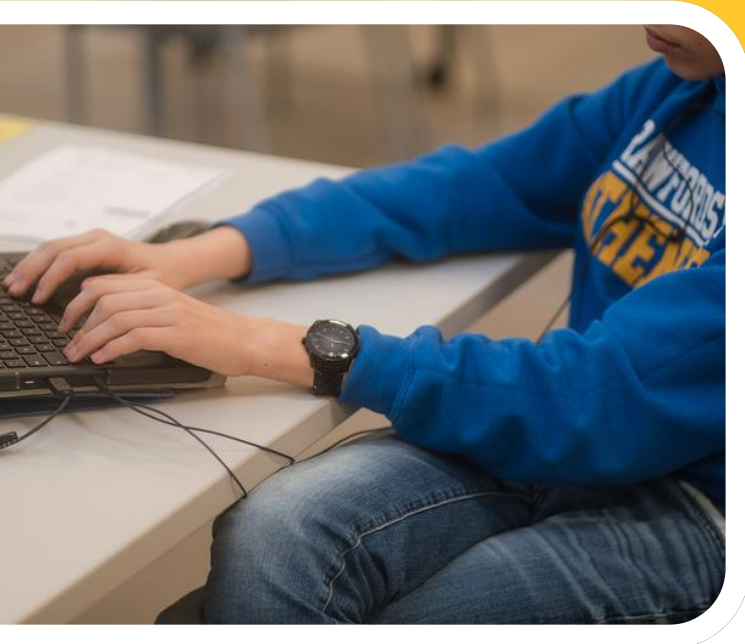

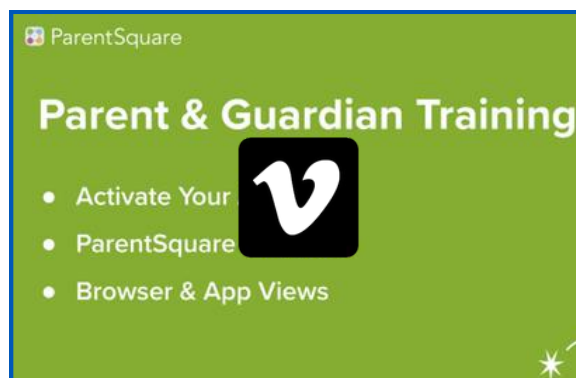

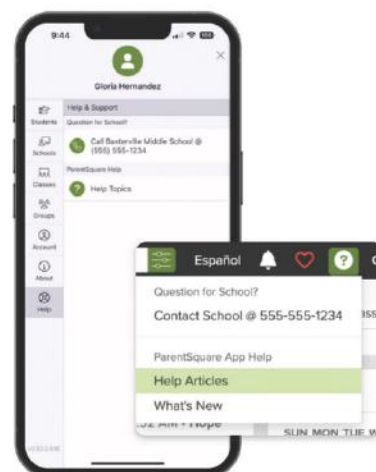

Transportation

Get Registered!

To begin riding the bus on the first day of school, please register for transportation by July 20th!

Bus registrations submitted after July 20th will not receive transportation until Aug. 12th



BusRight app

CCSC transportation uses the BusRight app for transportation information. BusRight will be the primary method of communicating important transportation information, including bus routes, schedules, and updates.

Download the app before school starts! Additional instructions are on the next page.

As you complete your student's school registration, please note that the first three contacts listed with an email address will receive bus transportation information through the BusRight app. Please review your contact information carefully and ensure the appropriate individuals are listed in the first three contact positions.

IMPORTANT - If your child's transportation needs are the same as last year, then you do NOT need to complete the transportation form. Please **ONLY** fill out the transportation form if your child's bussing information will be different from last school year.

1. Download the BusRight App

Find BusRight on the Google Play or Apple App Store by clicking the buttons on the side.



2. Sign Up for an Account

Sign up for an account in the app using the email you were invited with. Then, verify your email.

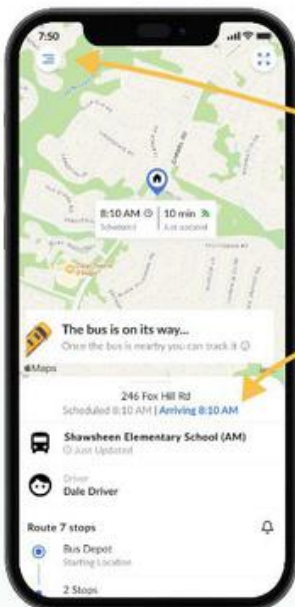
3. Log In to Your Account

Log in to your account using the credentials you just created.

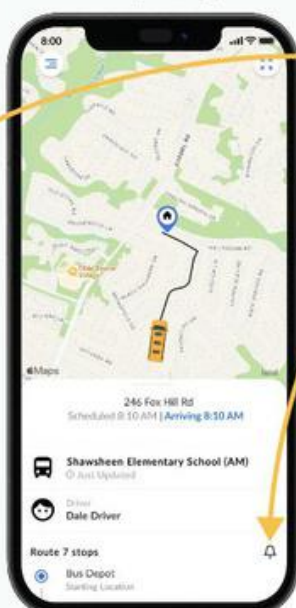
4. View Your Child's Routes

You'll be notified when you can view your child's routes and track their bus. Check scheduled ETAs before the route starts and get real-time updates while the bus is on the move.

Note

Bus tracking is only available once the route is live and bus is within range of your stop.

Switch routes to view morning and afternoon runs or routes for multiple students.

View the scheduled ETAs and the real-time ETAs to your child's stop.

Manage notification settings to receive alerts when your child's bus starts its trip and arrives at their stop.

What is Title I?

Title I is a federally funded program that provides financial assistance to states and school districts so that they may provide extra support to students who are educationally at risk. Children who are educationally at risk are considered to be at risk of failing to meet the state's standards.

How does our school get Title I funds?

The federal government provides funding to states each year for Title I. The state then sends this money to individual school districts. The number of students from low-income families determines how much money schools will receive. Schools with 40% or more children from low-income families can develop a school-wide Title I program to serve all students. Hose, Nicholson, and Hoover all have school-wide, Title I programs.

How can I get involved?

What you do matters! We love to see parents get involved with our schools and our Title I program. You can get involved by answering surveys for parent input, helping on our parent advisory committee, or volunteering at your child's school. You have the ability to influence your child's education more than any teacher or school!

What type of programs does Title I fund?

- Smaller classes
- Additional teachers and aides
- Opportunities for professional development for school staff
- Small group instruction for reading and math
- Additional teaching materials that supplement a student's regular instruction
- After-school programs
- Family activity nights
