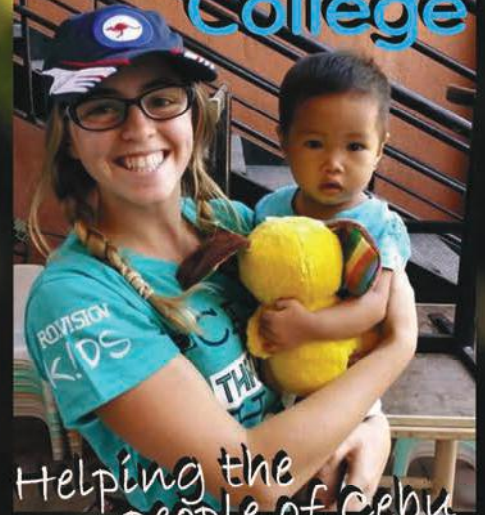

## Governor to Open Festival Fleurieu

The Festival program has been enthusiastically received and Government House in Adelaide has announced that the Governor of South Australia will - once again - launch the multi-award winning Festival Fleurieu this year.

His Excellency the Honourable Hieu Van Le AC, and his wife Mrs Lan Le will attend and 'cut the ribbon' at the opening ceremony at Bungala Park in Normanville on the afternoon of Easter Saturday April 15.

The vice-regal couple attended the biennial festival in 2015 followed by a lunch at Leonard's Mill.

"We are thrilled and honoured that the Governor has again agreed to launch our Festival and that His Excellency and Mrs Le have such a genuine interest in this part of the Fleurieu," said Festival Fleurieu chair Jane Mitchell.

The program for 2017 has a record 116 events being staged over more than 50 venues throughout the Fleurieu region from April 14-30. The festival is enthusiastically described as "a kaleidoscope of colour, music, the arts, culture, history, gastronomy and the environment".

Tickets to events are selling fast and several accommodation offerings are booked out. A few events are already fully sold, with many others selling above expectations.

Festival Fleurieu Coordinator Jill Langford said the 2017 program has something for everyone and "there is a real buzz and genuine excitement" throughout the region.

"Music lovers will be spoilt for choice with offerings ranging from an award winning classical quartet to a whole weekend of rock n roll. Talented vocalists and musicians will entertain guests at soirees and this Festival introduces the newly formed Festival Fleurieu choir."

"Young people will be enchanted by a special visit from members of the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra who are presenting an interactive concert and, once again, the region will be on show with talented artists welcoming visitors to their studios. For literature lovers, there will be poetry readings and book launches."

"With venues spanning from Myponga to Inman Valley, Carrickalinga to Yankalilla and Normanville to Cape Jervis, Festival Fleurieu 2017 is a wonderful opportunity to experience the Fleurieu Coast and embrace the natural beauty and artistic nature of our community," said Ms Langford.

## Pride, Passion and Propaganda, a World War I Poster exhibition

Second Valley Soldiers Memorial Hall  
Saturday May 6th and Sunday May 7th 1pm to 5pm

The Second Valley Progress Association has, as part of History Month, organised an exhibition of posters providing an insight into how Australians felt about our part in the Great War. From the early smiling calls to join up for victory to the later desperate pleas for reinforcements, the posters help us to understand local feeling. There will also be a display of Ron Blum's collection of WW1 fundraising buttons issued by organisations like the "Cheer Up Our Boys" society, and the "S.A. Children's Patriotic Fund" with mementoes of special days like "Violet Day" and "Wattle Day". In September 1917 at Second Valley, a proud and patriotic community unveiled a memorial to those who served and there will be an opportunity to see the research being done prior to the centenary celebrations to be held on September 23rd 2017. **Commemoration of the Centenary of the WWI Monument, Second Valley**

On a fine Saturday afternoon in **September 1917** a granite column was unveiled near Second Valley School to honour the members of local families from the then Rapid Bay District Council area who enlisted to serve in the Great War. The column was funded by private subscription (a sum of £113 was raised). According to local newspaper reports, approximately 250 people attended the unveiling ceremony, at which the local school children saluted the flag and sang the national anthem before refreshments were taken.

