

Congrats and much love to Michaela, Courtney and Orla. A massive thanks goes to our Board member, Nancy Clunie, for coming out of retirement as a Head Teacher to be our Acting Chief Executive. She has expertly guided us through the year.

CEO REPORT



MICHAELA COLLINS, MBE

This annual report covers a monumental year of change for PEEK. In 2024/25, we reached 2148 children, young people and families despite ongoing challenging financial circumstances. 1 in 3 children in Glasgow are living in poverty.

At PEEK, we believe this is 1 too many and we have focused all our efforts on reducing the impact of poverty on everyday life, supporting people to break cycles of poverty and influencing change at a policy level. As an organisation, we have continued to listen to the voices of our families and ensure our programmes are people-led, place-based and relationship-focussed.

Delivering high-quality programmes and demonstrating our impact has never been more crucial. Through our Wellbeing programme, we have continued to deliver practical support to families, reducing the impact of the cost-of-living crisis by providing immediate help to children and families who were struggling to afford the basics like food, heating and clothing.

In 2024/25, we spent around £35,490 providing this essential support. This year, we have worked with over 30 cross-sector partners. Without them, we could not improve life chances and deliver positive outcomes.

We are excited to be working in partnership with NHS Scotland to launch the HENRY programme in Glasgow. The HENRY programme is designed to help families engage in healthier eating and lifestyle habits and tackle childhood obesity whilst supporting holistic wellbeing.

PEEK is continuing to work in partnership with Glasgow City Council and Glasgow Building's Preservation Trust on 'PEEK into Whitevale', our capital build project which will see The Whitevale Baths become our future home.

I extend my thanks to every partner who has worked with us collaboratively to deliver change in communities. PEEK's expenditure continues to go over £1million per annum to operate.

This year, we have continued to invest our own resources into our programmes as grant funding becomes even more challenging and competitive. Every penny and pound is invested wisely. Our biggest expenditure continues to be our staff team, who directly deliver the programmes in the community.

Our next biggest expenditure of £77,638 was directly spent on food costs to ensure children and families are fed during school holidays, at sessions and through our mobile food truck PEEKACHEW.

£25,521 was spent on venue hire, particularly during school holidays. We spent £16,562 on providing respite holidays, residentials, trips, events and outings to help create lifelong memories. £12,193 spent on crisis grant support for families. £9651 was spent on quality arts and play materials and equipment. By investing in our young people and parents, we spent £4,449 on training, certification, awards and accreditation helping to improve life chances.

We would like to thank our funders and corporate partners for your ongoing investment in our organisation. The financial and pro bono support allows us to work towards our vision and mission, where children, young people and families are free from a life of poverty.

In 2024/25, we continued to invest time and resources into implementing our 5 year strategy and have delivered against our four strategic areas. We underwent a rebrand with a new logo and website, ready for taking us into the next chapter of celebrating 25 years of changing the lives of children, young people and families in Glasgow.

Team PEEK are the beating heart of the organisation, they continue to meet challenges and crises head-on and are always there to support our children and young people and their families. The team continue to innovate and work creatively to meet the needs and wants of our communities. Their passion is palpable, and they really demonstrate our values of Compassion, Dignity, Excellence, Integrity and Respect. The famous red hoody continues to be a beacon of light in our communities and to wear the uniform is aspirational for many in our communities.

Team PEEK would like to pay our deepest respects to both Dean Clearie and Kory McCrimmon's families. Dean and Kory were amazing young men who had a lifelong connection with PEEK, and they are both sorely missed by the team.

I would like to say a personal thank you to our board of directors for their support throughout the last year. Each one of them is so committed to the organisation and continues to strive for excellence by steering us through a very challenging landscape whilst remaining steadfast.

A special thank you to Nancy Clunie, who stepped into the role as Acting CEO during my maternity leave. You made this change for everyone easy due to your passion and commitment. This year sees two of our longest-serving board members, Alex Johnston (Chair) and Jackie Gilmour (Vice-Chair) step down from their governing roles.

PEEK would not be in the great standing it is today without both amazing individuals who have dedicated blood, sweat and tears to the organisation and their roles and made Team PEEK what it is today. We are eternally grateful for your leadership, and your legacy will continue.

And lastly, to our Friends of PEEK, the public who believe in the power of PEEK, who continue to donate, attend our events and follow and share on social media. Thank you for the unwavering support.

OUR TEAM & BOARD

We are dedicated to being a supportive employer and creating positive employment practices. Our goal is to assist our team members in achieving a healthy work-life balance whenever possible, as we believe that a happy and healthy team is vital to our success.

In 2024, we welcomed two new team members to enhance our projects across the board. This expansion features a new Development and Fundraising Manager. The purpose of this role is to diversify PEEK's income streams, to help us become more self-sustainable. Whilst we still rely on grant funding, we are now building other income streams such as corporate partnerships, community fundraising and individual giving. We also appointed a new Head of Operations.

Additionally, we brought back one of our former volunteers in an apprenticeship role. During their time with us, they worked across our Play and Create Programmes, gaining valuable insights into our initiatives. They said, "The positive impact this experience has had on me is that I have learned a lot of new skills and improved skills that I wasn't as confident in. From working across all the different programmes at PEEK, it has helped me to have a better understanding of everything that goes on behind the scenes".

We take pride in the fact that 40% of our team members come from a volunteering background, and we hope to continue this trend.

Regarding our Board, two long-standing members, Alex (our Chair) and Jackie (our Vice Chair), will be stepping down at the end of 2025. We are grateful for their invaluable support over the years, and we know they will always remain connected to our organisation.



OUR FAMILIES 08

We have a long-standing presence in the communities that we work in, and have built strong, trusted relationships over 25 years. This well-earned trust creates a safe and welcoming environment where families feel confident accessing our programmes and support.

At PEEK, we proudly maintain a city-wide presence, in neighbourhoods that face a variety of socioeconomic challenges, including poverty, health disparities, unemployment, low-income jobs, social exclusion, immigration issues, and elevated crime rates.

Participant Insights:

- 100% of the children, young people, and families in these areas are classified as levels 1 and 2 on the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD).
- 50% of the families we work with come from ethnic minority backgrounds.
- 12% of families have additional support needs.

We are committed to securing sustainable investments to support families throughout their lives.

Our four programmes take the 'Ways to Wellbeing Approach' based on the 5 Ways to Wellbeing model used by the NHS, as a pathway for families to access the support they need, meeting their individual needs at every stage of family life.

In the past year, we have adopted a holistic approach, supporting not only children and young people but also their parents and carers.

One of our new exciting sessions includes community growing allotments in the heart of Calton, where we host our weekly Family Garden Workshops. We will continue this approach, building on our experiences and successes to further benefit the community.

Our four strong programmes are focused on reducing the impacts of poverty and creating opportunities for children, young people, and families. We are now progressing towards a wraparound approach, integrating PEEK's Ways to Wellbeing into everything we do. This will enable us to create tailored pathways for our families to access a range of PEEK services across all programmes, regardless of where they first engage with us.

PLAY PROGRAMME



Our Play Programme brings year-round play opportunities to community spaces and schools across Glasgow. With the help of our Play Rangers, we create safe, inclusive, and fun environments where children, young people, and families can explore, connect, and grow through the power of play.



PEEK PLAY DAY

In the summer of 2024, we hosted our largest Play Day event to date, welcoming over 2,000 children, young people, and families for a fun-filled day out, made possible through our many partners and volunteers.

The event was made extra special by our friends at EPH Creative, who provided photo props and opportunities throughout the day, along with alternative carnival games.

The day's activities included a vibrant array of workshops, from arts and crafts to music and dance, all designed to inspire creativity and imagination. Children had the chance to explore new skills and express themselves in an environment brimming with encouragement and joy.

After discovering us on social media, EPH Creative chose to support a charity that supports creativity and assists children and families in Glasgow.

Reflecting on the collaboration, EPH Creative founder Rosie remarked, "PEEK felt like the perfect partner. Not only is PEEK based in Glasgow, but they also work with children and families while championing play and creativity, which aligns perfectly with our mission at EPH Creative".

We are also thankful for the dedication of 20 young volunteers and additional corporate volunteers from Morgan Stanley, Howden, Keepmoat, and Landsec. A special shout-out to Braveheart Catering and Scran Academy for their invaluable assistance with the event's catering. UNCRC

We've been working with P6 and P7 classes, helping them gain an understanding of children's rights through play and creativity. The students engaged in interactive workshops designed to bring the principles of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) to life. Through art, storytelling, and collaborative games, the children explored topics such as equality, education, and freedom of expression. These activities not only enriched their knowledge but also empowered them to think critically about their role in advocating for their rights.

YOUTH COMMUNITY DROP-IN



Our Youth Community Drop-in sessions offer a safe, welcoming environment for young people aged 11–18 to try new activities, usually held in local parks. Whether it's games, sports, cooking, art, or just chatting, there's something for everyone. Our team is there to listen, support, and provide guidance when needed. At Ruchazie Youth Drop-in, we had a record number of people attend, 50 in total.

One young person, aged 13, who has autism and finds social interaction difficult, began attending drop-ins more frequently in 2024. Initially shy and quiet, he only spoke with a few staff members and needed reassurance before joining our summer holiday programme. Over four weeks, he participated in every session, including trips to places like Kelburn Castle and Kelvingrove. These outings helped boost his confidence and gave him space to connect with others his age. His parent noted that, while he previously had few friends, he now has a strong peer group, including some classmates, which has helped ease his return to school and given him a more positive outlook.

