I was born in Philadelphia on October 10, 1932, where I was raised on a farm in rural North Wales, Montgomery Country. I attended elementary school in Prospectville, Pennsylvania; high school in Ambler, Pennsylvania; and Williamson Free School of Mechanical Trades in Media, Pennsylvania where I graduated from the Machine Shop course in 1952. Following my graduation I was employed at Lansdale Tube Co. until January, 1953 when I enlisted in the U.S. Army. I became a career soldier and retired in 1974. I served during both the Korean conflict and the Vietnam War. My wife, Priscilla, and I were married at Pleasantville Church in Eureka, Pa., July 15, 1956. We have four children and ten grandchildren. Our children traveled with us to posts around the United States, Europe, and Japan.

I was initiated into Free Masonry in September, 1972 at Pocono Lodge No. 780 F&AM, passed to Fellow Craft Mason in October, 1972, and raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason in November, 1972.

January, 1973 I started in the Chair of Junior Master of Ceremonies. I was elected as treasurer in December, 1974, elected to Junior Warden in 1976, and elected to Senior Warden in 1977. I was elected Master for the years, 1978 and 1979, during which time we built our present temple. In June of 1989 the current secretary was given permission by the Right Worshipful Grand Master to resign his position in order to move to Florida and I was asked to accept those duties. I accepted the duties of secretary, and in December, 1989 I was elected to this office where I continue to serve.

In 1974 I became a member of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite in the Valley of Scranton. I served as a lighting technician for several years. I had to relinquish this position as my Job required many months of travel during the year. In 2006 I was invested with the 33 degree of Masonry in Chicago, II.

I assisted the Grand Secretary with a computer program for the secretaries and DDGM's and Right Worshipfull's. I have been on the steering committee since the inception of a secretaries program. At the present time I am serving as the Help Desk for the program and work with all the secretaries and DDGM's requiring assistance. I attend yearly seminars in different locations of the state to update and help the New Secretaries and many of the older secretaries keep up with any changes to the system.

During my world travels I have been privileged to attend Lodges on both the European and Asian continents including the countries of Germany, England, Italy, Korea, and the Island of Guam where I was privileged to be investigated by a member of the Batan Death March of WWII. I feel one of the greatest privileges of being a Mason is the opportunity to visit other Lodges, be they in my own district or elsewhere. This has given me a great deal of insight to our fraternity and how we have become a band of brothers that no man can put asunder.

I am a member of the Grace Lutheran Church in Gouldsboro and have served as a Council member. While on Council I helped design and build a two-story addition to the church. The first floor is used for the Nursery Sunday school and the second for the Pastors office. At the present time I am also a member of the choir with my wife. I also assist in building maintenance.

I am an active member of the Gouldsboro Volunteer Fire Co where I had served as Chief Engineer keeping vehicles and pumps in operating order. I am a Pumper Driver and operator also a Tanker driver and operator. At present I am also assisting the ambulance department as a driver.

One of my favorite times was the 10 years I spent Sky Diving. This and world wide travel have always been a great joy. I have given up Sky Diving but not travel.

DECLARATION OF PRINCIPLES

BY THE

Supreme Council of Sovereign Grand Inspectors General Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry For the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction of the United States of America

This Supreme Council reaffirms its unswerving loyalty to the fundamental purpose of Freemasonry, which purpose from time immemorial has been to improve and strengthen the character of the individual man, and through the individual, the character of the community, thus undergirding the community with those spiritual values which give it strength and stability.

This Supreme Council believes that this purpose is to be attained by laying a broad basis of principle upon which men of every race, country, sect and opinion may unite.

Believing that good and true men can be trusted to act well and wisely, this Supreme Council considers it the duty of the Fraternity to impress upon its members the principles of personal righteousness and personal responsibility, to enlighten them as to those things which make for human welfare, and to inspire them with that feeling of charity, or well-wishing, toward all mankind which will move them to translate principle and conviction into action.

To that end Freemasonry teaches a belief in God and faith in His divine purposes. It encourages the worship of God in conformity with the dictates of individual conscience. It stands for truth and justice, liberty and enlightenment, fraternity and philanthropy.

This Supreme Council expects of its members strict obedience to the laws of the land, and respect for their country's flag.

Such principles unite men and encourage the pursuit by them individually and collectively of worthy endeavors and the attainment of the purposes inherent in them. In that unity human character achieves its highest unfolding and provides man's best hope for peace on earth and good will among men.

To the furtherance of these principles, all our ritual is directed and all our efforts are aimed. To their furtherance each Master Mason has pledged himself, and at the portal of the Scottish Rite has renewed that pledge.

This Supreme Council discountenances and rejects any attempt by any international groups or confederations of Scottish Rite Supreme Councils to legislate for individual Supreme Councils.

Recognizing that principles unite men, that programs sometimes divide them, and that the preservation of unity of purpose and devotion to principle is essential to Freemasonry, the Supreme Council affirms its continued adherence to that ancient and approved rule of Freemasonry which forbids the discussion within tiled doors of creeds, politics, or other topics apt to excite personal animosities.

This Supreme Council further affirms its conviction that it is not only contrary to the fundamental principles of Freemasonry, but exceedingly dangerous to its unity, strength, usefulness and welfare for Masonic Bodies in their official capacity to take formal action or attempt to exercise pressure or influence for or against any particular legislative project or proposal, or in any way to attempt to procure the election or appointment of Governmental officials, whether executive, legislative or judicial, or to influence them, whether or not members of the Fraternity, in the performance of their official duties.

The Scottish Rite of Freemasonry is one of two branches of Freemasonry to which a Master Mason may proceed after he has completed the first three Degrees in the Symbolic or "Blue Lodge". The Scottish Rite includes the degrees from the 4th to the 32nd. Although there are many Scottish Rite Members of Scottish ancestry, the Scottish Rite actually originated in France in the early 18th century. During the 18th century, lodges were organized in the United States with the first Scottish Rite Supreme Council founded in Charleston, South Carolina, in 1801.

The Northern Masonic Jurisdiction was formed in 1867 and includes 15 states east of the Mississippi River and north of the Mason-Dixon Line and the Ohio River, including Delaware. The Southern Jurisdiction encompasses the 35 remaining states, the District of Columbia and the United States territories and possession. The Northern Jurisdiction officially recognizes and enjoys friendly relations with many other jurisdictions around the world.

Scottish Rite shares the same belief of all Masonic organizations that there is no higher degree than that of a Master Mason. The Supreme Council and its subordinate bodies acknowledge the Masonic supremacy of the Symbolic Grand Lodges and Grand Masters within their jurisdictions. Scottish Rite serves to elaborate on and amplify that of the Symbolic Lodge.

The Scottish Rite degrees are lessons taught through allegory in the form of plays. The lessons are taken from Biblical as well as more modern historical events. Cast members use costumes and makeup to look like the characters who they represent. Candidates learn the lessons by observing the presentation. Memorization of material presented is not required. The Scottish Rite is open to all Master Masons in good standing.

The 33rd degree is conferred annually, a the meeting of the Supreme Council, upon a select number of 32nd Scottish Rite Masons who have contributed outstanding service to Freemasonry of Man under the Fatherhood of God. A recipient must be at least 33 years of age and may not apply for the degree.

Scottish Rite members meet in local or regional "Valleys" and are organized into four parts: Lodge of Perfection, 4° - 14°, Council Princes of Jerusalem, 15° - 16°, Chapter of Rose Croix, 17° - 18° and Consistory, 19° - 32°. Some individual Valleys do not contain all four bodies.