Thirty six names were inscribed on the column, including those of two nurses. At the time, four had paid the supreme sacrifice. As the war continued, another four names were added to the monument and seven more lost their lives.

On **23 September 2017** the Second Valley Progress Association (SVPA) is planning to hold a commemorative event to mark the centenary of the unveiling of the column. A re-enactment of the 1917 ceremony is proposed at the site of the monument. The SVPA would like to locate relatives and descendants of those who are named on the column to invite them to attend the event next year. We would be very glad to hear from anyone who is a relative or who knows of any relatives of the following so that we can make contact with them.

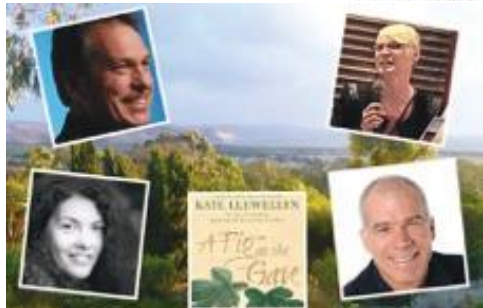

## Do you like good music?

Wilson Pickett, Bruce Springsteen and many others have asked that question in song. Good music is best appreciated live, and South Australia has great talent and great venues to heighten that experience.

Events on our doorstep on the Fleurieu mean that you do not need to travel to the city. Some gigs come around monthly; others are special 'feasts' that occur annually over several days. Together they encompass all genres of music: rock, folk, blues or whatever label suits your taste best.

Music labels are in many cases a bit vague, and can flow between genres. Traditional music conjures up thoughts of folk music, quiet guitars, perhaps with fiddles and banjos. Being traditional does not in any way imply difficult to hear or poor sound quality performances. It is possibly best defined as instruments that work naturally and do not require electrics, but may be amplified using microphones to get the best sound of singers and instruments, out to all the audience. Think "unplugged" rock bands, and you're getting close.

There are many very good SA music events with one being very local, "Wirrina Bluegrass and Acoustic Roots Festival". This festival draws performers and audience from both interstate and SA. It has a Main Stage and smaller more community based "open mic sessions". The bit I really liked was the camp fire sessions. We all know that it can be fantastic sitting around a splendid log fire, glass of something in hand, on a sunny afternoon or under the stars. Do you like good music? Yeah, Yeah, especially when the atmosphere is just right.

The event I attended in September 2016 was my first time attendance. Past excuses - busy, out of town - were all valid, but the end result was I missed the four previous years.

Technically, I am not sure how to explain Bluegrass; it is to me hard driving traditional instruments played well, indeed very well. It is, I think, a fusion of Appalachian Mountain, Folk, touch of Blues, some might say Americana. Whatever name tag you place on it, it is fun! This festival gives half its program to Bluegrass music or related traditional forms, Old-

timey, traditional string band styles. The other half is made up of good acoustic music played on traditional instruments and nearly all genres of music have acoustic roots.

The 2016 program started on Friday at 3pm, all day Saturday to 11pm and rounded off on Sunday at 5pm. Venues were a mix of large tents and open air locations. With the Main Stage, the break out music workshops, "open Mic sessions" and the campfires, there was always something happening. All participants mixed in and around, you could listen and chat to performers, enjoy good food and drink while you did.

Who attended? All types just like you would see walking down Yank Main Street. The full spectrum of society was represented.

