THE STORY OF FURNITURE IN WNC

Fairfield Chair:

Craft, Community, & Continuity in Lenoir



In Lenoir, furniture isn't just made — it's lived. It shapes the rhythm of daily life, the pride in steady work, and the legacy of families who've stayed even when the industry shifted around them. One company in particular has done more than stay — it's helped hold the town together.

Fairfield Chair Company, founded in 1921, is still headquartered in Lenoir, still owned by the Beall family, and still driven by the belief that craftsmanship and community are inseparable.

Built to Stay

That belief started generations before the company itself. James Harper, an ancestor of today's leadership, moved to the area in the early 1800s, opened one of Lenoir's first general stores, and donated land for the town's layout in 1841. Decades later, his grandson James Harper Beall Sr. purchased a bankrupt furniture plant and reopened it as Fairfield Chair — not just to build furniture, but to protect local jobs.

"My family's roots in Lenoir run deep," says Anne-Lindsay Beall. "Fairfield was restarted in 1921 with the goal of keeping opportunity in this town, and that commitment hasn't changed."

Leadership Through Generations

Public service has long been part of the Beall family's identity — from local government to business leadership. Anne-Lindsay's father, Harper Beall III, joined Fairfield at sixteen doing the hard, unglamorous work — sweeping floors, stacking lumber, and cleaning the ancient boiler. He eventually led the company for more than four decades with a quiet philosophy

that still guides the factory today: “Make every chair as though you were going to own it yourself.”

Harper was deeply respected by those who worked with him. Stories about his kindness still circulate — small moments that meant everything to those on the receiving end. When he passed in 2019, Fairfield lost more than a president. Lenoir lost one of its most loyal stewards.

In the years after Harper’s passing in 2019, longtime Board Chair John Beall — Harper’s brother and a steady presence at Fairfield — stepped in to help guide the company forward. “My uncle John was a good and kind man, a strong Christian, and a strong leader,” says Anne-Lindsay. “He wanted me here to make sure family leadership would carry on.”

John Beall passed away in late 2025, leaving behind not just a leadership role, but a legacy of humility, faith, and service to both the company and the community. His loss marked the end of another chapter in Fairfield’s family story — and strengthened





Anne-Lindsay's resolve to carry it into the next.

Today, that leadership continues through her and her cousin, John Beall, the founder's great-grandson. Anne-Lindsay serves as the new Chairman of the Board. For her, the work is personal.

"I saw how much my dad loved Fairfield — the people, the process, all of it," she says. "I understand that because I love it too. I feel a real sense of pride and responsibility in carrying this legacy forward."

Work You Can Feel

Inside Fairfield's two Lenoir plants, the company's values take physical form. Each piece of furniture passes through more than two dozen pairs of hands — from the first cut of hardwood to the final inspection. Skilled craftspeople shape frames, guide fabrics through industrial machines, upholster with practiced tension, and finish each piece with care. Robots assist with precision where needed, but the human eye still governs comfort, proportion, and feel.

"From frame-builders to upholsterers and sewers to hand-finishers, these individuals are true craftswomen and craftsmen," says CEO Dixon Mitchell. "They care deeply about what they make."

Anne-Lindsay agrees. "We absolutely use robotics and highly sophisticated machinery — they help us build with consistency. But there's no replacing decades of experience. What sets Fairfield apart is the pride our people take in their work, and the details only they will catch."

A Community Worth Building For

Fairfield employs around 500 people, many of them multi-generational. It's not uncommon to find a parent and child working side by side. "When most of the local industry moved production overseas, Lenoir was hit hard," Anne-Lindsay says. "But Fairfield stayed. We've made hard choices to keep people working."

That includes navigating economic shifts with

resilience. During the 2008 recession, the company pivoted into senior living furniture, a sector where it now leads nationally. During the 2020 pandemic, it secured a government contract to produce PPE — ensuring paychecks kept flowing even when furniture demand stalled.

“Our responsibility has always been bigger than profit,” she says. “It’s about honoring the people who built this company and protecting the community we serve.”

Forward Thinking, Firmly Rooted

That commitment also shows up in the details: all wood used is Forest Stewardship Council-certified. Fairfield was an early adopter of environmental practices within the American Home Furnishings Alliance. The company also invests in the future of skilled trades through apprenticeship partnerships with Caldwell Community College — ensuring that techniques like hand-finishing and upholstery aren’t lost to time.

Though it began as a chair company, Fairfield’s reach now extends into every room of the home, as well as commercial and hospitality spaces. Its catalog includes everything from traditional wingbacks to sleek contemporary silhouettes, made for boutique hotels, retirement communities, country clubs, and residential interiors nationwide.

Lenoir and Fairfield: Inseparable

Still, for all that growth, Fairfield’s identity remains deeply local. “Fairfield has always been part of the fabric of this town,” Anne-Lindsay says. “Our employees are our neighbors, our friends. In many cases, generations of the same family have worked here. You can see Fairfield’s impact in the churches, the schools, and the civic groups our people support. This company’s story is tied to the story of Lenoir.”

