



IEPO INDEPENDENT ENTREPRENEURIAL PROGRAM OPPORTUNITY

Girl Scouts participating in the IEPO will earn the Standard Girl Reward Plan and Nutty Dough. However, since they are not participating in a troop, they CANNOT earn Proceeds. Instead, they will earn additional IEPO Nutty Dough beyond the standard schedule to use toward GSSGC programming, events, or camp. The IEPO Nutty Dough for the 2025 Fall Program is calculated at \$5 for every \$100 sold.

*Girls currently active in a troop that is NOT participating in the 2025 Fall Product Program may participate through the IEPO. However, if more than 2 girls in the same troop want to participate, then they will not be eligible for the IEPO, and the troop will need a trained Coordinator to participate in the standard program.



WHY SELL IN THE FALL?

The Fall Product Program is a financial literacy program that allows girls to be entrepreneurs who learn and practice the Five Skills—Goal Setting, Decision Making, Money Management, People Skills, and Business Ethics—by offering family and friends the opportunity to purchase delicious nuts & chocolates, magazines, Tervis Tumblers, custom stationery, candles and Girl Scout-themed BarkBoxes.

Participating in the Fall Program is more than just a fundraiser—it's an opportunity to kick start a year filled with exciting activities, learning experiences, and personal growth.

Start Strong, Plan Big

By participating in the Fall Product Program, you're laying the groundwork for a year filled with possibilities. Your support ensures that your troop has the resources they need to embark on incredible journeys, both within Girl Scouts and beyond.

TROOP PROCEEDS



Standard Troop Proceeds is 20% of Total Sales This includes nuts, candy, magazines, I Care to Share, BarkBox, Candles, and Tervis Tumblers.



Troop \$350+ Per Girl Average (PGA)
Add additional 5% of total sales added to Troop

Add additional 5% of total sales added to Troop Proceeds. *Minimum 3 participating* girls to qualify.*



2026 Cookie Program Bonus

Troops with a PGA of \$275+ in the 2025 Fall Program can earn an additional 3 Cents per box for the 2026 Cookie Program. *Minimum 3 participating* girls to qualify.*

Troop Opt-Out

The Opt-Out Rewards Plan is the process of choosing an additional 10% of total sold, instead of receiving the reward line-up.

Girls will not earn the reward items like the plush, events/ trips or cookie dough or anything else on the standard reward line-up with the exception of the Program Patches. Girl Scouts may not Opt-Out on an individual basis. The decision to Opt-Out is a Troop decision. A vote must be made, as it will apply to everyone. Requests to Opt-Out are due from the Troop Product Coordinator by November 1, 2025 and require all girls/parents to agree to the terms.



Girl Scouts is the largest all girl organization and everything we do is designed to create an environment where girls can learn and grow together and become leaders in their daily lives. We strive to build girls of courage, confidence and character who make the world a better place. When girls go to camp, either on their own or with an adult partner, they explore leadership in a new way. At camp girls build life skills, responsibility and healthy habits while developing a deep appreciation for nature. Camp Skyland Ranch



Volunteer Safety Steps

GSSGC policy is to conduct a criminal background check on all volunteers. We require a Live Scan to be completed for volunteers that expect to be in direct contact with Girl Scouts for more than 16 hours per month or more than 32 hours per year.

You must complete both screening and training to participate in GSSGC activities!

Mandated Reporter Training

- Go to the Content Library, and search to complete "GSUSA Girl Scouts Child Abuse Neglect and Prevention".
- · Complete the training.
- Screenshot the achievement once training is completed and email it to mandatedreportercert@gssgc.org.


