## history of winchelsea

# James Stirling, early licensee of the Barwon Hotel Winchelsea, buried in Winchelsea Cemetry 1871

This week's history article on James Stirling. His brother William will be next week and his son William will be the week after.

In previous articles we looked at the Barwon Inn Hotel (now known as the Bottom Pub) as part of the foundation of the township of Winchelsea. The Inn was acquired by James Stirling in 1853 and included a blacksmith's shop and Post office.

James Stirling and his family came as assisted immigrants to the Colony of New South Wales in and settled in Geelong 1841. James was a weaver in Scotland (both in Stirlingshire and Renfrewshire).

James (age 39, kitchen gardener or labourer) and Ann (38) and their family set sail from Greenock, Scotland on 20 Sep 1841 aboard the ship, Robert Benn. They arrived in the Port Phillip District on 26 Jan 1842.

James and Ann were married in Nov 1817 and had eleven children. However, only seven emigrated to the Port Phillip District NSW: Jane (19), James (18), William (15), Peter (13), Elizabeth (9), Thomas (6) and Margaret (11/4).

By 1849 they had a house and shop in Spring Street in the area of Geelong called Little Scotland, which is between Gordon Ave and Aberdeen St in Geelong West. In April 1852 James Stirling secured the license to The Bunyip Hotel and began advertising in the local newspaper.

In about 1853 James acquired the Barwon Hotel in Winchelsea, and held the license until his death, after which the license passed to his wife, Ann Stirling. As well as being hotelier, James operated a store in Winchelsea and continued to operate the Bunyip Hotel in Geelong together with his sons until 1858. The Bunyip hotel passed to a new licensee in 1859 and appears not to have been renewed again in the name of any of the Stirling family.

Michael completed a Bachelor in History and Anthropology and a Master of Cultural Heritage at Deakin University, then went on to complete a PhD at Federation University, focusing on colonial and European collections of Indigenous Australian Cultural Heritage. Michael lectured at Federation and Monash

Universities, lecturing in World History, Folklore Studies, Indigenous Studies and literary studies. Michael has worked in museums and cultural collections across Victoria, and can usually be seen in and about Winchelsea with his wolfhound.

Until Ann's death in 1885, the Barwon Hotel appears to have been managed by James' son-in-law Martin Gullan, who had married James and Ann's youngest daughter Margaret in 1864.

James' brother William Stirling also managed a general store in the town and James' son, also called William, became a prominent figure in the foundation of the town. Both will be the subject of future articles.

Upon James' death the Barwon Hotel was inherited by his son William and daughter Margaret. James died at his residence the Barwon Hotel in Winchelsea in the morning of Sunday 11 Jun 1871, at the age of 77 years. James was buried in Winchelsea Cemetery. After her death he devised four separate parcels of land constituting his real estate to other members of his family.

- The first parcel of land (a little under three acres) comprising lots 2B and 3B, crown grants in favor of Beal and Trebeck, together with the hotel and premises i.e. the Barwon Inn, he devised to his son William and daughter Margaret, as tenants in common.
- He devised a further five acres comprising Government Lots 4 and 5, with any appurtenances on them, to his grandson James Stirling (son of James Stirling and his wife Ann Stirling) and granddaughter Ann Stirling (daughter of Peter Stirling and his wife Mary).
- A third parcel of land on which a blacksmith's shop and dwelling house were erected he devised to his granddaughter Ann Roadknight, (daughter of Jane Stirling and her husband William Roadknight, settler in Gippsland).
- A fourth parcel of land, comprising twelve acres,
   Government allotments 26 and 27, he devised to his daughter Elizabeth Fender, widow of William Fender.

#### David Arden, Songman: A Review

Who was lucky enough to attend Dave Arden's concert at COPACC last Wednesday? I saw a few familiar faces... and I'm ready to bet that you left the theatre in a more thoughtful frame of mind than when you entered it.

What we heard last week was no less than a nuanced and deeply personal history, both of Arden's family and the wider Indigenous community. Through his songs, he told the stories of remarkable First Nations people, their journeys of heartbreak and oppression, empowerment and triumph. Each song was a part of the richly glowing tapestry that was the programme.

