On May 8, 2025, Christendom witnessed a historic milestone with the election of Pope Leo XIV.

Born Robert Francis Prevost, he is the first pontiff in the Church's 2,000-year history to hail from the United States.

Chosen after four ballots on the second day of the conclave, his election signals a moment of both continuity and renewal, especially for communities like ours that are deeply rooted in grassroots faith and the mission of Gospel outreach.

Let us reimagine and refresh our gatherings so they remain meaningful, welcoming, and Christ-centered.






BEC AD ST FAUSTINA

Pilgrimages:

Prayer and Reflection:

- Special masses, prayer gatherings, and retreats will be held to deepen one's connection with God.

Community Building:

- Events are designed to foster unity and solidarity within the community, both locally and globally.

Works of Mercy:

- Engaging in acts of charity, such as donating to the poor, supporting religious or social works, or volunteering in service to the community.

Renewal and Faith:

- Opportunity for conversion, spiritual renewal and deepening one's faith with Christ.

Acts of Penance:

- Participating in spiritual exercises, missions, or formation activities on Vatican II documents and the Catechism.

Spiritual Practices:

- For those who cannot physically travel, they can obtain the indulgence by uniting themselves spiritually with those who are on pilgrimage, reciting the Our Father, Creed, and other prayers, while offering their suffering.

STEPPING INTO THE SANDALS OF JESUS



The BEC Reflection paper for the month of June clearly pointed to **the need for spirituality among church leaders** when the quadrant on **‘Church Unbelievers’** observed the threats of task-oriented leadership that focuses on performance and results. We must not allow the secular practices replace our church work but continue to glorify the Lord in our services.



The ecclesial community needs a **synodal leader that dialogues with respect, listens without domination and adopts an attitude for service for journeying together in building relationships.**



It is important to discern the signs of times and **embrace new missions** equipped with spiritual knowledge and doctrinal understanding to model our lives after Jesus, staying committed to his teachings.

This is important because as leaders we encounter one another, rather than correcting each other, making decisions based on biblical principles and established doctrines where we are responsible for setting the spiritual direction of the church.

Conversations in the Spirit is a promising method that turns opinions and points of views into agreements from disagreements. It is lead with spiritual self-reflection to identify 'reasons' and to recognise 'weightier reasons' by praying, pondering and meditating for a spiritual experience.

As leaders we are encouraged to be open to the surprises of the Holy Spirit and to the Spirit's newness.

Finally, let us **reflect on Pope Leo XIV, the first pope of the Order of Saint Augustine** known as Augustinians with roots tracing back to St. Augustine of Hippo

They are a mendicant (homeless) order dedicated to poverty and service (relying on donations for sustenance), focusing on contemplative spirituality and communal living.

They hold on to the core value of **living in harmony and unity, being of one mind and heart on the way to God.**
