



BAKED EGGPLANT DISH

BY PARENT GEORGE KOZAH

METHOD

1. Prepare Eggplants

Peel 2 eggplants in 3 vertical strips (as shown in the image).
Cut into large 4 cm cubes.
Spray with olive oil and place in a baking dish.
Bake at 180°C for ~45 minutes, or until browned.



2. Cook Onion Mixture

Cut onions into wedges.
Sauté in a pan with 1/3 cup olive oil.
After 2 minutes, add chopped garlic.
Cook for ~10 minutes on medium heat.
(Optional) Add finely chopped chillis.

3. Assemble the Dish

Spread the onion/garlic mixture over the baked eggplant.
Slice tomatoes and arrange on top.
Rinse chickpeas and sprinkle over.
Add 1 tsp salt.

2 large eggplants Olive oil spray 2 tomatoes

2 large onions 7 garlic cloves

1 spoon of tomato paste

1 cup of water

1 can of chickpeas

1/3 cup of extra virgin olive oil

2 tsp of salt

2 bay leaves

Fresh chilli (optional)

4. Add Sauce

Dissolve tomato paste in 1 cup of water with 1 tsp salt.
Pour over the dish.
Add bay leaves.

5. Final Bake

Bake at 190°C for ~1 hour.

Serving Suggestion

Best served cold, ideally made a day in advance.

Pairs well with thin crispy bread or a bed of spinach and rocket.



As we celebrate the Feast Day of **St Anthony of Padua**, we take a moment to honour the life of a saint who continues to inspire us with his compassion, wisdom, and deep love for others. Known as the "Saint of Miracles" and the "Finder of Lost Things," St Anthony lived a life of service, humility, and faith.

Here are 5 cool things you might not know about St Anthony:

- 1. He's the Patron Saint of Lost Things People all over the world pray to St Anthony when they've lost something important.
 - as a Brilliant Speaker Even though he was shy, his sermons were so powerful that crowds would gather from miles around to hear him.
- 3. He Loved the Poor St Anthony gave :hing he had to help those in need and often spoke out against injustice.
- 4. He's One of the Most Popular Saints in the World – Churches, schools, and cities across be are named after him.



Inspired by the Spirit, Guided by the Saints.



Each student prayerfully chose a saint who reflected something they admired or aspired to live out, and a gift of the Holy Spirit that spoke to the desires of their heart.

While the children may not fully understand it yet, the choices they made can deeply shape their faith journey. Some were drawn to courageous saints like St Joan of Arc or Blessed Carlo Acutis, who faced challenges with unwavering trust in God. Others felt a connection to peacemakers such as St Francis of Assisi or St Teresa of Calcutta, whose lives were marked by compassion, humility and service.

Whatever inspired their decisions, these saints will continue to intercede for them throughout their lives. In fact, I like to think that in a mysterious and beautiful way, the saints may have chosen the children too.







Be assured that we will be praying for each and every child and for you too.




