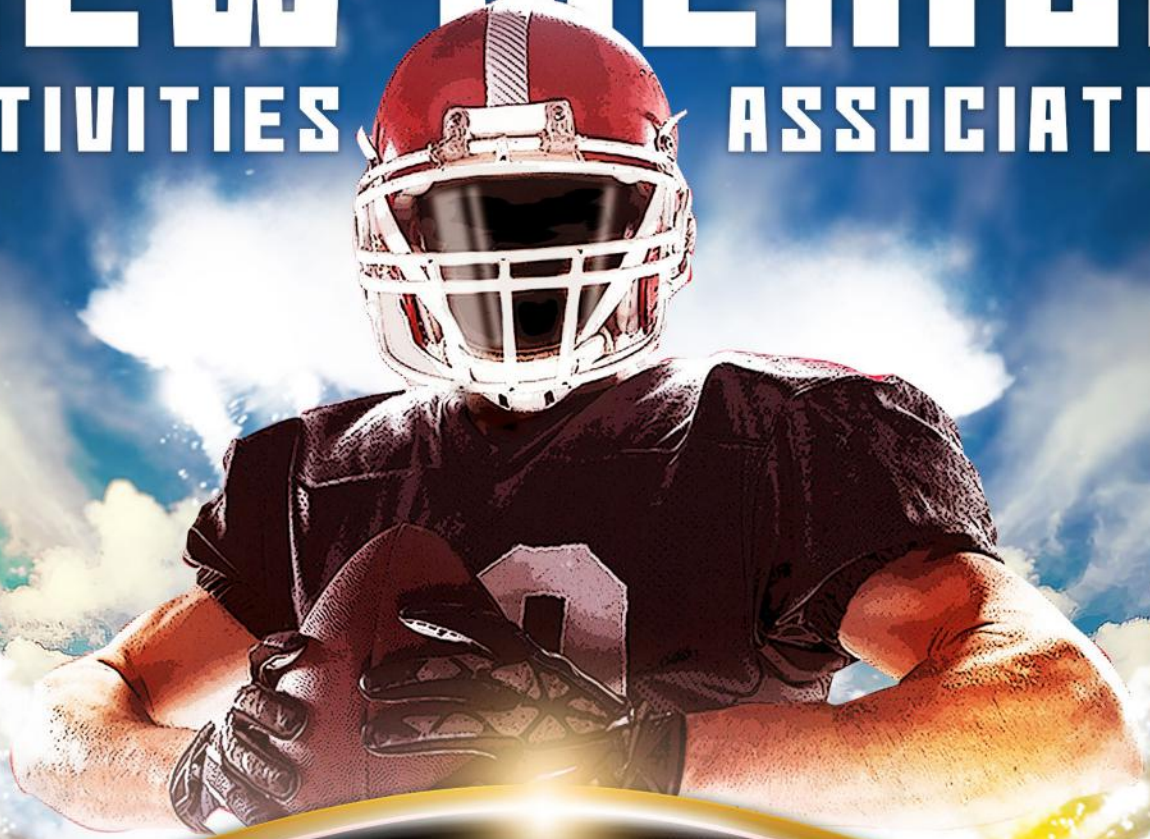

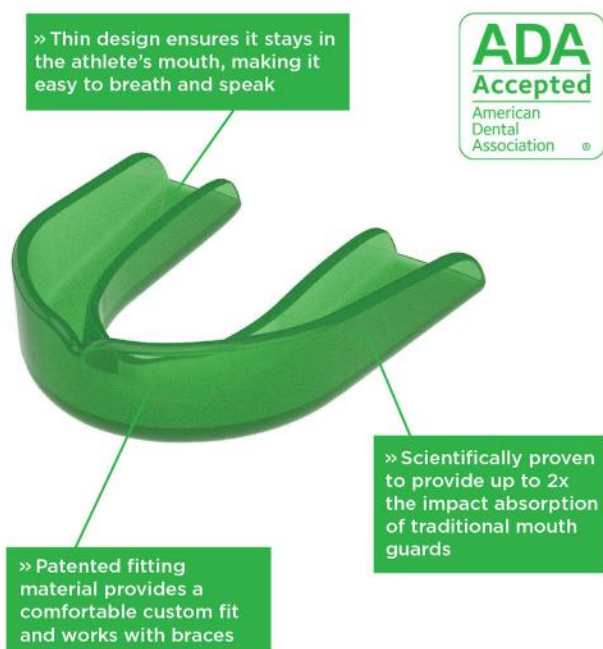

Welcome to the NMAA State Championships!

It is an honor for the New Mexico Activities Association to host you at this culminating event. The student-athletes, coaches, and officials who are participating in this championship have worked tirelessly throughout the season to make it to this level of competition and we are looking forward to an exciting time from start to finish.

