# “ I will forever be grateful for our special last Father’s Day ”

Surrounded by our beautiful gardens, Brian Swann’s final Father’s Day with his family was bursting with joy and love. The dotting grandad made precious memories on our Inpatient Unit that his daughter, Sue McEwan, says she will always treasure

**D**ad was such a positive, happy and content man. A ticket holder for Oldham Athletic, he had an eclectic range of hobbies, including metal detecting, ballroom dancing, making mosaics and even playing the ukulele!

Above all else, he loved his family. He was married for 30 years to his wife, Monica, and I was his only child. He also had four grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren.

He ran a launderette, where he often collected and returned washing to help elderly people. At the end of a long day, he loved nothing more than sitting in his garden. I surprised by him by having it done up whilst he was on his last holiday – he was absolutely thrilled when he came home.

In 2011, Dad was diagnosed with prostate cancer. Then ten years later, a scan showed the cancer had spread to his spine. We were heartbroken when we were told that he had between three and twelve months to live.

He was placed on end-of-life care on 10th June 2022, which was actually my birthday. When Dad was admitted to Dr Kershaw’s Hospice, I was so upset. I had never been in a hospice before and thought it would be doom and gloom, like a ‘final curtain’.

Instead, when I walked into the family lounge on the Inpatient Unit, I couldn’t get over how peaceful the atmosphere was. The gardens were beautiful, and the staff were amazing. It was worlds apart from the previous care settings Dad had experienced.

We could contact Dad whenever we wanted, which gave us peace of mind. When someone you love is dying, the last thing you need is to worry about the care they are receiving. I knew that Dad was being looked after.

The staff couldn’t do enough for us. They never rushed their care or conversations, and that made all the

difference. Dad was worried at first, but he soon told me it was “brilliant”.

His face would light up when staff came into his room. Dad felt loved and cared for, and it is hard to imagine him being anywhere else at the end of his life. Having the family lounge meant that we could spend meaningful time together outside of his room – I loved being able to stay and have my tea with him.

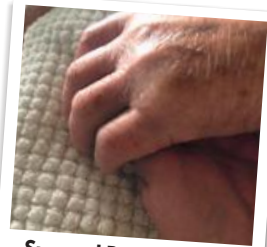
On Dad’s last Father’s Day, just before he died, he had the most perfect day. He was wheeled into the beautiful gardens and enjoyed a three-course meal with myself and two of his grandchildren.

His room was decorated with Father’s Day banners and the atmosphere was relaxed. It became one of the most precious memories we have of our final times with Dad. He died just a few days later.

Since then, I have supported the Hospice any way I can at Dad’s funeral. I signed up as a Lottery member, have made Light Up a Life dedications, and we asked people to donate at his funeral in lieu of flowers.

I hope that by supporting Dr Kershaw’s Hospice, it will continue to be there for other families. That is why leaving a gift in your Will is so important – even 1% of your Will would make a real difference.

It would help the Hospice to provide special care and precious memories for future patients and families. This is something I will be forever grateful for.



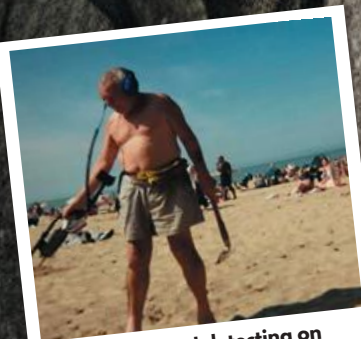

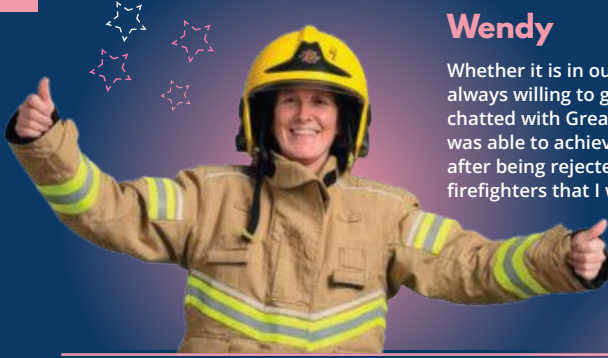

# 60 seconds with...

## our Volunteer Coordinator, Glenn Drake-Owen



**After being blown away by our spectacular volunteers, Glenn transferred from our Fundraising team to work with them more closely. He reveals what makes working at our Hospice so special**

Our gardens were recently awarded an 'Outstanding – Level 5' certificate by the Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) and North West in Bloom for the second year running.

## Hindu temple partnership tackling stigma

As part of our mission to highlight accessible palliative care within diverse communities, Dr Kershaw's Hospice has joined forces with a local Hindu temple.

Shree Swaminarayan Mandir is central to Oldham's Hindu population, providing a wide range of worship, learning and wellbeing support.

By partnering with the temple, we hope to tackle stigma around end-of-life care in the South Asian community and empower families to decide what is right for their loved ones.

Adele Doherty, CEO of Dr Kershaw's Hospice, said: "People from diverse ethnic groups may find it more difficult to access specialist palliative care services.

"We work alongside families to deliver care that aligns with beliefs and ways of living."

The temple has been an incredible support, including donating over 1,000 selection boxes for our Christmas campaign and hosting community events.

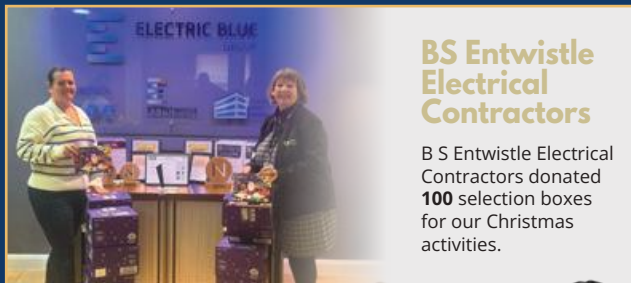
