

A Unique Approach to Entrepreneurship Education

Focus on Post-Startup Growth: While many entrepreneurship programmes concentrate on prestart activities like opportunity recognition and business model design, this course uniquely emphasises the management of new ventures from startup to scaleup and harvest.





Comprehensive Skill Development: This programme covers critical areas often overlooked in traditional entrepreneurship courses, such as selling, finance, talent management, and operations. It equips students with the skills needed for marketing & sales and finance & operations, addressing key deficits identified in Ireland's startup ecosystem (ScaleIreland surveys 2023, 2024).

Targeted Career Paths: The curriculum is tailored to prepare students for specific roles in the entrepreneurial landscape, including:






