I had the opportunity to climb Mt. Kang Yatse-I in Ladakh in August this year and it was truly an amazing and challenging climb. The peak is set deep inside the Markha Valley and stands at a towering 6150M or $20,177 \mathrm{ft}$. The 11 day long expedition started off from the village of Sara, about 70 km from Leh by road. From here on, we walked around 12 km with a 15 kg backpack every day for the next 3 days to reach the common base camp for Mt. Kang Yatse I \& II.

The base camp provides a magnificient view of Kang Yatse II and its harder, more technical sister peak, Mt. Kang Yatse I. After a rest day at the base camp, we took some of our high altitude clothing, equipment and food and dropped it at Camp-1. This was so that the load on our backs would be split between the two "ferries" we made to Camp-1. After yet another rest day at the base camp, we moved up and settled at Camp-1. The climb was tough, as we faced a long, inclined slope towards the end as well as cold and cloudy weather...

The next day, we left Camp-1 to move up to our summit camp at around 5700M... from Camp-1 onwards, the climb till the summit was completely technical. Due to the high incline, ropes were fixed on the mountain slope and climbers would use a device called the Jumar to pull ourselves up the slope. After about 4 hours of continuous climbing, we finally reached our summit camp, set up the tents and rested before setting out on


The preparations for the summit climb began at midnight on 08th Sept, as we put on our harnesses, boots \& crampons and prepared ourselves for the tough climb that lay ahead of us. The summit climb was a tiring 7 hr long walk, which was technically and physically challenging. So much so, that midway through the climb, our worn-out fingers would cramp up \& fold into the palm and we'd have to pull them open forcefully! But braving all these challenges, we finally reached the summit of the peak on 08 Sept 23 , successfully summiting my 5th peak above 6000M!

## WORKSHOP ON CPR

On 17th August, 2023, a workshop on CPR was held at Samvad. CPR is the abbreviation for Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation. The session revolved around how one can identify if a person is in need of CPR or not, and if so, how can one provide CPR. Several precautions were discussed, which needed to be taken care of while practising CPR. The students were briefed on how they can give firsthand CPR to a person appearing unconscious, and how they can confirm if the person is really unconscious or rather just sleeping. We were also informed about the hotspots on our body where one can check for pulse and confirm a person's unconsciousness. Information was also provided on where and how to give the chest compression to an unconscious person. The compressions are supposed to be regular and timely (i.e., 2 compressions per second), as well as consistent, until medical help arrives or there is betterment in the situation of the victim.



There was also a live display of CPR given by a professional on a dummy. Then, towards the end of the session, students were voluntarily called upon the stage to practice the procedure of CPR upon 3 different dummies kept there, under the guidance of medical professionals. All in all, it was a very informative and interactive session which was very important for the students as they have now become capable enough of enacting upon serious situations and potentially saving lives. We extend a heartfelt gratitude to team INHS Asvini for taking out valuable time and conducting this åmazing workshop for us.
