When you choose to host your event at Outhouse, you are helping to provide life-saving services and life-changing campaigns for the queer community in Dublin.

Outhouse LGBTQ+ Centre is a vibrant and safe space for LGBTQ+ people, communities, and organisations that is inclusive of the diversity within our communities.

Our mission is to improve the quality of life for LGBTQ+ people by providing a safe space to find:

- Connection: Discovering themselves, their people, place, and passions.
- Community Support: Accessing information, programmes, and services.
- Culture: Experiencing creativity, heritage, discovery, and fun.
- Campaigns: Being part of a strong, credible, and trusted voice for LGBTQ+ communities.

Since our doors opened in 1997, we have provided a welcoming drop-in space, a community café, social and cultural events, resources and support services, a queer library, a theatre, meeting spaces, and much more.

Outhouse was founded from the ashes of the Hirschfeld Centre, an iconic and pioneering LGBTQ+ space which was destroyed in an arson attack in 1987.

Outhouse was officially opened by President Mary McAleese in 1998, with the re-opening of an LGBTQ+ centre marking a significant milestone in Ireland's LGBTQ+ history.

Much like the Hirschfeld Centre, Outhouse has been at the forefront of agitating for social change and supporting, nurturing, and encouraging people, groups, and movements changing the face of Capel Street, Dublin City, and Ireland.

Outhouse's incredible achievements over its history include:

- Supporting tens of thousands of LGBTQ+ people with information, support, signposting, and peer support groups, ensuring that no one was left alone.
- Supporting the founding and early-stage development of two critical national organisations, BeLonG To LGBTQ+ Youth Ireland and the Transgender Equality Network Ireland (TENI). Both organisations successfully left the nest and won vital victories for the LGBTQ+ community.
- The Marriage Equality and Repeal of the 8th referenda were successfully fought and won from within the walls of Outhouse.
- Creating space for activists to come together, organise, and campaign was one of the founding goals of Outhouse.
- 105 Capel Street, our home and one of the first Georgian buildings built in Dublin, has been lovingly and painstakingly restored.

Preserving part of our city's heritage for generations to come and inspiring the revitalisation of Capel Street and its environs.

ABOUT OUTHOUSE

Located in the basement of the building, Outhouse houses Dublin's premier dedicated queer theatre space.

This remarkable space, the largest within the building, is fully equipped with state-of-the-art audio/visual equipment and boasts a portable and adaptable stage. As a result, it offers unparalleled versatility, making it the ideal setting for a wide range of events.

From captivating film screenings and dynamic rehearsals to productive meetings and engaging seminars, from interactive workshops and imaginative performances to thought-provoking panel discussions and vibrant cabaret shows – our theatre has everything you need to bring your vision to life.

The Outhouse Theatre has hosted many performances by artists, writers, comedians, DJ's and musicians like Sean Millar, SACK, and Ailbhe Reddy, and iconic theatre festivals in Ireland, like Dublin Gay Theatre Festival, Dublin Fringe Festival, Mother Tongue Festival, among others. The theatre has a resident performance group, Acting Out, which is drawn from the LGBTQ+ community in Dublin. With its unique design, this theatre provides the perfect backdrop for gatherings.

The impressive and aptly named Red Room is situated on the first floor of the building. This authentic Georgian drawing room still preserves many traditional characteristics, such as a 12-foot plasterwork ceiling and an original wooden floor. Its full-height sash windows offer fantastic views of Capel Street while allowing abundant natural light to flood the room.

The Red Room is a versatile space suitable for a variety of events, including meetings, corporate workshops, conferences, seminars, creative workshops, music rehearsals, smaller performances, launches, celebrations, exhibitions, and much more.

The room held many exciting events and exhibitions over the years, including government consultations, Culture Night exhibits, livestreamed concerts, and filming for national television.

The Red Room is connected to the Library by an adjoining door, and both rooms work well together, particularly as an entertaining and exhibition space.


The History of 105 Capel Street

Occupancy on the site has seen significant change over the centuries. The original mansion, some of the remains of which are beneath our theatre, is thought to date from 1676. It was bought by William Conolly, Speaker of the Irish Parliament in 1707, and demolished in 1770.

The current building at 105 Capel Street, completed in 1771, is one of Dublin's first, finest, and rarest surviving examples of a formal Georgian urban townhouse. It is a large three-bay, four-storey-over-raised-basement townhouse of national architectural significance, with surviving enriched hand-modelled Rococo stucco work, cornices and ceiling roses, original intact room layouts, original door sets, many original 18th Century windows, and an original open staircase with carved tread ends and internal joinery of fine architectural quality.

No. 105 Capel Street's notable tenures included Corbet's Hotel (1774 - 1810), where Robert Emmet planned his ill-fated uprising in 1803, providing lodgings for the upper-ranking generals of the French Army who came in support. From 1810 - 1910 it was primarily active in the spirits trade, with the Drake family Vintners (1810 - 1845) and Begg Brothers, in situ for almost a century (1808 - 1905).

The 20th Century saw it change hands ten times. Outhouse purchased the house as its home in 2001. Since then, it has played host to the two campaigns, Marriage Equality and the Repeal of the 8th, which successfully fought to change the Irish Constitution — continuing a solid legacy of activism on the site dating from Conolly and Emmet's time.



APPENDIX

Within these walls, we hold ourselves to a higher standard of conduct and social interaction. We strive to make of this place a haven free of the ills and abuses we find outside it.

Our premises at 105 Capel Street were built in the 1770s, making it one of the oldest Georgian buildings in Dublin City.

Unfortunately, due to the building's age, importance, and protected status, minimal interventions have been allowed by Dublin City Council to enable universal access.
