Lipstick, chrome, and a whole lot of attitude....read on to find out why this blonde chose a Harley...rather, two Harleys!!

I have learned two important things in life. First, cancer changes everything. Second, nothing clears your mind quite like a Harley Davidson and an open road. People are often surprised when they find out I ride motorcycles. I suppose I don't fit the stereotype. I have long blonde hair. I love being feminine. I enjoy wearing dresses, lipstick and heels. I'm a girly girl through and through. But, lo and behold, many of you have watched me climb onto my Harleys, wearing a dress over my leggings and Harley boots. My long hair can be seen flowing down the back of my helmet (yes, I always wear a helmet – I respect those who choose not to but I have too much to live for – I beat cancer...NOTHING is worth risking it in my opinion.) The reactions are priceless when people realize that's a woman on that big loud sexy Harley! Now, lots of women happen to ride these days and I think that's fabulous!

"A Harley? You ride a Harley?" Why yes, I do. And I love every second of it. The truth is, I enjoy the shock factor almost as much as I enjoy the ride. I mean, I really LOVE shock factor in general. I always have! Life is too short to be predictable. Trust me, I know. Breast cancer was my wake up call. Before breast cancer, I was like a lot of people. I had dreams. I had plans. I had things I wanted to do "someday." Then someday suddenly felt very uncertain. When I received my diagnosis, I realized something important. Nobody knows how much time they have. We act like tomorrow is guaranteed, but it isn't. I decided, soon after my double mastectomy, that I wasn't going to spend the rest of my life wondering "what if." If there was something I wanted to do, I was going to do it. No excuses. No waiting. No fear. One of those many things was learning how to ride a motorcycle.

Now, here's the funny part. I couldn't and still can't ride a bicycle. Seriously. Most people start with a bicycle and eventually graduate to a motorcycle. Apparently, I skipped a few steps. But, I've never been known for doing things the conventional way. The first time I rode a motorcycle, I felt something I hadn't felt in a very long time. Freedom. Pure, unfiltered freedom. Not cancer. Not doctor's appointments. Not hospitals. Not surgery after surgery. Not feelings of loss. Not fear. Just me, my bike and the open road. The engine growled beneath me and boy do I love that sound! Such a sexy sound! The wind rushed around me. The sunshine warmed my face and skin. For those moments, I felt free. I wasn't worried about the future. I wasn't

carrying the weight of the world. I was simply alive and what a beautiful feeling that is.

Motorcycles don't just take you places. They take you away from things...away from stress, away from worry, away from every thought that tries to steal your joy. For me, riding became therapy with a throttle. Who needs a bottle?! I never turned to the bottle thank goodness, but that throttle became my healthy addiction, my escape from my reality. I can honestly say I was and still am so damn proud of myself for learning how to ride a motorcycle. This girly girl always wanted to ride but never thought she could. Guess what folks! I can f'ing ride!!! Now, am I the absolute strongest rider out there? Heck no. I know my limitations. I hate taking right turns so if I can take three lefts for every right, I will do it. Crazy I know, but it works for me. Have I dropped my bikes a time or two? Maybe three? Absolutely! But, I'm proud to say it was never when I was moving or at least not moving too fast. I once got stuck on a speed bump since I went over it too slow so down I went. I learned! Did I burn my leg on my Vance and Hines pipes two times on the same day? Yup, I sure did and boy did that hurt! Have I gotten stuck on the side of the highway a time or two? Of course I have but you know what? I met the absolute best people in the world! So many kind souls always came to my rescue. I became a part of a new family and learned that us bikers look out for each other. What a wonderful family to be a part of!

People who don't ride motorcycles often imagine glamorous scenes. A graceful feminine woman. A gorgeous motorcycle. A scenic roadway. The wind flowing dramatically through her hair. And yes, sometimes it really is that magical. Other times? You get hit in the face by a bug the size of a golf ball. Nobody talks enough about bugs. Motorcyclists know what I'm talking about. Sooner or later, you're going to eat them or have them plastered all over your bike along with your face. You're out there feeling like the star of your own movie, feeling all sexy and badass, when suddenly a flying insect decides your face is the perfect landing strip or bird poop lands on your arm. Nothing humbles you faster. It's all part of the experience. Then there was the infamous bee incident. I was cruising down the highway at about 60 miles per hour, enjoying a beautiful day and minding



my own business. I never had a need for speed on a bike – a car, that's another story but on my bike, I love the ride. I love the smells. I love the sights. Well, one day, out of nowhere, a bee slammed into my arm and stung me. It literally got stuck

in my arm. Holy moly that hurt. I couldn't yank it out while I was riding 60 miles an hour. I would like to officially report that getting stung by a bee while riding a motorcycle is not enjoyable.

Like many Harley riders, my love affair started with a Sportster. I purchased my first bike even before I took the class. I had only been on the back of a Harley a handful of times throughout the course of my life but I knew I always wanted to learn how to ride. I found a pearl white 2008 Harley Sportster 1200 with super low miles and bought it even before I learned how to ride. Of course, this girly girl failed the class the first time and boy did I fail miserably! The worst score you could get was a 15 and the best was a zero. I got a 31. LOL!!! I recall the instructor, who was very tall – around 6'8" or so, leaned down to my female tall of 5'8" and said, "Cindy, in your heart of hearts, you know you're not ready for the road." I just teared up, felt totally disheartened, absolutely exhausted since I used muscles I never knew I had AND I was so so sore from a recent surgery I had. I had just had another major breast surgery a couple of weeks prior and knew I shouldn't have taken that class but given they booked up fast and I had already paid, I figured I'd just try and do my best. I was full of stitches and of course, my upper body was a bit weak, but I'm unstoppable. I went home feeling defeated but still very proud of myself for getting through the entire class. I ended up getting my permit and practicing the heck out of my Sportster, went back a couple of months later, took the class again and passed with a whopping 13. Not bad! I went from a failing score of 31 to a passing score of 13 and have never ridden any sort of motorized 2 wheel anything prior to this. The instructors were very proud of me. They told me that most who fail are never to be seen at the school again. I told them and I showed them, "I'm no quitter!"

