This includes over-the-counter (OTC) medication, as well as prescription medication. THE NURSES WILL NOT GIVE ANY OTC MEDICATION WITHOUT A PHYSICIAN'S SIGNATURE.

We have created a document, which has some of the most commonly used OTC medications (available on the next page). PLEASE PRINT IT OUT AND HAVE IT SIGNED BEFORE THE BEGINNING OF THE SCHOOL YEAR.