While we are together at this event, let us keep one thing at the center of what we do on the sidelines, on the bench, in the stands, and on the playing surface – **this is education-based athletics**. This is the true extension of the classroom, where students learn lifelong skills through their participation. This is the final bastion for the purity of sport. This is where the lessons learned, and the relationships made far outweigh the final score. Yes, champions will be crowned, and trophies and medals will be awarded, but the real win achieved through interscholastic sport is much greater than that.

National statistics show that fewer than 2% of all high school athletes go on to play Division I college athletics. In New Mexico, it is far less. For many student-athletes, high school sports are the final stop in their athletic careers, but the skills they develop through their high school athletic experiences prepare them for the rest of their lives. They learn about responsibility, dedication, teamwork, dealing with adversity, interpersonal skills, commitment, leadership, and countless other qualities that will make them champions in life.

Unfortunately, we know that education-based athletics are in crisis. Club sports, the changing landscape of the NCAA, bad behavior, lack of officials, lack of coaches, and an overall decline in societal values are threatening the world of interscholastic sports. We cannot let that happen. Our students need all of us to fight for education-based athletics. Our sports are worth fighting for, as are the students we serve.

We cannot forget that every decision we make and the way we conduct ourselves should be about kids. The things we say are important must be mirrored in the way we act and the words that come out of our mouths. The student-athletes are here to play their hardest and to represent their schools and communities at the highest level, and they expect the same standard of behavior and respect from those coaching them, officiating their contests, and cheering for them in the stands.

Every one of us must set a positive example for communicating effectively, building relationships, encouraging positive behavior, and ensuring that interscholastic athletics are protected and revered to the best of our abilities. The NMAA and its member schools will continually communicate and be readily available to those who need us. We must show everyone that the experiences student-athletes receive in interscholastic athletics cannot be replicated elsewhere. The value that we possess is priceless and we must champion it in every possible way.

We hope that this event is memorable and enjoyable for you. Remember that we are all in this together. Every one of us plays a critical role in the interscholastic sport environment, where student-athletes get to play the games they love and where they develop the skills to become lifelong champions, even when their playing days are over.

2022 State Championship Recap

Cleveland Scores 75 Points in High-Scoring 6A Title Game



It was the highest scoring 6A title game in New Mexico history, as the Cleveland Storm (11-2) and the La Cueva Bears (11-2) combined for 136 points, as the Storm captured the 2022 Nusenda Credit Union 6A State Football Championship, 75-61.

Only Jal High School with 76 in 1959, had scored more points in an 11-man football title game than Cleveland. For the third consecutive full season, Cleveland hoisted the blue trophy (2019, 2021, & 2022), as there was no fall season in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The two teams combined for just over 1,200 yards on the day, as the Storm rushed for 474 yards and the Bears threw for 522 yards.

Cleveland held an 8-point lead (28-20) with just under a minute to play in the second quarter, before La Cueva

scored not once but twice to take a 34-28 into halftime. The Bears extended their lead to 41-28 on the opening drive of the third quarter but the Storm rattled off 20 unanswered points in the third to take a 48-41 lead.

The Bears would add 20 more points to their total but the Storm countered, as it was too little too late for La Cueva, as Cleveland won 75-61.

La Cueva's quarterback Aidan Armenta threw for 517 yards and five touchdowns, while Wysong rushed for 246 yards and three touchdowns, while running back Mbuaha rushed for 108 yards and four scores.

Artesia Wins 31st State Football Title



The Artesia Bulldogs added another championship to their already long list of state titles. The top ranked Bulldogs beat Piedra Vista 27-14 to win the Class 5A Title at the 2022 Nusenda Credit Union State Football Championships. It's Artesia 31st state football championship, a New Mexico state record and third most in the country, according to the NFHS record book.

Playing on their home field in Farmington, the Panthers (11-2) scored on their first possession with a 6-yard touchdown pass from Logan Howell to Paul Brown. After trailing 7-nothing, Artesia put up 27 straight points. The Bulldogs (11-2) started their scoring on the next possession when

Artesia's Diego Wesson tied the game at 7-7 on a short touchdown run. Nye Estrada would throw the first of his two touchdowns to Julian Rodriguez just before the end of the opening quarter to give Artesia a 14-7 lead.

Peyton Greathouse's 19-yard scoring run in the second quarter would increase Artesia's lead to 21-7 going into halftime. Estrada threw his second touchdown of the game in the third quarter, connecting with Cayden Joy on a 34-yard scoring strike. A fourth quarter touchdown by Piedra Vista's Jacob Ramsted would cap the scoring in the game, giving Artesia a 13-point championship victory. It's Artesia's first state title since 2017.

The Bloomfield High School football team won their first state championship in over half a century. Bloomfield beat top ranked Silver 13-7 to win the Class 4A Title at the 2022 Nusenda Credit Union State Football Championships. It's Bloomfield's first state championship since 1966.

"The defense was outstanding," said Bloomfield head coach Mike Kovacs. "They gave up 45 last time and only gave up seven today. What more could you ask for? I'm so excited for these kids."
