A Guide to Eloping in No

Noosa

Planning a destination elopement in 2026 is about blending adventure with intimacy. Noosa was voted 'Australia's Top Town to Visit' by the *Australian Traveller's Reader's Choice Awards*. To ensure your experience is *simply perfect*, prioritise local expertise and meaningful moments over traditions.

Planning Your Noosa Elopement to Perfection

Trust local experts over Google

Local planners and photographers often have 'secret spots' that aren't searchable online and understand localised conditions like tide charts or wind patterns at specific times of day. Noosa has several Elopement Specialists, to suit all budgets, personality preferences and expectations.

The weekday 'secret weapon'

Opt for a Monday-Thursday ceremony during the school term to avoid crowds, better vendor availability and enjoy a more relaxed atmosphere.

Focus on priorities

Identify one or two 'splurge items' (like a high-end photographer or a luxury venue) and allocate your budget accordingly.

Legal vs. symbolic

Many couples find it less stressful to sign legal paperwork in their home country before traveling, allowing the destination ceremony to be purely symbolic and free of administrative "red tape".

Keep the focus on you

Design your elopement around what matters most — your love, your experience, and your comfort. Skip unnecessary formalities or traditions that don't resonate, and choose moments and activities that truly reflect your personalities.

Essential Logistics

Timeline buffers

Transition times often take longer than expected, especially in new terrain. Build in extra time to savor moments rather than rushing between locations.

Arrive early

Plan to reach your destination at least one full day before the ceremony to handle any travel delays and settle into the environment.

Clothing comfort

Choose attire to suit the Noosa climate. Coastal vibes work well. Ensure your shoes are appropriate for the terrain (e.g. hiking boots for summits such as *Emu Mountain*, or being barefoot for beaches. If you consider diving into the ocean for those final photo moments, then a traditional dress might not be the go!

Carry-on your outfits

Never pack your wedding attire in checked luggage; always use a carry-on to avoid the disaster of lost bags.

Enhancing the Experience

Plan a Wedding-Moon

Treat the elopement as a holiday rather than a project.

Incorporate activities

Schedule activities you love, such as sunrise hikes in *Noosa National Park*, private picnics paddleboarding, surf lessons, the beautiful *Noosa Everglades Kayak* adventure and sunset boat cruises.

Involve loved ones

If you're eloping without guests, have family write letters for you to read during your ceremony, or schedule a dedicated video call later in the day.

Post-elopement cruise

Arrange a sunset cruise on Noosa River to complete your day and to take you to your waterfront restaurant. There are several romantic small boat options to choose from.

Stay present

Don't overschedule the day. You might even like to share your personal vows sitting at *Little Cove* in the morning with a coffee, followed by a simple legal ceremony at sunset in the afternoon - *sounds perfect. NW*

Your Wedding Glow Starts Here

What Noosa's Top Stylists Want Every Bride to Know

Your wedding day is one of the few times in life where every detail truly matters, especially when it comes to how you look and feel. Here are our simple, tried-and-true steps that make the biggest difference in the lead up to your day.

Hair Preparation

IN THE LEAD UP

- Get a professional haircut 9-12 months before your wedding, then maintain it with a trim every 6-8 weeks. This keeps your hair healthy, removes split ends, and maintains length.
- Avoid major changes to your haircut, stylist, or colour in the year leading up to your wedding. Consistency helps you achieve your best result.
- Invest in good quality haircare. If you regularly colour or chemically treat your hair, begin monthly conditioning treatments to strengthen and hydrate it.
- If you have naturally oily hair, switch to an oil-control shampoo and conditioner. When washing, shampoo twice — the first cleanses, the second helps regulate oil production at the roots. Use lukewarm (not hot) water, as heat can increase oil production. Avoid massaging your scalp and use your palms rather than fingertips when shampooing. Apply conditioner only to mid-lengths and ends.

THE NIGHT BEFORE YOUR WEDDING

Wash your hair the night before your wedding and let it air-dry without heat tools or styling products.

