THE WEDDING VEIL

The tradition of wearing a bridal veil has deep historical and cultural significance.

Brides wore veils as symbols of modesty and purity, believed to shield them from evil spirits. They also hid the bride's face from the groom until after the ceremony.

MIDDLE AGES

Veils took on new meaning, symbolizing a bride's submission and obedience. The groom lifting the veil was seen as an act of ownership.

ARRANGED MARRIAGES

In cultures with arranged marriages, veils kept the bride's face hidden to prevent the groom from backing out if he found her unattractive.

SUPERSTITION

Veils were thought to protect brides from the "evil eye" and malevolent spirits. Lifting it was considered a safeguard.

RELIGIOUS SYMBOLISM

In many religious traditions, veils represent purity and modesty. Some associate them with the biblical image of the Church as the bride and Christ as the groom.

MYSTERY & ROMANCE

Over time, veils became symbols of mystery and romance, with unveiling marking an emotional transition in the ceremony.

FASHION & STYLE

Beyond tradition, veils have become a staple of bridal fashion, available in various lengths and styles to complement personal taste.

While the veil's meaning varies across cultures and religions, modern brides often choose whether to wear one based on tradition, style, or personal preference. Today, the veil is as much a fashion statement as a symbol of heritage.

TO WEAR WHITE OR NOT

The tradition of guests avoiding white at weddings is rooted in cultural and historical customs. While modern weddings often have more relaxed dress codes, the etiquette of not wearing white still holds significance for several reasons:

White is traditionally associated with the bride and the fresh start of her marriage. When guests wear white, it can lessen the symbolic meaning of the bride's gown and its special connection to the ceremony.

SUPERSTITIONS & CULTURAL BELIEFS

In some cultures, wearing white as a guest is considered bad luck and may be seen as an attempt to outshine the bride. Many wedding customs have roots in superstitions, and avoiding white is one of them.

RESPECT FOR TRADITION

Following this etiquette shows respect for the couple's wishes and long-standing wedding traditions. Even if a couple chooses a non-traditional wedding, many still appreciate guests adhering to classic customs.

Skincare & Haircare:

- · Cleansers, moisturizers, sunscreen
- · Hair products, styling tools

Makeup:

Wedding day makeup and everyday essentials

Toiletries:

Toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, etc.

Nail Care:

· Manicure / pedicure essentials

MISCELLANEOUS:

Wedding Decor:

· Any small decor items you want to bring

Wedding Timeline / Itinerary:

 Printed copies for you and key members of the wedding party

Travel Snacks:

· Quick bites for the journey

Emergency Kit:

· Sewing kit, safety pins, stain remover, etc.

Comfort Items:

· That make you comfortable and relaxed

HEALTH & WELLNESS

Medications:

· Prescription meds & basic first aid kit

Sunscreen:

Important for outdoor ceremonies

Travel-Sized Pharmacy:

· Pain relievers, allergy medicine, etc.

Remember to pack in advance and double-check your list to ensure nothing important is forgotten. Take the destination's customs, weather, and local dress codes into account, and review TSA rules for carry-on items.

CHECKING YOUR WEDDING GOWN

Transporting your bridal gown on an airplane requires careful consideration to ensure it arrives at your destination in perfect condition. Here are some tips to help you decide whether to check your bridal gown or every it on board:

CARRY-ON

- 1. **SECURITY:** Bringing your gown on board keeps it safe and prevents loss or damage.
- **2. Space:** Many airlines allow wedding dresses as an extra carry-on if they fit in the overhead bin.
- **3.** Avoiding Creases: Hanging the gown in a garment bag helps prevent wrinkles.
- **4. Peace of Mind:** Keeping it with you ensures its safety, especially if it has sentimental value.

CHECKED LUGGAGE

- Size & Policies: Check airline rules on oversized carry-ons, as some may have restrictions.
- 2. Storage: If it won't fit overhead, you may need to check it at the gate—use a sturdy garment bag.
- **3. Handling:** If checking your gown, inform staff so they can handle it with care.
- **4. Insurance:** Consider travel insurance to cover loss or damage.