That connection isn’t just history — it’s



living, breathing, ongoing. The people who walk through Fairfield's doors each day don't just clock in; they show up with skill, pride, and the knowledge that what they're building matters. It matters to customers, yes — but also to their families, their coworkers, and their town. That sense of shared purpose is hard to manufacture. It grows slowly over time, through trust, consistency, and care.

Anne-Lindsay sees it every day — in the quiet way a veteran craftsman teaches a younger hire to perfect a finish, in the laughter from the breakroom, in the handwritten notes from employees who feel seen. "There's a kind of pride here that you can't force. It comes from doing something well, for a long time, and knowing it's appreciated," she says.

It's that enduring pride — not just in the furniture, but in the people behind it — that she believes will carry Fairfield forward. "We're not chasing trends," she says. "We're building on what lasts. People know when something's been made with care. They can feel it."

And the next chapter is already underway — built not just on memory or nostalgia, but on the enduring values of craft, integrity, and care.

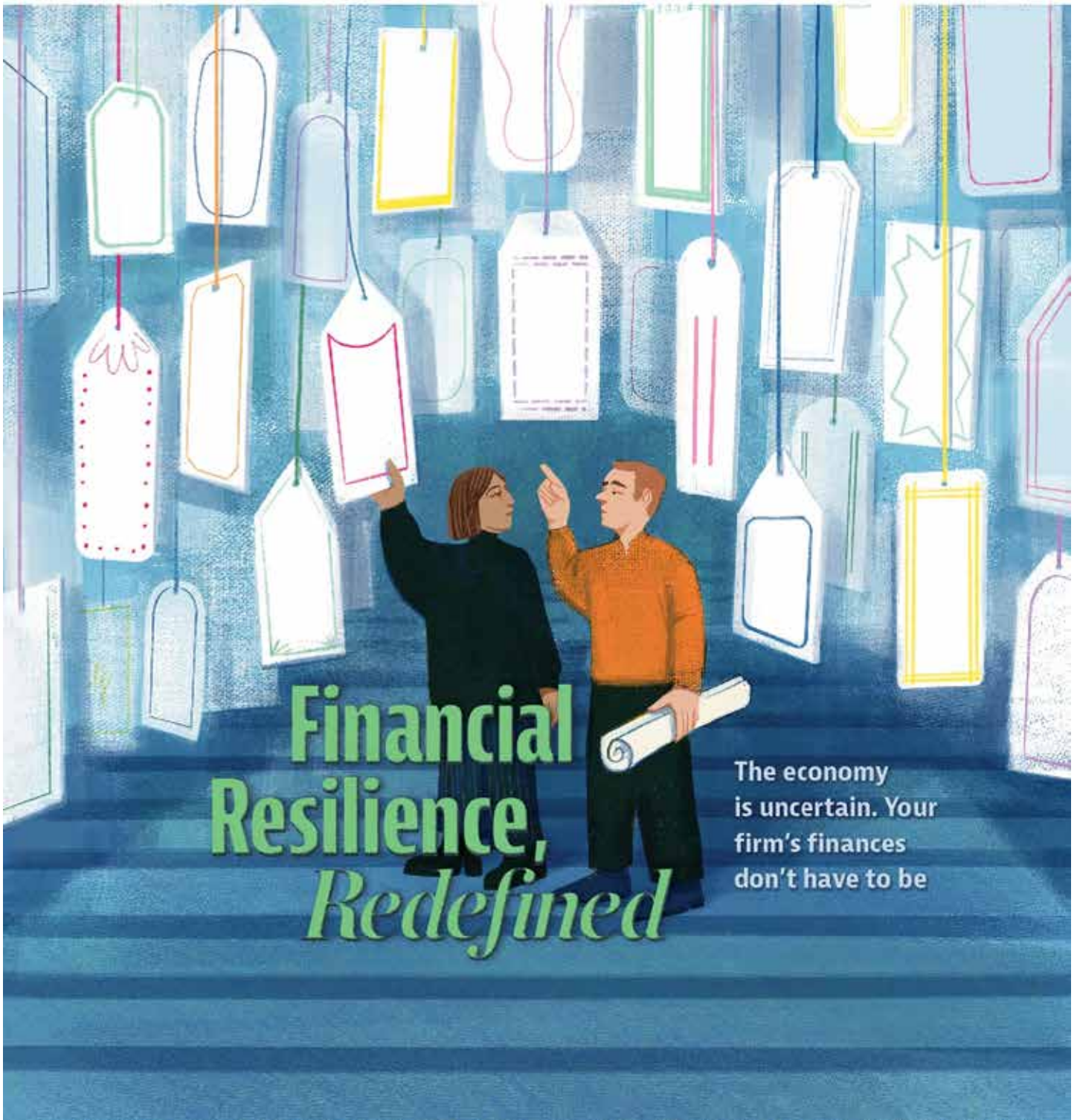
"There's nothing flashy about what we do," Anne-Lindsay says. "We just do it well, and we do it together. That's what makes Fairfield what it is — and why it still matters."

Resonance rules:

How mood and expression are driving home trends

Few words are tossed around as loosely as trend and lifestyle. They've been stretched so thin they risk losing all meaning, just when understanding them matters most.