Skin Preparation

IN THE LEAD UP

- Start to prepare your skin for your wedding day, ideally 6-12 months out from the wedding day.
- Invest in a good quality exfoliator and start to use this once a week for at least 3 months before your wedding date.
- Don't forget to exfoliate and moisturise your lips. This is something most people forget and makes a huge difference to any makeup look.
- If you are not already doing so, start to cleanse your face mornings and evening and use a moisturiser that suits your skin type.
- Using an eye cream as part of your nightly routine will really help moisturise your under eye area and help your makeup look flawless on your wedding day.
- Introduce a serum into your routine, morning and night, to improve the overall health and texture of your skin. If you're unsure where to start, consult a cosmetic specialist at your local chemist or beauty salon.
- Good quality skincare doesn't need to be expensive. Research options that suit your skin and your budget.



THE NIGHT BEFORE YOUR WEDDING

Cleanse and moisturise and do the same again in the morning. Skip any products with SPF on the day, as they can reflect light and create a white sheen in your photographs.

Lash Preparation

IN THE LEAD UP

- If you've never worn semi-permanent strip lashes before book a trial one to two months before the wedding. This helps you test the look, comfort, and any possible sensitivity to the glue.
- Considering lash extensions? Trial them a month before your wedding, then schedule a refill the week of the wedding for the best result. **NW**



7 DAYS IN NOOSA

The Ultimate Escape For Your Wedding Guests

There are few places in Australia that blend barefoot luxury, natural beauty, and effortless charm quite like Noosa. When a wedding invitation arrives with this Sunshine Coast gem as the backdrop, guests know they're in for more than a celebration; *they're stepping into a holiday.*

This curated 7-day itinerary turns a wedding week into a full-blown coastal retreat, balancing relaxation, adventure, and time together in one of Queensland's most beloved destinations.

Two Days Before the Wedding: Ease In, Unwind, and Choose Your Adventure

Day 1

Arrivals and ocean breezes

Guests drift into Noosa at their own pace, checking into boutique stays around Hastings Street or riverside apartments in Noosaville. The first afternoon is all about settling in: a gentle stroll along Noosa Main Beach, Sunshine Beach or Peregian Beach, toes in the sand, followed by sunset drinks overlooking the ocean. Dinner is relaxed and social; think fresh seafood, warm air, and the hum of holiday mode kicking in.







Day 2 **Choose your own experience**

The day before the wedding offers guests a choose-your-own experience.

Golfers can enjoy a round on one of the region's scenic coastal courses, while those drawn to the water might prefer a half-day fishing charter, a relaxed cruise along the river or an offshore adventure in search of local marine life. Others may choose to explore the riverside charm of Tewantin, cross the ferry to the wide open beaches of the Noosa North Shore, or discover the area's vibrant craft brewery scene, sampling small-batch beers in relaxed garden-style settings that capture the easygoing spirit of the coast. For anyone craving pure indulgence, a visit to a nearby day spa or mineral pool retreat is the perfect pre-wedding reset.

As the sun dips, everyone comes together again for a casual riverside dinner; the kind of easy, welcoming evening that sets the tone beautifully for the celebrations ahead.





Day 3 *The Wedding Day: A Celebration in Paradise*

Wedding mornings in Noosa have their own rhythm. Guests wander out for coffee, take a dip at *Little Cove*, or simply enjoy the slow coastal start. Then it's time for the main event. Vows exchanged against a backdrop of ocean, river or rainforest, followed by a night of celebrating under the stars.



Following the Wedding: Noosa At Its Best

Noosa National Park magic and beach time

The post-wedding glow pairs perfectly with *Noosa National Park*. A group walk along the coastal track from *Noosa National Park* toward Sunshine Beach reveals turquoise bays, koalas tucked into eucalyptus branches, and dramatic ocean lookouts along the way. The afternoon is made for swimming at *Little Cove* or relaxing on Noosa Main Beach, ending with sunset drinks overlooking the surf.

Day 4

Cruise through the waterways

Noosa's waterways offer two unforgettable experiences. Adventurers paddle or cruise through the *Noosa Everglades* or spend a peaceful afternoon by the lake at Boreen Point, where still waters and wide horizons create a true sense of escape. Others may prefer a leisurely river cruise, stopping along the way for a long waterfront lunch before continuing into an afternoon of relaxed exploring. Either way, the day is serene, scenic, and deeply Noosa.

