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Welcome

I am so encouraged as I reflect on the last year and recognise the ways God has used Scripture Union Ireland through this challenging season. We can see how God was preparing us for this time and we have held fast to the verse we wrote on our office whiteboard at the beginning of 2020 from Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." We are so grateful to all of you who have prayed for us, sent words of encouragement and supported us financially, this support has carried us through the last year.

Our ministry is made up of a diverse range of activities, in a normal year SUI runs 15+ residential camps and over 60 school retreats (primarily residential) at our retreat centre, Ovoca Manor. Our field ministries team and volunteers connect directly with young people on these camps and deliver in-school retreats in a further 40+ schools. Each year SU also runs CSSM in Greystones & Dun Laoghaire and this year we celebrate the 125th anniversary of CSSM in Greystones, the beginnings of SU's ministry in Ireland. We also host a further 100+ church, youth and other groups through the course of a year at Ovoca Manor, Due to restrictions and lockdowns this SU Ministry has not been possible, with a handful of exceptions such as RAW camp in August and a couple of excellent school retreats towards the end of 2020.



I am so proud of our team who from the start of the pandemic showed an attitude to persevere and keep pushing to find a way to continue to minister to young people and families through the many challenges. We quickly pivoted at the beginning of the pandemic to delivering online content through our SU+ platform in the form of online Easter camps and the 'SUrvival Kit' to assist secondary school students with some practical guidance to care for their mental health through the initial lockdown. During the summer and with our utmost gratitude to some of our wonderful volunteers we produced an online CSSM programme and an online family week program.

Our expectation was to be exiting the worst of the pandemic and its impact at the end of the summer 2020 however this was not to be. We felt and recognised the fatigue we and others were feeling towards anything virtual so turned our focus to developing high quality resources for schools and churches that would have longevity and life beyond Covid-19. In partnership with Scripture Union Scotland we have developed **NUA:Christmas** and **NUA:Easter** and we currently have other projects and training material under development as we build a suite of resources to support you, your local church, parish, youth worker or organisation in local ministry.

In the following pages, you will read updates from our team and volunteers and we hope that you are encouraged by what the Lord is doing through Scripture Union Ireland. Please continue to support us in prayer and share our work with your network. Thank you again for being a part of this journey with us.

What a difference a year makes! In our last edition of Inspire we were

gearing up to launch in person our new series NUA:Origins and while we're disappointed that didn't happen we are so thankful to God that since then we have produced two further film series NUA:Christmas and NUA:Easter, that has been a great blessing to schools and churches in these unique digital times! As we look to the future we will be producing some training material to help people use our resources effectively and we also hope to produce **NUA:Move**, a video series helping 6th class students make the move to secondary school. As summer looms with some uncertainty the resources team will continue to work closely with the field ministry team and assist with potential online camp initiatives. Here you will read an update on all our digital resources.



NEW RESOURCE NUA:EASTER

In early 2021 we produced NUA:Easter. Once again we partnered with SU Scotland and wrote and filmed a 3 part series that provides a fresh perspective on Easter and why it matters for us today. Our field ministry team of Darren, Mark and Sarah have been such engaging hosts for these mini-series and the creativity has hit new levels with the expertise of Greg Fromholz and Sharon Lynch. It has been a privilege to lead these very talented people to create God honouring resources to reach tens of thousands of young people. It has been a huge motivating factor to serve teachers and youth workers during the last year and we're so excited that over 550 groups are using NUA:Easter, that's nearly 30,000 young people exploring the truth about Jesus' ressurection this Easter.

One of the Mini series we have produced during COVID-19 is NUA:Christmas (when restrictions allowed) which turned out to be an impressive full staff team achievement. Over 550 groups engaged with this digital series from school groups to church groups or simply at home. This had the potential reach of 50,000 young people. SU Scotland who partnered with us on this project also had a similar reach. There were also 10,000 unique users on the RightNow Media platform (USA) and the content was used extensively through the Voke APP (Jesus Film), we are very thankful for these partnerships beyond our shores.

