When God first started talking to Samuel, he did not recognize the voice and thought it was his master Eli's voice that he was hearing. Discerning God's voice is not just a spiritual skill, but a source of enlightenment and empowerment for His children.

The story of Samuel reminds us that God's voice can come unexpectedly, even to the most unlikely of listeners. 1 Samuel, chapter 3. Here's what happened:

Samuel, who served Eli, was sleeping near the Ark of God in the Tabernacle. The lamp of God had not yet gone out. God called out to Samuel, saying, "Samuel!" Samuel, thinking it was Eli, responded, "Here I am. Did you call me?" But Eli hadn't called him. This happened three times. Finally, Eli realized God was trying to speak to the young boy. He instructed Samuel to say, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening."

God revealed a shocking message: He would carry out all His threats against Eli and his family because of their wrongdoing. Eli accepted God's will, saying, "Let Him do what is good in His eyes."

Samuel became a reliable prophet as he grew up, and all of Israel recognized this divine calling. Like Samuel, to be a true prophet to the nations, you must have ears that hear the Father's still-small voice.

Jesus Knew Exactly How It Felt to be Human.

“For we do not have a High Priest who is unable to sympathize and understand our weaknesses and temptations, but One who has been tempted [knowing exactly how it feels to be human] in every respect as we are, yet without [committing any] sin.” Hebrews 4: 15 {Amp}.

Believe it or not this concept is hard for people in the Body of Christ to understand. Jesus is mystified and dehumanized as if He were some guru that was untouchable to the hurts and pains that occur in life. He was human in every way. When He stubbed His toe, He felt it just like you and I do. When He suffered emotional trauma and rejection, He felt it just like you and I do. There was nothing mystical or spooky spiritual about Jesus. He was normal in every way, shape and form. This makes Jesus more real to me and I love that the Bible says this about Him.

There are many traumas that happened to Jesus while He walked this earth. In the period approaching His death before His resurrection. This is easy to gloss over during the celebrations that occur around the Resurrection holiday, but the truth of the matter is very serious when you consider that many in the Body of Christ suffer from the pains of rejection. Jesus was rejected by His own people. “But you have a custom that I release someone for you at the Passover. So shall I release for you the King of the Jews?” Then they all shouted back again, “Not this Man, but Barabbas!” Now Barabbas was a robber.” John 18: 39 –40 (Amp). I don’t know what the time frame was between the people celebrating Him as a King and then the people rejecting Him and asking for a criminal. How would you feel? One minute people are singing your praises and then you turn around and they want you dead? Jesus was human and He felt what we would feel. All of it. He wasn’t some mystical being.

Jesus was rejected by God. “And at the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, “Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?”—which is translated, “My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?” Mark 15: 34 (Amp). Jesus knew the full meaning of being rejected by God. He knew that God’s presence had left Him. Jesus knew what it felt to be completely empty on the inside. Can you imagine walking in a place where you do not feel love at all? Where there was no God and nothing made you feel good? Jesus knew this place. Jesus served us by going through these pains to establish us in His kingdom forever. Jesus chose to go through this level of rejection from God for you and for me. Court of New Beginnings, Article 2

In article 2 of this courtroom opportunity, we are going to focus on discerning all things properly. We each need to know where God is taking us to and what He is requiring of us. We going to move through the Courts of Heaven in order to present our case before the Court of New Beginnings. So, what step do we take now? We need to KNOW what we are contending for. We must be able to discern our unique commission and purpose upon the earth. Remember God's promise after the judgement of the exile:

Jeremiah 29:11, BSB For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, to give you a future and a hope.

What is your future? What plans does God have for you? You should have some answers to these questions, but do you have all the details? Enter into the Court of Covenant to receive full disclosure. Enter with pen in hand. Understand that you are not starting from scratch. You can use your prophetic words and even the dreams in your heart to start to guide you into a deeper discovery of who you are in Christ. The Holy Spirit will expand upon these and bring you into greater understanding of what He has been saying to you.

John 14:26, NKJV "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you.

As you go before God in this place, be prepared to have the opportunity to exchange your will and ways for God's. Are the desires in your heart pointing you towards God's plan for your life or are they your own? Are you delighting in Him or your own personal exaltation?

Psalms 37:4, NLT Take delight in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart.

Receive the promise of the New Covenant and let it clear out your heart, mind, will, and emotions.