He's now more confident in communication and has developed stronger bonds at home too, as his parents shared, "it's like having a different boy in the house".

By week three, staff observed real growth; he was initiating conversations and engaging more with peers. The programme culminated in a successful joint session with another local group, helping to break down community barriers and promote new friendships.

HOPSCOTCH

5 DAY RESIDENTIAL

In September 2024, we took 12 children to Ardvullin in the north of Scotland for a weeklong getaway. The group enjoyed horse riding, beach visits, local exploration, and the stunning Highland scenery, plus a visit to the Ben Nevis Range, and we were lucky enough to have the perfect weather for it.

When we set off on the bus to Hopscotch House, the atmosphere was buzzing with excitement. The children chatted, laughed, and sang songs together. One young person, however, remained noticeably quiet during the journey, engaging only occasionally with our team.

By the final evening, everything had changed. During a lively game of Among Us (a murder mystery-style game) we played together, that same young person, now fully immersed in the fun, ran around laughing, sharing ideas, and connecting with others. It was a special moment that showed how much confidence he had built since those early hours on the bus.

Being part of a group of peers from across Glasgow helped him develop important social skills and offered him a valuable break from his everyday environment, space to grow and just be a kid.

His mum later shared, "This holiday came at the perfect time. We're going through so much as a family, and we couldn't be happier. I was worried at first, but now I can see he's had the best time. Thank you for thinking of us".







HENRY PROGRAMME

A NEW FAMILY PROJECT

In 2024, we collaborated with the NHS through the Henry Programme to support families in giving their children the healthiest possible start in life. Our wellbeing team received training to become Henry facilitators. Now fully prepared, they are ready to deliver 8-week courses, workshops, and resources we support:

- Weaning, starting solids, and good nutrition
- Emotional well-being and parenting skills
- · Healthy eating habits and oral health
- Active lifestyles

This equips parents with the skills and confidence to foster healthier lifestyles for their children. One parent said, "Thank you for creating a space for us to come together and be supported. It means so much to me when you both believe me and validate my approach with my child. This group has been my rock for the past 8 weeks, I don't know what I'm going to do every Tuesday now".



MORGAN STANLEY



At the beginning of 2024, we embarked on a five-year partnership with Morgan Stanley to enhance four key programmes: Play, Create, Thrive, and Wellbeing.

With the Thriving Futures initiative, we aim to fulfil our mission of supporting families affected by poverty. Each year, we will provide support to children, young people, and families in Glasgow, specifically focusing on the areas of Calton, Gallowgate, and Sighthill.

Our long-standing collaboration dates back to 2017 when we began working together at St. Martin's Primary School, formerly known as St Stephen's and St Kevin's Primary School.

Morgan Stanley has not only provided financial assistance but has also gone above and beyond to support our families through fundraising events, clothing drives, and volunteering at our sessions. This collaboration extends beyond mere funding.

We are excited to see what the future holds as we collaborate with Morgan Stanley to make a meaningful difference in the lives of many. Together, we will strive to build thriving futures for our communities.

As the evening drew to a close, the young volunteers departed feeling inspired and valued, eager to take on new projects. We are incredibly proud of their achievements.



OUR NEW LOGO & WEBSITE

In the summer of 2024, we commissioned an external marketing firm to revamp our logo and website. The brief was straightforward: our previous logo was ineffective, difficult to read, and did not accurately represent our mission.

After years of growth, we recognised it was time for a transformation. Our old logo, which featured a community tree, no longer aligned with our vision. It became challenging to read when scaled down and failed to capture the full extent of our expanding programmes. With an increase in sessions, partnerships, and our growing influence, evolution was essential.

Our new logo is sleek, modern, and distinctly ours. It showcases a custom font and a transparent design that allows colours and shapes to emerge, symbolising that community is central in all that we do.

We are committed to investing in our future. Our new website is far more efficient, easily updated and user-friendly for both funders and families. This enhancement will simplify our fundraising efforts and keep our content current.


Expenditure

Our biggest expenditure continues to be our staff team, which comprises 50 individual members from our core team, sessional staff, freelancers, and part-time team members, who directly deliver the programmes in the community, this costs £1,021,907.

Delivering high-quality programmes and showcasing our impact has never been more vital. Through our Wellbeing programme, we have continued to offer practical support to families, alleviating the effects of the cost-of-living crisis by providing immediate assistance to children and families struggling to afford essentials such as food, heating, and clothing. In 2024/2025, we spent £100,680 on Food and Wellbeing.

To sustain our programme delivery and support our families, we have allocated funds across the following categories:

- Training and Awards £8,080