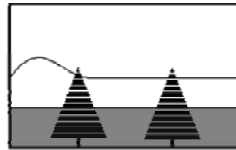

## Yankalilla and District Historical Society

**1** 75 years ago Henry Kemmis came to Yankalilla to settle on the land he had selected in the new colony of South Australia. Henry Kemmis was born in Ireland of landed gentry and came out to South Australia with his wife and children in 1839. Kemmis's memoirs state: "I took out a lot of decent labourers and two women servants". They lived for a while in Adelaide, and then moved to Yankalilla in 1842 and established the farm, called "Manna Farm" because of the large number of Manna gums growing on the property. The family lived at first in a Manning house, which was a prefabricated wooden house which

some early settlers brought out from England. Kemmis left the district in the 1850s, and went first to Tasmania and later to New South Wales, where he was the first headmaster of All Saints College at Bathurst. Kemmis is buried in New South Wales.

The second settler to come to Yankalilla was Septimane Herbert, who was the brother-in-law of Robert Norman, the founder of Normanville. Like Kemmis, he came to Yankalilla in 1842. He at first leased land from Robert Harvey, but later purchased the land, and also acquired more land from Robert Norman. Herbert became a leading figure in the area, serving as a Justice of the Peace and as Chairman of the District Council, after that was formed. Herbert built a home (now in ruins) for his growing family on a rise above where the ACH nursing home now stands. If you look up the hill above the medical centre you can just see the top of a Norfolk Island pine tree, which is near the ruin of Herbert's house. Herbert remained in Yankalilla for the rest of his life, and he and his wife Anna are buried in Christ Church cemetery.

George Worthington came to Yankalilla in 1850 and he also built his home on a rise, above and to the east of Christ Church cemetery. Worthington did not stay long in Yankalilla but moved to Morphett Vale, selling his Yankalilla property to Thomas Willson. Willson also bought some of Henry Kemmis's land which adjoined Worthington's, and part of this combined property he had surveyed and subdivided into 25 township lots. On 9 September 1857 Yankalilla was declared a township. Willson moved to Kangaroo Island in 1864, but kept much of his business interest in Yankalilla. He died in 1901, and is buried at Penneshaw.

To read more about the early years of Yankalilla go to the Historical Society's new booklet "Old Yankalilla", which will be launched at the **Anniversary Dinner on Friday 28 April** at the Normanville Hotel. The Anniversary Dinner is a Festival Fleurieu event (see the Festival booklet for details). During the dinner there will be some light entertainment in the form of a

re-enactment (with artistic licence) of a meeting of 1862, where Herbert and Willson aired their differing views, one supporting the claims of Normanville, the other those of Yankalilla. The cost of the dinner is \$39, and can be booked at the Visitor Information Centre, 8558 0240.

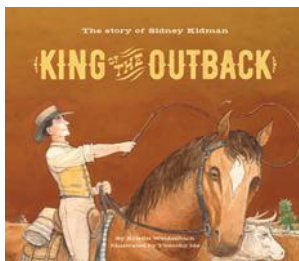
## King of the Outback: the story of Sidney Kidman

**A**t a time when Australia's largest private landholder, S. Kidman & Co. Ltd, has just passed into the hands of a corporate Chinese-Australian partnership, a new children's picture book captures the story of the pastoral pioneer that created the Kidman empire.

*King of the Outback* tells the rags-to-riches story of cattle king Sir Sidney Kidman, from a 13-year-old running away from his Adelaide home on a one-eyed horse, through his outback apprenticeship in Broken Hill, to his role as owner of almost 4% of the entire country and supplier of horses and cattle to the world.

*King of the Outback: the story of Sidney Kidman* is the second picture book by award-winning creative team Kristin Weidenbach and Timothy Ide, following on from *Tom the Outback Mailman*, the story of iconic Birdsville Track mailman Tom Kruse (Children's Book Council of Australia, Eve Pownall award, 2013).

