BARBER COUNTY FAIR JULY 27-30, 2023

It's Fair Month - good luck 4-H and FFA Members

2023 ROTATION FOR CLEAN-UP AT BARBER COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS (Clean up is Tuesday, July 25, 2023 at 6:00 P.M.)

Sunflower #1 Area - Clean: 4-H Building, and around the building. Place paper on shelves of displays; arrange tables for displays. Place card tables and chairs in areas as needed for judging. You will need to bring hand brooms to dust shelves, push brooms for the floor, rags and buckets for washing off tables, glass cleaner for foods and crafts cases. (You will no longer have the bathrooms.)

Stampede #2 Area - Clean: Horse Barn, Beef Barn and Park Area and area around the barns. Make sure panels are in center walkways and at ends of beef barn. Put out the picnic tables, benches and other play equipment and put them away after county fair. Bring rakes, shovels, post drivers, wire and wheelbarrows.

Sunny Lakers #3 Area - Clean: Swine, Poultry and Rabbit Barn and area around the swine barn. Install small panels for gates if needed. Clean out the gutters before and after the fair. Put out the hoses before the fair and away after the fair. Bring brooms and dust pans for sweeping pens.

Cloverleaf #4 Area - Clean: Sheep Barn, Wash Racks and area around the sheep barn and wash racks. Clean livestock picture back drop.Put out the hoses for the wash rack before the fair and put them away after the fair.

Gyp Hill Pioneers #5 Area - Clean: Fair Office and Bathrooms. Sweep and dust the office. Scour the bathrooms, clean the mirrors, put out toilet paper and paper towels, line trash cans with trash bags. Bring brooms, dust pans, rags and bathroom cleaners.

Stateline #6 Area – Distribute: Trash Cans. Put out the trash barrels in all areas and put plastic liners in them. Return the trash barrels after county fair is over. A flatbed trailer is helpful. If there is a chance of rain between Tuesday and Thursday, turn trash cans upside down after the liner is put in.

North/South Barber FFA #7 Area - Clean: Show Arena and set up panels for the show ring and the alley way for the weighing of the livestock. Clean under the bleachers. Clean the bleacher seats. Put up the light bulbs and take them down.

All Clubs Small children may canvas the fairgrounds and pick up trash before and after the fair. Animals Tied Out All 4-H'ers who tie their animals out are required to clean up their area before leaving the county fairgrounds.

JULY 10th - pre-entries AND Fashion Review papers are due in the office by 2:00pm. This year we are changing things up with online preentries. Each and every member will need to have an online form completed individually. There will not be 2 part livestock cards completed for animals this year - the online form will replace it. As a reminder, entries that are not pre-entered will have a \$3.00 fee at the fair.

Horse Show participants both open & 4-H will also need to have pre-entries completed for the Horse show by July 10th. Having trouble or unsure how to complete online?

The Market Wheat Show is open to 4-H and FFA youth ages 7-19 and Cloverbuds ages 5-6. Enrollment in the project is not required except for entries in Division 1.

There is a limit of 2 entries/exhibitor in Division 1 and 2. There is no entry limit for Divisions 3-8. However, cash awards will only be given to two placings/individual in each division. Cash payouts- Purple- \$5, Blue- \$4, Red- \$3, White- \$2. Extra division winner payouts- 1st- \$15, 2nd \$10 and 3rd-\$5. Ribbons will be awarded for all entries.

*Division 1- Bin Run Wheat – Crop Production Project

Send a 1 lb, bin run sample of wheat along with completed entry card to KSU. Exhibitor must be enrolled in Crop Production and Managem Limit 2 per exhibitor. Entries must be different varieties. Open only to youth ages 7–19 (no Cloverbuds). Samples must be postmarked by July 15,

*Division 2 – Bin Run Wheat – Adopt a Producer

Send a 1 lb, bin run sample of wheat along with completed entry card to KSU. For youth not enrolled in Crop Production and Management who adopt a wheat producer. Limit 2 per exhibitor. Entries must be different varieties. Open only to youth ages 7-19 (no Cloverbuds). Samples must be

ostmarked by July 15, 2022

Division 3 - Clean Wheat - 1 Quart

One quart jar of cleaned wheat. May be mechanically cleaned, but handpicked is advantageous. Bring entry day of show, labeled with name, nty/district, club and variety.

Division 4 - Yeast Rolls

Three standard yeast rolls, any kind with wheat flour as major ingredient and no additions (i.e. nuts, fruit, cheese). Place on a plate enclosed in a plastic bag and include recipe. Bring entry day of show, labeled with name, club and county/district.

Division 5 - Cookies

Three standard sized cookies of any kind with wheat flour as major ingredient. Place on a plate enclosed in a plastic bag and include recipe. Bring , labeled with name, county/district and club.

Division 6 - Muffins

Three standard sized muffins of any kind with wheat flour as major ingredient. Place on a plate enclosed in a plastic bag and include recipe. Bring day of show, labeled with name, county/district and club.

Division 7 – Wheat Photo

8 x 10 photograph related to wheat. Black/white, color, landscape, etc. are accepted. All photos compete against each other. Use Kansas State Fair 4-H mounting rules. Bring entry day of show, labeled with name, county/district and club.

Division 8 – Wheat Educational Poster

Use standard poster board (22" X 28") or 3' X 4' (maximum) display board. Central theme must be related to wheat. Photos and artwork are allowed, but no copyrighted materials. Bring entry day of show, labeled with name, county/district and club.

Division 9 - Cloverbuds (ages 5 - 6)

Cloverbuds may compete in Divisions 3 - 8. Participation ribbons will be given. Entries will not be judged, and are not eligible for cash prizes.