As the pace and unpredictability of culture accelerate, decoding what drives aesthetic shifts has become essential to success in the home industry. At heart, both terms are reflections of the moment-visual expressions of who we are and how we connect that turn home and lifestyle design into a kind of shared language. Together, they capture the zeitgeist—or push back against it—shifting with the realities, needs and aspirations of modern life. The result: an expressive, hybrid home environment unlike anything the industry has seen before.

In the three years ahead, the tendency to embrace or resist (or both) will be expressed in two major trends that will shape the home-interiors conversation: Post-Minimal and Neo-Traditional.

Post-Minimal: resonates with consumers prioritizing wellness sensory comfort.

Neo-Traditional: appeals to those seeking timelessness, authenticity and balanced modernity.

Both open new paths for creativity and choice in an era defined by change. Most importantly, they also signal a collective move beyond Minimalism's austerity, advancing toward something warmer, more expressive and more emotionally resonant.

Post-Minimal: Serenity through simplicity

The Aesthetic: Warm Post-Minimalism channels serenity through simplicity, offering a softer, more tactile evolution of minimal design. It reflects a collective desire for calm, grounding spaces that simplify without feeling sterile. The look is clean-lined and uncluttered but enriched with texture and warmth—minimalism that feels lived-in rather than austere. Spaces are designed to be both functional and comforting, balancing clarity with a sense of quiet luxury.

The Materials: Natural oak, ash and walnut woods anchor the aesthetic, paired with finishes that highlight purity of form and the play of light. Transparency and optic effects introduce gentle movement, while tactile details like shagreen and hair-on-hide add depth. Warm metallics such as oiled bronze and brushed nickel lend subtle contrast.

The Palette & Form: Layered neutrals like warm whites, taupe and sand, meet earthy tones of clay and moss, punctuated by muted blues and greens. Furnishings stay low and modular, with rounded edges and fluid silhouettes that invite ease.

The Mood: Serenity and grounding define the emotional core. This is a restorative canvas for overstimulated lives – a space that balances clarity with comfort, simplicity with soul.

The introductions reflect a focused exploration of Organic Modern and New Traditional design styles, expressed through a more nuanced composition of material, form, and finish.

New upholstery introductions articulate this direction through a broadened range of silhouettes and detailing. Organic Modern emphasizes soft curvature and sculptural profiles, with pieces such as the Chloe and Kimpton sofas and the Ashby Lounge Chair establishing a relaxed, architectural sensibility. What happened at High Point Market?

If you've been keeping up with industry headlines, you'd be forgiven for assuming this spring's [High Point Market](#) would be a doom-and-gloom affair. [Tariff headwinds](#), surging freight costs and designers with [dwindling pipelines](#) have all been hallmarks of the past six months—how would they shape the market season? But as the design world touched down in High Point, North Carolina, something surprising seemed to take hold. The mood on the street was far more upbeat than Markets in recent memory: the introductions were more buoyant, and the showrooms were filled with a bit of inspiration.

TRAFFIC REPORT

While everyone loves to refrain, many showrooms perceived a slow start, especially true of showrooms from smaller brands, and some of the larger teams—the num-

Official registration numbers were down from last October's. The uptick in international registrations this spring—firms that had never before attended High Point Market.

Some would-be attendees may have skipped the trip to North Carolina in light of the show's overlap with [Salone del Mobile](#) in Milan—though a handful of jet-lagged editors and executives managed, perhaps miserably, to attend both. National and global politics likely played a role as well. The 44-day Department of Homeland Security shutdown that triggered massive airport delays from mid-February through March fell right at the time when most Market-goers buy their tickets; at the same time, surging fuel prices caused by conflict in Iran began to impact flight prices. Together, they created new hurdles to booking travel and likely made it far easier to sit out a cycle.

CHANGE IS AFOOT

Reinventing a home brand can be tedious, but the ongoing efforts of several companies made a lasting impact. With a bit of color and pattern in its Hamilton Place digs, upholstery brand [Burton James](#) had a fresh new look that was inspiring its designer customers; meanwhile, [Fairfield Chair](#) continued trending in the right direction with a great mix of new introductions, and [Roger Turnbow's](#) latest releases at ART offered a fresh take on its traditional-meets-modern styles. Over at [Arteriors](#), president [John Hart's](#) long-awaited refresh (alongside a fun new collection from [Barry Dixon](#)) created a spark of energy that is sure to continue at Markets to come.

[Barrie Benson's](#) return to Highland House, where she celebrated her original line's immersive display of new pieces and patterns (the roll-arm chaise in a crimson and [Charlotte Lucas's](#) first collection for Taylor King, which featured a stunning fireplace bench, and detail-driven upholstery decked in bullion fringe. [Noz Corbett Lighting](#) was an absolute delight, marrying jewelry-inspired motifs from [s](#)—like the Hoshi pendant's stretched silk shade suspended from a T-bar, which uses a new method for drying persimmons.

DETAILS

Coming into more displays. This spring, it was in full force, with bold and immersive lighting at every turn. Take, for example, the way [Kim Scodro](#) and [Suzanne Kasler](#) worked within the Hickory Chair showroom. Scodro delivered a master class in "a mix of gingham, floral and striped textiles paired with intricate applications of trims" and weaved the refined details of her designs. Kasler, meanwhile, drenched a long room with a narrow pink-and-white stripe. With walls, upholstery and pillows all in pattern, the result was a sublime sophistication.