In "Kokatha Gunditjmara Clan", Uncle Dave explored the issue of identity, race and ancestry. "I See, I Hear" spoke of his childhood growing up without his birth mother, raised by his aunts. "Freedom Called" told the stories of his ancestors who served in Gallipoli and World War II, thus acknowledging the frequently forgotten First Nations people who served in the Australian army. The battle to be heard when no-one wants to hear the truth was eloquently voiced in "One Step Forward". A local choir, The Colac Chorale, joined him for "So Young", and "Call It Out", which was a powerful protest against racism and discrimination. My personal favourite, "Meerta-The Ballad Of James Arden", finished the programme. It told the story of his great-grandfather James, who served in the First World War as a horse breaker for the Light Horse Brigade. He was a pillar of the Indigenous community, and fought for First Nations rights.

Needless to say, this concert left a deep impression on me. There was so much power in the simplicity of David's performance, and his straight-forward lyrics gave each song a raw, personal edge. I detected a rather pronounced Country influence to his music, which perfectly suited his earthy approach. Dazzled, I waited in the foyer after the performance to meet the icon.

Uncle Dave is as unassuming and kind as he is great. He was so humbled by the size of the audience, and had an enthusiastic greeting for everyone. Despite having graced some enormous stages, he was equally honoured to perform in a country theatre. His charm and warmth captivated me immediately. Of course I begged him to perform in our region again – so here's hoping...!

All in all, an unforgettable experience! Keep an eye out for future concerts of Dave Arden's, I highly recommend.

#### Biography David Arden - Kokatha/Gunditjmara Songman 1986-2025

David Arden is a prominent Australian musician and songwriter of Kokatha/Gunditjmara heritage. Over his four-decade career, he has collaborated with legendary First Nation and non-First Nation artists, leaving a significant mark on the Australian music scene.

In 1986, David was frontman for the Koori Youth Band, which recorded its first EP as part of Rock Against Racism Volume 2. This marked the beginning of his musical journey.

David went on to work with various acclaimed First Nation artists in Australia, including the Hard Time Band, Archie Roach and the Altogether Band, and Bart Willoughby and the Mixed Relation Band.

He worked very closely with late Archie Roach and Ruby Hunter, serving as a key guitarist and vocalist for them and touring nationally and internationally with Archie.


David Arden has released several albums, including "Rainbow Man" (1996), "Kookatha/Gunditjmara Clan" (2007), "Close My Eyes" (2016), "Red Desert Man" (2020) and "Meerta" (2023). He released singles like "Freedom Called," written with Paul Kelly, which acknowledged the often-forgotten Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander military service.

In 2006, David Arden co-founded The Black Arm Band made up of respected Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal names in Australian music industry.

David took on the role of Musical Director for "Nukkan Ya Ruby" (2010) which celebrated the legacy of the late Ruby Hunter at Sydney Festival's opening night at the Domain. He also musically directed "A Fight For Survival" (2021) which celebrated the strength of the Northlands community led by activist Gary Foley in their successful and epic fight against the Victorian State Government.

On December 15 2022 he performed at the State Memorial Service for Uncle Archie Roach at the Sidney Myer Music Bowl in Melbourne.

In 2023 David was inducted into the Arts Centres Australian Music Vault Hall of Fame. Arden reflects on his rich family heritage, experiencing racism, incarceration, and the beauty of keeping his mobs' storytelling alive in song..

# How a climate adaptation 'shortfall' is being felt in northern Australia

Some urban areas in northern Australia are struggling to adapt to climate change as experts warn of increasingly unbearable temperatures.

Talk to anyone who has lived north of Australia's 26th parallel and it will not be long until the conversation turns to the heat. Karratha residents at an early October park run in WA's northwest were jogging in 30-degree heat by 8am.

At the height of summer, the heat will be much worse. The Pilbara city hit 48.4C in 2022.

Water scarcity in the sub-tropics and extreme weather in the tropics is making climate mitigation more difficult.

An urban design expert says significant temperature reductions can be achieved by building low-cost shade structures and using cool reflective building materials.

# PR firms are spreading climate misinformation on behalf of fossil fuel companies. Could Australia stop them?

Have you heard offshore windfarms kill whales? (They don't.) Or that electric vehicles catch fire more often than petrol cars? (It's the opposite.) Perhaps you've heard "natural" gas is clean? (It can be worse than coal.)

