


Towerites: Name given to the uncultured wolves that roam the upscale tenement yard behind Taylor Hall. Their natural habit is ELR Towers Hall.





The Rex Nettleford Hall was first envisioned when the then Director of Student Services and Development, Dr. Thelora Reynolds, took office in 1996. She identified, as one of the University's problems, the need for an affordable housing solution that would satisfy a large number of students. After consulting with Student Services and Development Managers, Mr. Carlton Lowrie and Mr. Peter O'Sullivan, the group worked in coordination with the Executive Director of the National Housing Trust, Mr. Milverton Reynolds, and formulated a plan to add new blocks to Chancellor and Taylor Halls. However, this idea was soon further revolutionised resulting in the birth of perfection, the Rex Nettleford Hall.

Located only a short walk from the Mona Bowl, the hall is nestled comfortably in the foothills of the famed Blue Mountain Peak. This location is quiet and serene, far away from the 'humdrum' of Campus life and undoubtedly fosters good study habits which are vital for survival at this University. Security & You

Security on the Mona Campus is everybody's business. Security affairs are managed by the University's Security Council and the Office of the Director of Security who brings together the Campus Security Unit (uniformed security officers) and the Mona Police.

In Hall:

- Where applicable, a resident who enters or leaves the domicile after closing hours is responsible for securing the outside door.
- · Do not leave your room door open.
- Keep all doors locked.
- Do not scream unnecessarily; habitual screaming lulls residents into a false sense of security.
- Do not tamper with locks; report defects to the facilities office, immediately.
- Do not admit strangers.
- Do not leave textbooks / laptops unattended.
- Put valuables, wallets and money out of sight.
- Report unsafe practices in Halls to your Student Services and Development Managers.
- Be aware of unaccompanied persons who appear "out of place" on hall and report any such person to the Security Offiers at the main entrance, Hall Administration or the Mona Police.
- Report all crimes or suspicious activities
 On-Campus to the Mona Police,
 Campus Security, the nearest Security
 Officer and to your Hall Administration.

On Campus:

- To enhance your personal safety, develop a strong awareness of your community and your environment.
- Avoid making rendezvous in secluded hideaways. Remember, these are the natural habitat of criminals.
- Avoid travelling with valuable items on display such as, jewellery, cell phones and large sums of money.
- Be aware of persons or groups of persons approaching you.
- Avoid poorly lit walk-ways
- Always wear your student ID on your person. This is the quickest and most efficient means available to the security personnel differentiating you from the "bad guys"
- Avoid / be alert when approaching a clump of bushes or other foliage that obstructs line of vision.
- Never walk, jog or go swimming alone.
- Let someone know where you are going and when you will return.