I loved my first Harley and thought I'd have it forever. It taught me confidence. It taught me balance. It taught me courage. Most importantly, it taught me that even me, a girly girl, belongs on two wheels. But the more I learned

about bikes, the more I decided I wanted something with a lower center of gravity. I had a very part time job at the Danbury Harley and would see all sorts of bikes come in. I test drove a Heritage and really liked it. Soon after, I found my dream bike, a gorgeous 1992 Heritage. This beauty had blue and cream original paint. I added tons of chrome and skulls, Vance and Hines pipes, upgraded all of the electrical, straight handlebars and whitewall tires. She has attitude, class, personality. People always admired her. She has character. She's strong. She's sexy. She's fearless. I felt one with my bike and what an exhilarating feeling that is! So, yes, I felt powerful on my bike. I felt sexy. I felt fearless. I felt like I could conquer the world. I felt freedom. I felt strong. After cancer, those feelings meant absolutely everything to me. Cancer can make you feel vulnerable. Motorcycles reminded me that I was stronger than I ever realized. Every mile became a celebration. Every ride became proof that I was still here. Still living. Still laughing. Still chasing adventure. Still refusing to let fear drive my life.

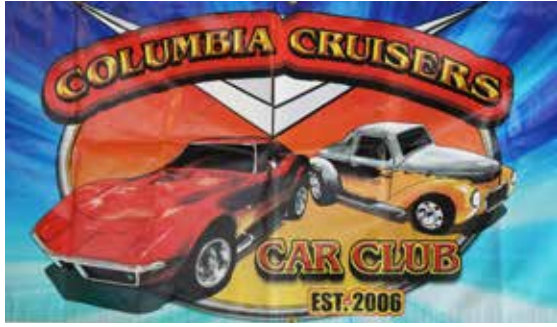
Summer is my favorite time to ride. The sun is shining. The skies are blue. The roads are calling. There is nothing better than taking off on a beautiful day with nowhere important to be. Sometimes I ride to a destination. Sometimes I ride just because the weather is perfect. Sometimes I ride because my soul needs it. The destination doesn't matter nearly as much as the journey. It's ironic because with regards to my cancer journey, I say, "The journey sucked but the destination is amazing." I love where I am in life, but I didn't love how I got here. But riding is an entirely different scenario. The ride is the best part. The destination never mattered to me.

Riding motorcycles, for me, is about freedom, courage and joy. It's about feeling every second of my life instead of watching it pass by. Cancer taught me life is precious. Motorcycles taught me how to celebrate it. So, if you happen to see a blonde woman rolling down the highway on a chrome-covered Harley with a giant smile on her face, don't be surprised. That's just me. Living loudly. Riding proudly. And proving that sometimes the most badass person in the room is the one wearing lipstick.

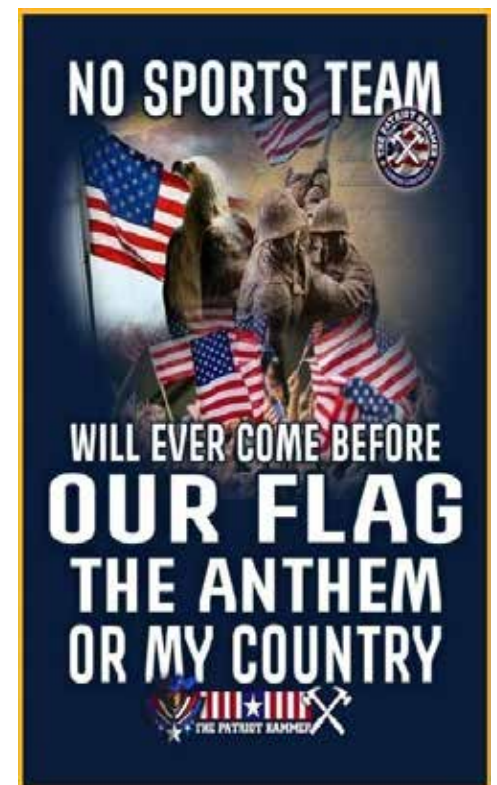
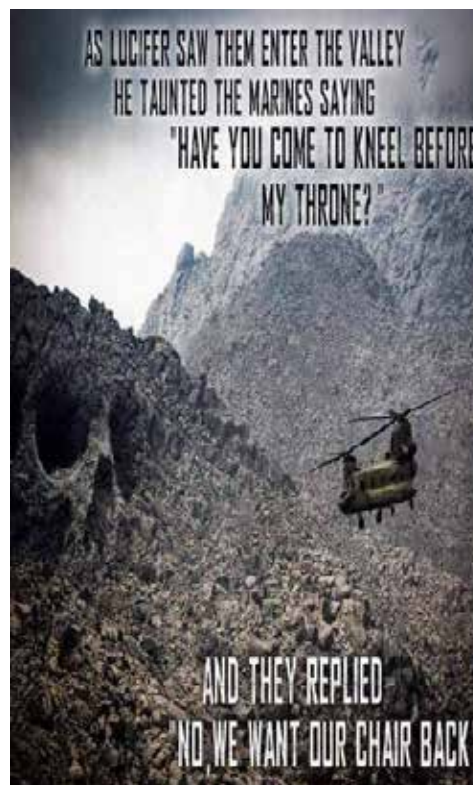