Weidenbach's words and Ide's illustrations vividly bring the outback alive with mobs of cattle, hobbled horses and stockmen with swags and saddlebags. The story culminates in Kidman's famous 75th birthday rodeo in Adelaide attended by 50,000 people, making it the largest public birthday party ever put on in Australia to honour a private citizen. Facts and figures at the back of the book inform readers of other of Kidman's achievements, such as his establishment of the biggest horse sales in the southern hemisphere and a knighthood for his donation of horses, money, beef and wool during World War I. Listing Kidman's many



accomplishments reinforces for children that the book is a true story of an Australian pioneer.

In Dec 2016, the company S Kidman and Co Ltd and most of the company's herd of 185,000 cattle extending across 101,411 square kilometres, was bought by Australian Outback Beef Pty Ltd, majority owned by Gina Rinehart's Hancock Beef Pty Ltd. Anna Creek and its outstation The Peake were sold separately to a local farming family.

Properties in the Channel country that have been held by S Kidman & Co for more than 100 years include Glengyle, Durrie, Morney Plains, Durham Downs and Innamincka stations.

The new book will be in stores in April and Kristin Weidenbach will be presenting it at **Yankalilla Community Library** as part of the **Festival Fleurieu** on **28 April**.

## Walking a New Path

# DRAINAGE & WEEDING PROGRAM

Road works throughout the whole district will continue over the next eight weeks in preparation for winter.

Drainage works are the first element to be finalised helping ensure water does not pool on the road during winter.

This drainage work will be followed by an intensive weeding program, prior to the grading of the roads. Council will be spraying weeds along all roads and verges unless residents notify Council ahead of time that they do not wish this to take place in front of their property. Following this weeding and once there is moisture in the soil, the second stage of the road works will commence – namely grading the roads. To ensure the grading is of the highest quality, the roads must be wet.

Council recognises the priority for an improved road network and has a comprehensive and continuous improvement program to raise the quality of roads throughout the district. As such Council will spend approximately \$4 million on road works this financial year.

## TRAINEE

The District Council of Yankalilla have been successful in receiving funding through the Regional Youth Traineeship program to create one traineeship role based in horticulture.

Fifty-seven new jobs will be created state-wide through the second round of the program, kick-starting the careers of young South Australians in the local government sector.

The Regional Youth Traineeship Program offers \$14,500 a year to regional governance bodies across the State towards the cost of providing entry level employment for a trainee for two years. Local Second Valley resident, Ryan Fisher, has been awarded the traineeship.

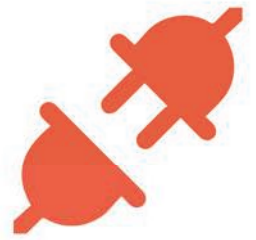

# LIBRARY CONNECTED TO THE NBN



**The Yankalilla Library is now officially connected to the NBN.**

The connection is the result of a partnership between the State Government and Council. Through this partnership the State Government Public Library Services supplies and funds the internet connection services and software, while the Council supports the hardware and infrastructure.

The NBN connection provides Library users with free high-speed access to the Library's four public

computers and Wi-Fi network to improve their overall user experience. Library staff also have access to the NBN connection at the service desk to enhance their face to face customer service capability and access to the Library Management System.

As a result of the NBN connection, internet speed has improved from approximately one to two megabits per second to 25-26 megabits per second. This enables customers using subscriptions to graphic, image and video rich websites to use these services seamlessly.

## RESULTS REPRESENTATION REVIEW

**Council has undertaken a review of elector representation. This involved two stages of public consultation regarding the election of Councillors, Chairperson (called Mayor); the retention of Wards and a re-arrangement of Ward Boundaries. At the March 2017 meeting of Council it was determined:**

- The Principal Member of Council would remain a Chairperson and be elected from within the Elected Body.
- The Council area would continue to be divided into two (2) Wards.
- The Ward names (Light and Field) would be retained and the boundary between the Wards be adjusted slightly.
- The Numbers of Councillors per Ward remain five (5) for Light Ward and four (4) for Field Ward.
- The elected body of Council continue to comprise a total of nine (9) Councillors.

