Encouraging Others

One of my favorite characters in the Bible is Barnabas. Acts chapter 4 tells us his real name was Joseph, but he was given this new name by the apostles because it meant "Son of Encouragement." When we first meet him, he is giving a large sum of money he had from selling a field so they could do the work they were called to do. He was an encourager. As Chaplains, we need to be encouragers. We need to encourage fellow believers to utilize the talents and abilities that God gave them to serve the Kingdom, reach the lost, and help others. We need to encourage those who don't have a relationship with Christ by introducing them to Him. Or by being an ear to listen, a shoulder to lean on, or a friend to care.

The next time we see Barnabas, he is bringing Saul to the apostles in Jerusalem. Acts 9 tells the story of how the rest of the believers were afraid of Saul and didn't trust his conversion because of his past. But Barnabas did. He spoke up on Saul/Paul's behalf. As Chaplains, we will find ourselves in these situations as well.

Think of what happens when an unsaved biker comes to know our Lord. Will he be accepted in the local church? Who will make introductions for him? Who will help him get established in the disciplines necessary to become a healthy follower of Christ? Will you? Will the lady biker who meets Christ for the first time have a friend that comes along side of her to help her learn about Jesus without judgement?

I've heard it said that every person needs a Paul, a Barnabas, and a Timothy in their lives. Their "Paul" is their mentor – their spiritual leader who helps disciple them and guide them, who helps them grow. Their "Barnabas" is their peer who comes beside them to be their friend. companion, and co-worker in the ministry and journey of life. And, their "Timothy" is the one they pour into - the one they mentor, teach, and guide. While it's important to know who your Paul, Barnabas, and Timothy are, I want you to consider who are you being a Barnabas for? Who are you coming alongside? Who are you befriending? Who are you encouraging? Take some time and think about the people in your life and the relationships you have with them. How can you be more of an encourager? Galatians 6:2 says we are to share each other's burdens. I can't think of a better way to start encouraging others than to invest in their lives and let them see that you truly care because Christ cares for us.

In 2006, when Marty Edwards

still had hair, Jim Birmingham was referred to as "Jesus," and Laz Alba was still in grade school, I felt led to join Black Sheep Harley-Davidson for Christ. The decision to join was driven in part by the wisdom imparted to me by our marriage counselor (as Vicky and I were coming out of a dark period in our marriage) and his recommendation to get involved in "ministry" as our next step in marriage restoration. During those times of marriage struggle, I had fallen in love with motorcycles as a distraction from my personal and spiritual problems. So, after experiencing unmerited grace from God and my family, a renaissance in my faith, a renewed sense of commitment to Vicky, and that I could use motorcycles as a ministry tool, I knew that a Motorcycle Ministry (MM) was where I belonged. Shortly after, I encountered a professional clown, Marty, and his side-kick, the late Ron Walker, at Arizona Bike Week. I knew that the Holy Spirit was saying to me "this is the ministry for you."


Little did we know at the onset of joining Black Sheep that he would use the ministry to help rebuild Vicky's trust in me, surround me with accountability partners, we would make hundreds of friends, and we would participate in countless ministry opportunities both across the western USA, but also in Australia. Black Sheep members became an extension of our church "family" and loved us despite our flaws and shortcomings.

After 17 years as a BS patch (15 for Vicky), I began to think that we weren't of much use to Black Sheep, partly because I had switched over to the "dark side" (riding Indian Motorcycles for the past seven years), and partly because both of my parents were in rapidly declining health (they both passed away last summer). We spoke to the leadership about our intention of leaving, sent our patches to National, and left. The reaction from most was "what went wrong?" Actually, NOTHING really went wrong. We believe it was God's timing for us to spend quality time with my parents in their final months, but it was also a time to reflect upon "what was in it for me?"

After leaving Black Sheep, I decided to prospect with another two-piece MM. But I realized that ministry shouldn't be about what's in it for me, it's about "how can God use me in this ministry." At the end of my prospect period, the new MM was going to ask me to patch up. I thought and prayed about it, and realized that any misgivings I had about Black Sheep would be the same misgivings about any new motorcycle ministry. Consequently, I had put in the hard work to join another motorcycle ministry, but felt that God didn't want me there. He wanted me back with Black Sheep, After all, Black Sheep is our "family" and it was through Black Sheep that I grew in my walk with Christ, Vicky and I grew in our love toward each other, and God used us in countless ways that we will never understand.

No more is it "what's in it for me?" Today it's "God, I'm open to be used however you want in whatever organization, ministry, or calling you've placed me." Our pastor recently said, "Do you know how to make God laugh? Tell him YOUR plans for your life!"

Jeremiah 29:11 –
"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."



I'm returning to Black Sheep, knowing that this is where I belong ministering alongside so many dear and eternal friends and recognizing that OUR mission and ministry are not complete. While there are things that I would like to see changed in BSHDFC, at my church, in my work, in my community, in my government, in the environment, and in my life, God uses us where we are and in ways we'll never fully understand.

Self-examination is vital in the life of a believer. It helps us align our actions with our beliefs, ensuring that we live out our faith authentically. By regularly assessing our spiritual health and involvement, we can identify areas for growth and make necessary adjustments. This practice also fosters a sense of accountability and responsibility, encouraging us to contribute positively to our ministry. Moreover, self-examination promotes personal and communal growth, strengthening the bonds within the ministry and enhancing its overall effectiveness.