As we continue to wait to officially launch NUA:Origins we are still equipping pilot groups and right now there are over 150 groups that have begun using NUA:Origins which is very exciting. That's a reach of 5500 young people. Jim Donnan (Church Relations) has done incredible work locally to assist parishes at the confirmation level. He has been equipping Anne Dooley, a Parish Catechist, Marino Parish to use NUA:Origins over zoom. There have been up to 100 young people with their parents tuning in each Monday.

One of the exciting components of NUA:Origins is the accompanying Journal. Our team has done an incredible job of creating and designing an engaging book and keepsake for the participants. We will be printing them later this year.











Our original 8 part series became invaluable during the pandemic with schools and education organisations making use of NUA as they evolved to online learning both here in Ireland and around the world. NUA was ideally set up for this as we had pivoted to offering it as a free digital pack through online registrations. Since the first lockdown, we have had over 150 registrations reaching a further 7000-10,000 young people and young adults. There are still exciting developments with this series through our partnership with Jesus Film. They are investing to translate and dub NUA into 12 further languages with the vision of reaching the unreached. We look forward to working with our SU colleagues around the globe to see how this tool can aid their work on the ground.

SHINE ONLINE

We are still doing what we can to support young Christians in the school context. Shine is an initiative of all SU's across the UK and Ireland alongside Logos Ministries and Crown Jesus. It exists to equip faith-based groups in Second level schools and to encourage young people to share their faith with their friends. That's why we got together to run a youth conference called 'Shine Online 2021.' This event gathered 150 young people from right across the UK and Ireland to hear 3 fantastic talks about the 'Why?' the 'How?' and the 'What? of sharing your faith with your friends. This summer the Shine group are producing a film series on the theme of 'Influencers' to equip outreach for faith-based groups in schools during the autumn



VOKE APP

Our partnership with Jesus Film also continues the development of the VOKE APP. All of our NUA material is presented on this app geared for individual growth and peer to peer evangelism.

This Easter the app is also being used for a family campaign.

The Family Easter Adventure is a 5-part series using our original NUA Easter content to unpack the events of Easter and why faith matters for your family in today's world. It's the perfect series to spread out the story of Easter beyond a single weekend. Field Ministries

If you told me in March 2020 that we would only run one physical

camp for a whole year I would have called you crazy! A lot has changed and we have been okay with that and leaned into the opportunities it has provided. All Scripture Union's direct work with people including through camps , schools work, residential work and training comes under the Field Ministries banner with the mission of sharing the hope of Jesus with the young people of Ireland. Our delightful team is made up of Sarah, Mark and Darren. Then we have our wonderful administrator Andrew.

So what have we been doing over the past year !? Restrictions meant camps were not able to go ahead so we moved ourselves online! We produced two online Easter camps for those who were missing out due to restrictions and this was an exciting way to still provide a taste of the camp experience. In spring 2020 we developed an online retreat package "SUrvival Kit" to assist students with their mental health through that time. During the Summer we produced an online Super CSSM programme as we were not able to run camps, this was a mix of online content, activities and zoom gatherings. It was a great way to creatively share who Jesus is to young people. A huge thank you has to be

made to all the volunteers who made the massive undertaking happen. Family week also went online this year, for all those who had registered and a huge thanks to Alison O'Neill for all the work she did to produce this.

We were super fortunate to be able to work in a lot of schools during the last year. As our retreats are 'religious education' we are considered an essential service, so we have had the excitement of working in schools. Here is some wonderful feedback from 2nd year students on just one retreat.

"I learned how important God is and what he does for us."

"I enjoyed the time I spent here today because it made me feel safe and loved"

"That God is always here even when you feel alone"

"this is a day I will remember for the rest of my life"

"it was fun and good craic"

It is so encouraging to hear young people open to exploring faith and seeing how important life with Jesus is.

We learnt a lot from creating all the content we did this year, what kind of

online content is wanted and needed, this was a huge learning curve for us. We took all this learning and applied this to the creation of NUA:Christmas and NUA:Easter for schools, churches and youth clubs alike with the intention of the content having life beyond covid. It has been an honour to produce resources that reach young people from across the country and from different backgrounds.