This is what climate misinformation looks like. These claims are common, influential and damaging. They're often spread for a reason: to slow the uptake of clean alternatives to fossil fuels. Unfortunately, they are shaping public opinion.

This week, a Senate inquiry is hearing testimony from officials, climate scientists and researchers about the scale of the problem and its effects on Australian politics. Policymakers are also hearing about the main culprits: oil, gas and coal companies, as well as key enablers such as public relations firms.

#### **International Court of Justice**

Last month, the International Court of Justice ruled that the 1.5°C threshold is the world's agreed primary temperature goal, and it is legally binding. It was crystal clear that governments must ensure their climate plans represent their "highest possible ambition" and are capable of limiting global warming to 1.5°C.

The world's highest court went further, stating that it is not only domestic emissions that must be addressed, but that fossil fuel extraction, licensing and subsidies may be an "internationally wrongful act".

## In My Garden

Julia Holohan

I feel it's time to do some work with my herbs. I don't have a proper herb garden, my herbs are scattered around from where over the years I've attempted different spots for herb gardens. We've cut back on trying to grow everything herbal & now only have those that grow well here and that we use regularly.

I do look after our mints, learning early on, if you don't, they'll take over your garden! They're now grown in an old concrete laundry twin trough with both plug holes blocked so their roots cannot escape. They are close to the house making them easy to access to water, trim & use. There's only 2; spearmint & peppermint which are used daily. The peppermint is starting to shoot after being dormant over winter whereas the spearmint grew robustly through winter, I have finally cut it back today hoping it will rejuvenate quickly.





Coriander & dill, their seeds are sown straight into the garden, being happy for them to grow wild, picking out any that end up in the wrong spot, leaving others to go to seed for more to grow. Our neighbours struggle with coriander which we can swap with them for others of theirs. Coriander grows well over the cooler months, but can go straight to seed in the warmer months when I'll resow seeds fortnightly, it's already bolting quickly with seed heads. I love coriander!

I don't have a lot of luck with chives & parsley, I perservere and can usually get just enough. Lucky our neighbours will swap theirs for our coriander.

Bay. We're not very fond of the massive tree it grows to be. We don't have a bay tree, our lovely neighbours are happy for us to gather bunches of leaves from theirs to use.





Lovage self seeds & pops up this time of year after being winter dormant. I love using it in place of celery & in salads.

Wormwood is for growing around the chook pen as it's good for their general health, keeping mites at bay & it also helps with shade for the girls on hot days, it's currently struggling with what looks like thrip, another job to attend to.


We've recently planted ginger, glangal & tumeric for the first time crossing my fingers that they'll grow & in our cool climate.

Garlic, another crop we like to be able harvest enough to use a whole year. The Garlic cloves are planted around the shortest day of the year (mid June) & harvested around the longest day (mid December).

Chilli is another we want to crop enough to have for year round use. We have tree chillis which are a large, hot red chilli that grow well in our cool climate and can stay in the ground for around 5 years.

I have started some Habanero chilli seeds in punnets this year & have my fingers crossed they'll do well too. They're a smallish orange chilli & hot! I bought the chillis in an op shop last year! We liked them so I saved the seeds, the same way I do the tomato seeds, on the paper towel & they have now sprouted.

Then there's the herbs I've neglected; lemon balm, sage, thyme & marjoram. I haven't cut them back and they've become woody & have crept into each other & neighbouring areas! I need to get them under control ... I'd better get out there now & enjoy their scent while I try to tame them!



William (Bill) Tyrer was born in 1944 and lived in Footscray for the first 9 years of his life. He loved sport and football and of course was a keen Bulldogs supporter and attended their 1954 premiership game! Bill and his sister were part of a loving and musical family.



In 1954 Bill's father bought a dairy farm at Ricketts Marsh where

Bill began his lifelong connection to the land. By the age of 12 he mastered the Clydesdale horses, long before the family could afford a tractor. He played tennis and football locally and he attended Colac High school. He studied Wool Classing at the Gordon Tech and last year proudly accepted 60 consecutive years with a certificate of Recognition. He worked in woolsheds across NSW, Victoria and SA and loved the lifestyle and shared many amusing stories from the time.

