## Spotlight on the Colleges...

### **Asiatic**

A huge shout out to Asiatic College. We've made a great start to the year, amassing 13692 Reward points... so far. Just for clarity that is almost 5 times the number of Consequences that Asiatic has received. As a college team our focus is on Rewards so this is great to see. There are some exciting reward incentives coming soon so watch this space. Well done to the vast majority of Asiatic who have consistently been in the correct uniform with the correct equipment; keep it up.

We have watched a number of assemblies including conflict and tolerance, highlighting how British Values are integrated into our school through our CORE values.

During mentor time we've been covering topics such as Courageousness and how having the courage to do the right thing and to stand up for the right thing can have a positive impact on not only our own community within the school but the wider community outside of the school as well.

With that in mind, if we can continue to do the right thing, in the right place at the right time then I am sure as a college we can continue to smash those reward points and look to at the very least improve on last year's competitions up to and including sports day.

We look forward to building on this positive start and competing against the other colleges in upcoming schoolwide events.




### Sixth Form...

We have been delighted to welcome over 175 students into our Year 12 this September to join the 190 that have moved into Year 13.

These Year 12 students have been settling into life at Finham Park Sixth form and have been getting used to A-Level lessons and how to use their study periods.

In Period 1 sessions they have learned about the "Cycle of independent learning" (pictogram below) which they should be using to support their study away from lessons. They have also had sessions on organisation of folders, how to create a study timetable, how to take notes and how to revise.

### Continuing to support Year 13 on their next steps

Year 13 students are now well underway with their exploration and applications that will take them on the next steps of their post Sixth Form journey. They have had P1 sessions on how to complete UCAS applications, how to choose the right course and how to find apprenticeships.

Before half term we finalised and submitted 15 "Early Entry" University applications for students applying to Oxford University, Cambridge University and courses in Medicine. We are looking forward to keeping up to date with how their applications are progressing!

The remaining Year 13 students are currently spending their P1 sessions updating their applications and putting final touches to their personal statements or covering letters to support their desired Post 18 pathway before the final deadline to submit their UCAS application on the 28<sup>th</sup> November.

### Fund raising and support for charities

Our Sixth Form Students have continued their amazing support for good causes this year with events supporting the "Bhumi" organisation which helps to support access to education for children in India and a breast cancer awareness campaign.

An awareness assembly followed by a bake sale raised over £250 pounds to send to the Bhumi organisation.

A bake sale and "wear it pink" alongside a "just giving" page raised over £2000 that will be sent to support breast cancer research!

A big well done to all involved for organising the support for these causes and our students and staff that stepped up to donate!





### **Out Of Hours opportunities**

As well as timetabled opportunities to take part in recreational sport, learn DIY skills, participate in yoga sessions, play board games and access further study support, students have been accessing extra curricular activities such as the Gold Duke of Edinburgh award, Debating club, Medical Society, Law Society, Crochet club and also sport enrichment including Football, Netball, Basketball and Badminton clubs. These have also been in addition to our "Period 6+" provision that has included lecture style talks on the genocide in Rwanda, careers in Physiotherapy and How to apply for Medicine/Dentistry and Veterinary Medicine.

# Uganda '24 trip – Immersive Learning...

Fifteen Year 13 students spent ten days away travelling to Uganda and spending time with African students and each other on an immersive learning educational visit during October half term.

Since 2018, Finham Park School has been partnered with Viva College School, Jinja, Uganda. This partnership has been forged to include quality assurance CPD for teaching staff, links around the curriculum and teaching schemes and International Conferences between Uganda and UK students. We regularly meet online via Zoom (once per month) with staff to keep the links and relationships alive.



Our most recent visit in October 2024 led to pupils leading assemblies in Viva College School with students discussing topics such as globalisation, concepts of justice, the role of religion in society, the place of social media and equality. Students live with and eat with Ugandan students as well as tour the local area, producing a talent show performance together. They are able to learn vast amounts from their peers in Uganda about their culture with the learning experience being reciprocated.



