During the weeks between Thanksgiving and New Year's, many people quietly carry more stress than at any other time of year. Doctors even tell us that this season is when people are most likely to have a heart attack. Our calendars fill up, our routines change, and our bodies and hearts feel the strain.

There are practical reasons for this stress, like too many events, late nights, and long travel days. We often eat too much and spend too much, move less, and sometimes forget healthy habits like vegetables, sleep, and exercise. Some of us grieve loved ones who are no longer with us and feel the ache more deeply in these special moments.

On top of this, the constant noise of advertising can make Christmas feel more like a contest or transaction than a celebration. When gifts, parties, and social media become the main focus, our hearts can end up feeling empty, anxious, or numb. Yet in the middle of this, God has given us a very different center for the season, the birth of His Son, Jesus Christ. The angel's words still ring true today:

"And the angel said to them, 'Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people" (Luke 2:10)

Christmas is first and foremost about God's love coming near to us in Jesus, who is the greatest gift we could ever receive. Because of Jesus, we can have peace with God even in a busy and broken world, "we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 5:1). This peace is not




A Special Thank You
