> VOCATIONAL

If you're aged between 16-18 years old you will have a study programme specifically tailored to meet your educational needs and career aspirations. It consists of your main chosen course as well as further development of maths, English and employability skills.

> A LEVELS

If you're looking to study A Levels, our Ludlow Sixth Form College provides an excellent choice of A Level subjects. Students often progress on to higher education and secure places at Russell Group universities.

APPRENTICESHIPS

We currently offer a variety of different apprenticeship subjects and routes ranging from Level 2 qualifications right up to Degree Level. This route allows you to combine work and study through on the job training with classroom learning.

> T LEVELS

These courses offer you a mixture of classroom learning with workplace experience. During the course you will put your skills and knowledge into practice during an industry placement of 315 hours.

GCSE's

This is a one-year GCSE course designed for students wishing to develop their maths and/or English skills and improve their grades. Students will require a grade 4 (grade C) in both subjects to progress to any A Level course or Level 3 Vocational course.

The course will help you to improve on the areas you find the most difficult, building your confidence as well as your understanding and skills. For students who do need to re-sit either (or both) GCSE maths or English, it will be accommodated into your programme of study, as day and evening classes are available.





COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The information below outlines the minimum entry requirements for the different types of courses we offer.

Entry/Foundation Level 1 Course

No formal entry requirements. Applicants will be considered on aptitude and commitment, following initial advice and guidance.

Level 2 Course

A minimum of four GCSEs at grade 3, including English and maths or successful completion of a relevant Level 1 qualification. Students without grades 9-4 in GCSE English and maths must demostrate good attendance to English and maths lessons and must attend all GCSE exams.

All full time courses can lead to employment as well as the routes shown.

FOUNDATION ANIMAL CARE & RURAL SKILLS

Entry Level 3

1 YEAR

About the course

As well as learning a variety of useful rural skills, including animal health, animal care, gardening and horticulture, you will also be involved in a range of wider activities. There are also a variety of trips and visits, plus fundraising activities and opportunities to socialise and take part in games and sports.

This is a general, Entry Level, skills related course which provides you with the opportunity to experience and learn about a variety of animal care and rural skills before progressing into further education or into the workplace. You will be supported in developing your life skills needed to help prepare you for the world of work or further study, including your English, maths, communication, healthly living and social skills.

Holme Lacy College is a wonderful setting, with extensive animal care facilities and it's own organic farm.

You will also be involved in planning, hosting and catering for a charity event during the year. There is the opportunity to be involved in a wider range of activities, such as a variety of trips and visits, fundraising activities and opportunities to socialise and take part in games and sports.





Applicants without suitable practical experience may be advised to commence study at Level 1. Students without grades 9-4 in GCSE English and maths must demostrate good attendance to English and maths lessons and must attend all GCSE exams.

Level 3 Course

Successful completion of a relevant Level 2 qualification at merit grade and GCSEs at grade 3 in English and maths. Students without grades 9-4 in GCSE English and maths must demostrate good attendance to English and maths lessons and must attend all GCSE exams.

Level 2

1 YFAR

About the course

This Level 2 course is designed for any individual who has a passion for beauty therapy and would like a successful career in the continually expanding beauty industry. You will have the opportunity to undertake training in our professional salons, which are fully equipped with the latest products and equipment. You will experience working on genuine customers and combine this with relevant theoretical understanding of each unit.

There is an option to study additional certificates to the Level 2 qualification, such as make-up and skincare workshops, and also to be involved in the College's Hair and Beauty Show. You can also learn about IT, data handling and contributing to the effective running of a beauty therapy business. You will develop a sound knowledge of health and safety, client care and communication. This qualification is the equivalent of up to 112 UCAS Points.





It will provide them with the opportunity to develop their ability to support business functions, through a range of techniques, including use of business tools, problem solving and project management. Employers will provide demonstrations and talks on the industry and, where possible, work placements. This qualification is the equivalent of up to 168 UCAS Points

You will gain a range of knowledge, understanding and skills across the business support sector leaving you well-placed to develop to full occupational competence with the right support and training.

What you could do next

A degree in Business, Management, Marketing, Law, Criminology, Politics, Economics, an advanced apprenticeship in business administration, or management courses from the Association of Accounting Technicians, the Chartered Institute of Marketing or other professional bodies.



COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The information below outlines the minimum entry requirements for the different types of courses we offer.

Level 2 Course

A minimum of four GCSEs at grade 3, including English and maths or successful completion of a relevant qualification. Students without grades 9-4 in GCSE English and maths must demostrate good attendance to English and maths lessons and must attend all GCSE exams.

Level 3 Course

A minimum of five GCSEs at grade 4, including English and/or maths or successful completion of a relevant Level 2 qualification at merit grade. Students without grades 9-4 in GCSE English and maths must demostrate good attendance to English and maths lessons and must attend all GCSE exams.