Each, but the effect was just as breathtaking. The brand floated its vignettes within a restrained, sculptural furniture arrangements an installation-like feel. The lighting did the simple act of giving each concept room to breathe—only added to its impact. For example, [Thomas Pheasant's](#) new outdoor line was artfully arranged in a garden-like vignette reminiscent of a hedge maze. To add to the effect, Pheasant clad his upholstery from a lush green velvet and placed them in the showroom spaces that surround the new line, which was led by a lush landscape.

At [Vanguard](#), visitors moved through an splash spotlighting their custom capabilities. "We can do anything" is a hard sell in a showroom, where it's easy to internalize a singular piece on display rather than to focus on the details. At [Abner Henry](#), the solution was four designer vignettes, called The

he company's impeccable craftsmanship. At Vanguard, visitors moved through an

ist, but also a new approach to styling at sister showrooms Global Views and over in IHFC. Phillips Collection shifted how it showcases its line, separating its playful designs to clarify its range of offerings. And [Kim Salmela's](#) creative continues to bring a welcome jolt of energy to the upholstery brand.

Showrooms we visited: Designers keep asking brands to go bigger. [Jamie Young Co.](#) offered a great example of delivering on that ask, reimagining some of its bestselling mirrors at up to 60 inches wide. At [Currey & Company](#), five new oversized table lamp styles also followed that trend. At 5 or more feet tall, they're sculptural showstoppers for designers who need height atop large console tables in rooms with high ceilings.

The ongoing demand for indoor-outdoor living was also clear. [Rowe](#) offered the most comprehensive debut to meet the moment with its new [Allteriors](#) line, which takes many of its beloved indoor styles and transforms them with upholstery and occasional tables that work just as well alfresco. Over at [Gabby](#) was another clever approach—an indoor chair and an outdoor seating line displayed near one another, both with woven details inspired by the webbing of an antique snowshoe.

There were also microtrends galore to discover. Bookshelf lights were a recurring trend, popping up in various forms at [Pooky](#) and [Currey & Company](#) and in the new [Amber Lewis](#) lighting collection at [Four Hands](#). Bolster pillows inset into channels within a piece's arms, or strategically placed where cushions join, were also popular this spring; hooved ferrules adorned many a table and chair throughout the show; and we spotted several brands taking inspiration from Greco-Roman antiquities, including an inspired hallway display at [Currey](#) as well as [Eric Ross's](#) charming collaboration with [Chelsea House](#).

Finally, perhaps the most exciting feature of the spring show: joy. As one executive told us, "I've never laughed more at Market."

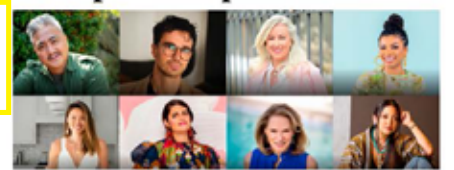

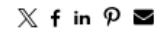

Sleeper sofas are making a comeback



Flip through enough design catalogs, and you'll be confronted with a curious development: the stylish sleeper sofa. Dig a little deeper, and you'll find that these multitasking furniture pieces have also evolved to be surprisingly comfortable. Gone are the days of clunky box springs, uncomfortable bars, eyesore designs, and confusing mechanisms that take two or more people to unfold. With sleek designs that don't sacrifice comfort, a new wave of dual-purpose pieces are proving they're worthy of more than just the basement.

"As real estate prices and rent go up, people are left in smaller spaces than they might have been five or 10 years ago. In smaller spaces, inherently, people need more multifunction," says Lance Trachier, the creative director at [American Leather](#), an industry leader in cushioned seating. "Typically, when I think of sleeper sofas, it's usually in the guest room, but we're seeing a lot more people using sleeper sofas as their primary sleeping surface. In a small studio apartment in a metropolitan area where someone doesn't have enough space to have a living room and a bedroom, they can use these as a really great two-for-one."

[Phantila Phataraprasit](#), the CEO of sustainable furniture company [Sabai](#), has also seen sleepers being used as a primary sofa. "Especially for customers in apartments or smaller homes where the living room has to do triple duty as a TV room, home office and guest room—that changes everything about what people are looking for," she says. "They're not willing to settle for a sleeper that looks like a sleeper anymore. It has to be the sofa they actually want, that happens to also turn into a bed."

The rise of rental properties on platforms like Airbnb and Vrbo has also caused an uptick in demand. “The need for additional multipurpose sleepers has increased,” says Dixon Mitchell, CEO of North Carolina furniture company Fairfield Chair. “Property owners are looking for space efficiency and flexibility within their sleeping arrangements, and the sleeper sofa is a great solution for providing additional guest accommodations without sacrificing the overall design of the space.”

Until recently, the market provided consumers with few options and little choice. But new technologies have allowed for advancements that make some sleepers just as comfortable as a regular mattress. “We entered this market because the existing models were just terrible,” says Trachier. “They were always terrible sofas *and* terrible sleepers—it was kind of the worst of both worlds. And so it really started as an exercise in trying to figure out how to make the *best* of both worlds. A lot of people have a really good frame of reference on what a sofa should feel like, but I think everybody has a really poor perception of what mattress comfort is going to be on a sleeper sofa. So to elevate on that front is really more about adding some wow-factor options that people don’t have. For us to have mattress options, to have different ways to specify your comfort, it’s a lot more special on the sleep side of things.”

