multisector, community development.

Community development is the foundation of our work in Argentina, Guatemala, Jordan, North Africa, and Kazakhstan. These five geographic areas are what we call our IDEAS Program Locations.

"I came to Jordan when I was young for domestic work in a family's home. Everything seemed fine at first, but then they stopped paying me for several months. My employer accused me of stealing and took me to the police station. I didn't know Arabic well, so I was very confused. They kept all my belongings. After remaining in prison for some time I was finally released to travel. I received clothes, travel money, and a plane ticket home. My family was so thankful to have me home in my country safely!"

TRAFFICKING VICTIMS REPATRIATED

Migrant domestic workers were able to return safely to their home country.

JORDAN



Anti-Trafficking Initiatives disrupt the cycle of trafficking by networking with local organizations, assisting incarcerated migrant domestic workers, and supporting victim identification and casework.

Education Programs offer high quality academic and music education in predominately low-income, refugee communities that have little access to education.

Global Reach Libraries trains librarians and offers professional support as they develop their libraries in underserved communities.

Eye Care for Refugees makes primary care optometry services available including prescription eyeglasses, optometry consultations, and basic ocular treatments.

NORTH AFRICA



ACT (Association for Cooperation & Transformation) seeks to see individuals and communities transformed into living witnesses of justice, dignity, and hope.

In relationships of interdependence, we partner with local associations to catalyze community-level efforts to combat poverty in all its forms.

We work with people with disabilities, victims of human trafficking, vulnerable women, rural communities, and minority groups.

Caregivers and educators of children with disabilities learn how to relate to children in a way that promotes healthy emotional development and self-advocacy.

"I was 6 years old when the Soviet Union collapsed. My family tried to eke out a living growing potatoes and tending fruit trees. My small rural community suffered from a lack of resources, and years of Soviet suppression left us in the dark.

When foreigners started a farmer training program in my region, I saw changes in the local farming techniques. After several years of training, I became an expert grafter and pruner. Now I'm highly sought after by farmers.

Initially I wondered why foreigners would come to my region to help my people. It finally dawned on me that it was not just about farming, but about learning how to help transform myself, my family, and my community."

Orchard Training & Consulting International helps orchard businesses succeed by improving nursery tree quality and increased yields of fruit trees.

Light on a Hill trains local English teachers to improve their language skills, which helps their students learn and find better jobs.

Nur-Hayat Sports aims to improve health and wellness for rural farming families of Central Asia through sports.

“We used to wheel Megan around in an old baby carriage, because it was all we had, but it didn’t provide her the postural support to sit up. This severely limited Megan’s ability to engage in the community. Since being fitted for her new wheelchair, Megan is able to sit at the dinner table, go places with the family, and engage with others, as her muscle control and vision is greatly improved. Our family has been completely transformed as we can now take Megan to appointments, school, church, and community activities easily. We are seeing Megan begin to thrive for the first time in her young life.”

FITTED WITH WHEELCHAIRS

Customized wheelchairs + holistic care opened a new way of life for children and families without access to healthcare.

GUATEMALA



Catalyst brings people with disabilities into community by providing assistive technologies that allow them to go to school, work, and church, and engage in their communities.

Educational resources, training, and peer-based support programs heal the mentality of shame associated with disability.

Mobile clinics provide custom-fit wheelchairs for children and connection to local resources for them and their families, such as care providers and physical and occupational therapists.

Complejo Gilgal is a retreat center in Córdoba, Argentina, where churches, organizations, and individuals come to recharge, connect, and be equipped as co-laborers of Jesus. In doing so, a network and community is being formed to partner and serve marginalized communities locally and globally.

The communities surrounding Complejo Gilgal have many families living in poverty, often without running water, daily access to food, and quality education. Along with physical brokenness, there are great emotional, social, spiritual, and intellectual needs. Complejo Gilgal is aiming to support these nearby communities and work toward making an impact on South America with the partnerships they are building along the way.

Through the installation of 28 tube wells in rural Bangladesh, 60 families now have clean water.

CHINA

RURAL COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT*

The Rural Community Development* program in China helps village residents - who live on less than \$2.00 a day - rise out of poverty through locally owned projects that meet needs identified by the local community. These projects focus on access to clean water, hygiene training, agricultural improvements, and a student sponsorship program, which enable the children to finish high school, enter college, find good paying jobs, and give back to their communities.