We are also using this time to evaluate our Field Ministries, exploring how we best serve the young people of Ireland, and how we may need to adapt to the new normal. We are looking at the sustainability of our schools' work and how we may connect the church with local schools. We aim to better disciple and train volunteers who have given and continue to give so much to SU.

I am reminded of John 15 where Jesus asks us to **"Abide in me"**. This is a great reminder to stay rooted to Jesus in this time. That while there is change and unknowns that we have our faith in Him as the steadfast hope we trust in.

So simple that one day he asked someone at the station 'When does this train go to Dublin?' He answered, 'Oh sir we send them out according as the crowd gathers!' 'So select was it that there were no trippers and the only attraction was ourselves!'

No CSSM that year due to the Easter Rising. Leader: Mr Edwin Arrowsmith 1911-19 & 21.

Edwin had been a member of Josiah Spiers team in Llandudno in 1873, where the CSSM had begun five years earlier. It is recorded that in 1915 after every morning service the children sang the National anthem! He was also used by God to bring Amy Carmichael to faith when he spoke at Harrogate CSSM. She later wrote. 'I don't remember what the speaker Mr Edwin Arrowsmith spoke about but after his address he told us to sing, 'Jesus loves me, this I know,' and then to be quiet. During those quiet minutes, in His great mercy the Good Shepherd drew me into His fold.'

Trevor and his wife Patricia worked as doctors in London during the blitz in the **1950's** and became some of the first medical missionaries to gain access to Nepal. Seemingly, the Atomic bombs that were dropped in Japan during the time of the mission had a huge effect on Stuart and the team.

Approx. 1983 when Andrew Batty was leading Greystones CSSM, they got the local Gardai involved in the Birthday Service. The team on the beach were dressed as criminals and were singing the song 'Marching beneath the banner' - doing all the actions. Meanwhile, Robert was sitting in a Garda car just down the road from the beach. When they got the nod, the Garda put the siren and lights on and drove down onto the beach. The Garda then chased the 'criminals' down the beach while everyone watched.

For almost a year now I've been saying, "We're not having a great time are we? But it doesn't have to be a waste of time or lost time." It's been a hard season in ministry during the pandemic but because of what God has done in me and through me in the lives of others, I wouldn't change it. I'm amazed I can say that because I was forced to cease so many ministries I love & that pointed young people to Jesus; youth groups down at Crinken, youth bible studies in my home, camps and meeting up I to I to disciple young people without a mask or having to check if the guidelines allowed me to do so.

Humbled and brought low to my knees in prayer for young people I could not seem to reach, I've seen God doing new things as he redeems and purifies old things.

I think I've tried everything at this point! But, some of the most fruitful ways I've seen young people connect with God have included:

Sunday afternoon phone calls, where I have prayed before hand and had a few



questions ready before I dialled. I've had some amazing pastoral conversations with young people.

When restrictions allowed I've texted guys a bible verse and asked if they'd like to meet up outside safely to catch up and talk about what God is saying to us in this verse. I've told them I'm here for them, praying for them, but more importantly Jesus is doing the same but he's actually with them by his Spirit and speaking by his Word.

It's been amazing to hear of young people grow as christians when all the events are stripped away from them and when Jesus is all they have, they find Jesus is greater, and God willing they decide to pray to him to follow him, not just listen to me or come to the youth group.

But to encourage them to listen to Jesus is the hard part. We all miss the community and helpful discipline in person ministry is for helping us take time with God. Online ministry is tough! People get sick of it and then summon the patience again. Including me! So I've taken breaks. Then with a prayed for, flexible & fun plan ready, I've posted teens flyers to online youth groups, with some chocolate, a 'Crinken Youth' sticker and a Mark's Gospel that we read a small passages of together each week.

I thank our Father in Heaven for tearing down so many things and I pray this season produces disciples of Jesus who love God and long to be with him in glory, as they are carried by his grace, day by day, in every season.
