A word from the

SENIOR PASTOR

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

We thank God for leading us into a "wilderness" experience as we vacated our church premises at No. 10 for the renovation works of our 30-year-old building. Our English congregation now meets at Bukit Panjang Gospel Chapel and our Mandarin congregation at the Methodist Church of the Incarnation for weekly Sunday worship services. We are grateful to these two churches for their generous response to our appeal for help. May the Lord bless them bountifully in the work of the gospel that they do.

In the Bible, the wilderness had been the place for God's people to draw close to God. With the relocation, we grapple with inconvenience and discomfort because we do not have our own space in which to hang out and hold ministry meetings.

But let us be reminded of two things. First, ministry can be carried out without brick-and-mortar premises. Certainly, while online meetings are now a viable option since the COVID-19 pandemic, I think of how, in some cross-cultural situations, evangelists might hold meetings under the shade of a tree to great effect, braving inclement weather. The early church met in the homes of believers. During this season, Hebronites have opened their homes for Bible studies and classes. They have also booked function rooms to host ministry meetings. Your hospitality is greatly appreciated.

Second, relationships are more important than activities. We are heartened that Hebronites reach out to one another on weekdays, go for dinner together after the Sunday 5pm worship service, and give time and energy to organise activities for the benefit of others. Do make a point to sign up for our monthly after-service dinners and, more than that, do make a date to eat with people with whom you are less familiar, including many of our new friends and visitors. Be regular at your KG meetings, look out for one another, encourage and pray for one another.

Our theme for 2025 is The Gospel is for Life. We seek to refresh our understanding of the gospel of Jesus Christ through the weekly preaching of God's Word and allow it to shape and align our values, attitudes and actions more closely with our identity as kingdom citizens. May the Lord help us grow and transform in Christlikeness.

If you are new in Hebron, we believe that the Lord has brought you here! We'd love to get to know you and to help you grow a sense of belonging to Christ and the local body of believers in Hebron! Do reach out to us even as we will look out for you!

The Movements in the HEBRON Worship Service

In Hebron, we worship God in three movements, viz.

ASSEMBLE TO WORSHIP

we come together as God's people to praise our Maker and Redeemer

ATTENTIVE TO GOD'S WORD

we heed the Word preached in the power of the Spirit

ALIGN FOR GOSPEL WORK

we go forth with the Good News to equip the saints and witness to the world

These movements help us to re-charge spiritually after a week in the world before returning to represent Christ in the world once more.



Some of Our Worship Service Practises

Standing to read Scripture is our way of demonstrating reverence for God's Word.

Kneeling for prayer is our usual prayer posture where space permits. It expresses a submissive attitude towards God. But feel free to sit for prayer if kneeling is physically challenging.

Offering is a time for Christians to express worship to God by a freewill giving of money towards his work through the church. If you are not a Christian, you need not give.

Benediction and Threefold Amen

The pastor proclaims a blessing from God to the congregation at the end of the worship service and the congregation affirms all that was heard and received by singing the amen.

Water baptism by sprinkling or pouring of water is practised in Hebron, since we follow the Reformed system of faith (see Westminster Confession of Faith, 28.3). Baptism is a sign and seal of God's covenant promise to his people. All believers are commanded to receive it (see Matthew 28:19) to signify their membership in the covenant.

Infant baptism is practised in Hebron. The infant children of one or both believing parents are entitled to receive the sign and seal of God's covenant promise (see Acts 2:38-39). In Hebron, such children become non-communicant members.

The Lord's Supper is observed monthly in Hebron. Its communicant members and baptised communicants of other Bible-believing churches who worship with us are welcome to partake of it. It reminds us of our covenant membership in Christ and its present and future benefits. Non-Christians, unbaptised Christians and non-communicant members of Hebron shall abstain.