Level 4 Course/HNC

A Levels or a relevant Level 3 qualification totalling 32 UCAS points. We will consider applications from experienced and mature practitioners who do not have the above qualifications. These applicants will be invited to complete and essay, which will demonstrate an ability to study at this level.

1 YFAR

About the course

This Level 2 course is a fantastic entry point into the childcare sector, offering the opportunity to broaden learners' knowledge on a wide variety of subjects. This allows for great insight into a diverse range of essential topics for working with children. Learners experience working in settings alongside qualified professionals, as the course is both knowledge and practice-based. The course design supports learners to make informed choices about progressing to higher level childcare qualifications with the potential to work in a sector that is, and always will be, in demand. This qualification includes work placements that provide successful students with a license to practice.

This Level 3 T Level course gives learners a comprehensive understanding of the Early Years sector (0-7 years), providing a balance between classroom learning and hands-on experience in both nursery and primary school settings. A wide range of experiences provides learners with valuable insight into a rewarding career within a sector that is always in demand. Tutors support learners to develop essential knowledge and practical skills that are required to work at a supervisory level. The course includes a core set of underpinning knowledge, concepts and skills tailored for the industry and occupation of choice, such as Safeguarding, Observing and Planning for Children's Development and the Importance of Play. Industry and occupational specific content is delivered, as well as specialist content, which will ensure students develop the knowledge and skills necessary to enter employment. This qualification is the equivalent of up to 168 UCAS Points.

Our aim

Herefordshire College is committed to supporting students with learning disabilities and/or difficulties. Our aim is to ensure that every student has a positive learning experience, and their individual needs are met supporting them to achieve.

Our Student Support team will work with you to tailor your provision to support you in a way which works for you - from providing scribes and readers through to specialist support for specific learning disabilities. We have a large team of experienced staff who work closely with students to help them overcome barriers and achieve their full potential. We strive to help you become as independent as possible and we can adapt and change the type of support you receive as you travel through your learning journey with us.

Special education provision means educational provision that is additional to or different from that made generally for others of the same age. We offer support at all levels and all abilities.

What might your support look like?

On-course support

In-class support can be one to one, where a Student Support Assistant supports you on an individual basis in class.

Shared support

Where a staff member supports you and others in the class. This might include discreet support where our support staff can help you without it being obvious.

Off-course support

This is to support you outside of your allocated learning hours - for example help with your course work, supporting you at lunchtime or taking you to your taxi.

Who can we support?

Our Student Support team are proud of the diversity of the support offered at Herefordshire College which includes, but is not exclusive to, support for learners within the following areas:

- > Autism or Asperger's Syndrome
- > ADD or ADHD
- > Dyslexia, Dyspraxia or Dyscalculia
- Physical mobility
- Sensory impairments
- Difficulties with maths or English
- Language support for students whose English is a second language



Education Health Care Plan

If you have an Education Health Care Plan, please let us know so we can work with you to make sure we have the right support in place for you.

We will work with the Local Authority to make sure we can provide the right support for your needs and then secure funding so we can put this in place. Without this funding, you may not be able to access a specific level of support. Transition support will be available for all EHCP students.

Our Student Support team will then ensure you have the right support in place when you start and throughout your studies and will co-ordinate annual EHCP reviews.


Transition to college life

Student FUNDING

Herefordshire College believes in giving everyone an equal opportunity to study further education. The College receives some funding from the Government to support student study and this varies depending on the course being studied, the student's age and their level of study.

Under 19?

No tuition fees! If you enrol on a further education full-time course before your 19th birthday or are continuing to attend a course before turning 19, there are no tuition or examination fees.

However, some courses may charge additional course costs to cover equipment, specialist clothing, etc.



Over 19?

Tuition fees will vary. But you may be eligable for free tuition. As everyone has individual circumstances the best way to work out the fees relevant to you is to call and speak to us.

Looking to study Level 3, 4, 5 or 6?

Advanced Learner Loans from the UK government can cover your course fees providing your course qualifies.

Most learners aged 19 and over, studying at Level 3 and above, will qualify for these loans. It's easy to apply, your household income is not taken into account and there is no credit check.

Careers advice & UCAS points

Student Services is there to support and guide you on your progression. This could be about what you will study next at college or in the future. We can help you with your UCAS application process and give you tips on how to create an effective personal statement.

Can I study university-level courses at the college?

Yes, you can study a wide range of university-level courses at the college and this enables you to save money by studying locally. Many courses are run in partnership with the University of Worcester and others have long running relationships with industry specific institutions.

What about higher & degree apprenticeships?

Higher and degree apprenticeships involve the development and assessment of skills and knowledge at Level 4 or above (relevant to the occupational sector or job role), and as defined by the Standard. Higher apprenticeships at Level 4 and 5 can allow progression on to university degrees and degree apprenticeships are also now becoming widely available in most sectors.