We want students to understand privilege, to consider global sustainability and to become more culturally aware. We want to increase students' confidence in public speaking, develop their teamwork skills and improve and widen their understanding of other religions and cultural beliefs. The organiser of the activity stated students link the visit to our Finham core values and relate to the global agenda on social justice and character development.'

Students develop a rich appreciation for their own culture. They engage with fundraising opportunities, celebrate cultural awareness through culture days in school and talk with others about the influence and impact sharing experiences with peers from a vastly different culture can have.

Students from both cultures learn how to co-exist, drawing from their own experiences so that they celebrate differences and diversity rather than tolerate it. This underpins the culture within our ethnically and religiously diverse community within the school.

  - ✓ 'What I didn't expect was how poor most people are and how they live day to day.'
- What surprised you?
  - ✓ 'How friendly the Africans were. Everywhere you go they are pleased to see you. They smile and laugh constantly' Their countryside is just so colourful, not desert like at all.
  - ✓ 'How much they value their education and just how hard they work in school.
  - ✓ 'How similar our views are on equality, justice, globalisation. There is more that unites us.
    - What have you learned from the experience?
      - ✓ 'It has really put things in perspective for me as I think about my life after school'.
      - ✓ 'I want to now live every day to the fullest. I have the utmost respect for them.'




### Access to phone app

## Year 11 and Year 12 visit to Kiel - July 2024

Finham Park School took a group of 16 students to visit the Ricarda-Huch Schule in Kiel to participate in a joint programme based around sports, language and culture. Our students were matched with a German partner before the visit and were able to get to know them over the course of the week through a variety of social activities, such as watching the Euros final and a barbecue.

During the visit some of our Y12 BTEC PE students and Sports Leaders were able to further develop their coaching skills by introducing sports such as rounders and dodgeball to classes of 11 and 12 year old German children. Our students had to work out strategies to overcome the language barrier to explain the rules of each activity. The rest of the group were able to accompany their partners to experience lessons German style and to support English conversation lessons.

We were welcomed to Kiel by the Mayor and had opportunities to explore the Town Hall and the city centre. We spent a day in the city of Hamburg including a visit to Miniatur Wunderland, one of the most popular tourist attractions in Germany. The highlight of the week for many students was the opportunity to go sailing on the Kieler Förde and to discover beach volleyball with their German partners. We are hoping that students from the Ricarda-Huch Schule will be able to visit Coventry again next summer.



### School Productions ...


It's been a time for celebrating success in the Finham Park Drama Department this term.


# World Class Day – July 2024 ...






Selection of laser cut banner workshop outcomes.

# Mandarin Excellence Programme - update ...

Congratulations to the current Y11 MEP students who have passed their HSK 3 Mandarin exam with flying colours! Special shoutout to Chuiki L who got 100 and Rebekah D and Holly P who were just a few marks off 100%.

In June, the current Y11 MEP students created some fantastic videos in Mandarin showcasing Coventry. They not only recorded a voiceover in Mandarin, but also interviewed the public in English and Mandarin about their opinions of Coventry. In a competition with all the other MEP schools in the country they were awarded overall best film.

The Y9 China trip took place in July. It was the first trip back to China since Covid. Our students went to Shanghai for 11 days of intensive language and culture learning at East Capital Normal University, bartered in Chinese, visited a Chinese Middle School and did some sightseeing. Miss Mansell and Mr Crawford are so proud of how respectful and enthusiastic our students were. They progressed so much in their Mandarin and made life-long friendships with the students from the middle school they joined them for culture lessons. They were stars in both the Chinese and English media as The British Council filmed the activities in China and interviewed students, teachers and parents.









# Inaugural MAT Robotics Summit - November 2024 ...

To support our Finham Park MAT World Class guarantee, each school within the trust was invited to attend the first ever MAT Robotics Summit. The summit was held at Finham Park School and focused on mastering the use of VEX IQ robotic kits through a series of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Maths (STEM) challenges. Students collaborated in teams on driver challenges and programming skills before exploring the rules and regulations of the VEX IQ 2024/25 competition "Rapid Relay", which will be used for the MAT Robotics Competition in the summer term. Each school left the summit with an understanding of the build, drive and program requirements for the competition. Schools now have until the summer term to apply systems thinking and problem solving to improve, adapt and iterate their robots. We look forward to welcoming the teams back in the summer to see who will be crowned the first Finham Park MAT robotics champion of 2025!