Tick Season Is Here: Protecting Your Pets from Tiny but Dangerous Pests

As temperatures rise, so does the tick population, and this year, experts are reporting an increase in tick activity across many parts of the United States. While these tiny parasites may seem like a minor nuisance, they can carry serious diseases that affect both pets and humans.

Dogs are particularly vulnerable because they spend time exploring grassy fields, wooded trails, and even backyard landscapes where ticks thrive. Cats that venture outdoors are also at risk.

One of the most common illnesses transmitted by ticks is Lyme disease, but ticks can also spread ehrlichiosis, anaplasmosis, babesiosis, and Rocky Mountain spotted fever. Keeping your yard maintained can also reduce tick populations. Mow grass regularly, remove leaf litter, trim overgrown brush, and discourage wildlife such as deer and rodents from entering your yard.

If you discover a tick attached to your pet, remove it promptly with fine-tipped tweezers or a tick removal tool, grasping it as close to the skin as possible and pulling straight out with steady pressure.

Finally, remember that tick prevention protects more than just your pets; it helps protect your family as well. Pets can carry unattached ticks into the home, where they may later attach to people.

With a few simple preventive steps and regular checks after outdoor ad-

ventures, you can greatly reduce your pet’s risk and enjoy the season with greater peace of mind. A few minutes of prevention today could spare your beloved companion from a serious illness tomorrow.

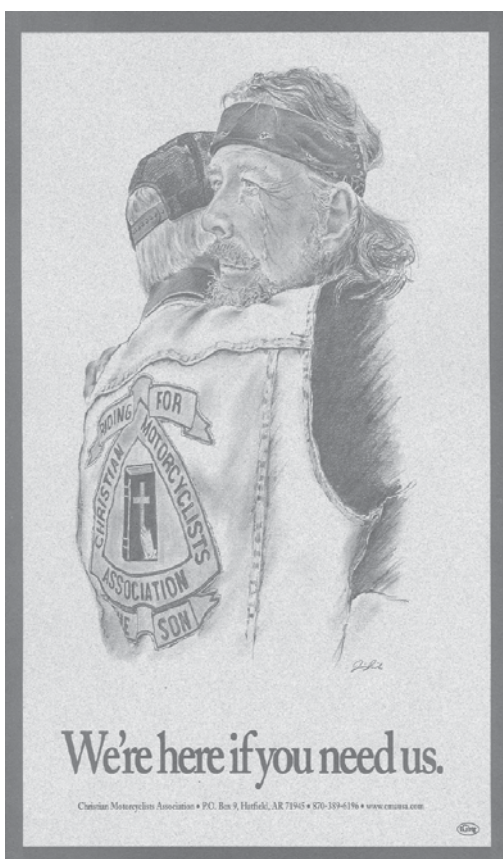

In Memory of John Russo



John Russo; age 82

John was a long-time member of WSRA who owned many cars through the years and loved the Hot Rod/Muscle Car culture. The first car was a '32 Ford in 1961 that John turned into a Hot Rod. Like many car enthusiasts John moved from car to car as tastes changed. He had several Corvettes, an El Camino, a Mustang, a Cobra kit car, a Dune Buggy and his last, a '40 Ford. He thoroughly enjoyed each of his rides and the company of fellow enthusiasts.

In Memory of John Segreto



John Segreto; age 84

John was longtime friend of WSRA and avid builder of multiple cars through the years, his latest was a 48 Ford Pickup.

As an entrepreneur, John built "Rye Auto Collision" into a successful business and earned the respect of his clients and all who worked with him. His love for cars was a defining part of his life. Forever diligent, ensuring every aspect of his many car builds were impeccably designed and crafted. He shared this passion for cars with his brother Jamie and son Michael and was always ready to offer a helping hand to fellow car enthusiasts.

In Memory of Marshall Stanley



Marshal Stanley Labow; age 83

Marshall was a long-time member of WSRA - Marshall devoted his life to his passion for automobiles. From hot rods and historical Italian factory race cars to the everyday cars that kept him moving, he found joy under the hood and pride in a job well done.

Cars were more than machines to Marshall, they were stories, craftsmanship, and connection to what drove his world. He worked tirelessly for anyone who needed help with their automobile, always ready with skilled hands, steady patience, and a generous heart. If something had wheels and needed care, Marshall was there - in jeans and a black t-shirt.



Doc Pomus (1925–1991): Singer, Songwriter and Rock & Roll Pioneer



Doc Pomus, born Jerome Solon Felder in Brooklyn, New York, overcame enormous physical hardships to become one of the most important songwriters in rock-and-roll history. Stricken with polio as a child, he spent much of his life using crutches and later a wheelchair. Despite these challenges, he developed a passion for blues music after hearing records by Big Joe Turner and began performing in New York clubs as a teenager. To keep his parents from knowing he was singing in nightclubs, he adopted the stage name "Doc Pomus."