Jeremiah 31:33, NLT "But this is the new covenant I will make with the people of Israel after those days," says the LORD. "I will put my instructions deep within them, and I will write them on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people.

This is the promise of the New Covenant. This promise comes as an exchange, and this exchange is two-fold: (1) the general exchange of the fallen desires of the fallen man for the desires of the renewed spiritual man and (2) the exchange of your own personal/unique desires for God's unique plans/desires for your life. This exchange process leads you to becoming conformed to the image of His Son.

Romans 8: 29-31 29For those God foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brothers. 30And those He predestined, He also called; those He called, He also justified; those He justified, He also glorified. 31What then shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?

What Does the Bible say About the Mouth (Part 1)

In Matthew 12:34 Jesus said, "Out of the overflow of the heart the mouth speaks." When the heart is filled, it will overflow through the mouth. And that overflow tells the true condition of the heart. In the Bible there are characteristics of both Christ and of His bride- in those portraits the first thing that is talked about of their spiritual and moral beauty is their lips and their speech. James speaks about the kind of religion that is acceptable to God: "If anyone considers himself religious and yet does not keep a tight rein on his tongue, he deceives himself and his religion is worthless." James 1:26. A lot of people believe that they are religious, but they have no control over their tongues. When a person has no control over their tongue, it does not matter how good a person is or what they do, their religion is worthless and unacceptable to God. James also tells us what kind of religion God will accept. James 1:27 tells us, "Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world." The first positive requirement of pure religion is not churchgoing, or even Bible reading. It is looking after and showing practical love to those who are in need, primarily orphans and widows. If you want to have a religion that is accepted by God, it must be demonstrated first and foremost in caring for those who are in need (orphans and widows). If you want to impress God with your religion, you need to show Him what overflows from your mouth because of what is in your heart. James 3:2 says, "We all stumble in many ways. If anyone is never at fault in what he says, he is a perfect man, able to keep his whole body in check." Here James is telling us that if you can control the tongue, you can control your whole life. Then James goes on with verses 3-8, "When we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we can turn the whole animal. Or take ships as an example. Although they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are steered by a very small rudder wherever the pilot wants to go. Likewise, the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark, The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole person, sets the whole course of his life on fire, and is itself set on fire by hell. All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles and creatures of the sea are being tamed and have been tamed by man, but no man can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison." James brings out the unique significance and influence of the tongue for the whole course of our lives. The first example was putting a bit in the horse's mouth, with the bit you can turn the whole animal around. In the Bible, the horse is a type of physical strength. But no matter how strong a horse is, if you can get a bit in its mouth, you can control where it goes. The same is true with us, that which controls our mouth, controls the whole course of our lives. Be careful what you allow to control your mouth. (to be continued next week)

Psalm 29,

11. The Lord will give (unyielding and impenetrable) strength to His people; the Lord will bless His people with peace.

Meaning of Jesus' Death and Resurrection (Holy Week)

The meaning of Jesus' death and resurrection is the sacrifice on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins. According to the New Testament, Jesus was resurrected by God, ascended into heaven, at the "right hand of God," and will return to fulfill the rest of Messianic prophecy as the resurrection of the dead, the Last Judgment, and the establishment of the Kingdom of God. Nicodemus was not the only one who heard the Redeemer repeat that prophecy.

Jesus taught His disciples, "... The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him; but after he is dead, he will rise again on the third day" (Mark 9:31).

In Matthew 16:21 "From that time Jesus began to declare to his disciples that it was necessary for him to go to Jerusalem and suffer much from the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes; and be put to death, and rise again on the third day."

The same is mentioned in Mark 10:34 and Luke 24:7. Jesus had to go through humiliations and be denied by his disciples Peter. Judas Iscariot betrayed him to fulfill what is written. When he chose his disciples he preached in Galilee, performing miracles, signs, and wonders by healing the sick, cleansing people with leprosy, and freeing a person from demons. In Luke 24:1-10 On the first day of the week, at dawn, the women went to the tomb with the perfumes they had prepared. 2 When they arrived, they found that the stone that closed the tomb had been rolled away. 3 They went in, but they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. 4 They were still puzzled at the case when two men dressed in shining garments came to them, 5 and when they saw the women bowing down on their faces to the ground in fear, they said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? 6 He is not here; he is risen. Remember that he spoke to you about this while still in Galilee. 7 He told you then that the Son of Man was to be delivered into the hands of sinners and that they were going to crucify him, but that he would rise again on the third day. 8 They remembered Jesus' words, 9 and returned from the tomb, bringing the news to the Eleven and all the others. 10 So it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others who were with them, who told the apostles what had happened.