## YANKALILLA SERVICE STATION

**The district is set to see the development of a new Integrated Service Station complex.** Council's Development Assessment Panel approved the proposed development, to be located on Main South Road opposite the Yankalilla Showgrounds, at its meeting in February 2017, after considering all information.

The application from Adelaide Fuel Distributors illustrated the complex is planning to operate from 6am to 12 midnight each day and includes a shop, fuel pumps for 6 cars and 4 trucks, together with car wash, dog wash and trailer hire facilities.

Once the applicant has prepared the full technical building specifications for the approved works final Development Approval can be issued.

We will keep you up-to-date with the development.

We are no longer restricted to what the library holds on its shelves.

Staff at the library are available to help people with managing online tasks such as Ancestry searches, learning how to use a range of software. There are four PCs available for public use. Learning is a life long journey and the library offers the facilities to everyone. The current pace of technology is fast and the library aims to be a facilitator of resources.

The current library is at the nurture stage and plans to relocate are in view. The staff relish feedback and want the community to be involved. Ideas for the future may include a children's library and a toy library. Developing a love of



language and reading in young children is high on the agenda. Future plans need to incorporate space for reading to young children as well as space to hold school holiday programs such as the recent 'flight' program.

The library provides links to the history of the town, with Margaret Morgan our local historian having a regular presence in the library.

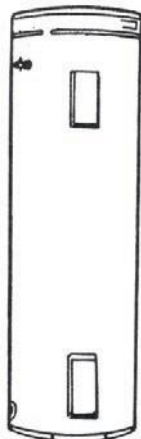

## Australian Decorative & Fine Arts Society – ADFAS (Fleurieu)

Dominic Riley, bookbinder, artist, lecturer and teacher will undoubtedly enthral us with his lecture *The Whole Art Of The Book*, on 1st May at which he will



tell the fascinating story of everything that makes a traditional handbound book. Come along and find out why the best paper was made from the worn out clothes of peasants, why leather had to be tanned outside the city walls and why gold leaf is measured in atoms and cannot be touched by hand.

Dominic first learned bookbinding from Benedictine Monks at the age of 16 and then later at the London College of Printing; gaining also a degree in English and the History of Art, he has worked at the Victoria and Albert Museum and for various binderies in London, New York and San Francisco. Dominic has his bindery in the Lake District in England where he restores antiquarian books for collectors, booksellers and libraries and creates contemporary fine bindings for collectors and exhibitions, winning many prizes over the years, including the prestigious Sir Paul Getty Award in the International Bookbinding competition in 2013. This award winning binding was acquired by the Bodleian Library in Oxford, England.

The picture below shows the binding of *The Somme: An Eyewitness History* - winner of the First Prize for the Set Book, and the Mansfield Medal, 2007. (Light and dark brown goatskin, pewter tooling. Painted edges, leather doublures and suede flyleaves.)

In this binding the three overpowering motifs of the battle are depicted: the trenches, the helmets and the barbed wire. The helmets stand in for the dead as they piled up in the trenches. The thinly pared helmets are full of holes, a sign of gradual decay. The small tool around the trenches evokes both the machine gun magazines, and the ladders that took the troops out of the trench to their futile final battle. The barbed wire is a simplified version of the wire common at the time.