2 Corinthians 13:5 advises, "Examine yourselves to see whether you are in the faith..." This verse emphasizes the necessity of ongoing self-assessment to ensure our faith and actions are in line with the Word of God.
Additionally, Lamentations 3:40 says, "Let us examine our ways and test them..." This verse encourages us to reflect on our actions, reinforcing the need for regular self-reflection to maintain a strong spiritual connection.

It poses a series of introspective questions that cover a range of topics including evangelism, regular participation in church and ministry activities, and personal spiritual practices like prayer and Bible study.

Editor's note: When reflecting on these questions, it's important to approach the process with a sense of responsibility and a desire for growth rather than self-criticism. The goal is to identify ways to better align your actions with the ministry's mission of sharing the Gospel. Consider how you can strengthen your relationships, prepare spiritually, and enhance your involvement in a way that contributes meaningfully to the collective purpose. Even small steps can lead to significant impact, reinforcing the values you hold and the broader mission of the ministry.



"What Kind of Member Am I? (A Self-Reflection)

- 1. How can I deepen my concern for those who need to know Jesus?
- 2. In what ways can I view BSHDFC as a meaningful opportunity to reach the lost?
- 3. How do I perceive the distinction between this ministry and a club?
- 4. How can I better prepare myself through daily prayer and study in God's Word?
- 5. How regularly do I attend and serve at my local church, and how do I balance this with riding on a mission?
- 6. What forms of bike ministry or service am I involved in on a monthly basis?
- 7. How well do I know the members of my chapter, and how well do they know me?
- 8. How can I focus on encouraging and supporting others more than critiquing?
- 9. How might leadership view my contributions to the chapter?
- 10. How often do I ride my bike, and how can I make riding a more consistent part of my life?
- 11. How connected am I with my HOG / Riding Group community, and do its members know me?
- 12. Am I up-to-date with paying my membership dues?
- 13. How often do I pray for this ministry and our leaders?
- 14. How do I view this ministry: is it more about what I receive or what I have the privilege to give?
- 15. Am I finding joy in being a part of this ministry?"

This reflection isn't just about personal improvement; it's about contributing to a larger purpose. By turning challenges into opportunities for growth, you ensure that your membership is more than just participation—it's an active engagement in spreading the Gospel and making a positive difference. Embrace the chance to make your involvement more meaningful and impactful, knowing that every effort you make adds value to both your spiritual journey and the lives of those around you.

TURNINGTRAGEDY NTO TESTINONY How Intentional Love Brought Jesse to Christ





Jesse, a biker with around five years of riding experience, was recently involved in a severe accident when a car unexpectedly pulled out in front of him while he was traveling at approximately 60 miles per hour. The collision sent Jesse flying, and he landed hard, suffering a broken pelvis and back.

Upon hearing the news, Mark Esola, the president of our BSHDFC Santa Maria chapter, promptly requested that their chapter chaplain visit Jesse in the hospital. The chaplain brought a blanket, prayed with him, and provided comfort during his visit. When Mark later learned that Jesse was being transferred from the Lompoc area to Pasadena, CA. he immediately took action. Mark reached out to Area Contact and International Vice President Greyson Adams and asked if he could visit Jesse at the Pasadena-area hospital.

That same day, Greyson visited Jesse in the hospital. Mark's intentionality and commitment were evident—not satisfied with just the initial visit, he ensured that Jesse continued to receive support from our ministry. As a result, during Greyson's first hospital visit, he was able to pray with Jesse and share the gospel with him. Jesse subsequently gave his life to Jesus—praise the Lord! This divine encounter might not have happened if Mark hadn't been so intentional.

This is why Black Sheep Harley-Davidsons for Christ exists. Yes, we engage in other acts of service, ministry, and fellowship, such as manning free boot shine booths, hosting monthly chapter breakfasts, and riding and serving our designated riding groups and motorcycle dealerships. However, Black Sheep's mission has always been, and will always be, to introduce Jesus to the motorcycle community. We remain focused and committed to sharing the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. Our ministry is rooted in this purpose—to reach out with love, compassion, and intentionality, ensuring that no opportunity to share Christ's love is missed. As Galatians 6:9 reminds us, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."

Mark, BSHDFC Santa Maria chapter, and Greyson's actions exemplify what it means to be a Black Sheep: always ready, always intentional, and always available to lead others to Jesus. Thank you to all that visited and continue to visit Jesse at the hospital. Let's continue to keep Jesse in our prayers. All for His glory!



'Christy' is more than a motorcycle; it's a rolling testament to faith, purpose, and the power of the open road as a path to spiritual journeys.







Fueling Feloviship at Bayside Harley-Davidson

A Snack-Driven Mission to Share the Gospel To Those Who Ride.

I have been an Area Contact for Black Sheep Harley Davidson for Christ in Tidewater, Virginia for a little over two years. Outside of joining the local H.O.G. chapter, and going on a handful of rides, there has been minimal practical ministry. Recently, my church, Iron Horse Fellowship, partnered with Bikers for Christ in supply baked goods for their fundraiser cookouts held at Bayside Harley Davidson. Bayside Harley Davidson and their H.O.G. did not have a BSHDFC contact, and I felt Holy Spirit guiding me to this location. My time with BSHDFC has been spent with Southside HD (Bayside's rival) and their H.O.G. chapter.
