“Barnwood can help you grow and learn. It is easy to make friends, especially at our after school clubs.”

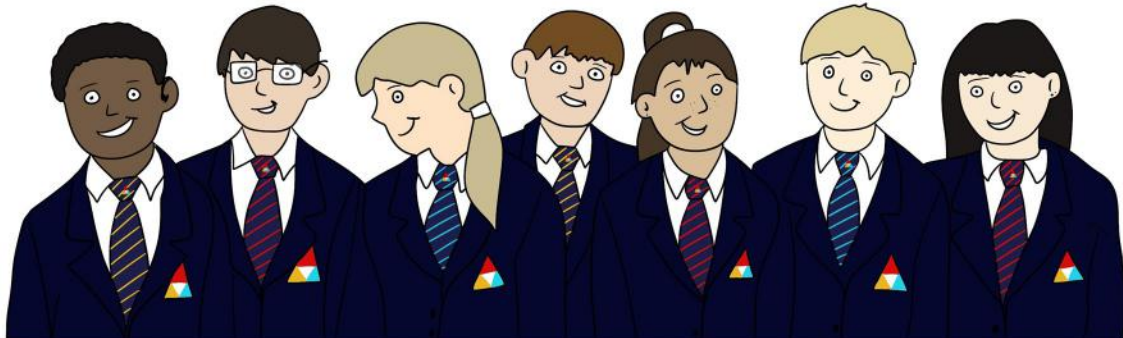


How will you help me get ready to come to Barnwood Park?

What do I need for my first day?

We believe in excellence in everything, which means we expect you to present yourself smartly and wear your uniform with pride.

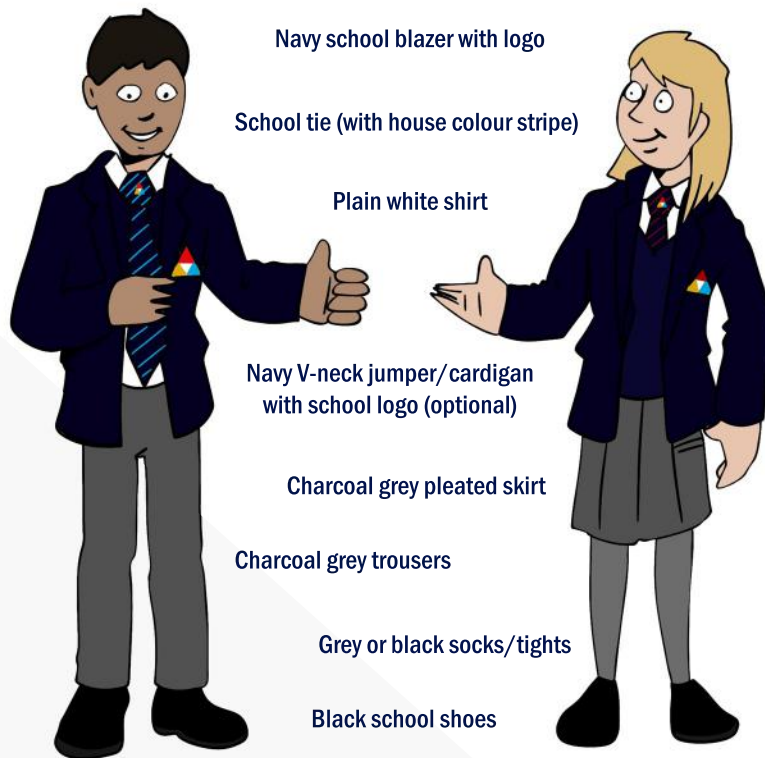
We have clear, simple rules about uniform and you will need to follow them from your first day with us.

PE KIT - COMPULSORY

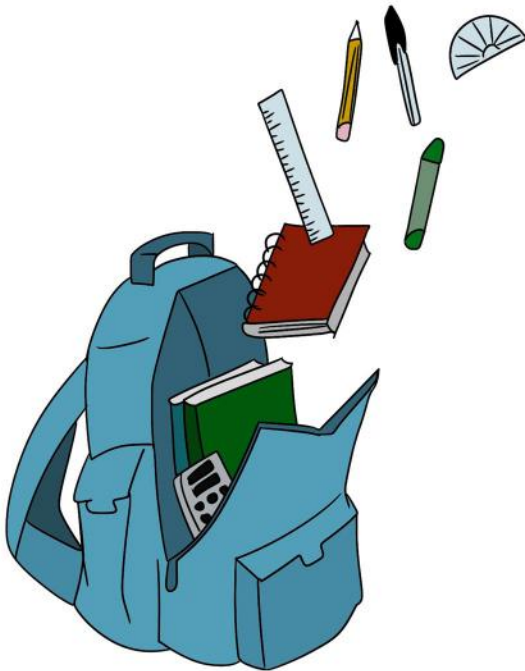
- Plain navy shorts/skort
- Navy polo shirt with school logo
- Navy and white rugby shirt with school logo
- Trainers
- Football boots & shin pads
- Navy football/rugby socks
- White ankle socks

