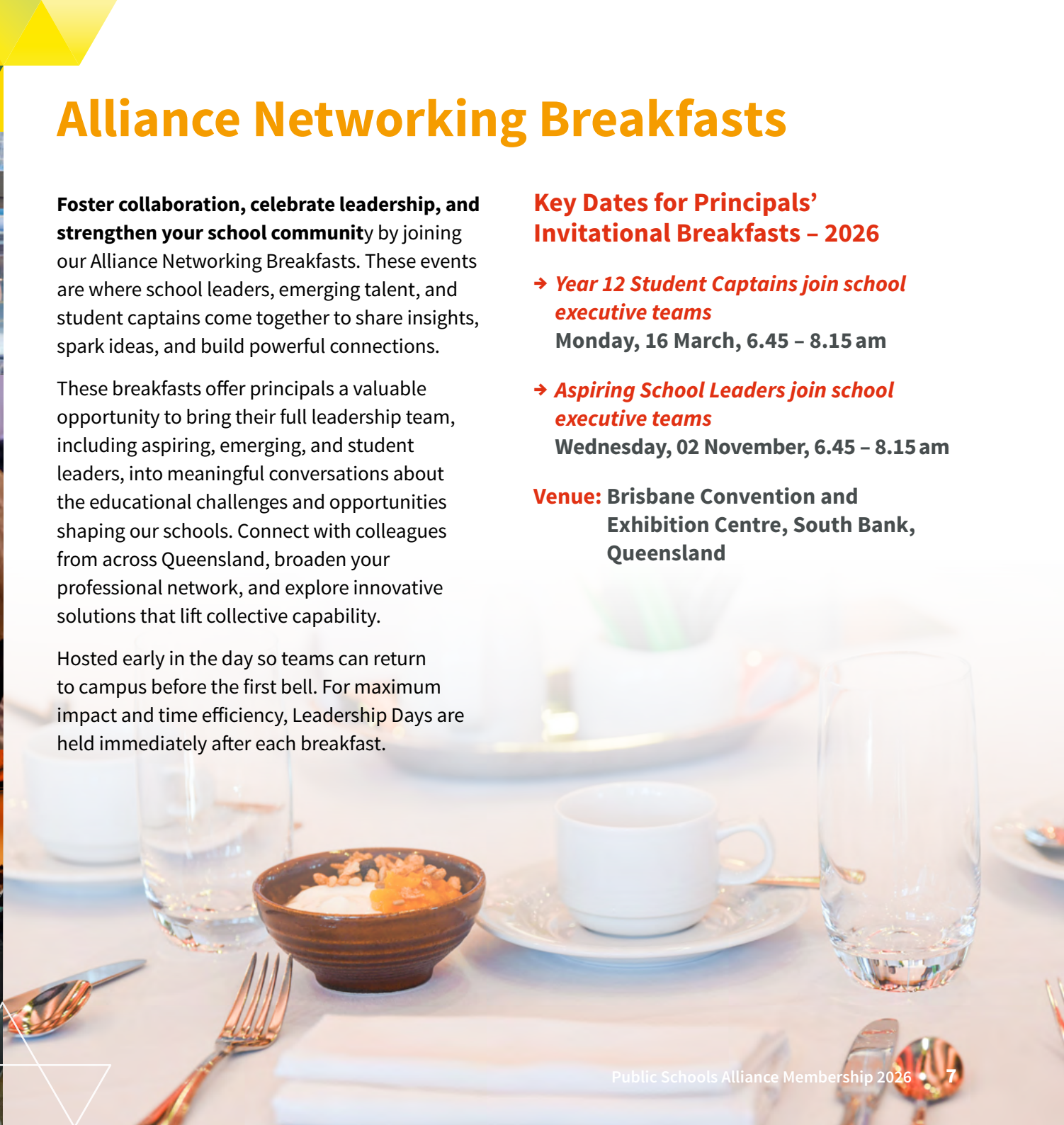

# Year 12 Student Leadership Conference

## *Creating Impact, Building Your Future*

### Event Details

**Date:** Thursday 5 February 2026

**Time:** 9.30 am – 2.00 pm

**Location:** Queensland University of Technology (QUT), Gardens Point Campus

*Lunch included, participants encouraged to BYO their own snacks.*

This event will bring together Year 12 school leaders from across Brisbane to explore the mindset and skills needed to shape their futures with purpose and impact.

**Guiding Question:** *Where do you want to be, and how do you want to get there?*

Through interactive activities and meaningful discussion, students will be challenged to think beyond traditional pathways and apply an entrepreneurial mindset to their leadership, studies, and post-school goals.

### Led by a Nationally Recognised Leader in Entrepreneurship

Facilitated by **Professor Rowena Barrett**, Pro Vice-Chancellor (Entrepreneurship) at QUT, giving students rare access to an academic leader with global expertise in entrepreneurial thinking and innovation.

### Future-Focused and Practical

This event equips students with a tangible **Year 12 action plan** and a clear vision for life after school. It's about doing, not just listening.

### Exclusive Networking Opportunities

Students connect directly with QUT academics, industry professionals, and peers from other Brisbane schools – fostering valuable networks they wouldn't otherwise access at this stage.

### Entrepreneurial Mindset Framework

The event is built around QUT's three-phase entrepreneurial mindset model (**Curiosity – Connections – Creating Value**) – a structured, research-informed approach that can be applied to leadership, study, and career planning.

### Ongoing Engagement Opportunities

Students who attend the event will be offered exclusive follow-up opportunities (once a term catch up afternoons and Open Day), ensuring sustained inspiration and connection throughout Year 12.

### Personalised and Reflective

Each student is encouraged to map their own questions, networks, and goals, making the experience highly individualised rather than a “one-size-fits-all” leadership program.

### Bridge Between School and University

Positions QUT as a partner in students' leadership and future pathways, helping schools demonstrate they are giving their leaders access to cutting-edge university learning and resources.

### Leadership Beyond the Ordinary

We move far beyond fundraising ideas and time capsules. Students will reflect deeply on their agency, influence and responsibility, exploring how leadership can shape school values, community connection, positive cultural change and student voice in staff decisions.