GENERAL TIPS

UNIFORMITY

It's important to maintain some uniformity with gifts, especially those used on the wedding day, like matching jewelry, robes, or accessories.

HANDWRITTEN NOTES

- When getting married away, families connect. Unlike local weddings, destination weddings allow loved ones to spend real time together.

- Be strategic when picking your destination. Consider airfare, flight schedules, and resort offerings to get the best value. A travel advisor can help.





- Proof of Age/Consent:
 - Both must be 18+; under 18 requires parental consent.
- Both applicants must be present at application.



To get married in St. Eustatius, you will need:

- · A completed application of marriage.
- To register your Notice of Intent to Marry in writing at least 3 weeks before the wedding.
- Be at least 18 years of age if under 18, proof of parental consent stamped and notarized.
- · Valid passports.
- Birth certificates with the parent's name.
- Proof of "Single" status: divorce decree or death certificate.
- If applicable, provide notarized Deed Poll proof of name change. Documents must be in English or Dutch; if translated, submit both versions.
- Two witnesses are required for weddings at the Registrar's Office, while marriages at other locations require six witnesses.
- Total Fees: US \$300 \$330 depending if you get married on a weekend or weekday, at the courthouse or elsewhere.

A dormant volcano towers over the tiny Dutch-Caribbean island of St. Eustatius. At nearly 2,000 feet, The Quill dominates the 8.1 square mile island, known as Statia.

Discovered by Columbus in 1493, it changed hands 22 times before the Dutch took control in 1816. In the 1700s, Oranjestad was a key trade hub for slaves, cotton, and sugar.

Accommodations range from small inns to luxury villas. Restaurants abound, and locals enjoy the island favorite—goat meat with rice and peas, a meal to die for!

THINGS TO DO

Statia's large crater hosts a tropical rainforest with orchids, bromeliads, and ferns. The Quill became a National Park in 1997, offering hikes through diverse vegetation zones. Adventurous hikers can enjoy stunning crater views before descending into

its lush interior, filled with vibrant flora & unique wildlife.

Statia is also a diver's paradise, with ancient wrecks, submerged anchors, cannons, pristine corals, and vibrant marine life, including rays and turtles.

STATIA CUISINE

While St. Eustatius lacks a specialized cuisine, it offers tasty Creole (Caribbean of African descent) options for those seeking something exotic. Though Dutch-influenced, the island features diverse international eateries, including European, American, and Asian.

Specialties include Carnistoba (Goat Stew) with rice, peas, and provisions, Funchi (polenta mush), Pan Bati (corn flour pancake), and Bolo Pretu (black fruitcake). Local seafood options include pickled conch, baked snapper in shrimp sauce, grilled fish, and lobster.









REQUIREMENTS MARRIAGE

No residency is required. Couples need a marriage license and the following documents:

- · A valid passport or photo ID.
- · An original or certified copy of your birth certificates.
- · If divorced, a decree absolute (an original or certified copy showing court's stamp or seal).
- · If widowed, a copy of the death certificate of the deceased spouse.
- · If documents are not in English, they must be accompanied by a notarized English translation.

Weddings: Couples Catholic must complete counseling, submit required documents, and provide a letter confirming they are unmarried and have received instruction. Weddings are held in the church.

Other Religions: Couples should bring a letter from their resident minister confirming they are known and unmarried. Counseling may be required and can be done by the couple's priest.

FEES: The marriage license fee is EC \$200.00 (US \$74). The Justice of the Peace may charge an additional fee.

RESIDENCY: An eight-day waiting period is required after the authorized application is received. The couple need not be on the island.

DOCUMENTS: If previously married, a certified copy of final divorce decree; if widowed, certified death certificate.

Applications must include a letter with visit dates and stay length. Legal marriage age is 18; if under 18, an affidavit with both parents' signatures is required. Non-US citizens need a passport or visa. Couples must appear before the Clerk of the Court or designee before the license is issued. To marry in court, an appointment is required.

FEES: The application and license fees are US \$50 each. Court marriage or judge fee is US \$200. Officiants charge US \$200. No personal checks.


