

Golf Connect Recap

Golf Australia is moving from GolfLink to Golf Connect, a new platform for handicap history, event registrations, and PGA Tour updates. Your GolfLink number will become your permanent Golf ID, which stays with you for life.

Key changes:

- New golf.com.au website and official Golf Australia app.
- Daily Handicap will now include a consistency factor.
- Some handicaps may shift slightly (usually <0.5) due to backdated PCC changes.
- All members will need to verify accounts by email.

At Green Acres

- GolfLink retires Sunday, 28 Sept, midnight.
- 29 Sept 12 Oct: Social golf only (no handicapped comps).
- Handicapped play resumes Mon, 13 Oct.
- Men's Medal: Sat 18 Oct.
- Women's Medal: Tues 14 Oct.

A decision has been made to remove regular team events for the month of September, this excludes special events such as the Saturday Guest Day and the GA Classic.

This adjustment is to maximise handicapping opportunities ahead of the transition period from GolfLink to Golf Connect, during which no handicapping will take place for two weeks.

Course Options and Boundary Changes from Monday, 1st September

From Monday, 1st September, we will be implementing several changes aimed at improving your golfing experience at Green Acres.

1. Yarra River - will be a Penalty Area

The Yarra River will be designated as a penalty area, which means you will now be able to take lateral relief instead of being limited to stroke and distance or the alternative stroke and distance options.

The river will be marked with red stakes. Some areas will be classified as 'No Play Zone Penalty Areas', indicated by red stakes with blue tops.

In these zones, you <u>must</u> take relief, as they are considered dangerous due to steep slopes or being snake habitats.

On the 12th hole, there is limited space available to take relief, so there will be a few drop zone options available.

A new Temporary Local rule will be released on Monday, 1st September, including the No Play Zone Penalty area ruling. Click here to view.

2. Changes to Courses and Tee Options

The Golf Sub-Committee, in collaboration with the Course Sub-Committee, has reviewed ways to improve the health of our tee boxes. Our current tee complexes are not large enough to sustainably support five sets of tees. As a result, we are moving to four course options:

Back, Middle, Front, and Short.

Along with this change, the tee colours will be updated:

- Back tees will now be Black (old Blue tees)
- Middle tees will now be Blue (old white tees)
- Yellow tees will no longer be used
- Front tees (formerly Red and mainly used by women) will now be White
- The Short course will remain Orange.

With the retirement of the yellow tees, there will now be three course options available each day, with the back (black) tees in play only on Wednesdays and Saturdays. This change will be highlighted by the introduction of new logo tee markers from the date of implementation.

We appreciate your support and understanding as we make these adjustments to improve the course and your playing experience.

Please note that these changes will not take effect until <u>Monday</u>, <u>1st of September</u>.



Founders Cup Results



Green Acres Classic - Sunday 14th September

The 12:30pm shotgun start booking sheet for this year's Green Acres Classic is due to open 15 days out at 6pm. Book your starting hole and enjoy playing the Gentsomes Ambrose format with your favourite group of members. The afternoon shotgun is strictly for those playing in the Green Acres Classic, and members' accounts will be charged the entry fee.

Gentsomes is a team event played in groups of 4. All players in the team play a tee shot, and then the team decides which tee shot is the best, and all players then play their own ball from that spot. The ball is to be placed within 1 club length from the selected spot, not nearer the hole.

All players then play out the hole with their own ball. Scoring is in Stableford format, and the two best individual Stableford scores are combined to give the team score for that hole. Men score using the men's stroke index; women using the women's stroke index. A minimum of three drives and a maximum of six drives per player must be used and recorded on the scorecard.

For a \$65 entry fee enjoy a day of Gentsomes Ambrose team event followed by a beautifully prepared two course sit down dinner and prize presentations. Prizes for best men's, women's and mixed team score as well as nearest to pins.



DOCTOR DIRT

GAGC Biodiversity Inventory

Ever since I first started at GAGC, I have been utterly astonished by the life that flourishes here. I had already been using iNaturalist for some time as an easy shortcut to identify things like native orchids, but here, it seems as if barely a day goes by without something new popping up, so I have made numerous observations and identifications all over the Course.

Then I heard about the Golf Fore Nature project started by the consultants Torgersen Gilbey. By joining this project, GAGC got its own page where all iNaturalist observations made within our boundaries would be collated and displayed. I was surprised to find I was only one of 25 people using iNaturalist here, and together we have all identified about 100 species (so far).

iNaturalist is a citizen science platform that anyone can join and use. There is no cost involved, and it is super easy to use, so I tend to be just a teensy bit of a fan. Once you have signed up, all you do it take a photo (or upload one you already have) and tap "What did you see?". Observations from iNaturalist go into the Atlas of Living Australia (www.ala.org.au), which is a database of over 150 million records of species in Australia. When you tap "What did you see?" the app searches this database to find the most likely matches. You pick the one that looks the best and submit the observation.

It then joins the ALA database, and specialists or researchers can check and verify the identification. If two or more people agree with you, the observation becomes "Research Grade" and can be used in all sorts of studies to help us better understand our unique flora and fauna.

I would be happy to help. Please enjoy the many interesting observations on our new Biodiversity Inventory page.

Some of my favourites include Southern Marbled Geckos, the Dog Vomit Slime Mould and a fungus that looks like orange fingers sticking out of the soil – called 'Stinky Fish'.

I look forward to bringing you further updates and information about our course and our environment in future editions of the GA News.