Pomus first gained attention as a blues singer in the 1940s and early 1950s, recording for labels such as Apollo, Savoy, Coral, Chess, and Dawn. Although his recordings achieved only modest success, they established him as one of the finest white blues singers of his era.

By the mid-1950s he realized that songwriting offered greater opportunities. His first major success as a writer was "Lonely Avenue," recorded by Ray Charles. Soon afterward he partnered with young pianist and composer Mort Shuman. Working from New York's famous Brill Building, Pomus wrote lyrics while Shuman generally supplied the music. Together they created some of the defining songs of the late 1950s and early 1960s.

One of Pomus's most famous songs, "Save the Last Dance for Me," came directly from his personal life. On his wedding day he watched his bride, Broadway dancer Willi Burke, dance with other guests while he was unable to dance because of his polio. The

experience inspired the lyrics, making the song one of the most touching and personal hits of the rock era.

Pomus and Shuman wrote numerous hits for Elvis Presley, The Drifters, Dion and the Belmonts, and many others. Presley alone recorded more than twenty of their songs.

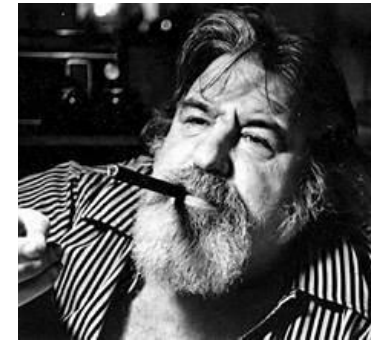

Legacy

Doc Pomus was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and the Songwriters Hall of Fame. His songs have been recorded by hundreds of artists and remain staples of oldies radio, rock-and-roll revival shows, and doo-wop concerts. His life story stands as one of determination and triumph over adversity. Despite the limitations imposed by polio, he transformed personal struggles into songs that captured love, longing, heartbreak, and hope for generations of listeners.

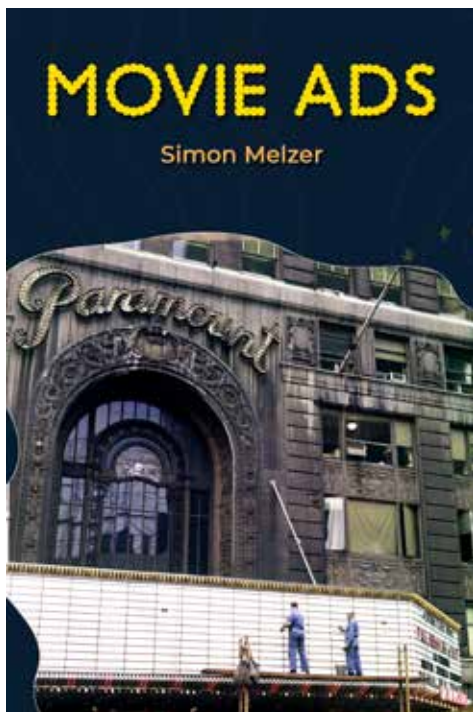

Golden Age Of Hollywood

The Golden Age of Hollywood, considered to have begun in the 1930's with the advent of the great movie studios. These studios were created by Eastern European immigrants. Carl Laemmle, created Universal, Adolph Zukor, Paramount, Samuel Goldwyn and Louis B Mayer created Metro, Goldwyn, Mayer, MGM, William Fox created Fox pictures later to merge with 20th Century Pictures to become 20th Century Fox and The Warner Brothers, (Harry, Albert, Sam and Jack) Warner Brothers.

These individuals were responsible for the creation of the greatest American art form and entertainment, The Motion Picture Industry.

The greatest revolution in the motion picture industry occurred in the late 1920's, the development of sound, they were called, "talking Pictures". It would be almost one hundred years later, that another revolutionary event took place, the introduction of digital Computerized movies that we see today.

My fascination with the movies began during my youth when I would

go to the movies regularly. This didn't stop with just watching movies but also making movies, and a desire to become a filmmaker. Professionally, this desire didn't materialize but I did manage to make quite a few films, first on film and later video. In the early 90's I decided to begin collecting vintage movie related Memorabilia.

Over thirty years ago I acquired a sixty drawer cabinet filled with thousands of magazine and newspaper photos of movie stars and movie advertisements.

This cabinet would become the basis of my book, *Movie Ads*, published in 2024.

I spent months organizing the collection into various categories and sold most of the vintage periodical photos but decided to keep the movie advertisements. As a youngster, I enjoyed browsing through the movie ads in magazines such as *Life*, *Look*, *Time* and others.

The ads were placed in two large loose leaf binders, preserving the originals for my future enjoyment.

The growing availability of new technology convinced me to professionally scan my favorite ads into digital files to make viewing much simpler and more enjoyable.

In 2023, I decided to turn this collection of ads into a book. I contacted an entertainment book publisher, Bear Manor Media, the publisher related to me that he used to collect newspaper movie ads, but got rid of them. He liked the idea of a book of movie ads and asked me to submit a proposal. I digitized the rest of the collection and dated every single ad.

Thus began the long two year's trek of creating a book, assisted by a person with computer expertise we designed each ad, reproduced from my original collection exactly as it appeared in the periodicals of that period.

I researched books that deal with movie advertising, and found that most included up to four black and white images per page with questionable quality. I decided that my book would

feature only one ad per page with the date of release for each.

