#### FROM SOUTHWESTERN PUBLIC HEALTH

Belonging starts here: How public health & schools are helping youth feel seen, heard & supported. Grade 12 student Ava Meadows is seated beside her school's social worker. The room is silent, aside from Ava's voice & a rolling video camera as she recounts her experiences being a student leader at St. Mary's Catholic Highschool in Woodstock. "I know so many of my friends here have bad days. But they're always telling me what's going on & that they're there for me. It's OK, I'm going through tough times too, it's OK." Ava's words capture something essential: belonging isn't just about being present in a classroom, it's about feeling safe, valued, & supported. Her experiences are central to the latest installment of Vital Perspectives, a miniseries by Southwestern Public Health that highlights important issues impacting the community like the opioid crisis & climate change. This 3rd installment shines a light on the powerful connection between belonging & youth, and how schools & public health professionals are working together to create environments where young people can thrive.

Why belonging matters For youth, particularly during adolescence, the need for connection is more than social; it's developmental. Belonging helps shape identity, builds coping skills, and protects against mental health challenges like anxiety, depression, and loneliness. Students who feel they belong are better equipped to manage stress and adversity, leading to stronger academic and emotional outcomes. "Our local school boards are already working on building belonging and inclusivity within schools," adds McLean. "Public health supports this work through collaborative efforts that put students' voices and well-being at the centre."

A call to action Parents, teachers, coaches & community members all play a role in creating spaces where youth feel like they matter. It starts with kindness, curiosity & connection, and it continues through partnerships that place student mental health at the heart of school culture. 

#### **EVERYDAY ORGANIZED**

A home renovation is exciting! Fresh paint, new layouts, and the chance to make a space feel more like "you." But anyone who has lived through one knows: the dust, the boxes & the shifting piles of stuff can quickly turn excitement into overwhelm. After recently going through my own home project, I came away with a few lessons worth sharing.

- **1. Have a plan.** Renovations are unpredictable. There are delays, extra steps, and those "while we're at it" moments. Having a plan for your belongings helps you feel more in control when everything else feels uncertain.
- **2. Organize what you pack.** It's tempting to toss things into boxes, but take the extra 2 minutes to label. You will need something unexpectedly a charger, a sweater, the dog's leash. A clear label saves you from tearing through 3 boxes to find it.
- **3. Declutter twice.** Packing is a perfect chance to let go of what you no longer need. Be honest: if it hasn't been used in years, do you want to pack, store & unpack it? And when you unpack, weed again you'll notice items you didn't miss or that don't fit your refreshed space.
- **4. Start with less.** Your renovated space will feel bigger & calmer if you begin with only the essentials. Bring things in slowly & intentionally to prevent old clutter from sneaking back in.
- **5. Create one storage hub.** No matter how carefully you plan, things will shift around. Having a designated "parking spot" for items you're not actively using means less moving of boxes.

6. Live in it first. Once everything is back, give yourself a few weeks



before making anything permanent - like installing drawer inserts or adding shelving. A new space may work differently than you expect. By living in it first, you'll learn how it truly functions. Renovations are messy, but they're also an opportunity to reset. With some planning, weeding & a temporary storage system, you'll enjoy not just the new look of your home but the fresh sense of order that comes with it. #### **COUNCIL NEWS FROM MAYOR RYAN**

It's no secret that I think changes are needed to our school governance system. But a loss of local democracy by a transfer of decision making to Toronto is not the answer. The good news is we can both change the governance system AND keep a local democratic voice. We already have local democratically elected councils who administer budgets & deliver public safety through fire and ambulance and safe drinking water. Why not trust councils to also administer local schools & transportation? Leave teacher contracts & curriculum with the Ministry of Education, where it already is. This would give us both a more effective school system AND a local democratic voice. Closing underutilizes schools as the Province has suggested is an oversimplified response (there are none in Zorra). There are many, many portables in the TVDSB. Could some of the students in portables be moved to permanent classrooms in schools? The most fiscally responsible thing to do is use the buildings we've already paid for, not close them. It seems there's always money to break the contract with the Beer Store, or build a 401 tunnel, or a parking lot for a spa in Toronto, but there is't money for our communities's children? At the Association of Municipalities of Ontario Conference I spoke to several Ministers about issues important to Zorra & Oxford. Homelessness funding to transition people out of homelessness, community para-medicine to help people living at home waiting for long term care, childcare spaces & rural schools. These conversations rarely result in a solution in the meeting, but are part of ongoing discussions that can lead to positive changes. For example, in the past we have got legislation that requires school boards to collaborate with municipalities on new builds, and \$720,000 for affordable housing and encampment response.

In September Zorra Council received a report on expected long term growth & resulting land needs. While the report still predicts a higher rate of growth for Zorra & Oxford than the provincial average, it also is clear that we should not need to expand any Zorra village boundaries to accommodate that growth. In other words, the work council has done to get the type of growth we want, in the places we want, has worked, and is working. The world changes around us, and our only choice is how we respond to those changes. We are responding well, and we need to continue that work. #doingourpart #growingstrongertogether

#### WHERE THE BUFFALO ROAM... By Laura Green

Our tour of Buffalo Ben Bisons using his self-constructed high Prairie wagon pulled by tractor horse power, brought back the memories of signing this campfire song "Home on the Range" which is the state song of Kansas since 1947. It was composed by violinist Daniel Kelley in 1873 and the text was written by otolaryngologist Dr. Brewster Higley as a poem titled "My Western Home" and published in 1876 in a Kansas newspaper. Of course, Braemar W.I. members didn't sing on the wagon because we didn't want to scare the bison with our voices. Buffalo Ben Bisons farm is located at 255395 25th Line, Thamesford and he has on-farm market of pastured-raised bison meat which is government- inspected and vacuum-packed and offers wagon tours of the paddock by calling/ texting 519-608-3020. Buffalo Ben Van Hasstert, a retired dairy farmer of 38 years has always had a passion for bison animal since he was a young child. He has studied the role of the bison in Canadian & American History. He also studies the animal husbandry of the bison. Moving from the dairy farm, he purchased his retirement property that feature lowland pasture. It has been 10 years since he started with 11 animals purchased from established producer near Hagersville and now has a herd of 33 including one breeding bull. September is mating season, so extra caution was taken for our Sept 3rd morning tour. A mature cow weighs 1,200-1,400 pounds and an older bull can weigh 2,000-3,000 pounds and reach & maintain a speed of 55 kilometers an hour. Ben's bison species is the Plains Bison and there is large herd of Wood Bison in Elk Island National Park, Alberta, The Van Hasstert herd are pasture fed & receive dry hay in late fall to early spring. Ben also outlined his herd health practices used. Buffalo Ben gives Santa a ride in his special designed high Prairie wagon trail wagon used for tours at the Embro & Thamesford parades. Braemar branch members enjoyed their brown bag lunches on the front lawn under the mature trees away from the bison herd & held their business meeting with President Anya Donaldson presiding. The next meeting will be held at the Ingersoll Creative Arts Centre, 125 Centennial Line, Ingersoll Oct 1 with the tour beginning at 1:30pm.
