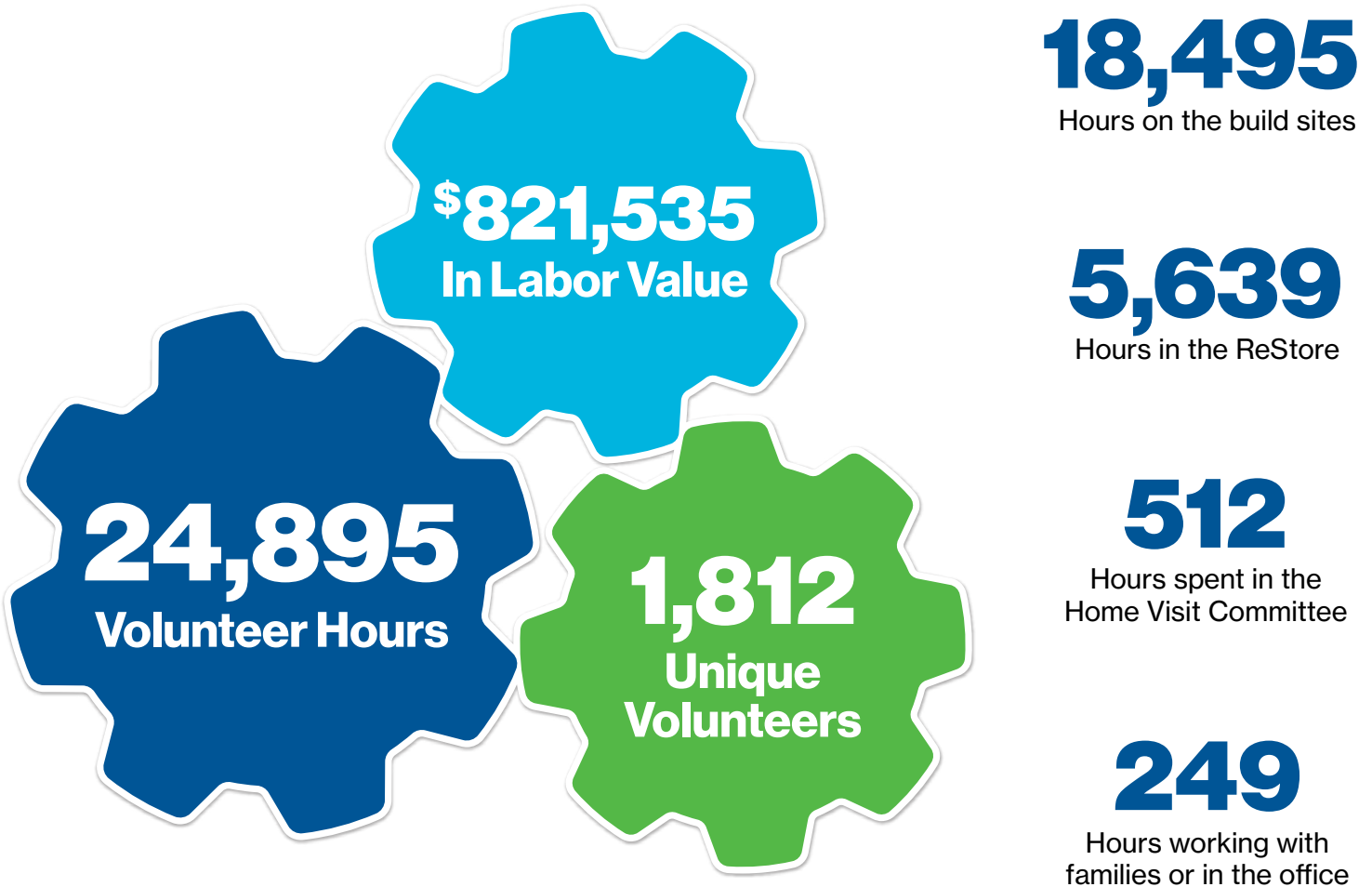

In fiscal year 2025, ReStore generated nearly \$1 million in funding to support our mission— that's enough to build 3 homes!

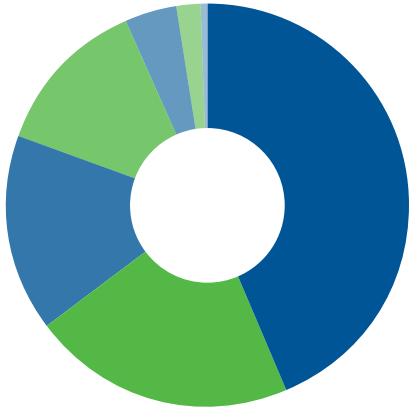

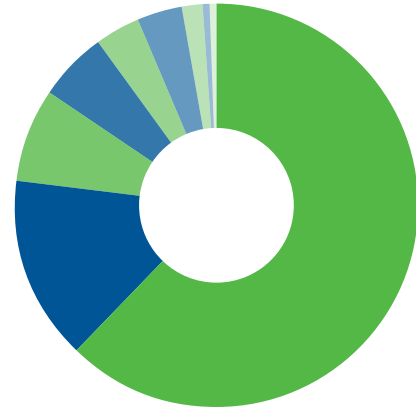

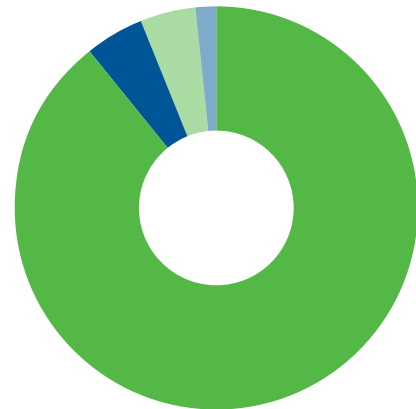