Day 6

Hinterland charm

A short drive inland reveals the Noosa Hinterland, where rolling hills, rainforest trails and quiet country villages offer a gentle change of pace. Guests can wander leafy heritage streets, browse local markets, enjoy a leisurely country lunch, and explore galleries, gift shops and artisan studios in Cooroy, Eumundi, Pomona, Kin Kin and Cooran. Botanical gardens, local waterfall walks, forest trails and winding rivers invite unhurried moments in nature before the evening settles into something simple and nostalgic; relaxed, scenic and unmistakably hinterland.

Day 7

Slow farewells

The final day invites guests to savour Noosa at their own pace; a gentle paddle along the river, a morning surf lesson, boutique browsing beneath leafy streets, or one last unhurried afternoon on the sand. As the week draws to a close, everyone comes together for a farewell dinner by the water, raising a final glass to the newlyweds and the unforgettable days shared together - a soft and fitting ending to a celebration and a beautiful week away.

A WEDDING WEEK TO REMEMBER

What makes Noosa so special is its ability to make every moment feel like a celebration.

A Celebrant's Guide to Saying 'I Do' in Noosa

Getting Around

Parking (or lack thereof) in Noosa can be tricky. A great option is to advise your guests to stay in Noosa Heads, or take the Noosa Ferry from Tewantin or Noosaville.

The Big Moment

Ask your Celebrant if they step aside for *the kiss*. Most do, as it's courteous and professional and an intimate moment that is not to be third-wheeled (the Celebrant appearing in lots of your photos, especially the kiss photo is a big no-no), however some Celebrants haven't got the memo yet. Ask them just to be sure.

/ CEREMONY

Back Up Weather Plan

Always have a backup plan for rain, even if the forecast looks clear. Check our 'Reception Venues' section in the Directory for some great backup and Plan B options!

Raise a Glass

Suggest, or preferably supply at least one mood-enhancing drink before the ceremony. A beer, glass of bubbles or a non-alcoholic option goes a long way toward creating a fun, enjoyable atmosphere for everyone! And of course, have bottles of chilled H2O on standby for those hot Summer weddings!

The Legal Stuff

Have your wedding admin sorted early - *The Notice of Intention to Marry (NIM)*, a legal document given to you by your Celebrant, is priority one. No completed NIM, no wedding. It's a pet hate of celebrants to have any 'time pressure' in relation to the NIM - so please, get it submitted as soon as possible. *NW*



Our Favourite CEREMONY L

The Noosa area has some of the **most iconic and world renowned photographic locations** for your wedding day, equal to anywhere in the world. Our most recognised sites are situated along the beautiful *Noosa Boardwalk*, with grass or sand underfoot, Casuarina trees offering shade above, and the Noosa Heads Main Beach and across to the coloured sands behind.



01 *Maison La Plage Grove*

ACCESS #17 | CAPACITY UP TO 200

This is the most popular ceremony location for 100+ guest list weddings and is the most manicured of the beach ceremony spots. With a beautiful green lawn surrounded by native trees & bushes it really is a must to consider for your special day.



02 *Casuarina Gardens*

ACCESS #17 | CAPACITY UP TO 60

For those who prefer a more natural spot for their ceremony, *Casuarina Gardens* should be at the top of your list. The Casuarina trees that give it its name provide a relaxed feel for this spot while still having a lovely view of the beach through the trees.



03 *Hidden Grove*

EAST OF BEACH ACCESS #16 | CAPACITY UP TO 100

A private ceremony location hidden amongst the trees, while still being close to the *Hastings St* restaurants and cafés, this is the second most popular spot for Noosa Beach ceremonies.

04 *Laguna Grove*

EAST OF BEACH ACCESS #16 | CAPACITY UP TO 100

A stunning ceremony location with easy access by the beach and the path to the life-saving tower, while still being close to the *Hastings St* restaurants and cafés, this is the another popular spot for Noosa Beach ceremonies.



05 *Access #14 / #15*

CAPACITY UP TO 80

With native trees scattered throughout the clearing and a beautiful view of the beach, this is a lovely spot for a wedding ceremony. In the late afternoon, there is gorgeous golden light spilling through the trees, giving a beautiful and warm feel to this location.



