What is Pursuits?

The Pursuits Program encourages students to enroll in an innovative, self directed High School educational pathway that pursues individual career aspirations. It provides them with a comprehensive and relevant, yet challenging, course of study that enables a deeper learning, based on personal areas of distinction and interest.




The Pursuits Program is a two year, future-ready course aimed at Grade 11 and 12 students who wish to gain educational recognition for a targeted area of study. Combining individually selected IB subjects with Advanced Placement (AP) and High School Diploma courses, their pathway is tailor-made to their career focused aspirations beyond a traditional classroom environment.

Why Join Pursuits?

The Pursuits Program is aimed at students who thrive on self-directed learning and challenging themselves to explore and discover opportunities led by their personal interests and career aspirations. It develops a sense of independence, confidence and encourage their development as global citizen.

PURSUITS PRACTICUM

Based on individual interests and ambitions, students select ONE area of distinction to study in Grade 11 and 12. This is supported by *FOUR courses related to that specific area.

Two semester-long courses of self-directed study related to their Area of Distinction.

An opportunity for students to apply their knowledge and skills in a learning experience outside the traditional classroom setting.

In the Pursuits program, students choose one area of distinction. This choice is based on the interests and ambitions of the student. After this, the students attend a set of offered courses while also conducting self-directed and applied learning (Pursuits Practicum).

Self-directed learning allows students to develop independence and further develop their own interests.

Pursuits Practicum is conducive to real-life applications; this can be seen in the Pursuits Project or participation in work opportunities (both on and off-campus).



TEACHING APPROACH

The Pursuits Program consists of a combination of ISKL offered courses and self-directed and applied learning schemes. Some courses will be taught in the familiar classroom setting. However, other aspects of the program will be independent – students will seek out their own mentor(s) with the help of the Pursuits Coordinator.

Self-directed with help from mentors / Pursuits Practicum

Two academic years

COURSE LOCATION

On-campus, with the option for off-campus experience

INTAKE

Intake from August onwards*

COURSE SYLLABUS

Based on interests and ambitions, students select one specialty area upon which to focus in Grade 11 and 12, taking a set of courses related to that area. Students have the opportunity to apply their learning in an authentic environment outside the classroom setting.

Pursuits allows students to personalize a learning experience for themselves based on an area of interest.

COURSE SYLLABUS

Students must choose four courses related to their area of distinction to help them specialize in their interests.

Must choose minimum of 4.0 credits from courses

Applied learning (Pursuits Practicum) requirement is a minimum 0.5 credits

Self-directed learning:

Two semester long courses based on student's area of distinction

PURSUITS EXPLORATION

A mandatory semester course in Grade 11 where students explore topics related to their area of distinction or explore several options for an area of distinction. In this course, an assigned classroom teacher will guide students.

PURSUITS PROJECT

Students can dive deeper into an area of distinction with greater independence. In this aspect, students work with a mentor while independently creating a project directly related to their area of distinction.





COURSE SYLLABUS

Pursuits Practicum

An opportunity for students to apply their knowledge and skills in a learning experience outside the traditional classroom setting.

Off-campus opportunities (e.g., internships, research assistant, dedicated service opportunities)

Other opportunities (chosen by the student and approved by ISKL)

Work placement on campus

Builds on ISKL's partnership with FLIP (Future Leaders Internship Program, Discovery Internship)



What did you do for your Pursuits Project?

"I've decided to do a Psychology study. I managed to compare and contrast data from each student age group and finally present my findings.