To achieve these goals, the bed mechanism technology had to change. Brands worked with engineers to create conditions that resemble a traditional platform bed; unlike first-generation sleepers, the mattress doesn’t fold into parts and get stuffed under the cushion—instead, the effect is more like that of a box spring, or the slatted bars that distribute support across the length of the mattress. “What you probably conjure in your mind

of a sleeper sofa, it's usually a spring mattress folded in half," says Trachier. "Because it's a loose-spring core, they have to put [in] bars to support that mattress so you don't sink, and over time, you just feel those bars. Everybody has a memory of sleeping on grandma's pullout couch and remembers the springs and the bars as being really uncomfortable. We figured out a three-platform mechanism that, for lack of a better word, 'origamis' into a sofa. Instead of everything having to sit underneath the seat, some of it sits underneath the back of the sofa. It is a very smart use of space, which allows us to both have a bigger mattress when it's unfolded and have a better seating experience when it's full."

Los Angeles-based interior and furniture designer Kim Salmela's [Jasper sofa](#) for Norwalk also doesn't fold on itself, allowing for more leeway in the rest of the sofa design. "The past 30, 40 years we've been really limited to those drop-in systems where you take the seat cushions off, you pull it out, fold it over, and you've got that 3- or 4-inch mattress, which is usually not terribly comfortable," she says. "That particular mechanism has limitations: You have to have a very deep rail and almost no leg on it to be able to accommodate and hide the mechanism. What I love about the Jasper is that you have a really clean look because the trundle itself is really the front rail, so it slides out, and then just pops up to meet the same height as the top of the seat and turns into a bed."

The upsides to many of these new sleeper sofa designs aren't just aesthetic—they've also eliminated the need for confusing mechanics or uncomfortable bars that dig into your back. "The mechanism needs to be intuitive and easy to convert from sofa to bed and back again, without requiring two people or a wrestling match," says Phataraprasit, whose company developed a foldout style of its own. "With the [Eclipse](#), where the seat cushion itself unfolds to become part of the bed, the opposite challenge can show up too: The cushion can read as visually bulky if it isn't proportioned carefully, because it has to be substantial enough to sleep on. And then there's the silhouette itself—arms and bases often get boxy to accommodate the mechanism inside. We worked hard to design around all of those: The Eclipse reads as a sofa first, with proportions that don't telegraph 'This is a sleeper.'"

Given the prominence of these pieces in a room, visual appearance has become an increasingly important factor. American Leather's [wide array of sleeper styles](#) range from transitional to contemporary and are available in hundreds of different fabric and leather options for a fully customizable look. Sabai's Eclipse collection features 70- and 90-inch sofa versions that fold out into a queen-size mattress, as well as a sleeper chair—all of which are available in three different fabrics and dozens of colors. Fairfield's Katy twin sleeper boasts scallop trim and comes in a range of styles and fabrics as well—a seat so cute you'd never guess it pulled out into a bed. "Having a customer react with surprise that the upholstered sofa is actually a sleeper is a huge win," says Mitchell.

Salmela had the sofa design top of mind when creating the Jasper. "I just [thought], 'Why can't sleeper sofas look like real sofas? Why do they have to be straight, track-arm, two cushions, loose seat?'" she says. "I wanted something that was stylish, but really could lend itself to different design aesthetics. I wanted it to look like a beautifully designed sofa that has the added bonus of that sleeper. Because, really, most people are using this as a sofa 96 percent of the time."

The crux of the matter is, it's about striking the right balance between sleep comfort and seat comfort and not sacrificing on either end. "If you start with the sofa silhouette and try to retrofit a bed mechanism into it, you end up compromising the sleep experience," says Phataraprasit. "If you start with the bed and build a sofa around it, you get something that looks like a piece of convertible furniture rather than a beautiful sofa. Our approach was to design for both from day one, treating it as a single object that has to perform two jobs equally well. The Eclipse sleeper had to look like a sofa someone would choose for their living room even if they never unfolded it once."

As more and more brands are catching on, the days of sacrificing comfort and looks for utility are long over. "The industry myth is that you typically have to pick one or the other," says Trachier. "You have to pick the sleeper sofa that sits really well or the sleeper sofa that sleeps decently. And that's just not the case. If you really vet your vendors and where these are coming from, you *can* have both."

North Carolina's Furniture Industry Scrambles as Tariffs Upend Day-to-Day Routines

After years of decline, businesses are a far cry from the glory days of being 'Furniture Capital of the World' amid price hikes and supply chain snafus

Colleen Bennett has a habit of opening new businesses at the toughest possible times.

Bennett opened an interior design business right before the Covid-19 pandemic. This time, she's opening a furniture manufacturing venture — and in the time of tariffs, she's hoping it will be an easier journey.

Bennett, 43, is making this play in a part of North Carolina that was once home to the "Furniture Capital of the World."