# Biology Field Trip – June 2024 ...

On 17<sup>th</sup> June the whole Year 12 cohort of Biology students visited Bishop's Wood Field Study Centre to complete the practical assessments of the course involved with ecological sampling and statistical analysis of populations under the supervision of Mrs Koutsou and Dr Woodward.









In addition: on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> May, A level Biology students enjoyed an outreach session with academics from Warwick University, who introduced students to the physiology of the heart, ECGs and other aspects of circadian rhythm that went beyond the specification of the recent A level topic that they had been learning about.



# Residential Trip to Marne la Vallée and Paris – June 2024 ...

The second week of June saw 31 Year 9 students off to France. Students had the opportunity to practise their French language skills in everyday life situations and find out a little bit about the rich history of Paris. We visited Chateau Vaux le Vicomte – a grand stately home to the south-east of Paris famous for featuring in a James Bond film. We spent 2 days in Paris, exploring the city's beautiful sights from a bateau on the River Seine and seeing all the preparations for Les Jeux Olympiques opening ceremony. We had our first experience of Virtual Reality with a 'jet pack' flight across the beautiful scenery of France. There was time to spend shopping on the Champs Elysées, after climbing the 284 steps to the top of the Arc de Triomphe to see the magnificent views across Paris. On our last evening we dined in a French restaurant at Place du Tertre in the shadow of the Sacré Coeur. The trip ended with a day spent at Disneyland Paris where students were able to experience the thrills of the Tower of Terror and Hyperspace Mountain. The teachers joined in with the Disney fun too! It was lovely to hear the positive accounts from our students regarding all their experiences and we look forward to running this trip again in 2025.











# Finham is 'active' - Sports update ...

Finham Park is one of the only schools in Coventry to offer a whole school sports day. In the last week of the summer term over 1200 students took part in an amazing day. Students competed in 21 different sports included chess. Well done to Masai winning their first ever sports day. All students took part in various inter-college sports events throughout the last academic year. Well done to Barbary who won their title.



#### **Sports Enrichment Clubs**

Since May the department has offered a variety of enrichment clubs in over 16 sports / activities. These include, football, rugby, table tennis, badminton, trampolining, netball, fitness, fencing, basketball dodgeball, archery, cheerleading, tennis, athletics, cricket and rounders Over 65% of year 7 students attended clubs in term one. We are always trying to give students many out of lesson opportunities. Attendance at these clubs by KS3 students has been fantastic with 75% (Y7) 60% (Y8); and 74% Y9) coming to enrichment last academic year. **215**+ inter school fixtures took place last academic year across a variety of different sports. The PE department aims to increase this further with Derbies (10 fixtures in football and netball in one night), not only against rivals Bishop Ullathorne school, but also against FP2, Meadow Park and North Leamington School.

#### **Sports Games Mark**

Kieret has been practicing judo for three years and has accomplished a remarkable amount in that time.


Like many martial arts, judo can be pursued simply for belt advancement or competitive success. With judo being an Olympic sport, Kieret has chosen the competitive route, with aspirations of reaching the European Championships and the Olympics in the future.

She has qualified twice in consecutive years for the England Judo squad, a feat that requires athletes to battle It out for a place on the podium at an all English annual event. Her best achievement so far is winning a bronze medal at the 2023 British Judo Nationals in Sheffield, where she triumphed over the number one seed in her category. This event is the pinnacle of judo competition in the UK, featuring competitors from England, Scotland, Ireland, and Wales competing for national honours.

Despite her demanding schedule, Kieret has managed to stay on top of her studies at Finham Park.

Her judo journey has taken her to various countries, including France, Belgium, Italy, the Netherlands, and Canada. Over the summer, rather than having a rest, she

participated in several training camps in UK, Canada, and Belgium, where she engaged in intense open-mat training, averaging 20-30 fights per day.