Bill met Frances in Deans Marsh in 1964 and they were married 4 years later. Their daughter Kylie was born in 1969 but tragically lost her life in a car accident 18 months ago. Their next child sadly died at birth then in 1973 Sylvia was born and in 1978 their son Stuart.

Bill worked in the Portland Wool Stores and was also a wool traveller covering a big area but was away from the family. He then became a Livestock Agent with Elders in Heywood and then in 1979 he joined Dalgety Farmers in Colac. He soon stepped into the role of auctioneer where his easy manner and genuine care for his clients built a loyal and thriving clientele. In 1986 Bill became a livestock agent and auctioneer for Charles Stewart & Co and most of Bill's clientele followed him. He loved his work and was a valued staff member and was there until 2011 where his clients respected his honesty, friendship and knowledge.

Bill always wanted to be a farmer and bought part of his in-laws property and happily farmed until 3 years ago. His favourite time of year was shearing where he enjoyed all the camaraderie in the shed. He joined the Birregurra Bowling Club and was soon 'hooked'. Bill was in demand as auctioneer for many charity functions with his quick wit and infectious sense of fun. Bill always loved cars and finally replaced his first car with a 1956 Dodge Kingsway which he at times proudly drove to church!

Bill & Frances loved to dance and they were good at it! When the church closed in Deans Marsh Bill and Frances faithfully attended St Thomas's weekly together for years and they were much loved by all the parishioners. Bill and Frances celebrated 57 wonderful years of marriage together and Bill was a wonderful husband, father and grandfather. Frances was an amazing support to Bill in his last years of ill health where he bravely persevered on. Bill has fought the good fight, finished the race and kept the faith.

Bill's funeral service was at St Thomas's in Winchelsea on the 8th October. The church was packed as well as the hall and many people were standing outside. There were hundreds there, some from interstate and around Victoria to pay their respects. It was a beautiful service taken by Rev Chris Duff, the Eulogy read by Peter McConachy and an amusing poem written and read by Rod Armistead and the Bible readings were read well by Stuart. The fitting Recessional was 'True Blue' as Bill was! Bill you were much loved by your family and many friends and you will be sadly missed by us all and long remembered. *God bless you Bill.*

# Improving consumer laws on rentals

#### Victorian Government

Victoria's renting taskforce is now partnering with major real estate websites to block unlawful rental bidding at the source.

Realestate.com.au and Domain.com.au have upgraded their platforms to ensure only a single, fixed price is included on rental listings.

This change is a significant win for renters – guaranteeing transparent pricing on rental properties, while also helping rental providers and agents stay on the right side of rental bidding laws.

Victorian residential rental properties must be advertised with a single fixed price, to protect against rental biddingt.

Advertising without a price, using a price range or phrase such as 'contact agent', is considered a form of rental bidding because it creates confusion and encourages renters to offer higher prices to secure the rental property.

Non-compliant listings are now blocked from publication.

Since its inception in 2024, Consumer Affairs Victoria's renting taskforce has issued over 90 fines totaling more than \$750.000.

Other reforms from 25 November include increasing the notice period for notices-of-rent-increase and notices-to-vacate from 60 days to 90 days, removing no fault and no cause evictions and banning third-party businesses and apps from charging extra fees to pay rent or apply

# Cromwell's Quirks Special (About the significance of being human)

Some of the following may sound utterly fantastic to the uninitiated, prompting you to reach for a boulder of salt to take it all with, but it truly is a wondrous world we live in, so I warmly invite you to query the reputable sources wherever it might seem I'm drawing a long bow.

Some people feel fairly confident of the special places humans have earnt for their selves across the stages of evolution, history, the sciences, arts and culture. But if, as it's beginning to look likely, that organisms in general are special in exactly the same terms, then what can "special" actually mean?

And in turn, speaking of beating humans to it, we all know the architectural prowess of gang-gang cockatoos, but what I find even more appealingly amazing about them is crèching their nestlings so each couple gets more chances to forage for their chicks, which I am reliably informed they achieved millions of years before the first hominids even began to climb up the greasy pole of evolution ... so I'm guessing that's not what makes humans special either.

May be humans are special because they harness fire, along with the kites and the falcons, no, that can't be it.