"Where we live is where it was born and bred," said Bennett. "The goal is to bring that back."

But years of off-shoring, consolidation and cheap Chinese imports led to the loss of tens of thousands of jobs and the crumbling of an industry that once was a way of life. Hometown companies like Henredon Furniture and Drexel Heritage got swept up in corporate takeovers and others fell into bankruptcy, leaving plants empty and unused.

It's not going to be an easy journey. This part of North Carolina, known as the Piedmont, has lost much of the know-how that defined it for decades. Though far from those glory days, manufacturers and sellers hope higher quality, locally made pieces will lure customers back to showrooms.

President Trump said in a Truth Social post he wants to bring back furniture production to North Carolina, and he would impose "substantial tariffs" on any country that doesn't make furniture in the U.S. Earlier this month, new 25% tariffs on lumber, upholstered furniture and kitchen cabinets went into effect.

But industry executives say that rising tariffs on imported parts have already started to [bite into profits](#).

Bassett Furniture CEO Robert Spilman Jr. said half of Bassett's fabrics came from China and the company discontinued a lot of that. Bassett also imports fabrics, plywood, componentry and finished goods from Vietnam and India which have been hit by tariffs.

So, despite having 80% of its wholesale shipments manufactured or assembled in the U.S., the company raised retail prices in July. Spilman said the company has been "somewhat insulated" by its domestic manufacturing, but today's furniture industry is truly a global enterprise.

Winds of Change

Before the new tariffs, manufacturers finally felt like they were in a stable position, learning how to adapt to the flood of cheaper imported furniture over the past two decades from places like [China, Vietnam and Indonesia](#).

Bigger companies, like Ethan Allen Interiors were able to slim down operations, getting core materials like wood from domestic suppliers while things like fabric and structural components come for cheaper from Asia.

Ethan Allen — a publicly traded company with 2025 sales of over \$614 million — maintains a presence in North Carolina with plants in Maiden and Old Fort. Having its core supply chain stateside has allowed the company to handle higher-quality orders in a way that manufacturers that moved overseas cannot, says its top executive.

"We decided that customization would give us a great advantage," said Ethan Allen CEO Farooq Kathwari.

Making its operations nimble required Ethan Allen to tighten its belt— paring its warehouse count and reducing its staff by 35% in the past six years, and cutting 5% to 6% of its staff in fiscal 2025, Kathwari said on an earnings call in July.

[Ethan Allen says that it makes 75% of its furniture in North America](#) — with the remaining 25% made overseas, including at a partner plant in Indonesia. But that 75% isn't just the U.S.; there are newer plants in Mexico and Honduras, where labor is considerably more affordable.

In Need of Workers

If tariffs are able to create new investment, finding skilled labor may be a challenge. Laborers trained to do jobs like sewing and woodworking were left behind after companies fled overseas. These workers were then forced to find new jobs and learn different skills – allowing the knowledge and expertise of the previous generations to be lost.

“This rebuild is going to require another generation of craftspeople,” said Dixon Mitchell, who runs Fairfield Chair Co. out of Lenoir, N.C.

From 1990 to 2010, furniture employment in North Carolina plummeted to just over 30,000 jobs from 90,000 jobs, according to data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Meanwhile, furniture imports from overseas exploded. China accounted for 2% of the furniture imported to the U.S. in 1990, at just over \$100 million, according to data from the International Trade Commission. By 2000 that number had ballooned to \$4.1 billion, and by 2010 to over \$14 billion, or nearly half of all furniture imports to the U.S.

Mitchell’s company employs 450 people and provides apprenticeships to young workers joining its ranks, and works with the local community college system to help train up students to be able work on a factory floor.

Bennett is confident that her new manufacturing venture, a plant building upholstered furniture, will be able to find the workers it needs. But she acknowledges that it may be difficult to get new people interested in rejoining the industry.

“No 23-year-old is like ‘I want to be an upholsterer when I get out of school,’” said Bennett.

Bracing for Price Hikes

Meanwhile, Bennett says the new round of tariffs forced her to expedite the shipping of components, like fabric, to avoid paying significantly more for them once tariffs went into effect.

“We’re literally having to airfreight stuff,” said Bennett.

Her interior design company has grown beyond the original six clients — to 150 clients internationally that contract her to furnish and stage their homes. The latest tariffs threaten to expose Bennett, a 20-year veteran of the industry, to more price hikes.

As an interior designer, Bennett’s business makes money by charging clients a premium to the wholesale prices she pays for the furniture she acquires. But higher prices mean that she has to pay more up front, and convince her clients to absorb the steeper costs.

“I have to go back to the client and say ‘Guess what, I’m not eating that,’” she said, one of many business owners in the Piedmont

who expects to pass cost increases onto customers.

Though consumers being cautious about their spending, Bennett believes that jumping into the fire now is a business risk that pays off. The factory will attempt to source all of its components from other suppliers in North Carolina, building sofas and chairs that middle-class consumers can afford.

“If you have a forest fire and you’re the last tree standing, you’re the tallest tree,” she said.

At Fairfield — the “Quiet Giant” of Lenoir —
furniture is a family tradition.