Then Jesus ascended into heaven and left us the Holy Spirit. Through the Holy Spirit, they received Jesus' instructions to go to other nations, preach the word, and make other disciples.

It is important this Holy Week to check ourselves, repent of our sins, and make a covenant with Jesus to change our lives completely. He is love and wants to give us eternal life.

IMPORTANCE OF GATHERING A FAMILY HEALTH HISTORY

Family health history offers clues to your health risks and gives your care team a more complete picture of your health. It is the strongest influence on knowing your risk of developing hereditary conditions and diseases, including heart disease, stroke, diabetes, certain cancers, osteoporosis, depression, asthma, arthritis and dementia. These conditions can be almost entirely dependent on genetic inheritance from your ancestors.

WHO SHOULD BE INCLUDED – Three generations of biological relatives

- * children, siblings and parents
- * aunts and uncles
- * nieces and nephews
- * grandparents and great-grandparents

WHAT INFORMATION IS IMPORTANT

- * major medical issues that can be inherited
- * age they were diagnosed (your doctor can recognize the early onset of certain diseases)
- * age and cause of death
- * environmental factors, habits and behaviors such as use of tobacco, working in a factory with certain exposures, alcohol or drug abuse)
- * pregnancy loss or birth defects in your family (spina bifida, cleft palate or heart defects)
- * allergies
- * genetic or chromosomal conditions (cystic fibrosis, muscular dystrophy, down syndrome)
- * mental health conditions (depression, anxiety, bipolar disorder, schizophrenia)
- * ethnic background
 - African-Americans have a higher risk of inheriting sickle cell anemia.
 - Caucasians are at a higher risk of cystic fibrosis.
 - Asians have a higher risk for tuberculosis.
 - Hispanics have a higher risk for cardiovascular disease.

WHAT IF YOU ARE ADOPTED

If you are adopted, ask your adoptive parents if they have any information about your birth parents. It's possible family health history was shared during the adoption process. If not, ask the agency that arranged the adoption.

I have to admit, the Holy Spirit is still revealing to me just what that means – the depth of how precious and what we really are worth to the Godhead and really I believe it takes a lifetime or more to learn it in its entirety.

The Blood has always been used to cleanse the sins and make a person right before God. But because of Jesus's obedience he brought cleansing of our sins and remove death from us and give us eternal life. {Romans 5:15-20}

You have to receive the Blood of Jesus we must do so in faith. {Romans 3:23} This faith must be consistently active and displayed through obedience. Faith without obedience is dead. {James 2:17, 22, and 24} We cannot claim to be covered by Jesus' blood if we, in rebellion and lack of faith, walk out from beneath its covering.


So how do we get back under that covering, repentance. Ask the blood of Jesus speak about forgiveness and that through Jesus' blood you will be redeemed and freed from the power of darkness and into the Kingdom of Jesus. {Colossians 1:13-14}

Repentance must be heartfelt and followed through. It cannot be a passive thing. You should never take that or the blood ever for granted or just a thing to do. It was too high of a price that was paid for you to receive the eternal reward from it and the Love that comes along with it to just be trampled on or dismissed as a penny.

When you truly repent, the forgiveness that comes with it and joins the voice of the blood of Jesus becomes a heavenly bomb that will defeat the enemy in ways you could not imagine.

When God forgives us and we are given salvation – He doesn't take our free will or our emotions away from us. He doesn't want us to be robots, but to give us a choice to follow Him or stay in the sinful way. And we also have to understand that our salvation is a daily choice, a daily walk, and must be maintained every second without exceptions. And when we find we have sinned we have to repent and allow the Blood to cleanse you again.

So when the enemy comes at you trying to get you to believe either one you are too far gone and God can't forgive you, or that you are not in sin or do not sin, repent before God and allow Him to open your spiritual eyes and show you just what the Blood of Jesus can and will continue to do as you are cleansed, purified and made righteous and holy again so that when you are accused in the courts – you stand innocent. {1 John 1:7-9}