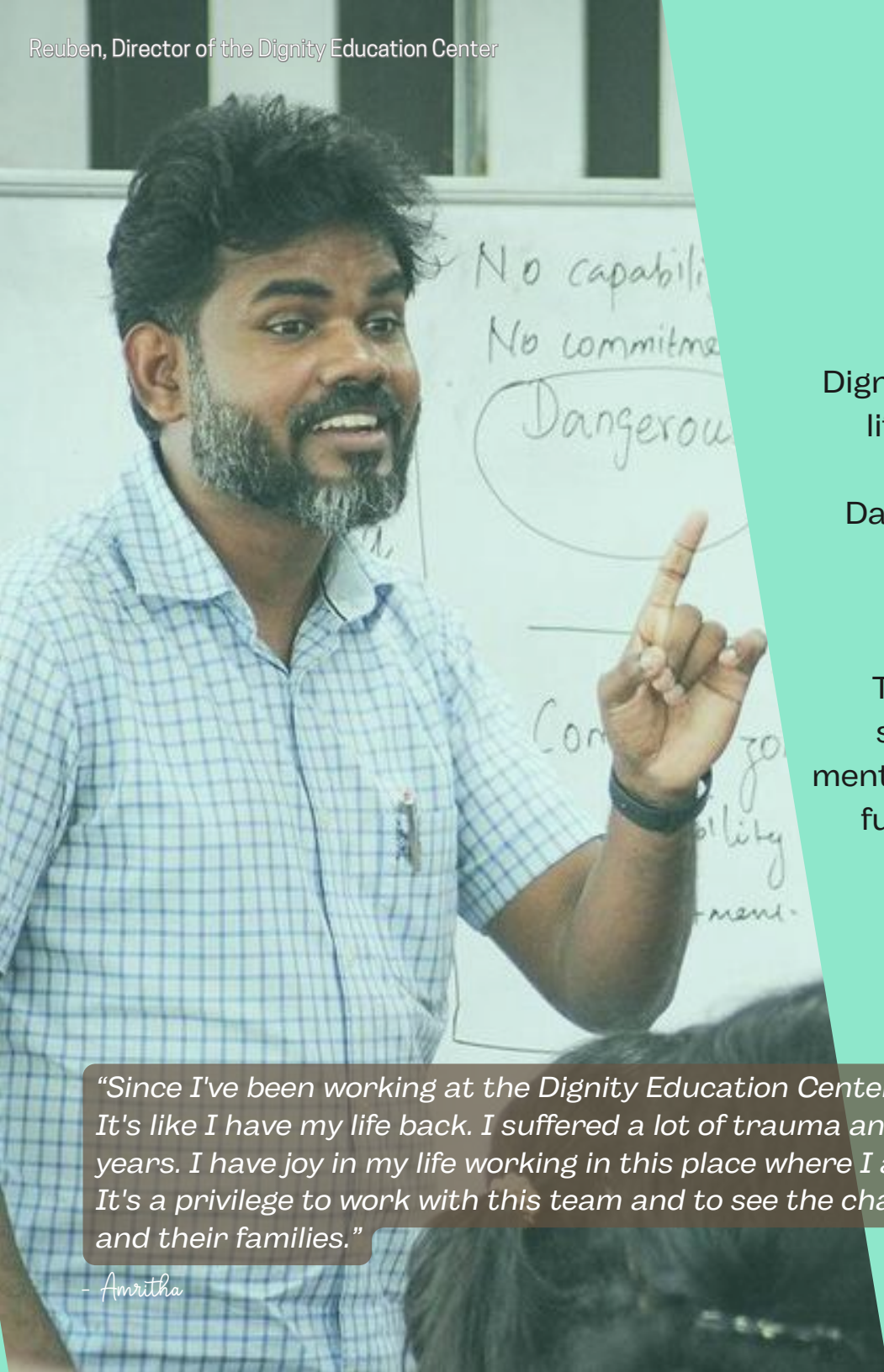
PEOPLE HAVE ACCESS TO CLEAN WATER

DIGNITY EDUCATION CENTER

Dignity Education Center works to improve the quality of life for Tamil-speaking Dalits who've worked in difficult conditions in tea plantations for many generations. Dalit people have few opportunities to improve their life situation due to casteism, oppression, and lack of education, services, and opportunities.

The center provides English classes, tutoring in math, science, and other subjects, as well as counseling and mentoring so that the Dalit community can build a better future through education and vocation opportunities.

"Since I've been working at the Dignity Education Center, I've come alive again. It's like I have my life back. I suffered a lot of trauma and was in depression for years. I have joy in my life working in this place where I am safe from abuse. It's a privilege to work with this team and to see the changes in the students and their families."

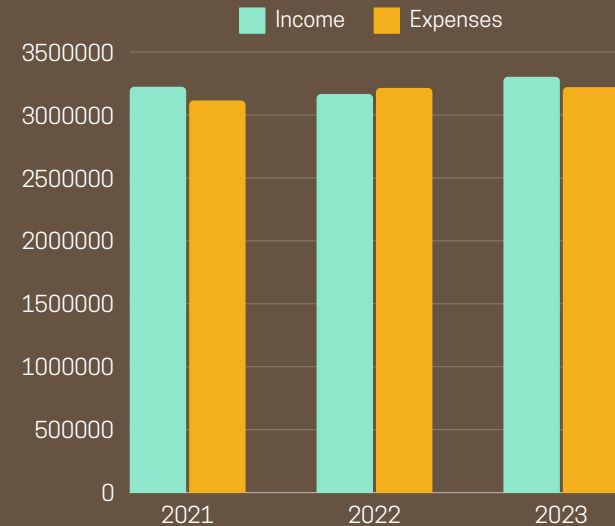

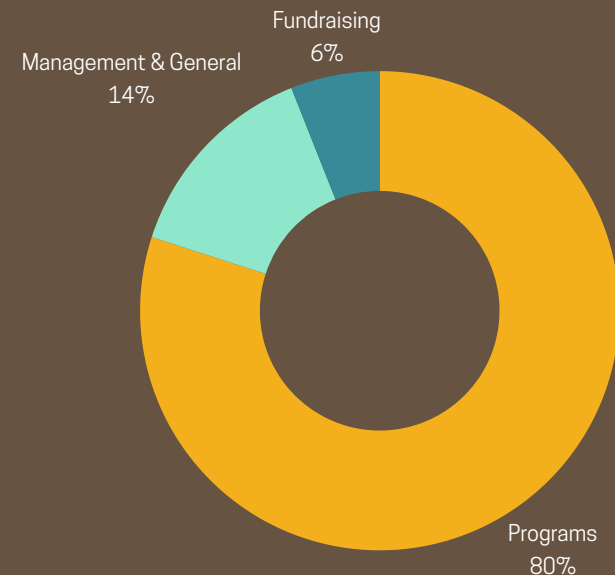