The result is a unique, good looking book with clear images on each page. This is truly a one of a kind book with over five hundred pages of my personal collection of movie ads. It is a tribute to the publicity departments of the major studios of the time.

The book is divided into four chapters; The 30's, The Early Talkies; The 40's, World War Two; The 50's, Un-American Hollywood, and The 60's, The Spectacles and Hitchcock.

This period contains the largest number of Hollywood's golden age movies and movie stars.

To name just a few movies; *Picnic* (1955), *The Story of G.I Joe* (1945), *The Birds* (1963), *Little Women* (1933), *Butterfield 8* (1960), *Imitation of Life* (1959), *Gunfight at the OK Corral* (1957), *It's A Wonderful Life* (1946), and over five hundred more. The stars include; Bette Davis, Joan Crawford, Gary Cooper, William Holden, Humphrey Bogart, John Wayne, Loretta Young, Grace Kelly, Gregory Peck, Clark Gable, James Stewart, Natalie Wood, Elizabeth Taylor, Marlon Brando and hundreds more.

The original ads jump off the pages with exciting graphics, in b&w, color or both with provocative text. A book for collectors as well as fans, historians, filmmakers and artists.

Culture Corner



KEEPING AUTOMOTIVE HISTORY ALIVE

One of the key missions of the car club which I am President of is Keeping Car Culture Alive and well for future Generations.. One of our Charter Members Jeff DeMarey has done just that in a big, big way. His credentials are CCCA National & Regional Director, VSCCA Member, Stonewall Insurance Collector & Collector Car Insurance Owner & Specialist, and Master Judge.



He founded The Springfield to Boston Education Foundation which is a nonprofit educational organization with a DIFFERENCE

They continue to set themselves apart from other foundations, museums, art museums and even the national history museums by running and driving the majority of their collection.

As they operate our collection, one element remains constant: education. The collection will not be like other antique collections, transportation you can't touch. The Springfield to Boston Education Foundation allows both staff and volunteers to store, maintain, repair and drive their world-class collection of automobiles to keep the magic alive.



THE WILBRAHAM HILL CLIMB

In 1908, a steep hill in Wilbraham, Massachusetts served as one of the earliest tests for the American automobile.

Carmakers brought their machines to Monson Road, pointed them uphill, and let the grade do the judging. More than a century later, the Historic Wilbraham Hill Climb is still using that same hill,

The race is just the beginning. Around it, DeMarey has built a full day: historic cars, motorcycles, museums, vendors, food and a car show with 350 cars. Money realized from the HILL CLIMB EVENT helps fund The Springfield to Boston Education Foundation. A VERY WORTHY CAUSE.

This year, the Hill Climb added a chapter that would have felt fitting to the carmakers who started it all. Engineering teams from MIT, Boston University, UMass Amherst, and Western New England University are expected to bring prototype vehicles and student-built technology to Monson Road, placing today's innovators on the same grade where the earliest automobile builders once came to prove themselves.

DeMarey does not take that image lightly. To him, placing today's student engineers on the same road where the earliest automobile builders once tested their machines is not a programming addition. It is history doing what it rarely gets the chance to do... Repeat itself!

"It matters because the engineers, designers and prototypes of 1908 were on that same hill," he said. "Now we have talented young engineers from some of the best programs on the East Coast coming to test their vehicles on the very same road."

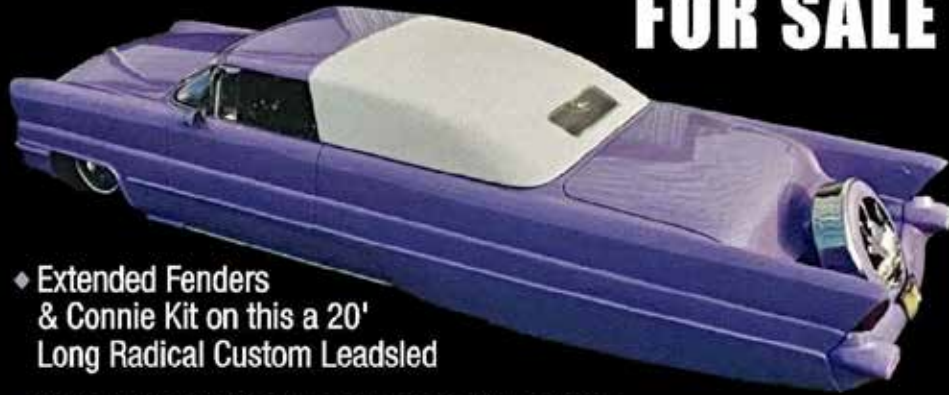

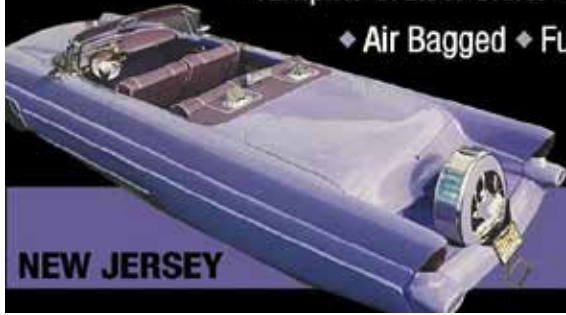

Why We Treat Our Cars Like They're Human

A Day at the Races

Queen released an album in 1976 called *A Day at the Races*. While the title was inspired by the classic Marx Brothers film "A Night at the Opera", every time I find myself at Lime Rock Park in Connecticut, I can't help but think that Queen got the title exactly right.