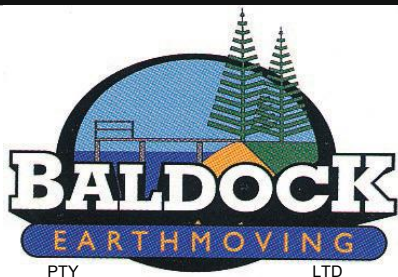

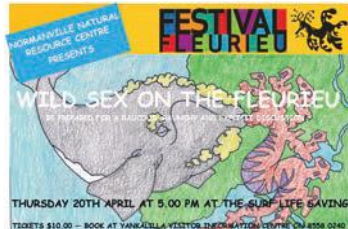

## Recycling and Making Soap

Making your own soap is surprisingly simple and very rewarding. Soap consists of three basic ingredients: Lard (fat), water and caustic soda (the cleaning agent). Other ingredients are added for texture and aroma - such as oatmeal, oil, herbs, etc. People are often intrigued by how quick and easy it is to make soap - the only 'delay' is that it takes three weeks for homemade soap to 'mature' ready for use. Many people are concerned about the 'caustic' component of soap - however for soap to 'clean' it needs to contain some type of cleaning agent - caustic soda being the most appropriate and accessible for the home soap-maker. Only about 2-3% of the soap is caustic soda - once it is diluted with the other ingredients its potency is no longer a problem.

## Weed of the Month from Cape Jervis Coastal Community Group Witchgrass

(*Panicum capillare* var. *brevifolium*)

(Photos: E. Cousins; growth habit, emerging flower head or inflorescence)

The mild, damp summer was kind to weeds as well our 'good' plants on site this year. This weedy grass was producing lots of seed when we came across it at our February working bee. It is a hairy, tufted grass... check those hairs out in the second photo! Notice also the slight purple in the plant, and the dominant midrib on the leaf. You might be able to spot all the ribbing on the stems as well. The flower head is very open and wide, at up to 40cm, with many branches. Single spikelets, each containing two flowers (one of which is

fertile, the other sterile), adorn these branches. Unlike the leaves and stem, these spikelets aren't hairy, but rough! Later, the mature flower head, full of seed, breaks off as a single structure, blowing away to spread the seed.

Fragrance. Kate Grenville

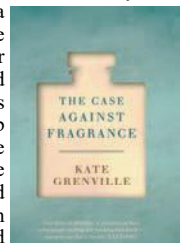
When Kate Grenville was tiny, her

mother had a tiny, precious bottle of perfume on her dressing table and on special occasions she'd put a dab behind her ears. The smell of Arpege was always linked in her mind with excitement and pleasure - her Mum with her hair done, wearing her best dress and her pearls, off for a night out.

Kate had always associated perfume with elegance and beauty. Then the headaches started. On a book tour, dogged by ill health, she started wondering: what's in fragrance? What does it do to people?

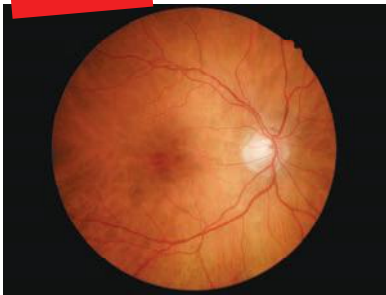

## Keeping Fit: Step ups

'Step ups' are a great follow up to the 'calf raise and stretch exercise'. It introduces a cardio element to your growing routine, while helping to increase/maintain bone density via the repeated impact of the stepping action. (So be prepared to feel a little puffed after this one)

1. Stand in front of a flight of stairs. (I'm using a low sturdy box)
2. With your right foot step fully onto the next step, followed by the left foot.
3. Now that both feet are level on the first step, step back down leading with the right foot, followed by the left. (it can help to count to 4 with each completed cycle).
4. Repeat 20 times before changing to the left foot now becoming the leading foot both up and down the step.
5. The pace you set yourself should make you puff while still keeping you safe.
6. Remember to keep good tall posture,

so that your back is neutral and your weight remains over your hips.