06 *Beach Access #12*

CAPACITY UP TO 60



Light, Landscape & Love

Noosa offers more than a stunning setting for a wedding; it offers atmosphere. From the soft salt-kissed air along the coastline, to the layered greens of the hinterland, photography here is *shaped as much by environment* as by emotion.

Capturing a wedding in Noosa requires more than technical skill. It requires understanding the light, the landscape, and the relaxed coastal rhythm that defines this place.

Photography that respects the landscape

Just as styling should enhance rather than compete with Noosa’s natural beauty, photography should honour it.

The coastline delivers luminous golden light, reflective sand tones, and ocean blues that need little embellishment. The headlands of Noosa National Park offer dramatic backdrops framed by native pandanus and eucalyptus. The calm waters of the river and the rolling hinterland provide softer, romantic textures.

An experienced local photographer understands how to:

- Work with coastal wind rather than against it
- Use natural shade to soften midday ceremonies
- Time portraits around golden hour and tide movements
- Capture iconic locations without disrupting public spaces

In a place like Noosa, light changes quickly. Knowing when and where to position a couple can transform a photograph from beautiful to extraordinary.

The importance of local knowledge

Noosa’s beaches, parks and reserves are shared community spaces, often managed by council or state authorities. Photography within these locations requires discretion, efficiency, and respect for regulations — particularly in areas such as Noosa Heads and surrounding coastal reserves.

Local photographers are familiar with:

- Permit requirements
- Restricted areas within national park zones
- Weather and wind patterns unique to each location
- Seasonal tourism flow and timing considerations

This knowledge ensures photography remains seamless and unobtrusive — preserving both the moment and the environment.

The Iconic **HASTINGS ST**

When you've travelled to Noosa for a wedding, chances are the ceremony is only part of the experience. Sitting right on Noosa Main Beach, Hastings Street is the perfect place to turn a wedding weekend into a mini holiday.



From pre-ceremony coffees to post-reception cocktails and relaxed beach walks in between, this iconic strip offers plenty for wedding guests looking to make the most of their stay.

Start the day with a beachside coffee

Wedding weekends often involve early starts, whether you're attending a ceremony, helping with last-minute preparations or simply soaking up the atmosphere. Hastings Street is ideal for a slow, sunshine-filled morning.

Enjoy a relaxed coffee at one of the many beachfront cafés or choose something lighter such as fresh juices, smoothies or nourishing breakfast bowls from a nearby local favourite.

With takeaway coffee in hand, wander down to Noosa Main Beach and enjoy the calm, north-facing shoreline. It's a gentle way to ease into the day before the wedding festivities begin.

Local providers also have established relationships with venues and wedding planners, making coordination smoother and far less stressful.

They know what works (*and what doesn't!*) in real-world Noosa conditions, from busy school holiday traffic to weather considerations on the river.

Planning Ahead Is Key

Wedding transport should be booked early, especially for peak wedding season. Consider guest arrival and departure times, accessibility needs, wet weather contingencies, and how transport fits into your overall run sheet. Clear communication with your guests, including pickup points and schedules, will help everything run effortlessly on the day.

Whether you choose to arrive by ferry, coach, classic car (or a combination of both), well-planned transport allows you to relax and truly enjoy each and every moment. **NW**

/ STYLING

WEDDING STYLING 101

Wedding styling is the visual storytelling of your day. It brings together colour palettes, textures, florals, furniture, lighting and layout to create a cohesive atmosphere that reflects who you are as a couple.



Done well, **styling elevates a space, photographs beautifully, and ensures your ceremony and reception flow seamlessly.** *But great styling isn't just about aesthetics.* It's also about logistics, safety, environmental care, and compliance, especially when your wedding takes place in one of Noosa's cherished public or outdoor locations.

01 Understanding Noosa's Unique Locations

Noosa offers some of the most sought-after ceremony locations in Australia — beaches, parks, headlands and riverfronts — many of which are managed by local council or state authorities. These spaces come with specific rules designed to protect the environment and ensure public safety.

Local, experienced stylists understand:

- Where ceremonies are permitted (and where they're not)
- What structures are allowed (arches, arbours, flooring, furniture)
- Wind, tides, weather patterns and access considerations
- Time restrictions, bump-in and bump-out requirements