I recently attended the Trans Am Memorial Day Classic race at Lime Rock, and even with rain falling for much of Saturday's race, it reminded me why I've been coming back year after year. A day at the races is never just about the race. It begins long before the first green flag waves. Long before engines roar to life. Long before spectators stake out their favorite viewing spots around the track. For me, it starts at sunrise.

Sunrise at Lime Rock is simply magical. The hills are quiet. The air is cool. The paddock slowly comes to life as trailers are opened, tools are unloaded, and drivers prepare for the day ahead. Cars that will soon be flying around the track at triple-digit speeds sit quietly under the soft morning light, almost as if they're still asleep.

One of my favorite traditions is strolling through the paddock before the crowds arrive. In many ways, it's a great car show, too.

You'll find everything from vintage sports cars and historic racers to modern performance machines. Owners and crew members wipe down fenders, check tire pressures, make lastminute adjustments, and talk shop with fellow enthusiasts. Some have been coming to Lime Rock for decades. Others are experiencing the track for the very first time. Yet everyone shares the same anticipation for what lies ahead.

The spectators are part of the experience too. Some arrive with cameras slung around their necks, determined to capture the perfect shot. Others come armed with lawn chairs, coolers, and years of racing knowledge. Families introduce a new generation to the sport while lifelong enthusiasts swap stories about races they've attended and cars they've owned. Spend a few minutes talking with people at Lime Rock and you'll quickly discover that everyone has a favorite car, favorite driver, and at least one favorite memory.



And then there are the cars themselves. One of the joys of Lime Rock is the incredible variety of machinery that finds its way onto the track. Depending on the event, you may see everything from historic race cars that helped shape motorsports history to modern purpose-built machines capable of astonishing performance. Corvettes, Porsches, Mustangs, BMWs, Lolas, and countless other marques have all taken their turn on Lime Rock's famous circuit. For car enthusiasts, simply walking through the paddock can feel like a trip through automotive history.

The paddock is where the stories live, and every car has a story. Some have spent years being restored. Others have raced all over the country. Some owners can tell you every nut, bolt, and modification. Others simply smile and say, "I just love driving it."

After fifteen years as a volunteer at Lime Rock Park, I've learned that one of the greatest pleasures along with watching the cars is talking with the people. I typically work in the information area, helping visitors find their way around the facility and answering questions. Over the years I've met everyone from first-time spectators to lifelong racing fans, and one thing I've learned is that people often arrive expecting a race and leave having experienced something much bigger.

When the drivers get on track, the peaceful morning silence gives way to the unmistakable soundtrack of motorsports. Some cars growl. Some scream. Some crackle and pop on

deceleration. The sounds echo through the hills and instantly signal that the day is underway.

Then comes one of the toughest decisions of the day: where to watch. Most spectators have their favorite locations. Some head for the Sam Posey Straight. Others gather near Big Bend. Personally, I love the Esses because they showcase driver skill, and the chicane because every now and then you get to see a car catch a little air. It may only be for a moment, but it's enough to get everyone's attention.

Stand near a braking zone and you'll witness drivers pushing the limits of physics. Watch from a sweeping turn and you'll appreciate the precision required to carry speed through the corner. Position yourself near one of Lime Rock's seven turns and you'll see just how hard these drivers are working to extract every ounce of performance from their machines.

Television simply doesn't capture that sensation. The speed. The sound. The vibration. The rush of air as a car flashes by. You really have to experience it in person.

But racing is about more than speed. It's about competition. One of the most exciting aspects of any race is watching drivers battle for position. Two cars enter a corner side by side. One driver takes a defensive line. Another searches for an opening. The crowd collectively holds its breath as the battle unfolds. Sometimes the pass works perfectly, and sometimes it doesn't.

Occasionally a driver misses a braking point, drops a tire into the grass, gets a little too ambitious exiting a corner, or discovers that the limits of adhesion are not quite where he thought they were. That's racing.

Those moments remind us that motorsports are ultimately a human endeavor. Behind every helmet is a person making split-second decisions while managing speed, traffic, changing conditions, and pressure.

One comment from a friend has always stayed with me. He once told me he'd rather be in last place on the track than standing on the sidelines watching a race.

A day at the races is about speed, certainly. It's about competition and machinery and driving skill. But it's also about community, passion, stories, and shared experiences. It's about the people who gather because they love automobiles and everything that surrounds them.

After years of volunteering at Lime Rock Park, I can say with certainty that the race itself is only part of the attraction. The real magic is everything that happens around it.

And that's why, year after year, there is no place I'd rather spend a day than at the races.

A Note from Judy: As this article was being written, the racing world was mourning the loss of two-time NASCAR Cup Series champion Kyle Busch at just 41 years old. His passing is a reminder that while we come for the cars and the competition, it is ultimately the people and the memories they create that make this sport special. Those memories endure long after the checkered flag falls. Rest in peace, Kyle, and thanks for the memories.

Early Car Motoring, Comradery and Rescheduling

The Mission of the Fairfield County Region of the Horseless Carriage Club/Antique Automobile Club of America (HCCA/AACA) is to "Preserve the collector hobby and family fun of owning a Pre-World War II Automobile for generations to come." President Shenton King leads the club's focus on early car motoring, comradery and sharing the passion with others. While the unsettled springtime weather has delayed a major event, the club members still participated in several activities.