7. If you feel unsteady, for added balance assistance use stairs which have a hand rail for support.

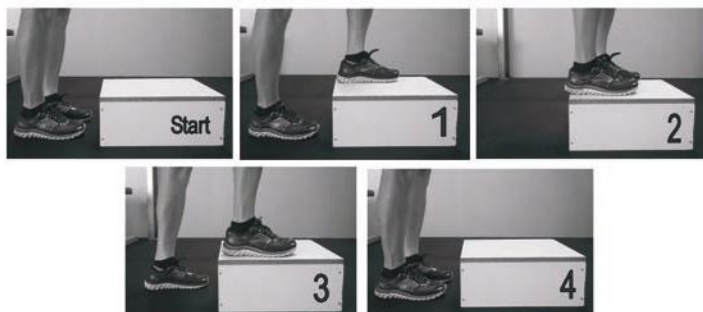

### Lady Bay Shack

Dear Editor – way back in 1956 my parents, Andrew and Eleanor Wells, in partnership with Bob and Betty Calvesbert, built a small shack at Lady Bay.

Two fine local master-builders – Andy Taylor and Jim Cooper – helped them with the project; Andrew and Bob worked under them, as honorary apprentices.

I was only three years old, but I remember Andy Taylor and Jim Cooper with great clarity: Jim, a man of slim build and few words, who had a wonderful way with wood; Andy Taylor as a young man, short, compact, bristling with energy, full of practical wisdom and knowhow.

It was Andy Taylor who put down the foundation of our shack. My father often used to recall a quote from his favourite book, *The Wandering Years*, by Weston Martyr:

*Men should tell what they know. If my father had told me, at fifteen, a little of what he knew at fifty five, he would have saved me a world of trouble and grief. He died, aged ninety two, and he took all he knew with him. Remembering his career, I feel he must have known a lot.*

I have no doubt that Andy Taylor, who died recently, knew an enormous amount about concrete and stone-masonry and the principles of building – and I expect he was able to pass on his formidable knowledge by example and instruction, and perhaps even by the written word.

Whatever the exact case, that foundation at Lady Bay has stood the test of time, and on behalf of my family I wanted to acknowledge his guidance and excellent workmanship, with gratitude.

### Drones

Last year there were two major rain and storm events, and several normal ones. Every time a huge amount of silt was carried out the Bungala River and coated the sea grass.

A week ago I swam directly out from the beach for two hundred metres, just north of the jetty. I was horrified. I could see no healthy living sea grass. What was there was brown and limp, and covered in unhealthy algae, the algae itself a sign of unhealthy conditions for the sea grass.

Sea grass has deep roots and holds the sand down. If sea grass dies, the waves over the sea floor start moving the sand. This action slowly changes the sand platform in the sea and along the beach.

Sea grass dies when it is coated with silt, as it can no longer photosynthesise. The condition of the sea grass is directly related to the amount of silt (and other pollutants) coming from the land via the Bungala.

I would like to collect aerial data on the regularity of silt flowing from the Bungala River into the sea, the extent of the silt over the sea grass, and how long before the silt is dispersed. The Yankalilla and Carrickalinga creeks could also be included in this data collection and analysis.

On one episode last year the beach was covered with *Phragmites australis*, the reedy water plant washed down the

Bungala River. This also needs to be monitored. Could you please contact me if you have drones with a suitable camera and are able to film these events as they occur, so that data can be assembled for systematic long-term analysis.

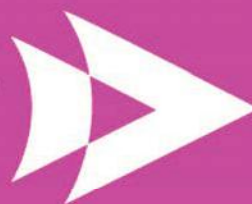

Activities will include: facilitating 2, two-day youth camps; feeding those who live on the streets; sharing with internees in the women's prison and participating in children's programs. Whilst the team seeks to make a difference in the lives of those trapped by their circumstances, the greatest lesson is the realisation that hope is not simply economic freedom, but ultimately a relationship. Over many years, the greatest discovery for the team is the realisation that hope is not about what we bring to Cebu, but the integrity of the relationship we share with the people of the Philippines. We can be hope wherever we are. In the weeks leading up to 7 April, the students are seeking to raise \$4000 to give 120 young people the opportunity to attend one of the camps, and put together a small bag of personal hygiene items and messages of hope for the 500 women in prison.

