TAYLOR & SOURCE ON FOOT

The Taylor on Foot community walking program officially launched on May 17. The program is designed to meet residents where they are—fostering communication between the City and community members to hear concerns, identify solutions, and build trust.

During the first event, five teams made up of 26 participants—including City Council members and volunteers from City staff, police, fire, the Greater Taylor Foundation, and Taylor ISD—walked through District 3 and knocked on 61 doors.

The most common concerns were street conditions, speeding, and water rates. As a result, City staff have already been directed to install speed limit signs and a radar sign on T.H. Johnson. SUMMER SAFETY TIPS



FROM THE TAYLOR FIRE DEPARTMENT

Stay Hydrated

- Drink plenty of water throughout the day, especially during outdoor activities.
- Avoid excessive caffeine and alcohol, which can lead to dehydration.

WATER

Protect Yourself from the Sun

- Wear sunscreen with at least SPF 30 and reapply every 2 hours.
- Wear sunglasses, wide-brimmed hats, and light, breathable clothing.
- Seek shade during peak sun hours (10 AM 4 PM).



Practice Water Safety

- · Never swim alone; always have a buddy or adult supervision.
- Make sure children wear life jackets near water.
- Learn CPR and basic water rescue techniques.



Watch for Heat-Related Illness

- Know the signs of heat exhaustion and heat stroke: dizziness, nausea, rapid pulse, and confusion.
- Take breaks in cool or shaded areas.



Prevent Bug Bites

- Use insect repellent containing
- Wear long sleeves and pants in areas with mosquitoes or ticks.
- Check for ticks after spending time outdoors.



Grill and Campfire Safety

- Keep grills and campfires at least 10 feet away from buildings or trees.
- Never leave a fire or grill unattended.
- Have water or a fire extinguisher nearby in case of emergency.



Travel Safely

- Wear seat belts, obey speed limits, and never drive under the influence.
- Prepare an emergency kit for road trips (water, snacks, flashlight, first-aid kit).



Protect Your Pets

- Never leave pets in hot cars.
- Make sure they have plenty of water and shade.
- Walk them during cooler parts of the day.

May 8 Meeting

COUNCIL APPROVED AN AMENDMENT TO THE TIRZ SURROUNDING SAMSUNG, MOVING LINDE GAS OUT OF THE ZONE AND BRINING AN ESTIMATED \$1.7M A YEAR INTO THE GENERAL FUND, AND RECEIVED A PRESENTATION ON THE WELLNESS AND RECREATION CENTER FEASIBILITY STUDY.





May 22 Meeting

COUNCIL AMENDED AN AGREEMENT WITH WILLIAMSON COUNTY TO EXTEND OUR \$2M FINANCIAL OBLIGATION FOR CORRIDOR A2 TO 2028, AND INTRODUCED AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR MULTI-FAMILY DEVELOPMENTS AND RV PARKS.