The season started with a Derby Day themed fundraiser for the Pequot Library in Southport, CT on May 2, 2026. Three Horseless Carriage club cars participated in a very festive tailgate party on the library's Great Lawn. The antique cars were a 1912 Pope-Hartford, a rare 1911 Maxwell GAR, and our 1911 Hupmobile Model 20 Roadster. It was an opportunity to promote the car club and its upcoming Hill Climb event while the guests posed with the Brass Era cars in their horse themed costumes and hats.

Another event to promote the Hill Climb was at the Congregational Church Hall in Easton, CT on May 16,

2026, co-sponsored with the Historical Society of Easton as part of the town's America 250 celebrations. Starting with a barbecue followed by a fascinating presentation by Mitch and Wendy Gross: Peking to Paris - A motoring Odyssey in a 1910 White Steam Car. Covering an astonishing 8,500 miles, their 109-year-old automobile proved its endurance by completing one of the world's most demanding vintage car rallies back in 2019!

The next day a large group of Brass Era automobiles jaunted to a museum lawn in Stratford, CT as a special antique display for that town's 250 celebration. This was a promotional preview of the cars that would be partaking in the following weekend's Hill Climb to be held in Easton on Saturday, May 23, 2026.

Sadly, the forecast for Memorial Day weekend called for rain. While Shenton still wanted the Hill Climb event to go on, the Chief of police called and "encouraged" him to reschedule. We all felt Shenton's anguish at having to postpone the event after all of the buildup for it.

Soooo....rather than speed up a hill, friends and volunteers were invited to drive a modern vehicle to a private car barn for coffee, pastries, and watch restored car films from the club's early beginnings in the 1950s. We also heard

many of the stories of the cars in the barn.

The rain continued through Sunday and during the start of Memorial Day Monday. Many towns cancelled their parades, but Fairfield, did not. The Fairfield Museum had requested some antique cars with a military connection to help represent them in the parade as part of their 250 celebration. Since the Hupmobile Model 20 was evaluated by the 26th Infantry as a scout car in 1911 and has the distinction of being the first American car officially used in U. S. military service, it qualifies for a military theme. As the Fairfield Memorial Day Parade is one of the largest parades in CT, it was an opportunity for many to see a brass era car in motion with appropriate vintage costuming, even if a bit wet from the early morning rain.

As of the time of this writing, the Sport Hill Antique Car Show & Hill Climb has been postponed to Saturday, August 29, 2026. It will again be an opportunity for the public to see cars over one hundred years old be cranked up and running once again.

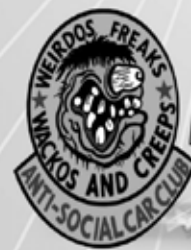

Cruisin' in the Kitchen

Hello Car People! Car season got off to a rainy start but finally the weather has warmed and the sun has come out! We're out with our car, seeing familiar faces and catching up on what we've all been doing over the winter.

In this issue we've decided to go South. A big piece of "Southern Hospitality" is about the food. Southern Cuisine is a rich comforting culinary tradition built on Native American, West African and European influences. It highlights soulful slow cooking, bold spices and local ingredients. It has "sub cuisines such as Cajun and Creole in Louisiana, Low country in Georgia and the Carolinas, Appalachia, and Soul Food. Whether fried, baked or stewed it is full of flavor and packed with love.

So why don't you try a Southern Soul Food meal. The recipes that we have written are flavorful and easy. It's all about the flavor. Enjoy, have some friends to share the hospitality....be good, be kind and happy cooking!

Southern Baked Chicken (serves 4)

Ingredients:

4 bone in chicken thighs and 4 bone in drumsticks (or 1-4 lb chicken cut in 8 pieces)

3 tbsp prepared Soul Food Seasoning or you can make your own: 2 tbsp garlic powder, 2 tbsp onion powder, 2 tbsp paprika, 1 tbsp ground black pepper, 1 tbsp cayenne pepper, 1 tbsp

ground thyme, 1 tbsp celery seed, 1 tbsp dry parsley and 1 tbsp salt.
2 tbsp vegetable oil

Directions:

1. Pat dry chicken, brush with oil and season well with spice blend. Place skin side up on a baking sheet.
2. Bake in a 375-degree pre heated oven for 45-50 minutes until chicken is golden brown and crispy. Let rest 5 minutes before serving.

Southern Fried Chicken (serves 4)

Ingredients:

4 bone in chicken thighs and 4 bone in drumsticks (or 1-4 lb chicken cut in 8 pieces)

For the Brine:

16 cups water
¾ cup kosher salt
½ cup granulated sugar
Lots of Ice

For the Seasoned Flour:

1 cup flour
1 cup corn starch
1 ½ tsp garlic powder, 1 ½ tsp onion powder, 1 ½ tsp ground black pepper, ½ tsp seasoned salt,
1 tsp smoked paprika

For the Egg Wash:

3 eggs
3 tbsp water

Directions:

1. To brine the chicken-bring the water to a boil in a large pot. Add kosher salt and sugar, stirring until completely dissolved. Remove from heat and let cool for 30 minutes. Then add ice to the pot until the water mixture reaches room temperature. Add the chicken pieces to the pot, cover and refrigerate for at least 4 hours or overnight. Before cooking remove the chicken from the pot, rinse thoroughly and pat dry before dredging.

2. Put flour, cornstarch and seasoning in a large bowl and mix to combine.

3. Crack eggs into a large bowl, add the 3 tbsp water and mix well.

4. Dip each piece of chicken into the egg wash making sure it is evenly coated, then coat each piece of chicken with the flour mixture, coating well.