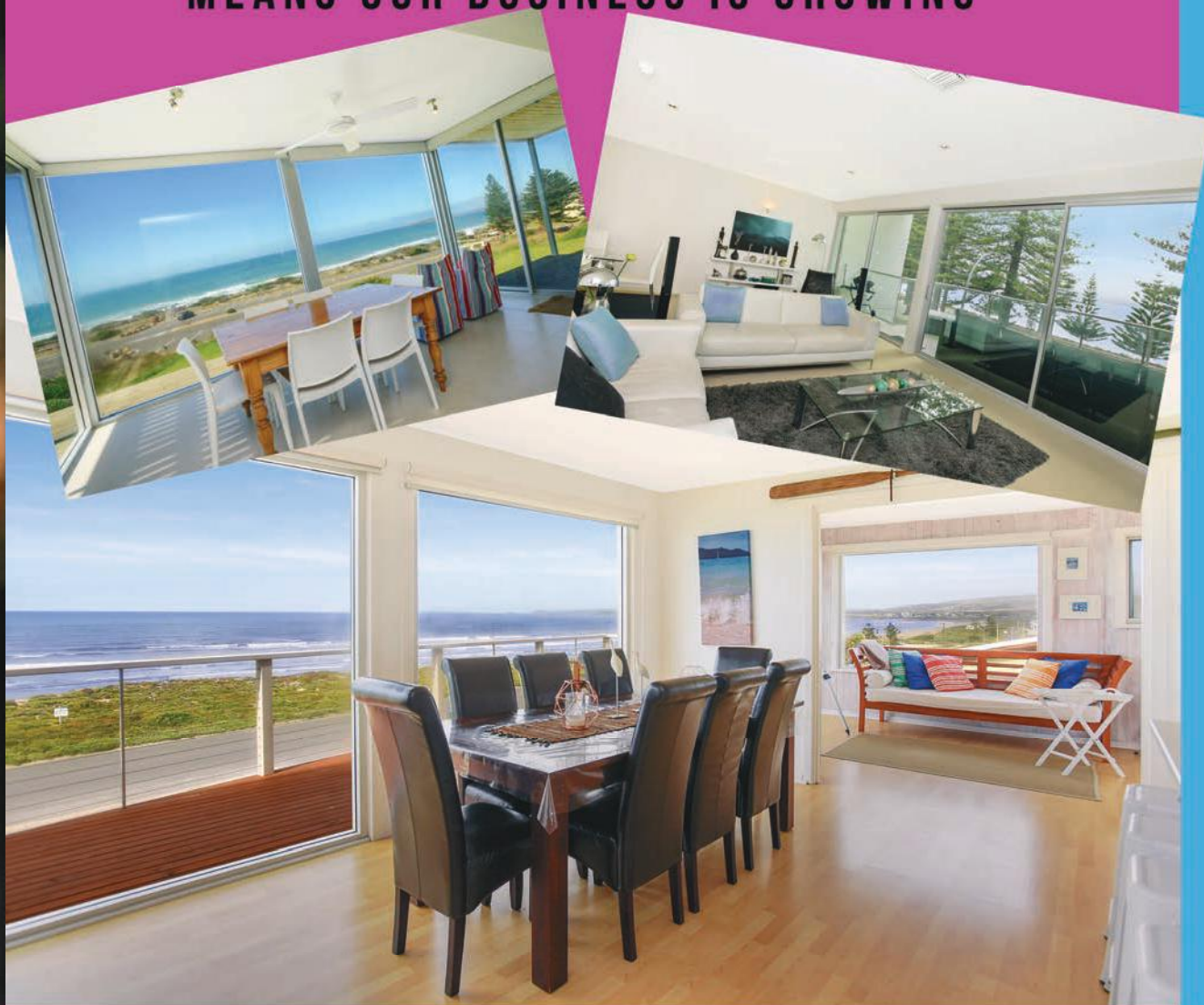