It's common knowledge that many animals use tools, but just like humans, (and well before them), sea otters have been sequestering their favourite shellfish-bashing stones in their

underarms, ready for whenever a snack comes their way. Octopodes collect and carry coconut fragments around with them which they can configure as a defense when threatened or protection for their eggs, even deploy as multi-part tools for various challenges through life. Bottle-nosed dolphin Mothers teach their Daughters how to carry and protect their noses with sponges whilst probing the seafloor for food. Ravens carry favourite stones with them for dropping on things to break them open, as well as maintaining curved bark "cups" for carrying more food or even water than otherwise possible. Chimpanzees carry entire toolkits around with them for probing, spearing, pounding, crushing, scooping, scraping, hunting, involving favourite rocks, sticks and even paint-brush frayings for brushing ants and termites out. They also maintain "ateliers" or workshop spaces with equipment set aside for creating tools by modifying common objects around them in nature, e.g. detaching, reducing, reshaping and combining, even spongemaking. The typical chimpanzees' ateliers will house all the special tools for tool making, as well as anvils for specialised tool use. Each chimpanzee's tool-kit can vary in number according to environmental requirements from around 4 to 18 instruments, most of which can last many many seasons before requiring a replacement to be manufactured. May be the carrying and construction of tools, alongside the comprehension of past, present and future required to understand how worthwhile they are, isn't what makes humans special either.

Humans configure middens, mind you, when a crash of rhinoceros complete their annual migration, one of the first things they establish is their communal midden, where, by scent, everyone can tell, exactly who lives in the vicinity including their age, sex, territorial status, oestrous state, as well as the general health of the crash and elements of conditions over the last little while. Well, that's most rhinoceros, there are some specific types, lets call them "toxic alphas", (its just a name after all), who don't like attention being diverted away from them, who will trample all the individual midden-postings into one conglomeration in order to destroy each discrete data "point", then void as many bodily fluids as he can over the lot, to make the midden all about their Self instead. (I wonder if any other species act so? ;-) ) Fluent in midden-technologies are also squirrels and octopodes, pack rats, hydraxes and squirrels. So, looks like humans aren't so special when it comes to middens or toxic-alphas.



Servo Saver has now been launched on the Service Victoria app. It could save up to \$333 a year at the pump – putting money back in their pockets.

Price data is fed directly into Servo Saver, allowing motorists to see where they will get the best deal in their area or along their route and make informed decisions about when and where to fill up.

Currently, fuel price reporting in Victoria is voluntary and often patchy. Commercial price reporting websites exist, but Servo Saver will include every fuel provider, won't be advertiser funded, and will never promote one outlet over the other.

Servo Saver will support the next phase of the Fair Fuel Plan to cap the fuel price once a day and lock that ceiling in place for 24 hours, or when the price is reduced.

You'll be able to check your local area for which service station is offering the best price throughout the next day – and when you arrive in the morning to fill up, there'll be no surprises.





# Compassion and dignity for terminally ill patients

#### Victorian Government

New legislation will amend the Voluntary Assisted Dying Act 2017 which has allowed 1,683 terminally ill Victorians to make their own decisions about their death since 2019.

There are 13 proposed amendments to the legislation, with proposed key changes to include:

- Removing the 'gag clause' so registered health practitioners can raise VAD with their patients during discussion about end of life options
- Requiring registered health practitioners who conscientiously

- object to provide minimum information
- Extending the prognosis requirement (life expectancy limit for eligibility) from six months to 12 months
- For people with neurodegenerative diseases (like motor neurone disease), they'll no longer need a third prognosis if their expected lifespan is between six and 12 months
- Introducing a new administering practitioner role to expand the workforce able to support VAD.

Victoria led the nation in 2017 by becoming the first state or territory in Australia to legalise VAD – since then other jurisdictions have followed and, in many cases, improved the service. The proposed amendments would bring Victoria's VAD legislation into line with these other states where they have been operating safely and effectively for several

# Parents save money on students' digital devices

**Victorian Government** 

Parents at Victorian Government primary schools will no longer need to buy a device for their children – saving them more than \$500 per student.

Schools will be required to provide access to tablets and laptops for students to use at school. To further support student learning and engagement, screen time limits will also be introduced to all schools.

The changes will be phased in gradually to support schools' transition to the new arrangements.
