County Fair Theme, Prizes Survey, and More Changes

4-H Council selected the Fair theme: "County Fair Era." An entry form for the Fair Book Cover Contest is included at the end of the newsletter. The deadline was extended to May 6.

The Fair Board is increasing the opportunities for 4-H and FFA members to receive premium money. First, added to the traditional live auction is Breeding animals shown in Beef, Sheep, Goats or Swine shows. Each member may only sell 1 entry. Any breeding animals that go through the Premium Sale may continue showing, but cannot be sold through any future Barber County Premium Sales. As a reminder, animals may sell in the Premium Sale and continue to be shown at the State Fair or Kansas Junior Livestock Show.

New this year, 4-H members not selling in the Premium Sale, may select 1 project to sell in a Silent Auction from the project area of Foods, Crafts, Woodworking, Photography, Fiber Arts, or Sewing and Textiles. These items will become the property of the highest bidder. This will keep them from being eligible for the Kansas State Fair. Members will declare by Friday at 5:00 P.M. if they are selling an item in the Silent Auction. The Silent Auction will be in the 4-H Building from Saturday at Noon until Sunday at 1:45 P.M. Fair Changes, Continued

The expectation is that foods sold in the Silent Auction will have a fresh product made and delivered soon after the fair. The champion food entries will continue to have the opportunity to sell in the Live Premium Auction.

The Fair Board would like to know what kind of prizes members would like for the building exhibits. A 1 question survey is available at

<u>https://kstate.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV_5dRuP3heqmnojj0</u>. Please answer the question by April 22. As of April 13, we have 2 answers. We will keep the same plaques if we do not get a larger response.

The Food Bake Sale right after the 4-H Foods are judged generates very little revenue. For 2024, we are going to allow members to take their items back, donate them to the fair kitchen or the superintendents can keep the items for display. No items will be allowed to be picked up until 4-H Foods Judging is completed.

A mule class has been added to the Horse Halter Show.

Starting with 2024, 4-H members will be required to attend half of their club meetings between October 1 and the County Fair to be eligible to sell in the Premium Sale. This includes the live auction and the silent auction.

2024 Tagging Policy: For the 2024 Barber County Fair, all market and breeding animals will be identified by a State EID Tag, a Barber County Tag, Scrapie Tag or a Tattoo. This number will be submitted with 3 photos (Front, Side, & Side) by the deadlines announced in the 4-H Newsletter. Tags will be available for purchase in the Barber County Extension Office.



4-H Summer Camps

Summer brings 4-H Camp Season. We have several opportunities for members to be involved.

Discovery Days is June 5-7 on the K-State Campus for members 13 years old or older. Registration Deadline is May 5. This is a mini college experience. Classes are held on a variety of topics related to many 4-H projects or careers. 4-H members stay in the dorms and eat in one of the dining centers. Madisyn Day went last year, visit with her to learn more. More information will be posted on the state website.

County 4-H Camp is at Silver Maple Campground in Kingman County. This is a 2 night camping experience for 7-12 year old members with teens serving as counselors. The groups participate in archery, crafts, paddle boats, swimming, and other learning experiences. A flyer is included with a registration form in this newsletter.

Rock Springs 4-H Center is hosting camps this summer. They have a variety of options that include longer stays at camp and teen leadership experiences. With the new camp format, all 4-H members can attend as a camper up to 18 years old. See the included flyer for more details.

Summer 4-H Interns will once again be in Barber County. They will have classes in both Kiowa and Medicine Lodge this summer. One class will be Reading Makes Cents that focuses on books and money. Other classes will be added in May.


