



Prophet Muhammad's subscinduct towards the OPPRESSED

The stories of the oppressed throughout history are filled with the cruelty of tyrant kings and their subjects.

In every era, Allah has sent messengers and prophets to liberate the oppressed from the cruelty of their oppressors, just as He sent Musa to rescue the Children of Israel from Pharaoh.



One of the primary reasons Allah sent
Prophet Muhammad as the final messenger was to eliminate oppression from the world.

The Prophet participated in Hilf al-Fudul (an alliance to uphold justice) before his prophethood in Makkah to help the oppressed.

Makkah, he always
showed sympathy
towards other
oppressed individuals.

During the hardships in Makkah, when weak companions faced severe persecution, the Prophet would console them with the glad tidings of Paradise.



**Both Muslims** and non-Muslims approached the Prophet to seek justice against oppressors, and he always ensured their rights were upheld.

A stranger from the Arash tribe came to the Prophet , recounting Abu Jahl's oppression, and the Prophet and the stranger received his due rights.



Through the saying, "Support your brother, whether he is an oppressor or oppressed," the Prophet encouraged helping the oppressed and advising the oppressors to cease their wrongdoing.

The Prophet prohibited causing harm to the oppressed and warned that their curses would be answered by Allah without any barrier.



When sending Mu'adh bin Jabal as a general to Yemen, the Prophet's primary advice was to avoid the curse of the oppressed.

The Prophet mentioned that Allah has declared oppression forbidden for Himself and among His servants.



The Prophet warned oppressors that they would be unable to cross the bridge of Sirat (the bridge to Paradise) due to their oppression.

The Prophet stated that if anyone unjustly seizes someone's land, they will be burdened with the weight of seven lands around their neck on the Day of Judgment.



The Prophet said said that those who remain silent in the face of oppression will be subjected to Allah's punishment.

The Prophet seemphasized that remaining silent about oppression is equivalent to supporting the oppressor.



The Prophet stated that Allah gives the oppressor time, but when He finally seizes him, the punishment is severe.

The Prophet said, "Allah will contend on the Day of Resurrection against the person who hires a worker, takes full work from him, but does not pay him his wages."




The Prophet warned oppressors by saying that oppression will be darkness on the Day of Judgment.