5. Place all coated chicken on a baking tray lined with foil or parchment paper.

6. Fill a deep skillet or Dutch oven with enough vegetable oil to fully submerge chicken pieces (2-3 inches)

Now use your handy dandy pocket thermometer to heat the oil to 360 degrees.

7. Carefully place the coated chicken pieces into the hot oil and fry until golden brown. The internal temperature of the chicken should be 165 degrees and this should take 8-10 minutes for white meat and 12-14 minutes for dark meat. (Do not over crowd the chicken in the oil, you might have to fry in batches)

8. Carefully remove the cooked chicken from the oil with tongs or a slotted spoon and place on a baking pan lined with a cookie cooling rack. Rest for 5 minutes before serving.

Southern Baked Mac and Cheese (serves 8)

Ingredients:

2 cups of cavatappi, elbow macaroni, shells or your choice of pasta (uncooked)

3 large eggs
1 12 oz can evaporated milk
1 ½ cups half and half
1 8 oz. block of sharp cheddar cheese, shredded
1 8 oz block mild cheddar cheese, shredded
1 8 oz block Monterey jack cheese, shredded
1 8 oz block of mozzarella cheese, shredded
Salt and pepper to taste

Directions:

1. Cook macaroni until al dente, 8-10 minutes, in boiling salted water. Drain and set aside.

2. In a large bowl beat the eggs well. Add evaporated milk and half and half and mix well. Add the shredded cheese to the mixture reserving 1 cup for topping.

3. Fold cooked pasta into the mild and cheese mixture and season with salt and pepper. Stir until well coated.

4. Transfer the macaroni mixture to a 9x13 greased baking dish. Sprinkle reserved cheese on top.

5. Bake in a 350 degree pre heated oven for 40-45 minutes until golden and bubbly. Let the casserole sit for 15 minutes so it will settle and thicken.

Collard Greens with Ham Hocks (serves 6)

Ingredients:

2 smoked ham hocks
½ yellow onion finely chopped

2 chicken bouillon cubes
1 tsp onion powder, 1 tsp garlic powder ½ tsp red pepper flakes, salt and pepper to taste
1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce
1 ½ tsp cider vinegar
2 bunches collard greens, trimmed, chopped and washed well

Directions:

1. Place ham hocks in a medium stock pot and cover with water two inches above the hocks. Stir in onion, seasoned salt, chicken bouillon, black pepper, salt, onion powder, garlic powder and red pepper flakes, Worcestershire sauce and vinegar. Bring to a boil over medium high heat and cook for 45 minutes until ham hocks are tender. Remove the hocks, shred the meat and return it to the pan. Discard the bones.

2. Add the collard greens to the pot, cover, reduce heat to medium low and simmer for 1 hour until the greens are tender. Serve hot.

Southern Style Banana Pudding (serves 12)

Ingredients:

4 tbsp flour
1 ½ cups sugar
3 large egg yolks
3 cups milk
1 tsp vanilla extract
1 box vanilla wafers cookies
6 bananas
1/8 tsp cream of tartar

Directions:

1. Combine flour, sugar and salt in a large heavy sauce pan. In a separate bowl lightly beat egg yolks and combine with milk. Whisk the liquid mixture into the dry ingredients in the sauce pan making sure no lumps remain. Cook over medium low heat, stirring constantly, until the pudding is thickened and smooth. Remove from heat and stir in vanilla.

2. In a 2 quart casserole, place 1/3 of the cookies in an even layer on the bottom of the dish. Slice bananas and place 1/3 on top of the wafers. Pour 1/3 of the pudding over the wafers and bananas. Repeat the layering process 2 more times.

3. Cover the casserole and refrigerate at least 3 hours before serving. Top with whipped cream if desired.

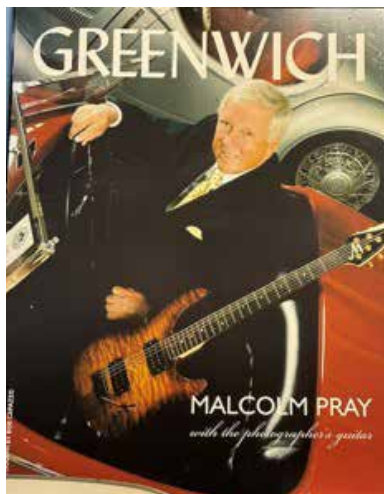

Malcolm always loved cars, but as a 10-year-old, his father took him to the 1939 World's Fair in Queens, NY where he became mesmerized by a 1937 Delahaye, a sleek French Roadster, and declared that he was going to own that car one day. The car filled his mind, and he drew pictures of it. After years of hard work and dedication, Mr. Pray managed to buy that Delahaye in 1963. He put \$1 million into its restoration, drove it regularly to about 50 premier car shows, and after he died in 2013, he stipulated that it be sold at auction, where it sold for a whopping \$6.6 million. The proceeds went to support the Malcolm Pray Achievement Center.

About 40 of our club members showed up for this private tour of Malcolm's beloved collection of classic cars, along with two journalists also doing articles. The trip was well worth it to see these cars...all beautiful, some rare and all in excellent condition. In addition to the car collection itself, there is a tremendous amount of car memorabilia. Many prestigious awards and trophies are featured in the library and in a gallery, several decades of car newspapers and magazines are neatly stacked up, and photos, posters, and portraits of cars cover the walls.