OPTIONAL

- Navy leggings/tracksuit bottoms with school logo
- 1/4 zip training top with school logo
- Navy base layer with school logo



You must also bring the following items with you every day in a strong bag:



COMPULSORY:

- Pencil Case
- 2 Black Pens
- Green Pen
- Pencils including HB & 2B
- Angle Measurer/Protractor
- Scientific Calculator
- Ruler 30cm
- Reading Book

OPTIONAL:

- Pencil Eraser
- Coloured Pencils (no felt tip pens)
- Highlighters
- Glue Stick

We will check you have everything you need at the start of each day but you will need to remember to bring it all in. Pack your bag the night before so you are less likely to be in a rush and forget anything.

To allow you to study without any distractions, you are not allowed to use any phones, smart watches or any other unauthorised electronic device from home (such as AirPods) in the school building.

What happens in a school day?

We have a 2 week timetable, Week A and Week B.

You will move between classrooms for each lesson and have different teachers. Don't worry about finding your way around. If you get lost, older students and teachers will be happy to help you. You will soon know where everything is and feel at home!

What about food?

We have a canteen that serves food before school and at breaktime and lunchtime. You can eat there or get something from the snack hut.

Why not start your day with your free breakfast, which you can collect between 8:10 and 8:40am from the Learning Support Centre.

Snacks, such as paninis, wraps, pasta pots and sandwiches, are available at break and lunchtime. Meals are also available. There is always lots of variety on the menu, including options for any students who have allergies and dietary requirements.

You don't need to bring cash with you. Your parents/carers will pay into an online account (Scopay) and you pay for your food using your fingerprint. If you have free school meals, you will use the same fingerprint system. You can also top up the account using cash in the machines we have in school.

You can also bring in a packed lunch from home.

If you ever forget your lunch or find your account doesn't have enough money in it, don't worry, speak to someone in Admin and they will help.

What will I study?

You will continue studying lots of the same subjects you studied in primary school. There are lots of brilliant new subjects in Year 7.

Our Library is open before school, break and lunchtime.

What happens when I have done well?

We ask that you do your best in everything and we will reward you when you have done well in the classroom and outside.

When a teacher sees that you have displayed one of our guiding principles, they will give you an 'achievement point' and at the end of each term we will celebrate your achievements in year group celebration assemblies.

You may also be recognised in a subject for your effort and achievement with an effort and achievement award. These are given out 3 times a year.

At the end of the year we hold an awards evening where selected students are invited along with their family to attend. We hope to see you there one day!



What do I do when I need help?

We all have problems from time to time. We know you can only do your best when you feel happy and safe, so please let us know if you are worried about anything in school or outside.

You will get to know your Form Tutors really well so they will be the best person to speak to. You can also speak to your Head of Year or any adult at the school that you feel comfortable talking to. They will listen to you and help. It always helps to talk.

How much homework is there?

Homework provides students with opportunities to develop independent learning skills and consolidate their learning.

There are 4 categories of homework task at Barnwood Park.

1. Consolidate and/or extend learning in lessons
2. Exam style questions/practise/ coursework
3. Preparation for an assessment – a revision activity
3. Flipped learning - preparing something to inform a lesson/activity.

Students in KS3 (Y7 - Y9) and KS4 (Y10 – Y11) will be set a homework per subject per week and should be spending no more than 30 - 40 minutes on each piece of work in KS3, rising to 40 - 60 minutes in KS4. Homework will never be expected to be completed for the next day and will be set in line with a homework timetable to help manage student workload.

Why do you get homework?

- To help you really learn what you are studying in class
- To encourage you to love your learning
- To help you to learn on your own
- To allow you to spend more time learning things you really like
- To prepare you for future learning
- To prepare you for assessments
- To give you chance to get your learning right – and wrong!
- To take your learning further and in a direction you want it to go in.

What is Edulink?



Edulink is an online tool which allows you to access a range of information including your homework, attendance, achievements and behaviour.

It is also used to notify parents/carers of any achievement points you have been given. We will also use Edulink to notify parents/carers of detentions that you have been given.

In September, you and your parents/carers will be provided with login details.

When you receive your login information, you will be able to access the login page by clicking on the 'Quicklinks' drop down at the top of our school website homepage.