When Anne-Lindsay Beall (opposite) began working as the lead director of Fairfield’s Board of Directors in 2022, following a 22-year career at SAS in Cary, she says it felt like a homecoming.

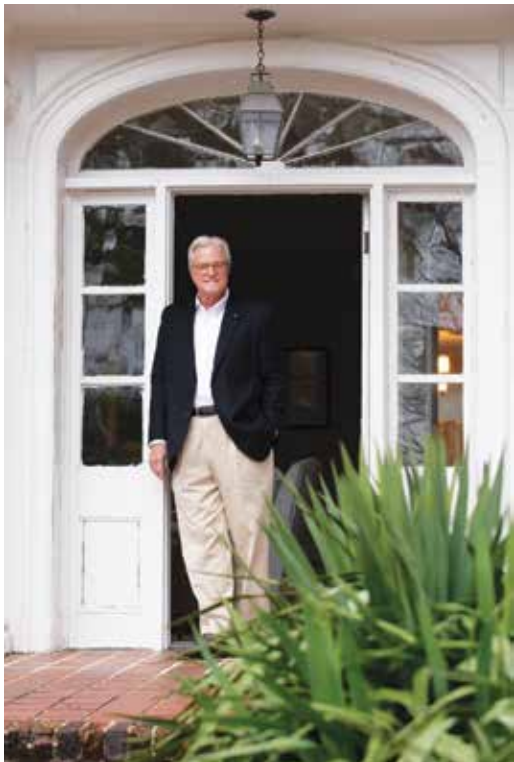
She's sitting in the boardroom of Fairfield, the 104-year-old furniture company her great-grandfather started in Lenoir, but this isn't a typical corporate setting. Instead of overlooking a factory or towering in a high-rise, this boardroom is a former apartment in the historic Fairfield House, finished in 1829 by Anne-Lindsay's great-great-great-grandfather James Harper. It's the same house where, growing up, she spent Friday nights with her grandparents, and the same room where she used to sneak chocolate chip cookies from her great-aunt Mary-Lindsay, her namesake.

"We had all of our July Fourth picnics at this house under the walnut tree," Anne-Lindsay

recalls. "The kids would pick up those nasty green walnuts and throw them at each other. I was in and out of this house my whole childhood."

Now she's in and out of the house as the fourth generation of leadership for Fairfield, a company that employs some 500 people in Lenoir. In its two plants — including a 1912 factory building located just a block from Fairfield House — it produces an average of 2,000 unique pieces of upholstered furniture a week. Quite an accomplishment considering that between 1999 and 2009, North Carolina's furniture industry lost more than half its jobs, and competitors like Bernhardt and Broyhill stopped manufacturing or closed their Lenoir plants.

With its enduring commitment to Caldwell County, Fairfield stayed afloat and continues to make 80 percent of its products domestically. Even during the pandemic, employees produced

masks and gowns in order to keep the doors open. The black walnut tree, estimated to be more than 250 years old, still stands tall outside the home, and the Beall (pronounced Bell) family still keeps its delivery trucks filled as it supports the community it loves.

ANNE-LINDSAY'S FAMILY HAS BEEN INVESTING IN Lenoir since before the town's inception. It was James Harper who donated 30 acres to the group that established Lenoir in 1841. Originally from Fairfield, Pennsylvania, he'd moved to the area for health reasons and opened J. Harper & Son, a general store.

As the family put down roots, the region was steadily building a reputation for making furniture thanks to its abundance of hardwoods, local craftsmanship, and low-cost labor. Many Foothills residents made the switch from farming to earning steady wages offered by factory jobs, and by 1900, 44 furniture factories were operating in High Point and surrounding towns.

One of those factories, the Ethel Chair Company, went bankrupt in 1921, and James Harper Beall Sr., Anne-Lindsay's great-grandfather, saw an opportunity. As president of Bank of Lenoir, he bought the company. He recapitalized, renamed, and relaunched it, with his main impetus being to keep jobs in Lenoir.

James Harper Beall II ran the company after

that, priming his son James “Harper” Beall III, Anne-Lindsay’s father, to be president. Harper got his start at age 16, sweeping the floors, loading lumber, and cleaning out the boiler, one of the oldest in the state. He worked his way up and spent more than 40 years at Fairfield before his death in 2019.

Just like his father, Harper knew his employees by name, and when he asked how they were doing, he stuck around to hear the answer. Cleta Bennett pauses in reverence before sharing the kind things he did for her. An employee for nearly 30 years, some of those as Harper’s executive assistant, Bennett remembers how he paid for her family to fly to Colorado to attend her father’s memorial service.

Then there’s the story of an employee who’d recently been diagnosed with diabetes and needed to see a doctor. Harper, also a diabetic, gave up his own appointment with a specialist in Hickory because his employee needed the medical attention more.

“That’s how Harper was. He would do things so wonderful for people and didn’t want any recognition for it,” says Lisa Thomson, who’s worked at Fairfield for 22 years.

Harper’s imprint remains indelible throughout

the company. Along one wall of Plant 2, just above workers trimming chairs and sofas with individually hammered nails, is his mantra: "Make every chair as though you were going to own it yourself?"

