Housing Supports

The Housing Services we offer aim to eliminate barriers to safe and permanent housing solutions. These services include:

Housing Transition Navigation Services:

Assistance in searching for housing or completing housing applications as well as developing an individual housing support plan.

Housing Tenancy & Sustaining Services:

Interventions for behaviors that may jeopardize housing, such as late rental payment and services, to develop financial literacy skills.

Housing Deposits: Assistance with housing security deposits, utilities set-up fees, first and last month's rent and first month of utilities as well as medically necessary items like air conditioners, heaters, and hospital beds to ensure their new home is safe for move-in.

Each client who enters our program receives an in-depth assessment of housing needs and eligibility, assistance applying for benefits and obtaining necessary documentation, and support with basic needs. We also help prepare our clients for meetings with landlords or property owners and offer landlord mediation and negotiation, and education in good neighbor practices.

The Aguirre Family One Year Later

In March 2023, the Aguirre family faced the unimaginable. With three young children— ages 4, 1, and just a few months old—Dela Marie and her husband found themselves homeless for the first time, struggling to navigate life in their car, on friends' couches, and in temporary spaces. The stress and uncertainty took a toll, leading to depression and anxiety.

Then they found Encompass Housing. "From the first moment we came in contact with them, we felt that there was hope," Dela Marie shared. "Our kids can finally experience the feeling of knowing where they would sleep every night in their own beds."

One year later, the Aguirre family is thriving. Both parents are employed full-time, earning enough to sustain their rent. Their children are enrolled in school and childcare, and their health and well-being have improved. While they once relied on therapy for support, they no longer need it—hope and stability have taken its place.

We are so proud of the progress they've made and deeply inspired by their resilience. Their journey reminds us why we do this work—because every family deserves a place to call home.









Recuperative Care

Recuperative Care is a program for individuals who are exiting the hospital and need a supportive and safe environment to rest and recover. This program bridges the gap between hospital and home, offering medical supervision and support in a stable environment by:

- Reducing costs for the system overall by providing a step down from hospitals
- Reducing unnecessary emergency room visits and 911 calls
- Creating a support network that can provide individuals with enhanced care coordination and connection to resources

Our goal is to help clients recover fully and connect them with resources to ensure a smooth transition back to health and stability.





Louise Street Transitional Housing Program

Encompass Housing proudly introduces Louise Street, a transitional housing site for Short-Term Post-Hospitalization clients. This six-month program helps individuals gain independence, secure income, and access vital services while preparing for permanent housing. We look forward to expanding this model to help more in need!

Enhanced Care Management

Enhanced Care Management (ECM) provides coordinated, client-centered care for individuals with complex health and social needs, addressing both medical and social factors. **Services include:**

- Medical care coordination
- Finding doctors, scheduling appointments, managing medications, and arranging transportation
- Assistance with housing deposits, medically tailored meals, asthma remediation, and day habilitation
- Communication and coordination with the care team Health education and advocacy

We are proud to report that 20 clients were enrolled in ECM services in 2024 with plans to continue growing the program!











Day Habilitation

Our Day Habilitation program offers a comprehensive, client-centered approach to support individuals in achieving greater independence and improved quality of life. Through targeted care coordination and management, we empower members to acquire, retain, and enhance essential self-help, socialization, and adaptive skills. As part of the California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal's (CalAIM) Independent Living-Focused Community Support initiative, our program aligns with statewide efforts to foster independence, resilience, and integration within the community.

Since July 2024, we've hosted 90 Day Habilitation activities for our clients, including Financial Literacy classes, budgeting, employment assistance, therapeutic art journaling, wheelchair tai chi, nutrition education, and more.





The Power of Giving

Thanks to our generous supporters, we raised a total of \$18,100 through our fundraising efforts in 2024! With 99 total unique donors, including 88 new donors, our community came together to make a lasting impact. From our first-time participation in Help Them Home and Long Beach Gives to our impactful Season of Giving campaign, every contribution has helped provide critical housing and support services to those in need.




