1. Registration for odd semesters is held in May-June
2. Even semester registration is held in November-December

Program Structures

The minimum number of credits taken by students is 42 credits and a maximum of 48 credits, with the following details:

1. 34 credits including 14 credits of compulsory courses, 12 credits of compulsory interest courses, and 8 credits of tentative courses according to the student's interests and areas of concentration, and 8 credits of thesis.
2. Taking courses exceeding 42 credits is permitted and classified as tentative courses, which can be taken either inside or outside the relevant study program.