Anne-Lindsay says her father cared deeply about the furniture Fairfield created because he knew it was going into people's businesses and homes to provide comfort, ease, and beauty in their lives. "My dad listened more than he talked, treated everyone with respect, and quietly helped others," she says. "He was a brilliant businessman who made bold moves that grew the company, but he was humble and quiet about his success."

That approach to business earned the company the moniker "Quiet Giant." In the Foothills, where the furniture industry thrived throughout most of the 20th century, Fairfield flew under the radar. Some of the locals who work at Fairfield didn't know about the company until they applied for a job there. But even as the industry faltered in the early 2000s,

the Bealls stayed true to the family tradition: keeping furniture in Lenoir.

AS DIXON MITCHELL, THE PRESIDENT AND CEO OF Fairfield, walks through the finishing department in Plant 2, skeletons of chairs dangle on a line like Christmas lights as workers spray them with the precision that only years of practice can render.

"I'm not an ivory tower guy in my office," he says. "I'm managing by walking around, talking to the people, finding out the problems and good things."

A native of Hickory, Mitchell has spent 35 years in the furniture industry. He's seen companies come and go in the region, along with the devastating effects major closings have had on the community. To combat that, he has reinvigorated Fairfield during his eight years there by launching a rebranding campaign, implementing a strategic plan, and upgrading equipment to state-of-the-art robotic machinery.

He refers to Fairfield's business components as a three-legged stool. There's private label (making furniture for other companies that do the marketing), the commercial sector (country clubs, funeral homes, hospitality, and senior living), and conventional retail.

While chairs with clean lines, rich upholstery, and meticulous finishes are still a big part of the business, Fairfield has evolved from its roots as a chair manufacturer: Today, it makes furniture for every room of the home, offering collections with mid-century influences, as well as traditional pieces with modern flair.

INSIDE PLANT 1, OLD LINEBERRY CARTS LOADED WITH freshly cut pieces of solid wood stand next to million-dollar machines. Twenty-seven people touch each piece of furniture before it leaves the plants. This mix of old and new — modern machinery combined with expert craftsmanship — demonstrates Fairfield’s respect for the past and its anticipation for the future.

“I have the philosophy that we need to work really hard, so we need to laugh; we need to enjoy each other,” Mitchell says.

He recalls the fun that coworkers have together while competing in Halloween contests, breaking bread during the annual Thanksgiving barbecue dinner, and building floats for Lenoir’s Starry Night Christmas Parade. Creating this kind of atmosphere builds trust, and Mitchell and Anne-Lindsay both say that Fairfield’s people are its greatest asset. In return, its employees are loyal to the company: Many of them say it’s where they want to retire.

“Everybody just helps everybody,” says Sylvia Roark, who leads the cutting department in Plant 2 and has worked for Fairfield for 46 years. Roark takes her job seriously — she always wants

to know which furniture her cut pieces are going to — but she also appreciates the fact that she can celebrate birthdays with coworkers. “They’ve been good to me, so I can’t complain about working here whatsoever,” she says. “I’m glad it’s still going strong.”

That’s the goal of Fairfield’s leadership team, to keep everything going strong — in Lenoir.

Back at Fairfield House, there’s a photo that Anne-Lindsay cherishes. It’s Halloween, and she’s 5 years old, wearing a furry gray mouse costume and snuggled up on her father’s lap. Her father is dressed for the office in his pressed white shirt. His files and reports are put to the side as he sits on a circa-1970s couch — made by Fairfield, of course — playing with his daughter. One of the things she loved most about him was that he always made time for her.

“My dad was a great leader, and I want so much to be like him. There are not that many great leaders in this world, and he just set such a beautiful example,” she says. “That’s what I want to follow.”

She’s determined to carry on his legacy, to keep up the tradition of making furniture in Lenoir. She knows he’d be proud. **Os**

Tariff tango

Could evolving changes reshuffle global trade alliances?

At least when it comes to doing business, every furniture manufacturer, supplier and retailer can attest that the first three months of the Trump presidency have been a whirlwind.

And that's mainly due to one thing: tariffs.

Since Feb. 1 (but really dating back to his campaign), President Donald Trump has made tariffs a main talking point.

First, the idea was a universal tariff on all countries and imports, which then morphed into 25% tariffs on Canada and Mexico, as well as 10% additional tariffs on China. After a series of pauses and adjustments, they're currently in effect on Canada and Mexico, but with a host of exemptions that substantially reduce their impact.

At press time, we have just experience "Liberation Day." On April 2, Trump

announced sweeping reciprocal tariffs on all major trading partners. It represents a move that — as long as tariff numbers remain unchanged — is sure to transform the entire global economy.

Companies in the furniture industry, particularly those that source product from or have manufacturing bases in Canada and Mexico, have struggled to keep up with pace of change in Trump's tariff policy. Those that source from China have at least seen consistency, though now pay tariffs totaling 45% on many items.

And now, with Liberation Day, virtually every supplier — with perhaps the sole exception of those that manufacture their entire product domestically — must contend with tariffs. Initial reactions from suppliers indicate price increases are sure to come, at least if current levels stay the same.

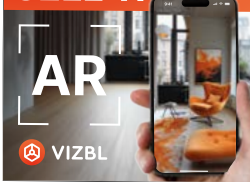
